




DISC TYPES:


DVD

Data on most DVDs is divided into sections called titles and then into subsections called chapters, each of which is given a title or chapter number. 

When placing the media center in any type of enclosed space, be sure to allow space around it for ventilation.


If placing in a tight space without ventilation, heat generated from the unit could produce a potential heat hazard.











SPEAKER/POWER WIRE SOCKET DIAGRAM




SPEAKER (6X4-ohms) WIRING COLOR CODE GUIDE






If using the external optional remote sensor, insert the plug into the EXT IR Jack as the arrowhead shown on above picture. This will allow the remote control to work in another zone if desired.

BATTERY INSTALLATION --- REMOTE CONTROL

Battery Installation

- 1. Slide and lift the battery door (Figure 1).
- 2.Install 2 (two) AAA size batteries into the battery compartment as indicated by the polarity markings (Figure 2).
- 3. Replace the battery door (Figure 3).



Battery Precaution

Follow these precautions when using a battery in this device:

- 1. Use only the size and type of battery specified.
- 2. Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the battery as indicated in the battery compartment. A reversed battery may cause damage to the device.
- Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.
- 4. If the batteries in the device are consumed or the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- 5. Do not try to recharge the battery not intended to be recharged; it can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's instructions).
- 6. The batteries shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.
- 7. Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.

Remote Control Effective Range

Notes:

- When there is an obstacle between the unit and the remote control, the remote control may not operate properly.
- When direct sunlight, an incandescent lamp, fluorescent lamp or any other strong light shines on the remote sensor of the unit, the operation of remote control may be unstable.

GENERAL OPERATIONS

- 1. Press the \circlearrowleft button on the unit or remote control to power on the unit from standby mode.
- 2. Press the ∃ button on remote control or touch the ∃ button on unit repeatedly to switch to desired mode as listed:

BT TV AUX FM OPTICAL USB DVD HDMI


NOTE: USB mode will be selected when the USB device is inserted.

- 3. During Playback:
- ~ Press the VOL+/VOL- buttons on the remote control or touch the + or button on the unit to adjust volume level as desired.
- ~ Press A, B or C button on the remote control or touch A,B or C button on the unit to switch ON or OFF the corresponding ZONE A/B/C speakers.
- 4. When finished listening, press the 🖒 button on the unit or remote control to power off the unit.
- 5. If the unit is not used for long period of time, please disconnect power.

LISTEN TO FM RADIO

BEFORE OPERATION

Insert the Antenna into the ANTENNA Jack on rear panel as illustrated as below.



SEARCHING STATION

- 1. Power ON the unit.
- 2. Press the ∃ button on remote control or touch the ∃ button on unit repeatedly to switch to FM mode, the FM frequency will appear on the display.
- 3. Touch and hold the I◀ or ▶ button on front of the unit or press and hold the TUNE- or TUNE + button on remote control, then release the button to search the previous or next available FM station automatically, when a station searched, it will playback automatically.

STATIONS STORAGE THROUGH THE TOUCH BUTTON ON UNIT

When a station searched, touch and hold the MC button to display the storage location (such as Pxx, the xx stands for 01-10), then press MC button to change and select the desired storage location, touch and hold the MC button to confirm and complete station storage. A total of 10 stations can be stored into the unit's memory.

STATIONS STORAGE THROUGH THE BUTTON ON REMOTE CONTROL

When a station searched, press and hold the MC button to display the storage location (such as Pxx, the xx stands for 01-10), then press the MC button to change and select the desired storage location, press and hold the MC button to confirm and complete station storage. A total of 10 stations can be stored into the unit's memory.

PRESET RECALL

Touch the №º button on the unit or press the №º on remote control repeatedly to select the preset stored station and playback.

FM Antenna

The antenna wire on the rear of the unit is for radio reception. If reception is weak, unwind and extend the wire or relocate the unit to improve the radio reception.

