

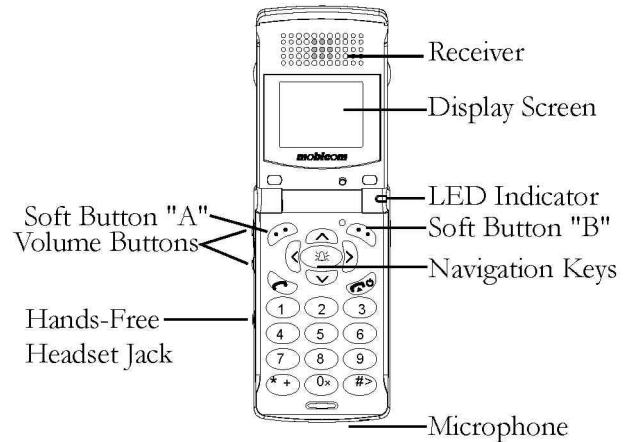

Safe use of your new phone

Please observe the following guidelines for safe and responsible operation of your cellular phone



Follow all guidelines for safe and legal use of your phone. See detailed information in this manual.



Use caution while placing or receiving calls while driving. You should try to find a safe place to pull over and stop driving before placing or receiving a phone call while driving. The use of a hands free headset is required for cell phone use while driving in some areas.



Keep your phone switched off near blasting areas where explosives are being detonated. Always observe local rules and regulations that may restrict or prohibit phone use in some areas.



When in hospitals or near medical equipment local rules and regulations may require that your phone be switched off.



FCC regulations require that your phone be switched off while on airplanes. Wireless phones could cause interference with the airplanes equipment or air traffic control signals.



Keep your phone switched off while refueling. Do not use your phone while near fuel or flammable chemicals.



Avoid contact with your phones antenna while the phone is in use.



All wireless phones, including this one may receive interference from other sources, which may affect the phones performance.

Installing your SIM Card

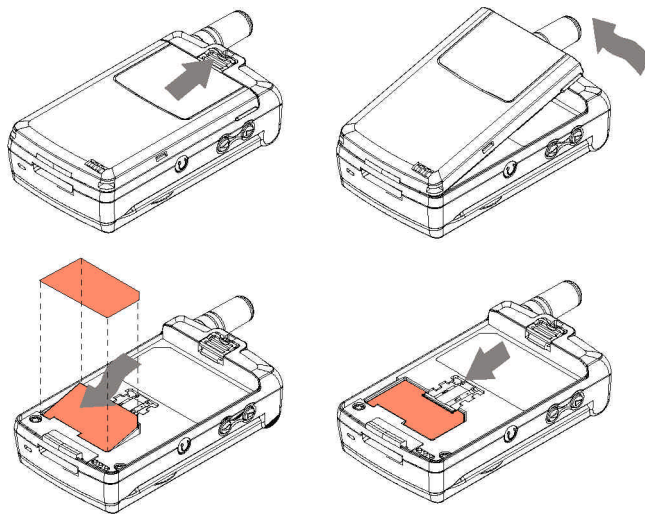
Depending upon how you purchased your Mobicom phone, it may or may not have come with a SIM card already installed. The SIM card acts as the heart of the phone, providing the ability to store both your phone's own number as well as those numbers that you frequently dial.

If the SIM card is not installed, please follow these instructions::

1. Remove the battery from the back of the phone.
2. Slide the SIM card into the slot, with the electrical contacts facing inward.
3. Move the latch downward to hold the SIM card in place.
4. Put the battery back into position.

Warning: The SIM card is a delicate piece of precision electronic hardware; care should be taken while handling it to prevent damage. Avoid excessive or unnecessary handling of the SIM card. Never touch the golden electrical contacts on the SIM card with fingers or other objects. Never bend the SIM card. Never force the SIM card into its connector; when properly aligned the card should slide in effortlessly

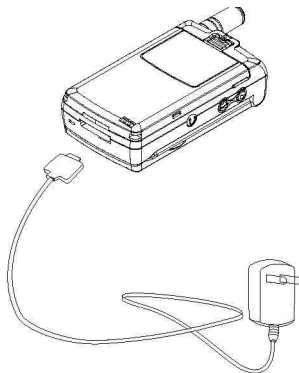


Charging your phone's battery

To ensure proper operation, your new phone's battery should be fully charged prior to its first use. Charge the battery by using the enclosed MobiCom AC wall charger or the MobiCom mobile charger. It may take up to three hours to fully charge your phone's battery.

Gently align and insert the charger into the phone by pressing the release buttons on the side of the charger... place the , until you hear it click into place.

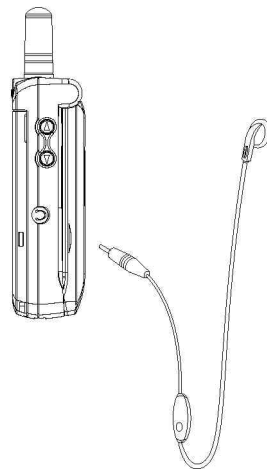

Turn phone on

To Turn your phone on, press and hold down the (red phone key) key for a few seconds. To Turn off your phone, follow the same procedure.

