Your pandigital **novel** is a light and stylish electronic multimedia eReader which allows you to quickly and easily download and read digital printed material (eBooks, eMagazines, and eNewspapers) anytime and anywhere.

Also, you can view photo slideshows, watch videos, and listen to music through the built-in speakers or with headphones (not included).

When connected to a Wi-Fi network, you can browse the web, send/receive email, download media files from the Barnes & Nobel's website, and much more!

Device Overview



Power Button Usage

Turn On: Press the power button and release.

Turn Off: Press and hold the power button for 3 seconds.

Sleep Mode On/Off (energy saver): While unit is on, press & release the power button quickly.

Touch-Screen Navigation

The touch-screen allows for quick, easy and convenient navigation for all applications.

Throughout the User Guide, you will be instructed to use the following touch navigation methods:

Tap = <u>quick</u> touch and release your finger on an item on the screen (i.e., selecting items)

Touch & hold = touch your finger and hold in place until a response by application. (i.e., display dictionary, add note to book page, paste selected text onto web page)

Finger slide = <u>quick</u> touch & slide your finger across the screen, and then release (i.e., turning pages of your book)

Touch, hold & slide = touch your finger, hold & slide your finger across the screen, and then release (i.e., highlighting text, selecting text to paste)

Using the Stylus

A stylus is conveniently stored in the bottom end of your device. When desired, you can use it instead of your finger for easier and sometimes more accurate screen navigation when tapping small options.

Reset Device

In the event that your device does not respond to your touch, you can reboot/restart it by pressing and holding the power button for 10 seconds.

Getting Started

1. Charge your device

Plug the power adapter into an electrical wall outlet, and then connect to your device to fully charge the battery before use *(approx. 4 hours)*.

2. Turn device on

Press and hold the power button for 1 second to turn on.

You can use the device while the battery is charging.

3. Select Language

1. Tap next to the desired language.



2. Tap Save.

4. Wi-Fi Network Setup

The pandigital novel will automatically scan and list local Wi-Fi Networks found. A \bigcirc indicates secure networks that require login name/key to connect.



- 1. Tap the desired network to which you want to connect.
- 2. If applicable, enter the network Password.
- 3. Tap Connect.
- 4. Tap to continue.
- ❖ If your Wi-Fi network broadcast is set as hidden, it will not be found by the auto scan. Tap Add Network and then enter the network name and password, → tap Connect.
- (Advanced) After saving the Wi-Fi network, you can change your network settings by selecting Manual Setup, and then follow the prompts.

5. Email Setup

POP3, SMTP and IMAP accounts are supported.



- Enter your Name, Email Address and Password, → tap Save.
 This will be your default account unless you add other email addresses later, and then you can select a different address as the default account (pg. 45).
- 2. *(optional)* To select the account type, tap **Manual Setup** and then select the account type.

6. Setup Complete

After the initial setup is complete, the $\ensuremath{\textbf{HOME}}$ screen is displayed.

BOOKSTORE (Barnes & Noble)

You must be connected to a Wi-Fi network in order to use the Barnes & Noble Bookstore feature.

Tap **Bookstore** to launch the browser and display the Barnes & Noble store locator page.

Bookstore Row

The top row on the **Home** screen displays the current Barnes & Noble bestselling books which can be purchased directly from the Barnes & Nobel online bookstore.

When you are connected to your Wi-Fi network, the Bookstore contents will automatically get updated once a day from the Barnes & Noble website.

Tap on a book icon in the Bookstore row to display the book's descriptive information and synopsis.

Tap **BUY NOW** to go to the Barnes & Noble store to purchase the book now.

Downloading Purchased Media

After purchasing media from the Barnes & Noble online store, you can download it to your pandigital novel using the Get Books feature (pg. 16).

MY LIBRARY



Select **My Library** from the Application Quick Launch Bar to display the main **Library** bookshelf screen and manage your downloaded media.

- Top Function Menu
- 2 Top row last 2 eBooks eMagazines, and 1 eNewspaper read (non scrollable)
- **3** Rows 2-4 additional media stored in device (scrollable)
- 4 Hide & open the Application Quick Launch Bar
- **5** Tap for list of other Bookshelves



While viewing media, turn your device to rotate the orientation of the screen from vertical to horizontal. When desired, you can lock the screen orientation to prevent the auto-rotation (Reader only. pg. 26).

Quick Jump to another Bookshelf

In the **My Library** bookshelf screen, tap **My Library** in the upper right of screen to display the list of all available bookshelves, → tap the desired bookshelf to open. Tap **Bookshelves** from top function menu to create new bookshelves (pg. 19).

