

Recommended screen resolutions

It is recommended to set the resolution of your display based on standard Windows settings.

If you set a high resolution, such as QHD+ (3200x1800), it may not correctly display some applications.

Product capacity representation

Storage capacity representation

The capacity of the storage device (HDD, SSD) of the manufacturer is calculated assuming that 1 KB = 1,000 Bytes.

However, the operating system (Windows) calculates the storage device capacity assuming that 1 KB = 1,024 Bytes. Therefore, the available capacity of the HDD in Windows is smaller than the actual capacity due to the difference in capacity calculation. For example, for an 80 GB HDD, Windows calculates the capacity as 74.5 GB, (80x1,000x1,000x1,000) Bytes/(1,024x1,024x1,024) Bytes = 74.505 GB.

In addition, the capacity representation in Windows may be even smaller because some programs, such as Samsung Recovery Solution, may reside in a hidden area of the HDD.

Memory capacity representation

The available memory capacity in Windows is less than the actual capacity of memory. This is because some memory is required for regular system operations.


For example, for 1 GB (= 1,024 MB) memory installed, Windows may report the capacity as 1,022 MB or less.

- Since some space on the HDD/SSD is reserved for system recovery and operations, the available space on the HDD/SSD may be less than the actual capacity.




Turning the computer on and off



Fully charge the battery using the AC adapter before using the computer for the first time.


Turning the computer on

- 1 Before turning on the computer, check that the battery is charged and charge it if necessary.
- 2 Open the LCD panel.



3 The computer turns on automatically when the LCD panel is opened.

If the computer does not turn on automatically, press the Power button.





Set the device not to automatically turn on the computer when the LCD panel is opened.

- 1. Select the Start button (⑤) → All Programs → Samsung → Easy Settings.
- 2. Select **Boot Management** and deselect **Auto Booting** in the **Lid Open Action** section.

About Windows Activation

When you turn the computer on for the first time, the Windows activation screen appears.


Follow the activation procedures according to the instructions on the screen to use the computer.

The computer's date and time may be incorrect when you turn it on for the first time. They may also be incorrect if the battery has been fully discharged or removed. To set the date and time, go to the desktop taskbar and right-click the clock area. Then, select **Adjust date/time** and set the current date and time.

Turning the computer off

1 Select the Start button ().

2 Select **Shut down**.





- Save all data before turning off the computer.
- Since the procedures to turn the computer off may differ depending on the installed operating system, turn the computer off according to the procedures for the purchased operating system.
- If **Easy Settings** is installed, the system shutdown location may differ.

Keyboard

Enter text or access computer functions with the keyboard.




























- Images and available features may differ depending on the model and operating system.
- The keyboard layout may differ depending on the country.


Using hot keys

To use keyboard hot keys, do one of the following:

• Press and hold the **Fn** key and press a hot key.



• Press the **Fn Lock** key and then press a hot key.

Touchpad

Use the touchpad to move the cursor or select an item. The left and right buttons of the touchpad act the same as the left and right buttons of a mouse.




- Use the touchpad only with fingers. The touchpad will not recognize actions of other objects.
- Images and the touchpad layout may differ depending on the model.

Basic touchpad functions


Moving

To move the cursor, move a finger on the touchpad.




Clicking

Tap the touchpad or press the left touchpad button.



Double-clicking

Double-tap the touchpad or press the left touchpad button twice.








Right-clicking


This function enables right-clicking.

Dragging


To move an icon or an app tile to a desired location, press and hold it and then drag it to the target position with the left touchpad button pressed.




Gesture functions

Swiping


To scroll up, down, left or right to a desired location, swipe with two fingers on the touchpad.






Pinching

To zoom in, spread two fingers apart while viewing a website, map, or image. Pinch to zoom out.




Touchpad lock

Press and hold the **Fn** key and press the **F5** key to lock the touchpad.



CD/DVD drive (ODD) (optional)

1 Press the Eject button on the optical disc drive.

- When the CD tray ejects, insert a CD or DVD.
- 3 Push the CD tray inward until it clicks into place.
 The operating status LED of the CD/DVD drive will turn on.



- Do not insert warped, cracked, or heavily scratched discs into the drive. Damaged discs may spin too quickly and can damage the drive.
- Do not eject discs while the operating status LED is on.



- The appearance of your external drive may differ in appearance from the images in this manual.
- If the drive will not open when the power is off, insert a
 paper clip () into the eject pinhole to open the tray
 manually.
- When cleaning a CD or DVD, wipe it with a soft cloth from the inside edge towards the outside edge.
- Reading and writing speeds may differ depending on the condition of the disc and the media type.
- Do not insert a CD or DVD that is not circular.

Memory card

Use a memory card to transfer data to other devices, such as digital cameras or MP3 players. Memory cards are sold separately. Purchase a memory card with the necessary capacity for the requirement.

This computer supports the following types of memory cards.

To use a mini or micro card, insert the card into an adapter before inserting it into the memory card slot.



- Some memory cards may not be fully compatible with the computer. Using an incompatible card may damage the computer or the memory card, or corrupt the data stored in it.
- Use caution to insert the memory card in the indicated direction.
- Store the card separately to prevent losing the card when moving the computer.
- Memory card speeds vary.