Welcome Screen

The welcome screen appears when you open your phone and turn it on, as well as when your phone is in a latent state when you are not accessing functions and features.

Menu:

Scrolling through the menu:

To access your phone's menu, press the MENU key at the welcome screen. Use the left, right, up and down scroll keys to access from the various menu and sub-menu items.

Making and Recieving Phone Calls

Dial By Number

Using the phone's key pad, enter the number you wish to call. When you have finished entering the phone number, press the (green phone) key to place the call.

If you want to dial a number that is already stored in your Phone Book (see Storing Phone Numbers, pg. xxx) use the scroll up and down keys to locate the phone book entry you wish to dial. Press the (green phone) key to place the call.

Dial By Name

Using the scroll keys, highlight the Phone Book icon from the main menu of features. Press the select key. Scroll to the SEARCH NAME function, and press the select key. Using the phone's keypad, enter the name of the contact you wish to call. Press the search key when finished. The name and number will appear on the screen. Press the (green phone) key to place the call.

If you want to dial a name that is already stored in your Phone Book (see Storing Phone Numbers, pg. xxx) use the scroll up and down keys to locate the name of the person you want to call. Press the (green phone) key to place the call.

Receive Calls

There are several ways to answer incoming calls:

Flip Open Answer:

This allows you to answer a phone call simply by flipping open the phone. To enable this function, scroll to the FLIP OPEN ANS function and press the select key. To enable the flip open answer function, Press the ON key. To disable the flip open answer function, press the OFF key.

If “flip open answer” has been deactivated (see Call Settings pg XXX) press the XXX key to answer the call.

Any Key Answer

This allows you to answer a phone call simply by pressing any key on the phone. To enable this function, scroll to the ANY KEY ANSW function and press the select key. To enable the any key answer function, Press the ON key. To disable the any key answer function, press the OFF key.

If any key answer has been deactivated (see Call Settings pg XXX) press the xxx key to answer the call.

To specify a combination of ringer and vibration options, scroll to the Ringer/Vib function and press the select key. You will then have the ability to choose from the following choices:

- Silent

Use the scroll down key to move between the various selections. Press the select key to choose an option.

Setting Tone Types

You can set tones for a variety of different functions. To set tones, scroll to the SET TONE function and press the select key.

Setting Key Tones

To set various key tones, scroll to the KEY TONE function and press the select key. You have 3 different key tones to choose from:

- Key Click Tone

Use the scroll down key to move between the various selections. Press the select key to choose an option.

Setting Info Tones:

To set an Info tone, scroll to the INFO TONE function and press the select key. To turn the info tone on, press the ON key. To turn the Info tone off, press the OFF key.

Setting the SMS Rx. Tone

To set a tone to indicate the arrival of a text message, scroll to the SMS Rx. Tone function and press the select key. You will have several different key tones to choose from:

Setting the Serve Tone:

Your phone can be programmed to emit a short beep every minute to help you track how long you have been connected.

o access new or existing messages, scroll to the VOICE MAIL function and press the select key.

Connecting to your voicemail:

To connect to your voice mailbox, scroll to the CONNECT function and press the select key. You are then prompted to enter your Voice Mailbox Number. Once you have entered your voicemailbox number, press the OK key to connect. Press the EXIT key to return to the previous menu.

Use the Up and Down Arrow keys to scroll through the messages

Press the __Exit key to return to the READ (1) Menu

Composing Messages

To write text messages, scroll to the WRITE function and press the select key. Using the keypad on your phone, press the number that corresponds to the letter you wish to display. Press the number once for the first letter, twice for the second letter and three times for the third letter.

If you make an error while writing a message, press the __-Erase key.

When you have completed writing your message and are ready to send it, press the __OK key. This will bring up the SEND TO: screen. Enter the number you wish to send the text message to. Press the OK key when you are finished.

When sending your text message, you will have three options:

To send the message without storing it, scroll to the SEND function and press the select key. You will be advised as to whether the task was Successful or Unsuccessful.

To send and store the message, scroll to the SEND and STORE function and press the select key. You will be advised as to whether the task was Successful or Unsuccessful.

To store the message without sending it, scroll to the STORE function and press the select key. You will be advised as to whether the task was Successful or Unsuccessful.

Deleting Messages

To delete messages, scroll to the DELETE function and press the select key. You will then be given the option to delete messages in your INBOX or your OUTBOX.

Deleting messages in your INBOX:

To delete the messages in your Inbox, scroll to the INBOX function and press the select key. You will then be given the option to:

Delete a particular Message

To delete a particular message in your INBOX, scroll to the DELETE MSG. function and press the select key. The following will be displayed:

The first message out of the total messages in your INBOX

the time the message was sent

Checking available message memory space

To determine how much message memory space your phone has, scroll to the FREE COUNT function and press the select key. You will be able to view:

TOTAL: the TOTAL number of messages that are currently stored on your phone
