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1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Scope

Measurement and determination of electromagnetic emissions (EMC) of radio frequency devices including intentional and/or unintentional radiators for compliance with the technical rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission and the Industry Canada Certification and Engineering Bureau.

1.2 PCTEST Test Location

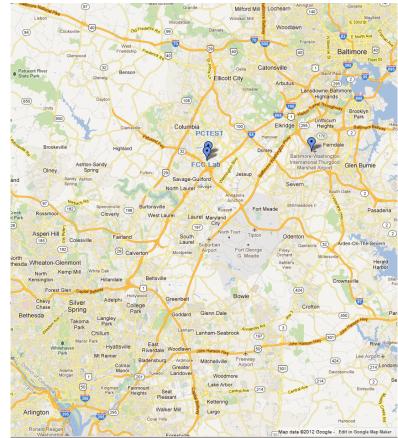


Figure 1-1. Map of the Greater Baltimore and Metropolitan Washington, D.C. area

The map below shows the location of the PCTEST LABORATORY, its proximity to the FCC Laboratory, the Columbia vicinity, the Baltimore-Washington Internt'I (BWI) airport, the city of Baltimore and the Washington, DC area. (See **Figure 1-1**).

These measurement tests were conducted at the PCTEST Engineering Laboratory, Inc. facility located at 7185 Oakland Mills Road, Columbia, MD 21046. The site coordinates are 39° 10'23" N latitude and 76° 49'50" W longitude. The facility is 0.4 miles North of the FCC laboratory, and the ambient signal and ambient signal strength are approximately equal to those of the FCC laboratory. The detailed description of the measurement facility was found to be in compliance with the requirements of § 2.948 according to ANSI C63.4-2009 on February 15, 2012.

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2.0 PRODUCT INFORMATION

2.1 Equipment Description

The Equipment Under Test (EUT) is the **Device Solutions Electronic Cigaratte FCC ID: OXW-CA0006**. The test data contained in this report pertains only to the emissions due to the EUT's BTLE transmitter.

2.2 Device Capabilities

This device contains the following capabilities:

2.3 Test Configuration

The Device Solutions Electronic Cigaratte FCC ID: OXW-CA0006 was tested per the guidance of ANSI C63.10-2009. ANSI C63.10-2009 was used to reference the appropriate EUT setup for radiated spurious emissions testing and AC line conducted testing. See Sections 3.2 for AC line conducted emissions test setups, 3.3 for radiated emissions test setups, and 6.2 for antenna port conducted emissions test setups.

2.4 EMI Suppression Device(s)/Modifications

No EMI suppression device(s) were added and no modifications were made during testing.

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3.0 DESCRIPTION OF TEST

3.1 Evaluation Procedure

The measurement procedure described in the American National Standard for Testing Unlicensed Wireless Devices (ANSI C63.10-2009) was used in the measurement of the **Device Solutions Electronic Cigaratte FCC ID: OXW-CA0006.**

3.2 AC Line Conducted Emissions

The line-conducted facility is located inside a 10'x16'x9' shielded enclosure. The shielded enclosure is manufactured by ETS Lindgren RF Enclosures. The shielding effectiveness of the shielded room is in accordance with MIL-Std-285 or NSA 65-5. A 1m x 1.5m wooden table 80cm high is placed 40cm away from the vertical wall and 80cm away from the sidewall of the shielded room. Two 10kHz-30MHz, $50\Omega/50\mu$ H Line-Impedance Stabilization Networks (LISNs) are bonded to the shielded room floor. Power to the LISNs is filtered by external high-current high-insertion loss power line filters. The external power line filter is an ETS Lindgren Model LPRX-4X30 (100dB Attenuation, 14kHz-18GHz) and the two EMI/RFI filters are ETS Lindgren Model LRW-2030-S1 (100dB Minimum Insertion Loss, 14kHz – 10GHz). These filters attenuate ambient signal noise from entering the measurement lines. These filters are also bonded to the shielded enclosure.

The EUT is powered from one LISN and the support equipment is powered from the second LISN. If the EUT is a DC-powered device, power will be derived from the source power supply it normally will be powered from and this supply line(s) will be connected to the second LISN. All interconnecting cables more than 1 meter were shortened to a 1 meter length by non-inductive bundling (serpentine fashion) and draped over the back edge of the test table. All cables were at least 40cm above the horizontal reference groundplane. Power cables for support equipment were routed down to the second LISN while ensuring that that cables were not draped over the second LISN.