Inserting a memory card

- 1 If a dummy card or a memory card adapter is inserted in the memory card slot, remove it.
- 2 Insert a memory card into the memory card slot in the indicated direction.

Use a memory card adapter to insert a micro memory card into the memory card slot. For mini memory cards, use a mini card adapter.



A memory card adapter is an optional item and may not be provided with some models.



- 3 Select the pop-up message to open the memory card folder.

 If a pop-up message appears, select the corresponding window → Continue without scanning.
- 4 Select Open folder to view files.
- Save, move, or delete data on the memory card.
 The memory card folder opens only on the desktop.

Removing a memory card

Grasp the end of the card and pull it out of the slot.

Formatting a memory card

Format the memory card to remove all data or before using it for the first time.



Formatting a memory card deletes all data saved on the card. If necessary, back up important data before formatting the card.


- 1 Select the Start button (\bigcirc) \rightarrow **Computer**.
- 2 Right-click the memory card drive, and then select **Format**.
- 3 Select Start.



- To use a memory card to exchange data with a digital device, such as a digital camera, formatting the data with the digital device is recommended.
- When trying to use a formatted memory card in another digital device, format the memory card again in the device.
- Data protected by copyright laws cannot be reviewed or modified.
- Inserting and removing a memory card repeatedly may damage the memory card.
- Secure Digital Input Output (SDIO) is not supported.
- If the write-protect tab is in the locked position, you cannot format, write, or delete data on the card.

External display

Connecting the computer to an external display device can be useful for presentations or when watching a movie. The cables required to connect an external display are sold separately. The computer supports either VGA or HDMI cables.





- Check the available ports on the display device to ensure that it is compatible with the computer.
- If both types of ports are available, the HDMI port is recommended for better audio and video quality.
- An external display is not supported when using DOS.


Connecting to a display

1 Connect the VGA cable or HDMI cable to the corresponding port of the computer.


Connect the other end of the cable to the D-SUB port or HDMI port of the external display.

If the display has several HDMI ports, connect the cable to the DVI IN port.

- 3 Connect the power cord to the external display.
- 4 Turn on the display and change its display mode to one that supports an external input.
- 5 Press and hold and press. The display mode selection window will appear.

While pressing and holding , press to select a mode.

- **Duplicate**: Show the screen on both the computer and the external display.
- Extend: Extend the screen to the external display.
- **Computer only**: Show the screen on the computer monitor only.
- **Projector only**: Show the screen on the external display only.

Wired LAN

To access the Internet at home, set up an account with an Internet service provider (ISP). To purchase Internet service and a modem, contact a local ISP.



- Some features or procedures may differ depending on the model.
- These descriptions are written for Windows 7, so some figures and descriptions may differ from your operating system. Since the procedures for other Windows operating systems are similar, use the computer referring to these descriptions.

Wired LAN

1 Connect a LAN cable to the LAN port on the computer.


2 Select Start button (⑤) → Control Panel → Network and Internet → Network and Sharing Center → Change adapter settings.



3 Right-click Local Area Connection and select Properties.



- 4 Select Internet Protocol Version 4(TCP/IPv4) from the list of Network Components and select Properties.
 - The Network Component name may differ depending on the operating system.



 To add a network item such as a client, service, or protocol, select Install... under the list of network items.

- **5** Configure the IP settings.
 - When using DHCP, select Obtain an IP address automatically.
 - When not using DHCP, contact the network administrator for the IP address. To use a static IP address, select Use the following IP address and set the IP address manually.
- 6 Select **OK** to save the settings.

Wake on LAN (WOL) feature

Activate the system remotely from sleep mode when a signal, such as a magic packet command, is received via a wired LAN.

- 1 Select the Start button (⑤) → Control Panel → Network and Internet → Network and Sharing Center → Change adapter settings.
- 2 Right-click Local Area Connection and select Properties.
- 3 Select Configure... \rightarrow Power Management \rightarrow Allow this device to wake the computer \rightarrow OK.

4 Restart the computer.

- If the computer wakes up from sleep mode inadvertently, disable the Wake on LAN feature.
- If you turn off the computer without disabling the Wake on LAN feature while connected to a network, the LAN LED may not turn off.
- The Wake on LAN feature may not work when simultaneously connected to a wired and wireless LAN.
 To use the Wake on LAN feature, set the Wireless LAN to Disable.
- The Wake on LAN feature may not work while using the Hybrid power saving feature. To disable the Hybrid power saving feature, select Control Panel → Power Options.



- Using the Wake on LAN feature with a Ping command is not supported on Windows 7.
- When connected to a 100 Mbps/1 Gbps wired LAN, a
 message appears informing the user of connection to
 a 10 Mbps/100 Mbps wired LAN when the computer
 wakes from sleep mode. This happens because
 restoring the network takes about 3 seconds. When the
 network is restored, the computer will be connected to
 the 100 Mbps/1 Gbps LAN.
 - It may take about 20 seconds for the connection to be established when connecting a LAN cable.
- When the system is running on battery power, it may take a few seconds for the connection to be established when connecting a LAN cable. This is the result of power saving features designed to reduce battery consumption.
- When the system is running on battery power, the speed of a wired LAN is decreased automatically to reduce battery consumption. In this case, a 1 Gbps/100 Mbps LAN would function at the speed of a 100 Mbps/10 Mbps connection.