BLUETOOTH PAIRING AND PLAYBACK

- 1. Power ON the unit.
- 2. Press the ∃ button on remote control or touch the ∃ button on unit repeatedly until "BT" appears on display and blinks, now it is in BT pairing mode.
- Activate the external BT Device and enter BT searching mode. Start pairing as the screen instructions on the external BT Player.
 For details pairing procedures, please refer to the user's manual of your BT Device.
- 4. When the external BT Device searched the unit, **WMSDVDZ3'** will appear on the display of the external BT Device, select it and make connection.
- 5. After successfully paired and connected, the "BT" on display will stay lit.
- 6. If you want to connect with other BT device, press the PAIR button on remote control or touch the PAIR button on the unit to disconnect the current pairing and connection, then try to pair and connect with other BT device.


During playback:

Press the VOL+/VOL- buttons on the remote control or touch the + or - button on the unit to adjust volume level as desired.

NOTE:

After pairing for the first time, the unit will remember and automatically pair with the last connected device when the bluetooth of the device and the unit are activated within range.


ADDING OPTIONAL EXTERNAL SUBWOOFER



NOTE: Before connecting, please disconnect power.

- Connect one end of subwoofer connection cable (not supplied) to the "+" Jack on the rear
 of the unit as the figure above.
- 2. Connect the other end to the "-" Jack on the rear of the unit as the figure above.
- 3. Power ON the unit.
- 4. Play the music as usual and set the desired volume.


CONNECT USING OPTICAL



NOTE: Before connecting, please disconnect power.

- 1. Connect one end of optical connection cable (not supplied) to the OPTICAL IN jack on the rear of the unit as pictured above.
- 2. Connect the other end to the OPTICAL OUT jack on TV etc.
- 3. Power ON the unit.
- 4. Press the ∃ button on remote control or touch the ∃ button on unit repeatedly until "OPTICAL" appears on display.
- 5. Set the desired volume.


CONNECT TO TV (ANALOG)



NOTE: Before connecting, please disconnect power.

- 1. Connect as the figure above.
- 2. Power ON the unit.
- 3. Press the ⋽ button on remote control or touch the ⋽ button on unit repeatedly until "TV" appears on display. TV audio is selected and will play through the unit.
- 4. Play the audio or video as usual and set the desired volume.

CONNECT USING HDMI




NOTE: Before connecting, please disconnect power.

- 1. Connect as the figure above.(TV 2, TV 3 are optional to connect)
- 2. Power ON the unit.
- 3. Press the ∃ button on remote control or touch the ∃ button on unit repeatedly until " DVD HDMI " appears on display.
- 4. Play the audio or video through DVD player as usual and set to the desired volume.
- 5. When playback through the MAIN TV by HDMI, only " HDMI " will appear on display, press the ARC (Audio Return Channel) button on remote control to transmit the audio from the MAIN TV to the unit and play through the unit, "ArC" will appear on display. Press the ARC button again to resume normal playback.

NOTE:

- The TV must have the ARC capability, and HDMI connected to HDMI ARC jack on capable TV.
- No matter which mode the unit is in, press the ARC button on remote control to switch back to ARC mode.

AUX IN: LISTEN TO EXTERNAL AUDIO DEVICES




- Jack on the external audio device
- Connect one end of audio connection cable to the AUX IN jack on the front of the unit as illustrated above.
- 2. Connect the other end to the Audio out/Line out/Phone jack on the external player (such as iPod, iPhone, iPad, MP3 player, smart phone... etc.)
- 3. Power ON the unit.
- 4. Press the ∃ button on remote control or touch the ∃ button on unit repeatedly until " AUX " appears on display.
- 5. Play the music in the external player as usual and set the desired volume.

USB: LISTEN TO EXTERNAL AUDIO DEVICES

- 1. Insert the USB device.
- 2. Power ON the unit.
- 3. Press the ∃ button on remote control or touch the ∃ button on unit repeatedly until " USB " appears on display.
- 4. Play the music in the external player as usual and set the desired volume.

NOTE:

The USB port can also be used for charging the external device.



DVD: PLAYBACK THROUGH DVD PLAYER

- 1. Power ON the unit.
- 2. Press the ∃ button on remote control or touch the ∃ button on unit repeatedly until " DVD " appears on display, or press the △ button on the unit or remote control directly to enter DVD mode.
- "OPEN" will display, insert the disc into the disc compartment with label side facing up, "LOAD" will appears on display, the unit will begin playback automatically after a few seconds.
- 3. During playback:
 - ~ Press the ▶ or ◄ Button on the Remote Control repeatedly to fast search for a specific section forward/backward. Press the Play ▶II Button to resume normal playback.
 - ~ Press the ▶Nor ◄ Buttons repeatedly to skip to specific chapter or track.
 - ~ Press the 0-10+ Button to select the certain chapter or track to playback.
 - ~ Press the TITLE Button on remote control to enter title playback.
 - ~ Press the MENU Button on remote control to enter menu.
 - ~ Press the ►II Button to pause, press the ►II Button again to resume normal playback.
 - ~ Press the STOP Button to pre-stop, the player will remember the point where disc was stopped, When press the Play/Pause ►I Button again, playback will start from this point.

 Press the STOP Button twice to stop completely, press the Play/Pause ►I Button to start playback from beginning,

4. Repeat playback:

DVD Disc repeat playback:

- Press the REP. Button once, "REP: [CHAPTER]" will appear on the connected TV. The current chapter will playback repeatedly and continuously.
- Press the REP. Button twice; "REP: [TITLE]" will appear on connected TV. The current Title will
 playback repeatedly and continuously.
- Press the REP. Button the three times; "REP: [REP ALL]" will appear on connected TV. All files
 on the current disc will playback repeatedly and continuously.
- To cancel repeat function, press the REP. Button repeatedly until "REP: [OFF]" appears.

CD disc repeat playback:

- Press the REP. Button once; "REP: [REP 1]" will appear on connected TV. The current track will playback repeatedly and continuously.
- Press the REPEAT Button twice; "REP: [REP ALL]" will appear on connected TV. All files on the current disc will playback repeatedly and continuously.
- •To cancel repeat function, press the REP. Button repeatedly until "REP: [OFF]" appears.

5. GOTO:

- In DVD playback mode, press the GOTO Button once.
 The TT (Title), CH (Chapter) and establish time selection menu will pop up on the screen. Using the direction & numeric Buttons to select the desired title, chapter or time then press the ►II Button to start to play from the selected Title, Chapter or established time.
- In CD playback mode, press the GOTO Button once. The TRK (Track) and establish time (for selected track) selection menu will pop up on the screen. Using the direction & numeric Buttons to select the track or establish time (for selected track) then press the ►II Button to start to play from the selected track or established time.

6. DVD/CD Program playback:

 During playback, press the PROG (Program) Button, the follows menu will appear on the connected TV.



- Using the Direction, Numeric Buttons to select and set the desired T (Title); C (Charter) or track you want to program. Repeat the same procedures until all the specific files were programmed.
 (During setting, using the Direction Buttons to selected and highlighted the "CLEAR" Button on the screen then press the
 Button to erase the settings.)
- Using the Direction Button to selected and highlighted the "PLAY" Button on the screen then
 press the ►II Button to start program playback.

SYSTEM SETUP

GENERAL SETUP

Press the SETUP Button once. The SYSTEM SETUP menu will appear on the connected TV.



Press the Direction ▶ Buttons to enter to the menu then press the Direction ▲ or ▼ Buttons to select and highlight the function you need to set or reset:

- If TV SYSTEM is selected, using the Direction and ►II Buttons to set to PAL, AUTO or NTSC. (Note: The TV system in US, Canada and Mexico is NTSC).
- 2. If SCREEN SAVER is selected, using the Direction and ►II Buttons to set it to On or Off.