Get Books



To use the Get Books feature, you must have an account with Barnes & Noble, and already purchased media online from their site.

If you have not yet registered an account with them, do so now by going to the Barnes & Noble website: www.bn.com.

- You must be connected to a Wi-Fi network in order to connect to and download media from the Barnes & Noble website.
- 1. In the My Library screen, tap Get Books.
- 2. Enter your Barnes & Noble account **User ID** and **Password**, → tap **Login**.
 - Your login information will be saved for future downloads.
- To download <u>all</u> purchased media, tap **Download All**.
 To download <u>specific</u> items, tap next to the items you want to download now, → tap **Download Selected**.
 - The media will be downloaded and added to your Library.
- 4. The first time you tap on the downloaded media to open it, you will be presented with an 'unlock' message; enter the required information to unlock the media file.

Manage Books



Use this feature to delete media from your My Library bookshelf.

- In the My Library screen, tap Manage Books to display a complete list of all media you have added to your My Library bookshelf.
- Media is sorted by date; if desired, tap **Title** or **Author** to re-sort your media accordingly.
- 3. Tap next to the media you want to delete, → tap **Delete Selected**.

Lend/Return Books



There are some books that Barnes & Noble classifies as "*lendable*", which means that those books can be loaned to others who also have a Barnes & Noble account.

Please be aware of the following considerations before loaning or borrowing any books:

- In order to unlock and open a loaned book, the recipient must use their name and credit card number that is registered with their Barnes & Noble account.
- The book can only be loaned for 14 days.
- Only one copy of a book can be read at a time. Therefore, you won't have access to the book until after it has been returned from the recipient.

- You must be connected to a Wi-Fi network before you can use the Lend/Return Books function.
- When present, the number that appears with the Lend/Return icon indicates new activity within this feature.
- After launching the Lend/Return feature, a pop-up window appears. A number behind Return books indicates books expiring in 3 days or less. A number behind Check for offers indicates new offers pending.

Loan a Book

- 1. In the My Library screen, tap Lend/Return.
- 2. Tap Lend books in the pop-up window.
- 3. Tap \square next to a book that you want to lend, \rightarrow tap **Lend**.
- Tap in the email address entry field to enter the email address of your recipient.
- Tap in the message window to enter a personal message to accompany the media. The recipient will receive the message when they log into their B&N account.
- 6. Tap Lend Book.
- 7. The media will now be listed as 'PENDING_LEND', awaiting the recipient's acceptance or decline.

Return a Borrowed Book

- 1. In the My Library screen, tap Lend/Return.
- 2. Tap Return books in the pop-up window.
- 3. Tap \square next to the borrowed book that you want to return, \rightarrow tap **Return**.

Check for Offers

Use this function to check for book loan offers that you have not yet accepted or declined.

- 1. In the My Library screen, tap Lend/Return.
- 2. Tap ${f Check\ for\ offers\ }$ in the pop-up window.
- Tap next to the offers you want to accept or decline, tap → Accept or Decline accordingly.
- Use the Get Books feature to add the loaned book to your My Library bookshelf.
- Declined books will be permanently removed from the Book Offers screen.

Opening Lent/Borrowed Books

After the recipient downloads the book, it will appear in the recipient's **My Library** in a locked status.

To unlock and open the book for the first time, the recipient must provide their name and credit card number that is registered with their Barnes & Noble account.

Bookshelves



Use **Bookshelves** to create and manage personalized bookshelves into which you want to save your downloaded media (i.e., Short Stories, Drama, etc.).

* The number of books within a bookshelf will be displayed in the right column.

Add New Bookshelf

- 1. In the My Library screen, tap Bookshelves.
- 2. Tap Add Shelf.
- 3. Enter the desired bookshelf name (i.e., Short Stories, Drama, etc.).
- 4. Tap 📵 to create the new bookshelf. (Use Manage Bookshelf to add media to the new bookshelf.)

Manage Bookshelf

Use **Manage Bookshelf** to add to and remove media from bookshelves.

- 1. In the My Library screen, tap Bookshelves.
- 2. Tap next to the bookshelf you want to add or remove media, → tap Manage Bookshelf.
- Media is sorted by date; if desired, tap Title or Author to re-sort your media accordingly.
- Tap
 next to the media you want to add to the bookshelf, or tap
 to delete from the bookshelf.
- 5. Tap Save to update your bookshelf.