Wireless LAN


Connect the computer to a wireless network to use the Internet.



The descriptions below are for computer models with a Wireless LAN card or device. A Wireless LAN device is optional. The pictures in this manual may differ from the actual product depending on the wireless LAN device model.

About Access Point (AP)

An Access Point (AP) is a network device that bridges wired and wireless LANs and corresponds to a wireless hub in a wired network. Multiple devices can be connected to an AP.



2 Select **Connect**. If the AP is password protected, enter the password and then select **Connect**.



If you require a network password, contact the system administrator.




When the AP connection complete window appears, select **Close**.

Using the security slot

You can secure the computer by connecting a lock and cable to the security slot.

Tie the lock and cable to a fixed object and install the other end of the cable to the security slot.





To use this feature, you must purchase a lock and cable (sold separately). Your product may differ from the one shown above. For more information, refer to your lock's manual.


Easy Settings (optional)

Easy Settings, a Samsung-integrated settings application, offers various settings functions.



- This description is for models that support this function and run Windows 7.
- Images and features may differ depending on the model and the application version.
- 1 Select the Start button (ⓐ) → All Programs → Samsung → Easy Settings.

2 Select an option to configure the corresponding function.


Samsung Update

Install and update Samsung applications and drivers on the computer easily and conveniently. This application enables the user to search for or download the BIOS, drivers, and applications over the Internet. Keep the computer performing better and more stably with **Samsung Update**.



- To check for available updates, the computer must be connected to the Internet.
- Only applications that have been installed with this application can be updated.
- Images and features may differ depending on the model and the application version.
- Select the Start button (⑤) → All Programs → Samsung → Samsung Update.
- 2 Read and agree to the User Agreement.
 This step appears only when the application runs for the first time.

3 Select Install & Update.



4 Select items to update and select **OK**.




Adjust the LCD brightness to reduce eye strain and save power.

 To brighten the LCD screen, press and hold the Fn key and press the F3 key.




Adjust the system volume or sound volume when playing music or video.

Controlling volume using the keyboard


 To turn down the volume, press and hold the Fn key and press the F7 key.



 To turn up the volume, press and hold the Fn key and press the F8 key.




 To mute or unmute the volume, press and hold the Fn key and press the F6 key.



Controlling volume using the taskbar

Select (1) on the taskbar. Drag the adjustment bar to the desired volume.



BIOS (Setup utility)

Define a boot password, change the boot priority, or configure the system's equipment-related settings.



- Incorrect settings may cause the system to malfunction or crash.
- The BIOS setup screens, menus, and items may appear differently depending on the model and BIOS version.
- BIOS setup functions are subject to upgrades.


Entering the BIOS screen

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Press the **F2** key several times.
 - If the computer is password-protected, press the **F2** key several times before the password screen appears.
 - If the password screen or the Windows start screen appears, restart the computer and try again.

The BIOS screen

The BIOS setup screen appears as shown below.

You can change BIOS settings using the keyboard or mouse.

Settings & Upgrade

Boot password

Setting a password with the BIOS enhances protection against viruses and hacking attacks.



- Do not forget your password or expose it to others.
- If you forget the Supervisor Password or HDD
 Password, request assistance from the Samsung
 Service Center. In this case, a service fee will be charged.
- If you forget the User Password, disable the Supervisor Password, and the User Password is also automatically disabled.

Setting passwords

There are three password settings available: **Supervisor Password**, **User Password**, and **HDD Password**.

- Supervisor Password (low security level): This password is required when turning on the computer or entering the BIOS setup.
- User Password (low security level): This password is required to enter the BIOS setup. This password will be deactivated automatically if the Supervisor Password is disabled.
- HDD Password (high security level): This password is required to access the hard disk drive (HDD) from another computer. This password may not be supported, depending on the model.

Setting a boot password

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Before the Samsung logo appears, press the **F2** key several times.
- 3 Access the **Security** menu.
- 4 Select a password type (**Supervisor Password**, **User Password**, or **HDD Password**).

If you cannot select an item or the **HDD Password Frozen** message appears, turn off the computer and turn it on again. Then, press the **F2** key several times before the Samsung logo appears to enter the BIOS setup screen.

- 5 Enter a password and select Ok.The password can be up to 20 characters.
- Enter the password again to confirm it and select **Ok**.
- 7 Select **Save** \rightarrow **Yes** to save and restart.



- To enable the Password On Boot option, set a Supervisor Password and enter the password when starting up the computer.
- To change the HDD Password after setting it, restart the computer.
- For some models, if the password entered message appears in the Setup Notice window, select **Ok** to complete the setup.

Removing a password

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Before the Samsung logo appears, press the **F2** key several times.
- 3 Access the **Security** menu.
- Select a password type (Supervisor Password, User Password, or HDD Password).
- 5 Enter the current password and select **Ok**.
- 6 Without entering any characters, select $Ok \rightarrow Ok$.



For some models, to cancel the password, select **Cancel** in the Setup Notice window.