Sufficient time for the EUT, support equipment, and test equipment was allowed in order for them to warm up to their normal operating condition. The RF output of the LISN was connected to the spectrum analyzer and exploratory measurements were made to determine the frequencies producing the maximum emission from the EUT. The spectrum was scanned from 150kHz to 30MHz with a spectrum analyzer. The detector function was set to peak mode for exploratory measurements while the bandwidth of the analyzer was set to 10kHz. The EUT, support equipment, and interconnecting cables were arranged and manipulated to maximize each emission. Each emission was also maximized by varying: power lines, the mode of operation or resolution, clock or data exchange speed, scrolling H pattern to the EUT and/or support equipment whichever determined the worst-case emission. Once the worst case emissions have been identified, the one EUT cable configuration/arrangement and mode of operation that produced these emissions is used for final measurements on the same test site. The analyzer is set to CISPR quasi-peak and average detectors with a 9kHz resolution bandwidth for final measurements.

Line conducted emissions test results are shown in Section 6.7. The EMI Receiver mode of the Agilent MXE was used to perform AC line conducted emissions testing.

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3.3 Radiated Emissions

The radiated test facilities consisted of an indoor 3 meter semi-anechoic chamber used for final measurements and exploratory measurements, when necessary. The measurement area is contained within the semi-anechoic chamber which is shielded from any ambient interference. The test site inside the chamber is a 6m x 5.2m elliptical, obstruction-free area in accordance with Clause 5, Figure 5.7 of ANSI C63.4-2009. For measurements above 1GHz absorbers are arranged on the floor between the turn table and the antenna mast in such a way so as to maximize the reduction of reflections. For measurements below 1GHz, the absorbers are removed. An ETS Lindgren Model 2188 raised turntable is used for radiated measurement. It is a continuously rotatable, remote-controlled, metallic turntable and 2 meters (6.56 ft.) in diameter. The turn table is flush with the raised floor of the chamber in order to maintain its function as a ground plane. A 78cm high PVC support structure is placed on top of the turntable. A $\frac{3}{4}$ " (~1.9cm) sheet of high density polyethylene is used as the table top and is placed on top of the PVC supports to bring the total height of the table to 80cm.

For all measurements, the spectrum was scanned through all EUT azimuths and from 1 to 4 meter receive antenna height using a broadband antenna from 30MHz up to the upper frequency shown in 15.33(b)(1) depending on the highest frequency generated or used in the device or on which the device operates or tunes. For frequencies above 1GHz, linearly polarized double ridge horn antennas were used. For frequencies below 30MHz, a calibrated loop antenna was used. When exploratory measurements were necessary, they were performed at 1 meter test distance inside the semi-anechoic chamber using broadband antennas, broadband amplifiers, and spectrum analyzers to determine the frequencies and modes producing the maximum emissions. Sufficient time for the EUT, support equipment, and test equipment was allowed in order for them to warm up to their normal operating condition. The test set-up was placed on top of the 0.8 meter high, 1 x 1.5 meter table. The EUT, support equipment, and interconnecting cables were arranged and manipulated to maximize each emission. Appropriate precaution was taken to ensure that all emissions from the EUT were maximized and investigated. The system configuration, clock speed, mode of operation or video resolution, if applicable, turntable azimuth, and receive antenna height was noted for each frequency found.

Final measurements were made in the semi-anechoic chamber using calibrated, linearly polarized broadband and horn antennas. The test setup was configured to the setup that produced the worst case emissions. The spectrum analyzer was set to investigate all frequencies required for testing to compare the highest radiated disturbances with respect to the specified limits. The turntable containing the EUT was rotated through 360 degrees and the height of the receive antenna was varied 1 to 4 meters and stopped at the azimuth and height producing the maximum emission. Each emission was maximized by changing the orientation of the EUT through three orthogonal planes and changing the polarity of the receive antenna, whichever produced the worst-case emissions.

3.4 Environmental Conditions

The temperature is controlled within range of 15° C to 35° C. The relative humidity is controlled within range of 10% to 75%. The atmospheric pressure is monitored within the range 86-106kPa (860-1060mbar).

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4.0 ANTENNA REQUIREMENTS

Excerpt from §15.203 of the FCC Rules/Regulations:

"An intentional radiator antenna shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party can be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this section."

- The antennas of the Device Solutions Electronic Cigaratte are permanently attached.
- There are no provisions for connection to an external antenna.