Display Shelf

- 1. In the My Library screen, tap Bookshelves.
- 2. Tap next to the bookshelf you want to display, → tap **Display Shelf**.
- 3. The screen's layout will resemble the **My Library** screen, with your last read media in the top row and other downloaded media in rows 2-4.
- Media is sorted by date; if desired, tap **Title** or **Author** to re-sort your media accordingly.

Quick Open another Bookshelf

Tap the bookshelf name in the upper right of any bookshelf screen to display the list of all bookshelves, → tap the desired bookshelf to open.

Delete Shelf

- 1. In the My Library screen, tap Bookshelves.
- 2. Tap next to the bookshelf you want to delete.
- 3. Tap Delete.

Update



You can check for new releases or updates to your Barnes & Noble eMagaine or eNewspaper subscriptions whenever desired.

You must be connected to a Wi-Fi network before you can perform the Update function.

In the My Library screen, tap Update.

If new releases or updates are found, they will be reflected in your **My Library** bookshelf accordingly *(row 1, spot 3, 4 and 5)*.

READER




The **Reader** application is for displaying your digital media (*eBooks*, *eMagazines*, and *eNewspapers*).

eBook supported formats: PDF, EPUB

Methods that can be used to launch the Reader:

- Select Reader from the Application Quick Launch Bar; the last read media file will open.
- Tap on a media icon in the **Home** or any **Bookshelf** screen.



- The Function Menu appears at the top of the screen for 3 seconds and then auto hides. Tap anywhere on the screen (except) to re-display it.
- Finger slide left or right to turn pages.
- Touch, hold & slide across text to Highlight text.
- Touch & hold on a word to add a Note or display the Dictionary.
- ❖ Tap to display the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- To turn Sleep Mode On/Off, press & release the power button quickly.

Play Music in Background while Reading

You can play music in the background as you read media files.

- Tap Music in the Application Quick Launch Bar, and then select the desired audio files to play.
- 2. Tap to minimize the **Music Play** screen; the music will continue to play as background music.
- 3. Open the desired media file in the Reader.
- 4. While reading, you can tap <a> in the upper left corner of the reader screen to display the music navigation bar.



Use the controls to pause/play and play previous/next. Use the volume buttons on the top of your device to adjust the volume.

- 5. Tap again to close the navigation bar and leave music playing.
- 6. Tap M to stop the music and close the navigation bar.

To return to the **Music List** screen, select **Music** again from the Application Quick Launch Bar.

Reader Function Menu

When the Reader application is launched, the **Function Menu** is displayed at the top of the screen for 3 seconds, and then auto hides.



To re-display the **Function Menu**, tap anywhere on the screen (except ______).





To access the main Library bookshelf while viewing a media page, display the top function menu, \rightarrow tap **My Library**.

Dictionary



The built-in dictionary allows you to quickly and conveniently look up the definition of words, either within the media you are viewing or any other words.

- 1. While viewing a media page, display the top function menu, → tap **Dictionary**.
- Tap in the word entry field. As you begin to enter text, matching words will appear.
- 3. Tap the desired word from the matching word list; the definition will appear and the keyboard will disappear.
- 4. Tap **New Search** to clear the entry field and display the keyboard again.

Automatic Lookup

- 1. While viewing a media page, touch & hold on the word you want to look up.
- 2. Tap **Dictionary** in the **Reader Options** pop-up window.
- 3. The dictionary will automatically search for the selected word, and will display the results in the dictionary dialog window.



When desired, you can bookmark pages, add notes to pages, and highlight text on pages, and then later quickly return to those pages.

Bookmarks

- 1. To **bookmark** a page, tap in the upper right corner of the page. The symbol will change to , indicating the page has been bookmarked.
- 2. To display the list of all bookmarks you have created in the media you are currently viewing, display the top function menu, → tap **Bookmarks**.
- 3. To **return to a bookmarked page**, tap next to desired bookmark, → tap **View**.
- 4. To delete bookmarks, tap on while displaying a bookmarked page, or while in the Bookmarks screen, tap next to the desired bookmark, → tap Delete Selected.

Notes

As you read your media, you can quickly and easily make notes on pages for later reference.

Add Note

- On a page, touch & hold on any word to open the Reader options pop-up window.
- 2. Tap Add Note. The Notes dialog window will open.
- 3. Tap into the note entry area, enter the desired text.
- 4. Tap **Add**.
- 5. The word related to the note will be highlighted in blue.