Boot priority

Change the boot priority from the BIOS setup.

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Before the Samsung logo appears, press the **F2** key several times.
- 3 Access the **Boot** menu.
- 4 Select **Boot Device Priority**.
- 5 Select an option menu to open the list.
- 6 Select an option.
- 7 Select Save → Yes to save and restart.
 Select Exit → Yes to restart without saving the changes.

Battery

Fully charge the battery using the AC adapter before using the computer for the first time.




- Use only Samsung-approved AC adapters, batteries, and cables. Unapproved adapters or cables can cause the battery to explode or damage the computer.
- Incorrectly connecting the charger may cause serious damage to the computer.
- You can use the computer while it is charging, but the battery charging time may increase. If the battery temperature rises too much, the charging may stop as a safety measure.



To restore the battery power after cutting it, connect the AC adapter.


Charging the battery

- 1 Connect the power cable to the AC adapter.
- 2 Connect the AC adapter to the DC jack of the computer.
- 3 Plug the power cable into an electric socket.



Settings & Upgrade

4 When the battery is fully charged, the operating status LED turns green. Disconnect the AC adapter from the computer.



5 Unplug it from the electric socket.

Installing/Removing the Battery

- 1 Shutdown the system, close the LCD panel and place the computer upside down on a flat surface.
- 2 Pull the two battery latches outward 🔁, then remove the battery.



3 To reinstall the battery, slide the battery into the computer.

The battery latches will automatically secure the battery to the computer.



Check if the battery latches have moved inward.


Battery status

Move the cursor over the battery icon on the taskbar to view the current battery charge.



Viewing the current battery charge when the computer is turned off

Connect or disconnect the AC adapter from the computer to view the current battery charge when the computer is turned off.



Battery usage time

Batteries are replacement items and over time the battery's capacity to hold a charge and its power level is reduced. If a battery can only hold its charge for half of the time that it could when new, it is recommended to purchase a new, replacement battery.

When not using the battery for extended periods, charge the battery to 30–40% of full charge before storing it. This extends battery life.

Samsung Recovery Solution

Samsung Recovery Solution is an application that enables restoring or backing up the hard disk drive for when a problem occurs with the computer.

If the computer fails to boot up, you can restore the computer by pressing the **F4** key in the booting screen.



- not be provided or the application version may differ depending on models. Some functions may differ or may be unavailable depending on the version. Refer to the application's help information.
- The screen images in this document may differ from actual product.
- If your computer does not have an internal DVD, you need an external DVD connected to your computer to use the Backup Function or Restore Function using DVDs.
- When you launch the application for the first time, read and accept the Terms and Conditions when they display on the screen.

Samsung Recovery Solution

Backup/Restore Functions

Backup Function Backs up drive C or required folders and files.

• Complete Backup Backs up drive C. Data Backup
 Backs up important folders and files.

A problem occurs



Restore Function

Restores major Windows files, drive C, or folders and files to the previous state.

- Basic Restore
 Restores only major Windows files in a short time.
- Complete Restore
 Restores drive C to the previous, normal
 state.
- Data Restore
 Restores important files or folders to the previously backed up state.

Restore Function

Not only can you use **Samsung Recovery Solution** when Windows is running, but also when you are unable to boot up into Windows.

Optional functions such as Initial State Image, Initial Status Backup, and Partitioning are only available in some models.

If the image of the initial state is saved on a DVD or removable storage device, connect the DVD drive or removable storage device to the computer before using the function.

Restoring the computer

1 When Windows is running
Select Samsung Recovery Solution.

When Windows does not start

Turn the computer on and press the **F4** key when the boot screen (SAMSUNG) appears. After a moment, the computer boots up in restoration mode and the **Samsung Recovery Solution** screen appears.



For computers supporting the touch screen function, the touch screen function does not work during Restore Mode. In this case, please use the touchpad or mouse.

2 If the initial menu screen appears, select **Restore**.





If you select **Select by Symptom**, the Select by Symptom menu appears. If you select a symptom, a recommended restoration option will blink. Select the restoration option to continue.

3 Select either **Basic Restore** or **Complete Restore** from the Restore menu.

To restore the computer to the initial state, select **Computer Initial Status** and perform the restoration process according to the instructions that appear on the screen.





Run **Complete Restore** if the computer does not work even after **Basic Restore** has been completed.



In the **Advanced** menu, you can change the size of the hard drive partitions (e.g. C: and D:).

- Make sure to backup your data in advance, as all data will be deleted after the partition size is changed.
- The Advanced menu appears only when the computer boots up in the restoration area by pressing the F4 key during the booting sequence.



Since a Complete Restore deletes all user data as well as additionally installed programs, please backup your important data first using the Data Backup function, before running Complete Restore.

- The computer boots up into restoration mode and the restoration progress message appears. If you select **OK**, the restoration begins. The restoration may take some time, please wait for a moment.
- When the 'Restart the System' message appears after the restoration is complete, select **OK** to restart the system.



Make sure that the power cord is connected while the restoration is in process. The first time the computer boots up after a Complete Restore has been performed, the speed of the boot process may be slowed down due to the system optimization process. At this time, do not shut the computer down by force.

