1. Body-worn operations is not approved unless SAR compliance can be demonstrated, therefore, the users manual and operator training instructions must be revised to indicate this device should not be carried next to the body when using certain accessories such as the proposed headset/microphone options. Please confirm.

Please see the revised manual.

2. Your latest response indicated there is information pertaining to controlled exposure limits in the training material, but none can be found. The only two items in the training material that relate to RF exposure for this Model 1225 handheld unit are - keep antenna away and keep transmitting duration short. These do not provide users with any information on the actual RF exposure requirements or for what purpose etc. Please confirm that these will be included in the training.

Please note that the following requirement will be included on the grant of authorization:

This device is a handheld unit approved for use in law enforcement operations with a maximum operating duty factor not exceeding 10% and must meet controlled RF exposure limits. Operations with the unit carried next to the body of a person, for non-occupational environments or for used by the general public are not approved. Grantee must provide operator training to ensure users can control their exposure durations and conditions for meeting RF exposure requirements.