View Notes

- 1. To display a note on a page, tap on the highlighted word associated with the note you want to view.
- 2. To display a list of <u>all</u> notes you have added to a media file, display the top function menu, → tap **Bookmarks**.
- 3. Tap Notes.
- 4. Tap I next to the notes you want to view, → tap View.
- 5. The **Notes** dialog box displays the first note you selected.
- 6. To scroll through selected notes, tap
- 7. To jump to the page associated with a note, tap View Page.
- 8. To delete the currently viewed note, tap **Delete**.

Delete Notes

- 1. Display the top function menu, → tap **Bookmarks**.
- 2. Tap Notes.
- 3. Tap Inext to the notes you want to delete, → tap Delete Selected.

Highlights

As you read your media, you may want to highlight points of interest for later reference.

Create Highlights

- 1. On a page, touch, hold & slide your finger across the text that you want to highlight.
- 2. The Reader options pop-up window will appear.
- Tap Highlight; your text will be highlighted in yellow (normal view) or orange (night read).

View Highlights

- To display the list of all highlights you have created in the media you are currently viewing, display the top function menu, → tap Bookmarks.
- 2. Tap Highlights.
- 3. Tap Inext to the highlights you want to view, → tap View.
- 4. To scroll through the selected highlights, tap

 ...
- 5. To jump to the page associated with a highlight, tap View Page.
- 6. To delete the currently viewed highlight, tap **Delete**.

Hide all Highlights

- To turn all highlights off in the currently open media file, display the top function menu, → tap Bookmarks.
- 2. Tap Highlights.
- 3. Tap **Highlights Off** (= highlights are hidden).

Delete Multiple Highlights

- 1. Display the top function menu, → tap **Bookmarks**.
- 2. Tap Highlights.
- 3. Tap next to the highlights you want to delete, → tap **Delete Selected**.



Use the **Go To** function for quick access to the Table of Contents, a particular page, chapter, or string of text *(word or phrase)* within the document you are viewing.

Display Table of Contents

- While viewing a media page, display the top function menu, → tap Go To.
- Tap Contents to display the Table of Contents.
- 3. Tap on a chapter title to jump to that chapter.

Jump to Page or Chapter

- While viewing a media page, display the top function menu, → tap Go To.
- 2. Tap Page or Chapter.
- 3. Enter the page or chapter number you want to view, \rightarrow tap **GO**.

Search for Specific Text

- While viewing a media page, display the top function menu, → tap Go To.
- 2. Tap Word.
- Enter the desired text, → tap GO.
 All instances of the found text will be highlighted throughout the document.
- You can scroll through the pages for all highlighted text, → tap Cancel Find to return to the original page you were viewing. OR

You can touch any of the highlighted text to automatically cancel the find mode, and then that page becomes the current page.

Last Read

After performing searches, you can quickly return to the last page you were reading.

- 1. Tap top area of screen to display the top menu, → tap **Go To**.
- 2. Tap Last Read.

Font Size



For optimal viewing, you can adjust the size of the onscreen text by changing the **Font Size**.

- While viewing a media page, display the top function menu, → tap Font Size to change the text size.
- Continue to tap Font Size multiple times to change the font size from small, medium, large, and X-large, until you achieve the desired size.

Night Read



Night Read switches the background to black with white text, allowing you to view media without emitting as much light as the normal view mode.

Normal view mode is white background with black text.

Night Read view mode is black background with white text.

- While viewing a media page, display the top function menu, → tap Night Read.
- 2. To switch back to normal view mode, tap Day Read.

Screen Orientation - Lock



For optimal viewing while reading, the orientation of the screen automatically rotates from vertical to horizontal depending on how you hold your device.

When desired, you can lock the screen in the desired orientation to prevent the auto-rotation (in Reader only).

To lock, while viewing a media page in the desired orientation, display the top function menu, \rightarrow tap **Lock**.

To unlock, display the top function menu, \rightarrow tap **Unlock**.

ACCESS MEDIA ON SD CARD

If desired, you can access your media directly on a SD card without importing the media into the internal memory.

1. Insert your SD card into your device.

- 2. Your device will automatically scan the SD card to find digital printed media files (eBooks, eMagazines, and eNewspapers).
- If appropriate files are found, the My Library screen will display the additional media icons.
- 4. Tap on the desired media icon to launch the **Reader** application.

WEB



Use the Web feature to access the Internet and 'surf the web' and visit your favorite web sites.