Complete Backup/Restore

A **Complete Backup** saves the complete image of the C drive onto another drive or DVD.

A **Complete Restore** restores the image file saved by the Complete Backup onto the C drive.

Complete Backup




If you perform the Complete Backup function onto a DVD or removable storage device, you can restore your computer even when a problem occurs with the hard disk or when the restoration area is removed.

To create a backup, a removable storage device with at least 15 GB of free space is required.

- 1 Select **Backup** → **Complete Backup** in the start screen of the Samsung Recovery Solution.
- 2 Enter a description of the current status of the computer and select **Next**.



After connecting a DVD drive or removable storage device, you can specify the DVD drive or removable storage device as the Save Path.



Select Drive D.

Select the DVD drive.

When the option selection item appears, select an option and select **Next**.



The Livelmaging function is supported as options for the Complete Backup operation.


The Livelmaging function performs the Complete Backup operation while Windows is running. The backup operation using Livelmaging may slow down if the hard disk drive is accessed frequently by other applications.

When the system restarts in restoration mode, the **Complete Backup** operation begins. Continue with the backup by following the instructions.



- Samsung Recovery Solution supports the DVD+R, DVD-R, DVD+RW and DVD-RW formats.
- If the Livelmaging option has been selected, the Complete Backup operation begins without the computer being restarted.

5 Continue with the Complete Backup operation by following the instructions.

6 When the 'Restart the System' message appears after the backup is complete, select **OK** to restart the system.



If the Livelmaging option has been selected, the computer is not restarted.

Complete Restore

1 When backing up onto DVD

Turn the computer on and insert the backup DVD into the DVD drive.

If there are multiple backup DVDs, insert the first DVD.

When backing up to a removable storage device

Connect the removable storage device.


When backing up to another drive

Proceed to Step 2.

2 Select Restore → Complete Restore in the start screen of the Samsung Recovery Solution.

3 Select a restore time and select **Next**.

The system is restarted.



Restore time

- The restoration progress message appears after the computer boots up in restoration mode. If you select **OK**, the restoration begins.
- When the 'Restart the System' message appears after the restoration is complete, select **OK** to restart the system.

Data Backup/Restore

The **Data Backup** function enables you to backup specific files and folders to another drive, DVD or removable storage device.


The **Data Restore** function enables you to restore data using the data saved by a Data Backup when data is lost.

Data Backup

- 1 Select **Backup** → **Data Backup** in the start screen of the Samsung Recovery Solution.
- In the data selection screen, select either Basic Selection or Select from all, select a folder or file to be backed up, and then select Next.
- 3 Enter a description for the backup, specify the Save Path, and then select Next.



If your computer has a DVD-Writer, you can specify the DVD drive as the Save Path.



- If you have specified a hard disk drive or a removable disk as the Save Path, the SamsungRecovery\SamsungData folder is created on the corresponding drive (e.g. D:\) and the data is saved to the folder. Take care to not delete the folder by mistake or on purpose.
- 4 Continue with the Data Backup operation by following the instructions.

The "Backup is completed" message appears.

Data Restore

When backing up onto DVD

Turn the computer on and insert the backup DVD into the DVD drive.

When backing up to a removable storage device

Connect the removable storage device.

When backing up to another drive

Proceed to Step 2.

- 2 Select Restore → Data Restore in the start screen of the Samsung Recovery Solution.
- 3 Select a backup item to be restored in the backup list and select **Next**.
- 4 Select a folder for the restoration and select **Next**. Data Restore begins.
- 5 When Data Restore is completed, check if the data has been restored to the specified folder.

Uninstalling Samsung Recovery Solution

You can uninstall the Samsung Recovery Solution application.



When you uninstall this application, the recovery area of the hard disk drive will not be deleted. When you press the **F4** key while turning on the computer, the computer boots up in restoration mode. You can use the restore and backup functions in this mode.

- Select the Start button (⑤) → Control Panel → Uninstall a program.
- $2 \quad \text{Select Samsung Recovery Solution} \rightarrow \text{Uninstall}.$ The application will be deleted.

Samsung Recovery Solution

What is a Recovery Area?

The computer has an additional partition for restoring data or saving backup files (only for models with the **Samsung Recovery Solution** application). This partition is called a Recovery Area and it includes a recovery image comprised of the operating system and applications.

Why is the capacity representation of the hard disk drive (HDD) in Windows different from the product specifications?

The capacity of the storage device (HDD or SSD) of the manufacturer is calculated assuming that 1 KB = 1,000 Bytes. However, the operating system (Windows) calculates the storage device capacity assuming that 1 KB = 1,024 Bytes, and therefore the capacity representation of the HDD in Windows is smaller than the actual capacity. The capacity representation in Windows may be smaller than the actual capacity because some applications occupy a certain area of the HDD outside of Windows.

For models with the **Samsung Recovery Solution** application, the HDD capacity representation in Windows may be smaller than the actual capacity because the **Samsung Recovery Solution** application uses a hidden area of 5–20 GB of the HDD to save the recovery image, and that hidden area is not counted towards the total size available to Windows. The size of the **Samsung Recovery Solution** application varies by model.

What is a recovery image?