Conclusion:

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6.2 Occupied Bandwidth Measurement §2.1049

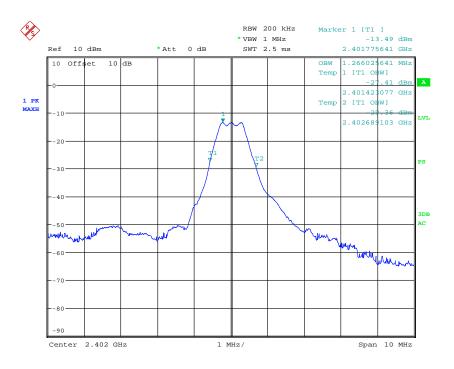
The occupied bandwidth, that is the frequency bandwidth such that, below its lower and above its upper frequency limits, the mean powers radiated are each equal to 0.5 percent of the total mean power radiated by a given emission shall be measured. The spectrum analyzers' "occupied bandwidth" measurement function was used to record the occupied bandwidth.

Plot 6-1. Occupied Bandwidth Plot (BTLE - Ch. 39)

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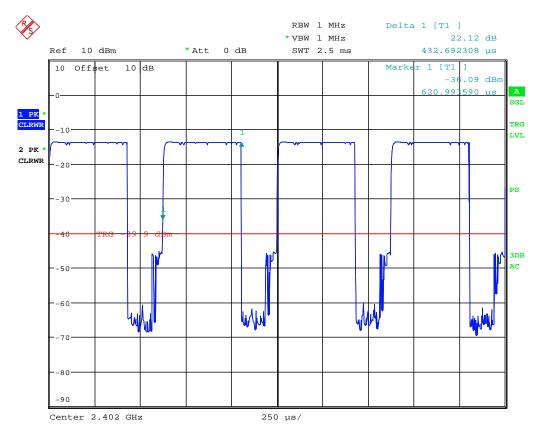

6.3 **Duty Cycle Calculation** §15.35(c)

Per FCC Part 15.35(c), an average radiated field strength can be determined by applying a duty cycle correction factor to a measured peak radiated field strength level. The duty cycle correction factor is determined based on the worst case operation over a 100ms time period on any given channel. Two plots are included below to determine the appropriate duty cycle correction factor.

In Plot 6-2 below, it is shown that the pulse width for one transmission burst of the BTLE transmitter while operating in non-hopping mode is 432.7 µs.

Plot 6-2. Pulse Width Measurement

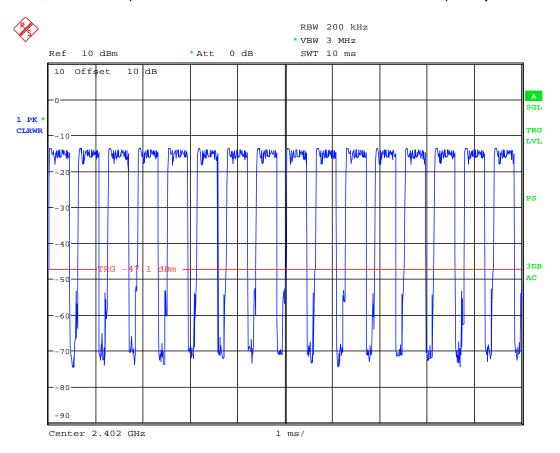
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Duty Cycle Calculation §15.35(c)

In Plot 6-3 below, a video trigger is used to determine the maximum number of times the transmitter operates at maximum power over a 10ms period. A 100ms sweep did not result in a clear indication of number of bursts therefore, a 10ms sweep was used and the number of bursts found was multiplied by 10.

Since it is determined that the transmitter burst appears a maximum of 16 times over a 10ms window(160 times over a 100ms window) with a pulse width of 432.7μ s, then the appropriate duty cycle correction factor is determined from the following formula, based on 15.35(c):

DCCF = $20\log_{10}$ (number of hits x (worst case 100ms operation / 100ms)) = $20\log_{10}$ (160 x (0.4327ms/100ms)) = -3.19dB

DCCF = -3.19dB

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6.4 Fundamental Field Strength Level Measurement §15.249(a)(e)

Measurement is made while the EUT is operating in non-hopping transmission mode. The field strengths shown below were measured using a spectrum analyzer. Peak field strength measurements are performed in the analyzers' swept spectrum mode using a peak detector with RBW = 3MHz and $VBW \ge RBW$. Average field strength data is determined by applying the duty cycle correction factor (DCCF) found in Section 6.3 to the measured peak field strength values.

The maximum permissible average field strength level is 50mV/m (93.98dB μ V/m). The maximum permissible peak field strength level is 500mV/m (113.98 dB μ V/m).