- The Web feature requires a connection to a Wi-Fi network. If you have not set up your Wi-Fi network, do so now using the instructions on page 47.
- While viewing the browser, you can turn your device to rotate the orientation of the screen from vertical to horizontal.

Go to a Web Site

 Select Web from the Application Quick Launch Bar to launch the internet browser.



- 2. To go to a web site, tap **Go To**; the keypad will appear so you can enter the desired web site address.
- 3. Tap **Go** on keypad to go to the web site address.

The **Options Menu** is displayed at the top of the browser screen.

Bookmarks



You can bookmark web pages that you visit and want quick access to later.

Bookmark a Web Page

- 1. In an open browser window, tap **Bookmarks**, → tap **Add Boomark**.
- If you want to rename the bookmark, tap in the Name field and enter the desired name.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

Go to Bookmarked Web Page

- 1. On the browser window, tap **Bookmarks**.
- 2. In the **Bookmarks** window, tap on the desired web page.
- 3. The browser will go to the selected web page.

Delete Bookmarks

- 1. On the browser window, tap **Bookmarks**.
- 2. In the **Bookmarks** window, tap next to the bookmarks you want to delete, → tap **Delete Selected**.
- 3. In confirmation, tap **OK** to delete.
- 4. Tap to close the window and return to the web page.

New Window



Up to the last 8 websites you have visited are cached and listed in the **Windows** screen allowing you to quickly return to them.

Open New Window

- 1. In an open browser window, tap **New Window**.
- 2. Tap **Go to** and then enter the new web site address, → tap **Go**.

Switch Windows

- 1. In an open browser window, tap **New Window**.
- 2. Tap on the window that you want to view.

Close Windows

- 1. In an open browser window, tap **New Window**.
- 2. Tap M on each window you want to close.
- When you're in the Browser application, at least one window must be open, so if you close all windows, a new window will automatically open.

Settings



You can set browser settings to enhance your Internet browsing.

In an open the browser window, tap **Settings**.

Page Content

Set the following options pertaining to viewing web pages:

- Text size (display text as Tiny, Small, Normal, Large, Huge)
- Text Encoding (Latin, Unicode, Japanese)
- Block pop-up windows (prevents pop-up windows from automatically displaying when web pages include them)
- Load images (display images if included on web pages)
- Auto-fit pages (automatically fit the webpage to the screen)
- Enable JavaScript (allows JavaScripts to run if included on web page)
- Open in background (open new window when you select a link on a web page, rather than replace the current web page)
- Set home page (desired web page to be displayed when browser opens)

Privacy

Set the following options pertaining to your privacy level when viewing web pages:

- Clear cache (delete all cached information from visited web pages)
- Clear history (clear the browser navigation history)
- Accept cookies (allow websites to save and read "cookie" data from your device whenever you visit their site)
- Clear all cookie data (clears all browser cookies that have been saved)
- Remember form data (remembers data you entered into forms for later use)
- Clear form data

Security

Set the following options pertaining to the security level when logging into secure web pages:

- Remember passwords (saves your user names and passwords for all websites that require that information when establishing accounts with them)
- Clear passwords (clears all the saved usernames and passwords)
- Show security warning (alerts you of a problem with website's security)

Advanced Settings

Set the following advanced options:

- Enable Gears (set for applications that extend browser functionality)
- Gears Settings (settings for applications that extend browser functionality)
- Reset to default (clears all browser data and resets to default settings)

Find on Page



You can search for a string of text within the currently displayed web page.

- 1. In an open browser window, tap \bigcirc , \rightarrow tap **Find on page**.
- Enter the desired string of text (word, phrase, etc.) in the entry field. All matching text will be highlighted as you enter the text.
- 3. If you want to scroll through multiple matches, tap

 .
- 4. Tap 🖹 to close the entry box and resume normal viewing.

Select Text abc

You can select the text of a web page address on the web page you're viewing, and then you can paste the text into the browser entry field.

- 1. On the browser window, tap \bigcirc , \rightarrow tap **Select Text**.
- 2. Touch, hold & slide your finger across the text you want to copy.
- 3. Touch and hold in the top URL entry field; the text will be pasted.
- If you've pasted a URL address, tap **Done** on keypad to go to the new web page.

Share



Use Share to chat with other users.

- 1. On the browser window, tap \bigcirc , \rightarrow tap **Share**.
- 2. Tap into the To field.
- 3. Tap into the message field to enter your messages.

Downloads



As you download files from web sites, the download history is recorded in the device. You can cancel downloads or clear the history through this feature.