This refers to the operating system, drivers, and software that are converted to a data image. It is required to recover the computer and is embedded in the computer's HDD. However, this is not provided for storage devices where the capacity is less than 64 GB, due to their small capacities.

How can I restore a computer that does not have the Samsung Recovery Solution application?

Restore the computer with the recovery function provided by Windows. Refer to the Recover Functionality item in the help for more details.

Maintaining the proper posture during computer use is very important to prevent physical injury. Improper or prolonged keyboard use may result in repetitive strain injury. Viewing the monitor screen for extended periods of time may result in eye strain. Therefore, please follow these guidelines carefully when setting up and using the computer.

Back and neck




- · Use an adjustable chair with firm, comfortable support.
- Adjust the height of your chair so that thighs are horizontal to the floor and feet are flat on the floor.
- The back of the chair should support the lower back. Adjust the backrest to fit your body properly.
- Sit back fully in your chair and straighten the back and neck.
 Avoid leaning forward or craning your neck toward the computer screen.
- Avoid using the computer while lying down or on your lap.
 If the computer's temperature increases, there is a danger of burn injury.




- The instructions in this manual have been prepared so that they can be applied to the range of needs of general users. If the user is not included in the range, the recommendations should be applied according to the user's needs.
- Images may differ from actual products.

Arms and hands




- When using the keyboard and touchpad, the shoulders should be relaxed. The upper arm and forearm should form an angle that is slightly greater than a right angle, with the wrist and hand in almost a straight line.
- Use a light touch when typing or using the touchpad and keep the hands and fingers relaxed. Avoid rolling the thumbs under your palms or supporting the wrists on the desk while typing.
- Use an external keyboard and mouse when using the computer for long periods. When using an external keyboard and mouse, position the devices at the same height as the computer and within comfortable reach.

Eye position and display illumination



- Position the screen at least 50 cm away from your eyes.
- Adjust the height of the screen so that its top edge is equal to or just below the level of your eyes.
- Avoid setting the screen's brightness settings excessively high.
- Keep the screen clean.
- If wearing glasses, clean them before using the computer.
- When referring to printed content while typing, use a static paper holder to hold the paper at about the same height as the monitor.

Hearing and volume control



- Ensure that volume is not too loud before using headphones.
- Avoid using headphones for long periods of time.
- Default audio settings can be changed by software and driver updates without your knowledge. Always recheck equalizer and volume settings before listening to audio.
- To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.



Operating conditions

- Take at least a 10 minute break every hour.
- Avoid using the computer in dark locations. Use the computer with as much ambient light as you would when reading a book.
- Indirect illumination is recommended. Use a curtain to prevent reflections and glare on the screen.
- While operating a computer and talking on the phone, use a headset. Using the computer while holding a phone on your shoulder or with your neck may lead to muscle strain or injury.
- · Keep frequently used items within reach.
- Only use the computer within the temperature and humidity ranges specified in this manual.

Safety precautions

This safety information relates to computer use. Some of the content may be not applicable to your computer. To prevent injury or damage to your computer, read the safety information before using it.



- Since this is commonly applied to Samsung Computers, some pictures may differ from actual products.
- The term "product," as used in this manual, refers to basic components, such as the computer, battery, adapter, and optional accessories provided by Samsung.



Warning

Failure to follow the instructions marked with this symbol may result in physical injury or fatality.

Installation related



Keep the computer at least 15 cm away from any object.

Failure to do so may cause computer malfunction or damage, or physical injury.



Do not place or use the computer on slanted or vibrating surfaces.

Failure to do so may result in computer malfunction or damage.



To avoid suffocation, keep the plastic bag away from infants and children.

Putting a plastic bag over the head may result in suffocation.

Power related



The power plug and wall outlet figures may differ depending on the country and the product model.









Handle the power cord with care.

- · Do not touch with wet hands.
- Do not use a damaged or improperly connected power cord.
- Do not overload a multi-outlet or an extension cord beyond the specified voltage/current capacity.
- Firmly insert the power cable into the AC adapter.
- Do not unplug the power cord by pulling on the cable.
- Unplug the wall-mount AC adapter (integrated plug and power adapter) from the wall outlet while holding the body and pulling it in the direction of the arrow.

Failure to do so may result in electric shock or fire.




Connect the power cord to the AC adapter firmly.

An improper connection may result in a fire.

Use only the provided AC adapter.

Using a third-party adapter may cause the screen to flicker.



Use only properly earthed electric sockets or extension cords.

Unearthed electric sockets or extension cords may cause electric shock. Any connection to unearthed electric sockets or extension cords may produce an electric field from a current leak.



If water or other substances enters the computer, the DC jack, or the AC adapter, disconnect the power cable and contact a Samsung Service Center. For notebook computers that are supplied with an optional removable battery, disconnect the battery.

Failure to do so may result in electric shock or fire.



Do not let dust accumulate on the power cord or the electric socket. Regularly clean the power cord and the electric socket. Wipe the power cord and the electric socket with a dry cloth.

Failure to do so may result in electric shock or fire.



Do not bend or damage the power cable or the AC adapter with a heavy or sharp-edged object.

A damaged cable or cord may result in electric shock or fire.

Battery usage related



Keep the battery, AC adapter, and the power cord away from infants, children, and pets.