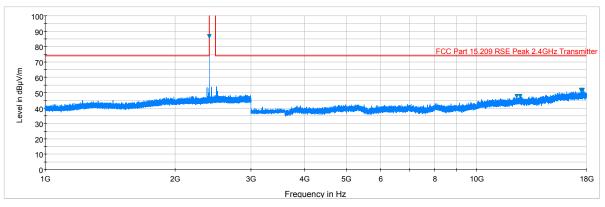

- The spectrum is measured from 9kHz to the 10th harmonic and the worst-case emissions are reported. There were no non-harmonic emissions detected whose levels were within 20dB of the applicable limits so only harmonic emissions data is shown in this section.
- All emissions lying in restricted bands specified in §15.205 are below the limit shown in Table 6-4. Per 15.249(d), the radiated emissions limits from 15.209 were used since they were less than the limit of 50dB of attenuation from the measured fundamental field strength level.
- 3. Peak measurements > 1GHz using RBW = 1MHz and VBW = 3MHz.
- 4. The antenna is manipulated through typical positions, polarity and length during the tests. The EUT is manipulated through two orthogonal planes.
- 5. This unit was tested with its standard battery.

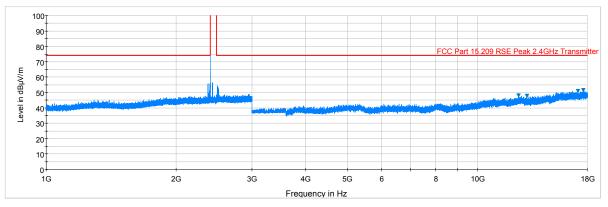

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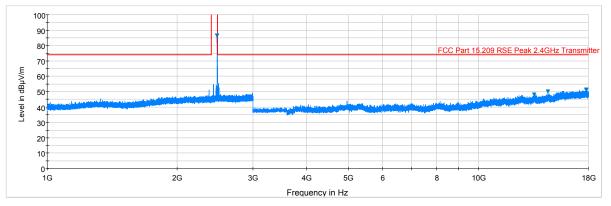

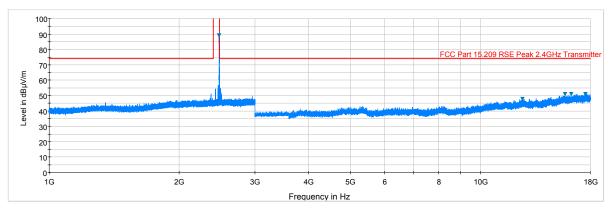
Plot 6-5. Radiated Spurious Plot above 1GHz (BTLE – Ch. 0, Ant. Pol. V)



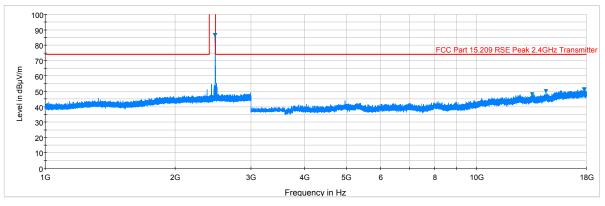
Plot 6-6. Radiated Spurious Plot above 1GHz (BTLE – Ch. 19, Ant. Pol. H)

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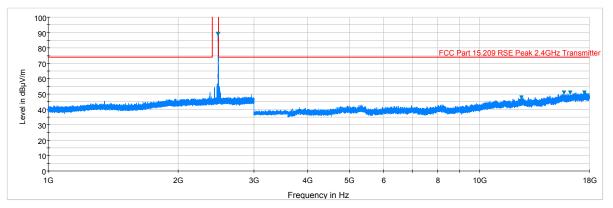




Plot 6-7. Radiated Spurious Plot above 1GHz (BTLE – Ch. 19, Ant. Pol. V)



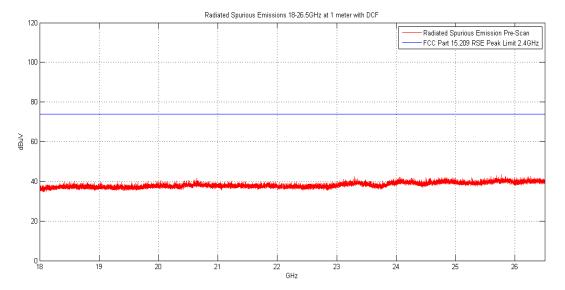
Plot 6-8. Radiated Spurious Plot above 1GHz (BTLE - Ch. 39, Ant. Pol. H)



