Dear Ms. Poole,

In your email dated 4/8/09, you state that we “must also provide some guidance about intended / permitted antenna types, cabling, connector info, etc.” We believe that we have already done this in our Quick Start Guide, when we state that a minimum of 20cm of separation between the external antenna and the user’s body must be maintained at all times (thus precluding the use of a stub, or similar antenna).

Further, we state in the Quick Start Guide that “this device must not be co-located or operate in conjunction with any other antenna or transmitter except for those described in the filing” (thus addressing co-location and co-transmission issues).

Lastly, we provide the maximum permitted antenna gain(s) in order to ensure compliance with RF Exposure limits.

If you deem these items not adequate to demonstrate compliance with the policy that you quote, please provide an example of language that you would find acceptable. Also, if you would be so kind as to inform us where this policy is documented, we could have this information readily available for future reference.
