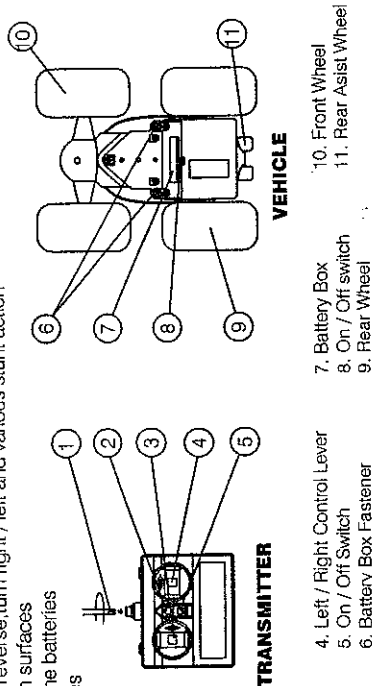

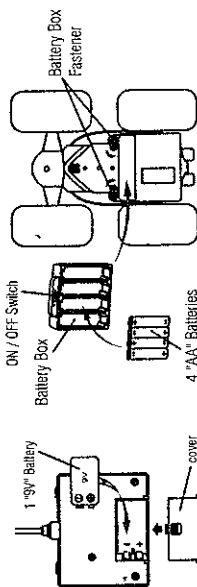

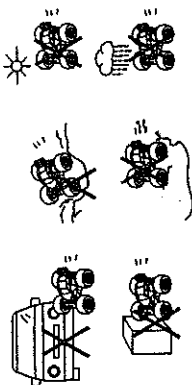
INSTALLING BATTERIES

1. Open the battery case of the transmitter, and install 1 "9V" battery into it, then close the case cover.
 2. Turn away the battery box fasteners, and take the battery box out of the vehicle.
 3. Install 4 "AA" batteries into the box, making sure the [-] and [+] poles of the battery are positioned properly.
 4. Insert the battery box back into the vehicle, and fasten the box by turning the fasteners.
- (Batteries are not included)



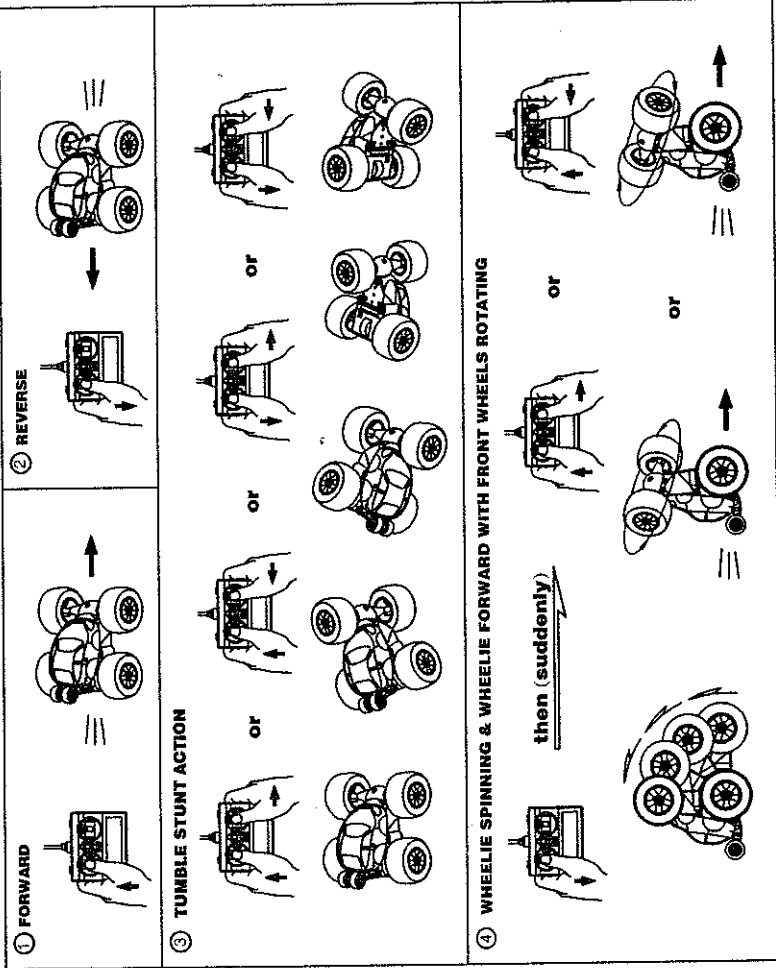

OPERATION

1. Extend the transmitter antenna to its full length.
2. Turn "on" the vehicle and transmitter.
3. Drive the car by operating the sticks of the transmitter.

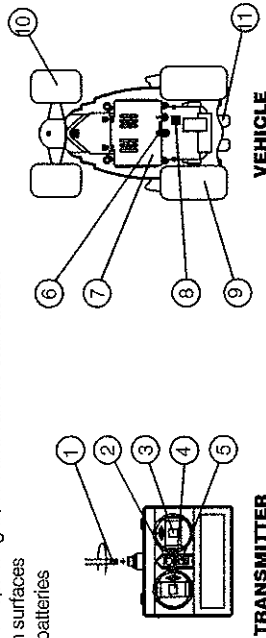