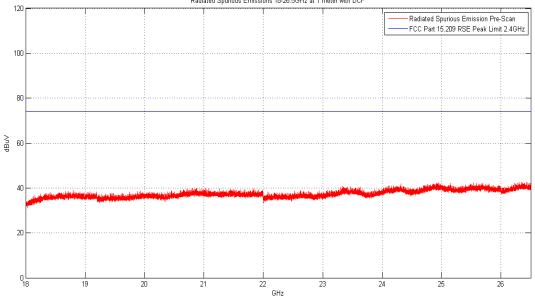
Plot 6-9. Radiated Spurious Plot above 1GHz (BTLE – Ch. 39, Ant. Pol. V)

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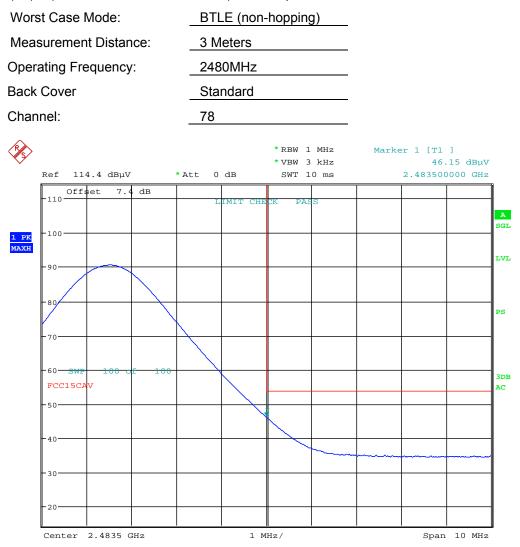

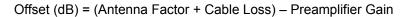
Plot 6-12. Radiated Restricted Upper Band Edge Measurement (Average)

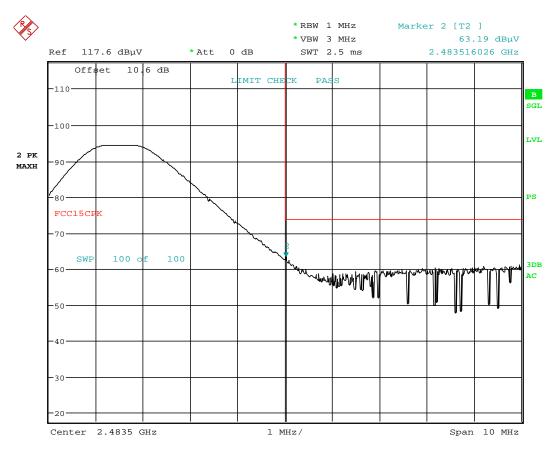

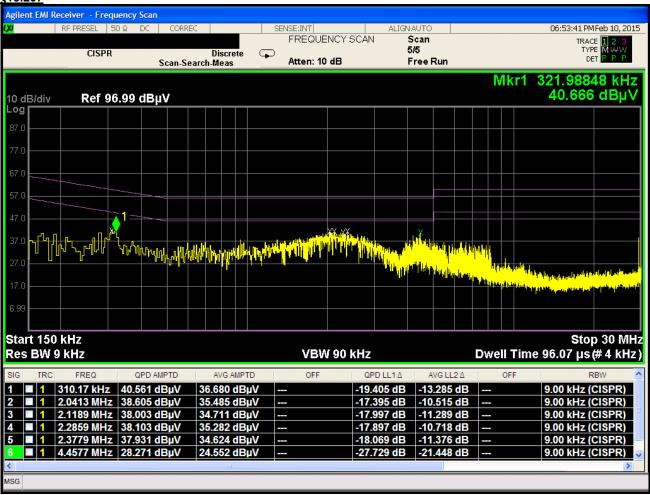

Plot 6-14. Line-Conducted Test Plot (L1)

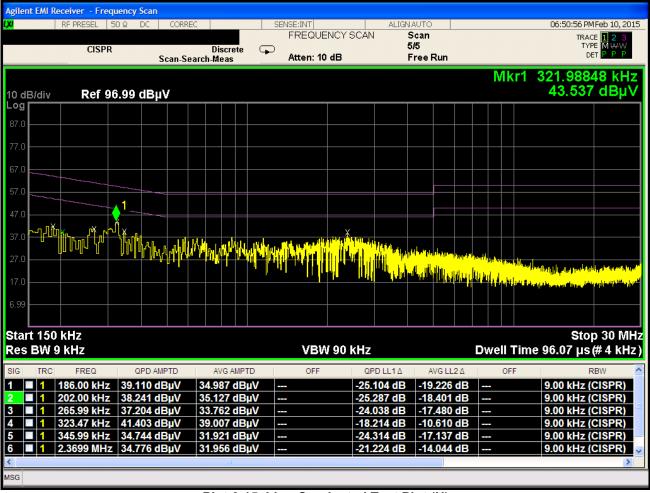
