Remote-controller's battery installation

- 1) Release the cover of battery box
- 2) Install 9V battery into battery compartment according to the right poles
- 3) Close the cover of the battery box

Car battery installation

- 1) Unlock the battery cover of the battery compartment which is back of the car;
- 2) Install four 1.5V AA Size batteries into battery compartment according to the right poles;
- 3) Close the cover of the battery compartment;
- 4) Lock the battery cover.

Use instruction

- 1) Turn the power switch of car-body to "ON" position;
- 2) When the user control the control stick, the LED light will be turn on; When the light is turning dimmer, the batteries are to be replaced;
- 3) Operate the handle of the controller, the car can move Forward and Backward clockwise.
After play, turn the power switches of car-body to "OFF" position.

Note:
