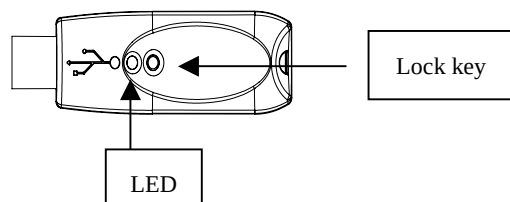

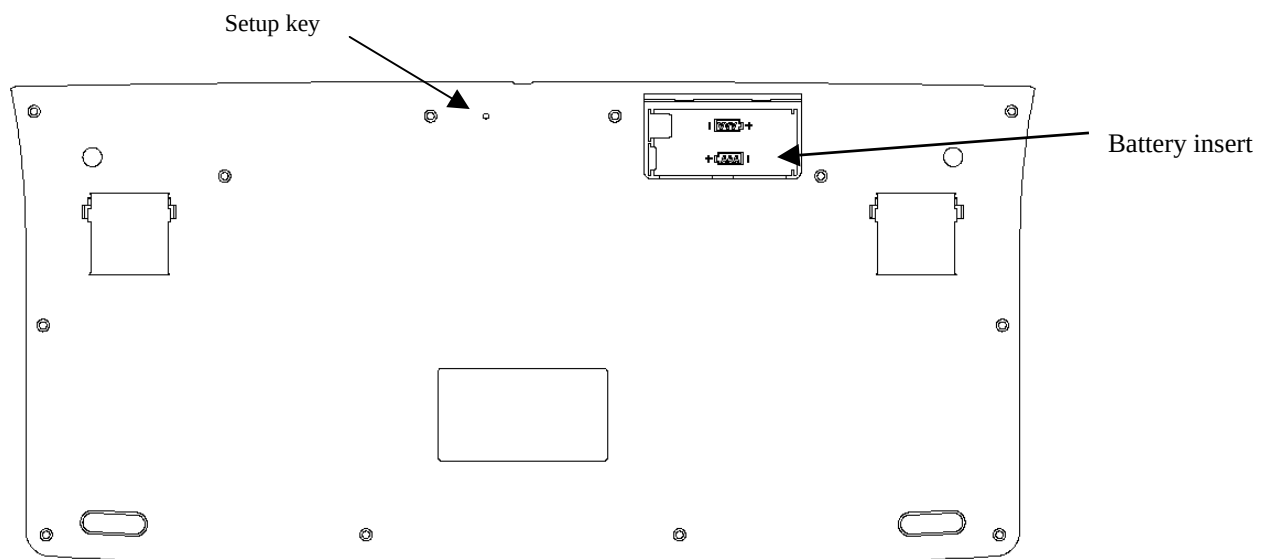

Hardware Installation

1. Plug USB receiver to USB female port of the Notebook PC or PC. The “Lock LED” light turns on.



2. Insert two AAA alkaline batteries to GKM-700; please ensure they are in the right direction.



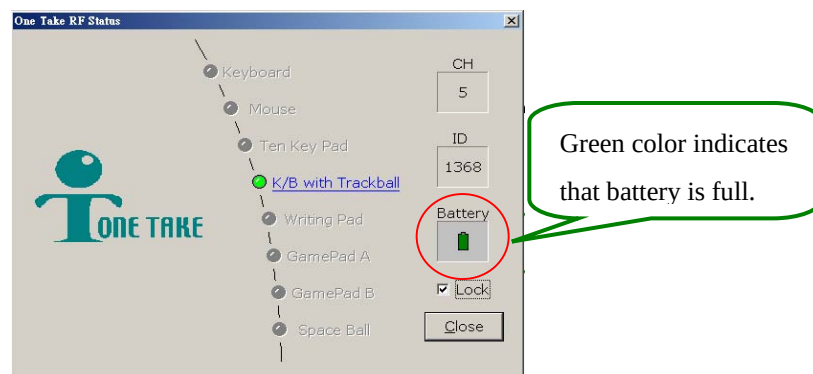
3. Press the “Setup” key on the receiver once, the LED lamp goes off.
4. Press the “Setup” key on the GKM-700 once, the LED of receiver will light on to indicate that the setup has been completed, and the GKM-700 is working now.

Software Installation

- Insert the attached CD driver in your CD-Rom driver. Execute the “setup.exe” to complete the installation. After installation, please re-start your PC.
- A radar icon will be added to the Windows task bar, when the radar icon is green it indicates that the battery is full, otherwise it becomes red to indicate low battery. The icon reminds the user to have new batteries prepared for replacement when the currently used batteries are about to drop out. Immediate replacement of batteries is not necessary and you can continue using the current batteries until the GKM-700 stops working.

