

Installing Your Handsfree Equipment

Your handsfree equipment offers improved traffic safety by providing handsfree functionality with maintained sound quality. Using handsfree equipment will keep your eyes on the road and give you excellent sound quality with built-in echo cancellation. Another feature is fast battery charging.

Your handsfree kit

Your handsfree kit includes the following:

- Electronics unit
- Battery/mute/ignition sense cable
- Fuse kit
- Microphone
- Loudspeaker
- FME/TNC connector
- Antenna cable
- Installation/User's Guide

Safety and important information

- Do not smoke or use open fire when working close to the car.
- The car battery must be disconnected before you start any installation work.
- Have your phone and handsfree equipment installed by qualified professionals. Ask the manufacturer's dealer if any equipment in your car is insufficiently shielded against signals from your mobile phone.
- Handsfree equipment must not interfere with the operation of the car. Place the holder so that you can read the display and reach the keys from your normal driving position. If your car is equipped with an airbag, check that the handsfree equipment does not interfere with its function.
- Always follow recommendations regarding distances for driver-microphone and speaker-microphone. These distances are shown in the "Installation Chart" on page 90.



- Operation of your phone close to other electronic equipment, such as example a car stereo, may cause interference. If you experience problems with your car's electrical systems, please contact your local car dealer.
- The handsfree equipment is made for use in cars with a 12 V electrical system. Other supply voltages may cause damage to the equipment.

Installation procedure

Note: *Always have your handsfree unit, antenna and cables installed by qualified professionals.*

The "Installation Chart" on page 90 shows connections and recommended placement for all parts of the handsfree equipment, as well as additional accessories.

We recommend that you use an external antenna for best reception. For advice on which antenna to use and for professional installation, please contact your local car dealer. Some car manufacturers require that you use an external antenna for your phone, please consult your car manual.

To comply with FCC RF exposure requirements for mobile transmitting devices, the external antenna used for this device must be vehicle-mounted to provide a minimum separation distance of 20 cm (7.8 in) from all persons, with the antenna gain not exceeding 3dBi.

The holder should be placed so that you can see the display and reach the keys from your normal driving position. However, it should not interfere with the operation of the car, block the driver's view, or distract the driver.
