

20426 R/C TRUCK - INSTRUCTION SHEET

3/4

Function:

1. Remote distance up to 4 to 5 meters in open environment.
2. The truck can move straight, left and right in forward and backward direction.
3. The dumper can move Up and Down.

How to play

Switch on the ON/OFF switch under the head of the Truck to "ON" mode

1. Forward/Reverse buttons – Press the forward button runs the truck in forward. Press the reverse button runs the truck in reverse. Release button to stop.
2. Steering forward – Press the left corner of the forward button steers the truck to the left. Press the right corner of the forward button steers the truck to right. Release button to stop.
3. Steering reverse - Press the left corner of the reverse button steers the truck to the left. Press the right corner of the reverse button steers the truck to right. Release button to stop.
4. Dumper motion - Press the "Up" button of remote controller to move the dumper up. Press the "Down" button of remote controller to move dumper down.
5. In order to save batteries life, switch the ON/OFF switch to OFF when not in use.

Caution:

1. Do not mix old and new batteries.
2. Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zinc), or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.
3. Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.
4. Rechargeable batteries are to be removed from the toy before being charged.
5. Rechargeable batteries are only to be charged under adult supervision.
6. Only batteries of the same or equivalent type as recommended are to be used.
7. Batteries are to be inserted with the correct polarity.
8. Exhausted batteries are to be removed from the toy.
9. The supply terminals are not to be short-circuited.
10. Any battery charger to be used with the toy should be regular examined for potential hazards, such as damage to the cable or cord, plug, enclosure or other parts, and that, in the event of such damage, the toy must not be used until that damaged has been properly removed.