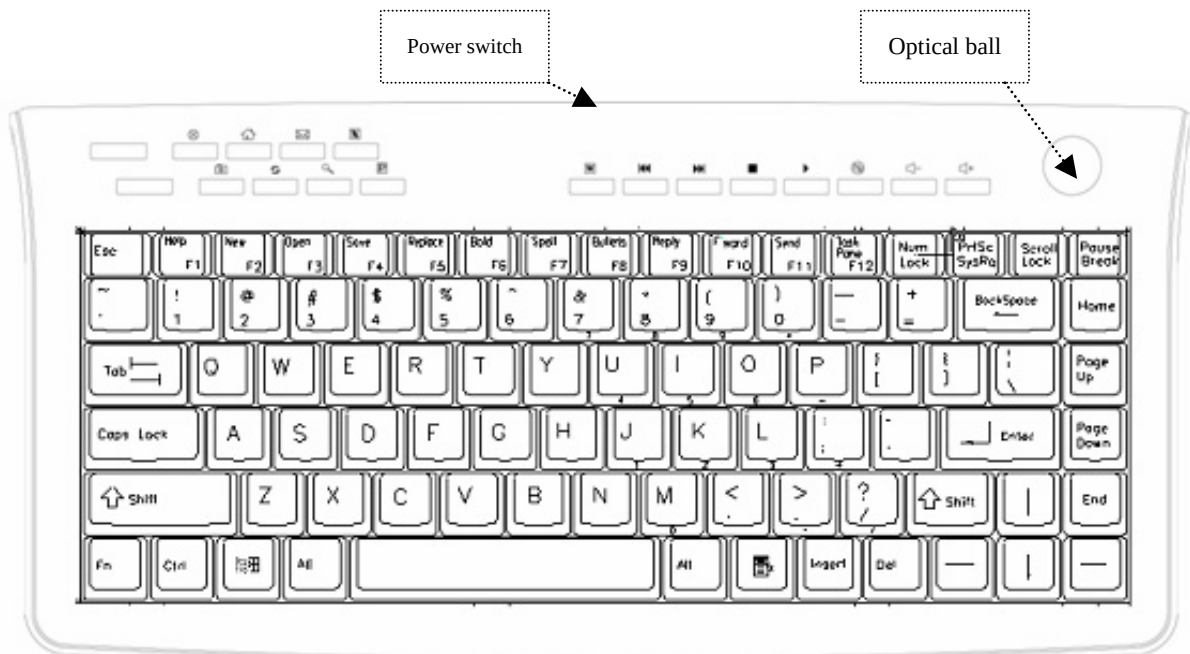
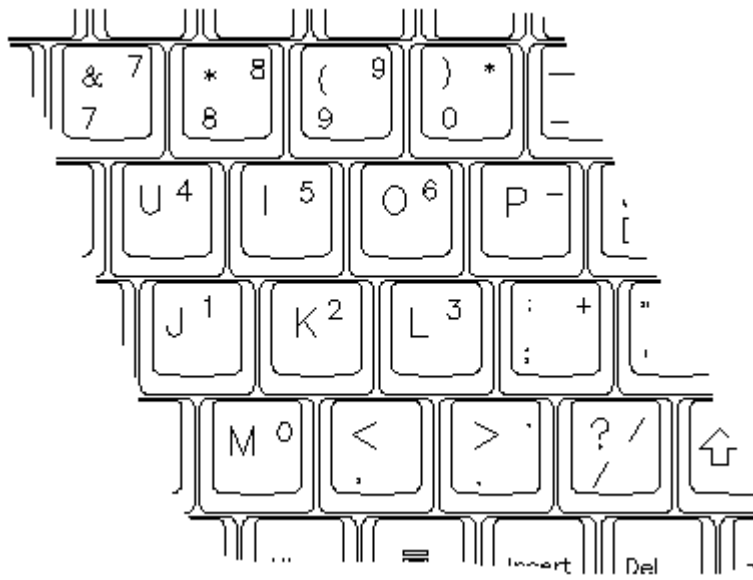


- Clicking twice the left button on the radar icon will enter into the mouse control interface.



How to use

- Put GKM-700 in your tabletop, the optical ball is used for moving screen cursor that it is replacing mouse.
- There are 16 keys for hot key which are using in Office, Internet and Multimedia.
- Two keys of upper left corner express for mouse of left key and right key.
- Power switch for saving power.
- While the NumLock is on, they are numeric symbol.
- While the NumLock is off (press the NumLock key once), they are change to character symbol.
