According to the KDB 447498 V07: The Maximum peak radiated emission for the EUT is 94.0 dBµV/m at 3m in the frequency 2402MHz The EIRP = [(FS*D) ^2 / 30] mW = -1.23dBm which is within the production variation.

The Minimum peak radiated emission for the EUT is 93.2 dB μ V/m at 3m in the frequency 2440MHz The EIRP = [(FS*D) ^2 / 30] mW = -2.03dBm which is within the production variation.

The maximum conducted output power specified is	2.36dBm=	1.722mW

Since max. conducted output power and effective radiated power (ERP) is well below the SAR low threshold level, so the EUT is considered to comply with SAR requirement without testing.

Note: EIRP is higher than ERP, thus EIRP is compared with the Exclusion Threshold.
