

The device has a standalone transmission.

According to KDB 447498 section 4.3.1, the 1-g SAR test exclusion thresholds at test separation distances ≤ 50 mm are determined by:

$$\left[\frac{\text{(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW)}}{\text{(min. test separation distance, mm)}} \right] \cdot \sqrt{f(\text{GHz})} \leq 3.0$$

The maximum tune-up limit power is 7.64dBm(5.81mW) @ 2.437GHz

For the head and body SAR, use 5mm as the conservative minimum test separation distance,

$$\left[\frac{\text{(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW)}}{\text{(min. test separation distance, mm)}} \right] \cdot \sqrt{f(\text{GHz})} = 1.81 \leq 3.0$$

So standalone SAR measurements are not required for both head and body.