Failure to do so may result in electric shock or damage.



Use only Samsung-approved batteries, AC adapters, and accessories.

Batteries or AC adapters that are not approved by Samsung may malfunction from a defective safety device, resulting in an explosion or fire.




Take care not to allow metal objects such as a key or clip to touch the battery terminal (metal parts).

This may cause excessive current and result in fire, burns, or damage to the battery.



If the computer or the computer battery leaks, emits strange odors, or swells, immediately stop using the computer and contact a Samsung Service Center.

Failure to do so may result in an explosion or fire.



Replace a run-down battery with a new, Samsung-approved battery.



When removing the real time clock (RTC) battery, keep it away from infants and children.

If a child swallows the battery, the child may suffocate. If this happens, immediately contact a doctor.

Usage related



Do not use the computer on heated floors or electric pads, or on beds, blankets, or cushions that block the ventilation of the computer.

In such environments, be careful not to block the vent of the computer, which is normally at the side or bottom of the computer. A blocked vent causes the computer to overheat, resulting in an explosion, fire, burns, or computer malfunction.



Do not use the computer in humid locations, such as a bathroom.

Failure to do so may result in computer malfunction or electric shock. Use the computer within the recommended temperature and humidity range (10–35°C, 20–80% RH).



Never heat the computer (or the battery) or put the computer (or the battery) into a fire. Do not put or use the computer (or the battery) in a hot location, such as in a sauna or inside a vehicle when the outside temperature is high.

There is a danger of an explosion or fire.



Before cleaning the computer, disconnect all the cables that are connected to the computer. For notebook computers that are supplied with an optional removable battery, disconnect the battery.

Failure to do so may result in electric shock or fire.



Keep the computer away from water or liquid.

Water or liquid entering the computer may short-circuit the computer, resulting in electric shock or fire.



If the computer is dropped or broken, disconnect the power cord and contact a Samsung Service Center. For notebook computers that are supplied with an external removable battery, disconnect the battery as well.

Using a broken computer may result in electric shock or fire.



Do not touch the computer vents or the connected AC adapter for extended periods while the computer is on.

Contact with the vent or the connected AC adapter for extended periods may result in low-temperature burns, such as redness on the skin.

Upgrade related



Do not attempt to upgrade the computer, unless you are qualified.

Otherwise, contact a Samsung Service Center or an authorized technician.



Follow the specified instructions contained in the manual for user maintenance.

Do not disassemble any other parts by yourself. Failure to do so may result in computer malfunction, electric shock, or fire.



Do not disassemble the power supply unit, the AC adapter, or the battery in any circumstances.

Failure to do so may result in electric shock, fire, or an explosion.



Shut down the computer and disconnect all cables before disassembling the computer. If the notebook has a removable battery, remove the external battery.

Failure to do so, may cause electric shock.

Storage and movement related



Do not store the computer in an enclosed space, such as a computer bag, while it is running.

Failure to do so may result in fire. Completely shut down the computer before putting the computer into an enclosed space.



When using wireless communication (LAN, Bluetooth, etc.) always follow applicable instructions. For example, airlines and hospitals have strict requirements.



Avoid exposing a drive to magnetic fields. Security devices with magnetic fields include airport walk-through devices and security wands. The airport security devices that check carry-on luggage, such as conveyor belts, use X-rays instead of magnetism and will not damage a drive.



When carrying the notebook computer with other items, such as the adapter, mouse, books etc., take care not to press anything against the notebook computer.

If a heavy object is pressed against the notebook computer, a white spot or stain may appear on the LCD. Therefore, take care not to apply any pressure to the notebook.

In this case, place the notebook computer in a separate compartment away from the other objects.



Caution

Failure to follow instructions marked with this symbol may result in minor physical injury or damage to the computer.

Installation related

Do not block the ports (holes), vents, etc. of the product and do not insert objects.

Damage to a component within the computer may cause electric shock or fire.

When using the computer on its side, ensure the vents are clear and facing upwards.

Failure to do so, may cause the internal temperature of the computer to rise and the computer to malfunction or halt.

Do not place heavy objects on the product.

This may cause a problem with the computer. In addition, the object may fall and cause injury or damage the computer.

Connect the power cord to the nearest socket outlet when charging the computer.

If a problem occurs and disconnection from the socket outlet is delayed, there is a danger of electric shock or fire.

Dispose of worn-out batteries properly.

- There is a danger of fire or explosion.
- The battery disposal method may differ depending on your country and region. Dispose of the used battery in an appropriate way.

Do not throw or disassemble the battery and do not put it into water.

This may cause an injury, fire or explosion.

Only use a Samsung-authorized battery.

Failure to do so may cause an explosion.

Keep the battery terminals away from metal objects such as car keys or paper clips.

If metal objects touch the battery terminals, it may cause excessive current and result in fire or damage to the battery.

Charge the battery according to the instructions in the manual.

Failure to do so may cause an explosion or fire.

Do not heat the product (or battery) or expose it to heat (e.g. inside a vehicle during the summer).

There is a danger of explosion or fire.

Usage related

Use the pen for its intended purpose only.

Using the pen for abnormal actions such as poking eyes or ears may cause physical injury.