 If set to On, the screen saver will come on when the unit stops or the image is paused for approximately five (5) minutes.
- 3. If RESOLUTION is selected, using the Direction and >II Buttons to set the HDMI relution.
- If TV TYPE is selected, using the Direction and ▶I Buttons to set the aspect ratio to match the playing movie.
- 5. If PASSWORD is selected:
- To release the lock and set/reset the rating level:

When PASSWORD is selected and highlighted, press the ►II Button to enter. " ---- on the screen will be highlighted, enter the default password "0000" by press the numeric buttons then press the ►II Button to unlock. "---- " will appearing. Then press the Direction ▼ Button to highlight RATING on the screen to set or reset the rating level.

• To set or reset new password and rating level:

When PASSWORD is selected and highlighted, press the ►II Button to enter. " ---- □ " on the screen will be highlighted, enter the default password "0000" by press the numeric buttons then press the ►II Button to unlock. "---- " will appearing.

Using the direction ▶ Button to highlight the "____ in on screen again. Enter the new four (4) digit password by press the numeric buttons then press the ▶I Button to save the settings and exit. Press the Direction ▼ Button to highlight RATING on the screen to set or reset the rating level.

- If RATING is selected after unlock, using the Direction and ►II Buttons to change the rating level as follows.
 - Press the ▲ or ▼ Buttons to select the desired level as the list below.
 - Press the ►II Button to confirm the selection.
 - ~ Rate levels:

1. KID SAFE: Kid safe 2. G: All ages

3. PG: Parental Guidance

4. PG 13: Parental Guidance less than 13 years old

5. PG-R: Under 17 years old, Parental Guidance suggested 6. R: Under 17 years old, Parental Guidance strongly

7. NC-17: 17 years old or above

8. Adult: Adult only

7. If DEFAULT is selected, using the Direction and >I Buttons to reset to factory settings or press the SETUP or Exit Button on remote control to exit without changes.

LANGUAGE SETUP

- If OSD LANGUAGE (On Screen Display Language) is selected, using the Direction and ►II
 Buttons to set the priority of the available language. (Function depends on the recording of the disc.)
- 2. If AUDIO LANG (Audio Language) is selected, using the Direction and ►II Buttons to set the priority of the available language.
- 3. If SUBTITLE LANG (Subtitle Language) is selected, using the Direction and ►II Buttons to set the priority of the available language or set it off.
- 4. If MENU LANG (Menu Language) is selected, using the Direction and ►II Buttons to set the priority of the available language of the on screen menu.

HDMI AUDIO SETUP

If HDMI AUDIO is selected, using the Direction and II Buttons to set it to AUTO or PCM format.

VIDEO SETUP

Using the Direction and **|** buttons to set or reset the Brightness; Contrast; Hue; Saturation or Sharpness of the video output picture as desired.

AUDIO SETUP

If DOWNMIX is selected, using the Direction and ►II Buttons to set it to LT/RT or Stereo.

- ~ If set to LT/RT, the rear left or rear right channels in Dolby 5.1 recording DVD disc will play on both Left and Right Speakers.
- ~ If set to Stereo, the rear left channel will play on Left Speaker; the rear right channel will play on Right Speaker.



DISC MAINTENANCE

Caring for Discs

Treat the disc carefully. Handle the disc only by its edges.

Never allow your fingers to contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the disc.



- Do not attach adhesive tape, stickers, etc. to the disc label.
- Clean the disc periodically with a soft, lint-free,dry cloth, Never use detergents or abrasive cleaners to clean the disc. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.
- If a disc skips or gets stuck on a section of the disc, it is probably dirty or damaged(scratched).
- When cleaning the disc, wipe in straight lines from the center of the disc to the outer edge of the disc. Never wipe in circular motions.



- Discs should be stored in their cases after each use to avoid damage.
- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high temperatures or dust, etc. Prolonged exposure or extreme temperatures can warp the disc.
- Do not stick or write anything on either side of the disc. Sharp writing Instruments, or the ink, may damage the surface.

Cleaning the Unit

- To prevent fire or shock hazard, disconnect your unit from the AC power source when cleaning.
- The finish on your unit may be cleaned with a dust cloth and cared for as other furniture. Use caution when cleaning and wiping the plastic parts.
- Mild soap and a damp cloth may be used on the front panel.