Do not place a candle, light cigar, etc. over or on the product.

There is a danger of fire.

Make sure to have the product tested by a safety service engineer after repairing the product.

Authorized Samsung Repair Centers will carry out safety checks after a repair. Using a repaired product without testing it for safety may cause an electric shock or fire.

In case of lightning, immediately turn the system off, disconnect the power cord from the wall outlet and phone line from modem. Do not use the modem or phone.

There is a danger of electric shock or fire.

Connect only permitted devices to the connectors or ports of the computer.

Failure to do so, may cause electric shock and fire.

Close the LCD panel only after checking if the notebook computer is turned off.

The temperature may rise and it may cause deformation of the product.

Do not press the eject button while the CD-ROM drive is in operation.

You might lose data and the disc might be suddenly ejected and could cause an injury.

Do not drop, hit, or apply excessive force to the computer.

Failure to do so may result in physical injury or data loss.

Do not allow the antenna and a source of electricity, such as a socket outlet, to come into contact.

There is a danger of electric shock.

When handling computer parts, follow the instructions on the manual supplied with the parts.

Failure to do so, may cause damage to the product.

If the computer emits smoke or there is a burning smell, disconnect the power plug from the wall outlet and contact a Samsung Service Center immediately. Disconnect the power supply and remove the battery if one is fitted.

There is a danger of fire.

Do not use a damaged or modified CD.

There is a danger of damaging the product or personal injury.

Do not insert the fingers into the PC Card Slot.

There is a danger of injury or electric shock.

Use recommended computer cleansing solutions when cleaning the product and only use the computer when it is completely dry.

Failure to do so may cause electric shock or fire.

You should not use a paper clip to perform an emergency disc ejection while the disc is in motion. Make sure to use the emergency disc eject method only when the Optical Disc Drive has stopped.

There is a danger of injury.

Do not place your face close to the Optical Disc Drive tray when it is operating.

There is a danger of injury due to an abrupt ejection.

Keep the computer away from magnetic material.

- Magnetic materials may cause computer malfunction or cause the battery to discharge.
- To avoid damaging the computer or magnetic stripe cards, such as credit cards, keep magnetic stripe cards away from the computer.

Do not use your computer in a hospital or on an aircraft that can be interfered with by radio frequency.

- Avoid using your computer within a 15 cm range of a pacemaker, if possible, as your computer can interfere with the pacemaker.
- To minimize possible interference with a pacemaker, use your computer only on the side of your body that is opposite the pacemaker.
- If you use medical equipment, contact the equipment manufacturer before using your computer to determine whether or not the equipment will be affected by radio frequencies emitted by the computer.
- When in a hospital, turn off your computer and follow all hospital regulations. Radio frequencies emitted from the computer may affect medical equipment.

Upgrade Related

Take care when touching the product or parts.

The device may be damaged or you may be injured.

Take care not to throw or drop the computer or its components.

This may cause injury or damage to the product.

Make sure to close the computer cover before connecting the power after a reassembly.

There is a danger of electric shock if your body touches an internal part.

Only use parts authorized by Samsung.

Failure to do so, may cause fire or damage the product.

Never disassemble or repair the product by yourself.

If the computer is serviced or repaired by an unqualified person, the warranty will not cover the repair fees. There is a danger of accident. Use authorized Samsung Service Centers.

To connect a device that is not manufactured or authorized by Samsung, enquire at a Samsung Service Center before connecting the device.

There is a danger of damaging the product.

Storage and movement related

Properly shut down, disconnect and secure the computer cables before moving it.

Failure to do so may damage the computer or cause someone to trip over a loose cable.

For long periods of inactivity or storage, discharge the battery and separate it from the computer (for external or removable battery types).

This will extend the battery's lifespan.

Do not operate or look at the computer while driving a vehicle.

There is a danger of a traffic accident. Please concentrate on driving.

Cautions on preventing data loss (hard disk management)

Take care not to damage the data on a hard disk drive.

- A hard disk drive is so sensitive to external impact that an external impact may cause loss of data on the surface of the disk.
- Take extra care, because moving the computer or an impact on the computer when it is turned on may damage the data on the hard disk drive.
- Samsung is not liable for any loss of data on the hard disk drive.

Situations that may damage the data of a hard disk drive and the hard disk drive itself.

- The data may be lost when an external impact is applied to the disk while disassembling or assembling the computer.
- The data may be lost when the computer is turned off or reset by a power failure while the hard disk drive is operating.
- The data may be lost and irrecoverable due to a computer virus.
- The data may be lost if the power is turned off while running an application.
- Sudden impact or movement to the computer while the hard disk drive is operating, may cause files to be corrupted or bad sectors on the hard disk.

To prevent data loss due to damage to the hard disk drive, please back up the data frequently.

LCD bad pixels

Samsung observes strict specifications regarding the quality and reliability of the LCD. However, there is a small chance that a few pixels may be bad. A large number of bad pixels can cause problems with the display, but a small number of bad pixels does not generally affect computer performance.

Samsung's quality standards for bad pixels are as follows:

- Bright dot: 2 or fewer
- · Black dot: 4 or fewer
- Combination (bright and dark): 4 or fewer

Cleaning the LCD screen