- 1. On the browser window, tap \bigcirc , \rightarrow tap **Select Text**.
- 2. Tap Clear download list if you want to clear all download history.
- Tap Cancel all downloads if you want to stop all pending downloads from downloading.

MUSIC



These audio file formats are supported: MP3, WMA, AAC

Methods that can be used to add audio files to your Music List:

- Import audio files from an SD card
- Save audio files from email attachments
- Download audio files from online music websites

Play Music

- 1. Select **Music** from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- Select the desired media source from which you want to play your audio files.
- 3. The Music List screen will be displayed.
- 4. When **Shuffle** is off, audio files will play in the order listed in the **Music List**. To play audio files in random order, tap **Shuffle** to turn on $\bigcirc = on$.
- 5. When **Repeat** is off, selected audio files will play once and then stop. To play audio files continuously, tap **Repeat** to turn on (= on).
- 6. If you want the songs sorted by song title rather than artist, tap **Title**.

- 7. To play <u>all</u> songs listed, tap **Select All**, → tap **Play Selected**.
 - To play one song, tap on the song listing.
- 8. When the Music Play screen is displayed:
 - Use the control panel (by bause/play, and play previous/next audio file.
 - Use the volume buttons on the top of your device to adjust the volume.
 - Tap to re-display the music play buttons.
 - Tap to return to previous screens; the music will continue to play.

Delete Audio Files

In the **Music List** screen, tap mext to the desired audio files to delete, → tap **Delete Selected**.

Playlist

If desired, you can build a separate playlist of selected audio files from your Music List, allowing you to play the selected list at any time (i.e., your favorites, specific genre, specific artist, etc.).

Add songs to Playlist

- 1. In the **Music List** screen tap next to the song titles you want to add.
- 2. Tap Add to Playlist.
- Tap in the New entry field, → enter desired name for your playlist, → tap Save.
- 4. Repeat steps to add another playlist or add music to existing playlist.

Play songs in Playlist

- 1. In the Music List screen, tap Playlist, \rightarrow tap desired playlist.
- 2. The Music Play window will be displayed. Follow the instructions for playing music beginning on page 32.

Remove songs from Playlist

- In the Playlist screen, tap next to the desired audio files to you want to remove from the Playlist.
- 2. Tap Delete Selected.
- Deleting audio files from the Playlist does not delete them from the main Music List.

Return to Music List

In the Playlist screen, tap Artist or Title to return to the Music List screen.

VIDEOS



The video file format supported: MPEG4

Methods that can be used to add videos to the internal memory:

- Import video files from an SD card
- Save video files from email attachments
- Download videos from online video websites.

Play Video

- 1. Select Videos from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- 2. Select the desired media source from which you want to play your video files.
- 3. The Video Gallery screen will be displayed.
- 4. Tap on a video, → tap Play.
- While viewing your video, you can turn your device to rotate the orientation of the screen from vertical to horizontal.

Video Navigation Bar

While your video is playing, tap anywhere on the screen to display the video navigation bar at the bottom of the screen.



Use the controls to pause/play, and play previous/next video.

Use the volume buttons on the top of your device to adjust the volume.

Tap le to close the navigation bar and resume normal viewing.

Delete from Video Library

In the Video Gallery screen:

- 1. To delete <u>all</u> videos, tap **Select All**, and then **Delete Selected**.
- To delete <u>selected</u> videos, tap Multi-Select, → tap on the desired video files you want to delete, → tap Delete Selected.

PHOTOS



These photo file formats are supported: JPEG, BMP, PNG, and GIF (non-animated)
The following methods can be used to add photos to the internal memory:

- Import photos from an SD card (pg. 42)
- Save photos files from email attachments
- Download photos from your favorite online photo sharing websites

Photo Gallery

- While viewing your photos, you can turn your device to rotate the orientation of the screen from vertical to horizontal.
- 1. Select **Photos** from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- 2. Select the desired media source from which you want to view your photos.
- 3. The Photo Gallery screen will be displayed.
- To view a <u>single</u> photo, tap on the desired photo, → tap View.
 To view <u>multiple</u> photos, tap Multi-Select, → tap on each photo you want to view, → tap View.

When a photo is displayed in full-screen mode, the Function Menu appears at the top of the screen and the papears at the bottom of the screen for 4 seconds. After they disappear, tap anywhere on the screen to re-display them.

If you leave the photo displayed on the screen for approximately 20 seconds, the slideshow will automatically begin to play.

Play Slideshow

You can set photo slideshow display functions through Settings> Photos (pg.44).

To play a slideshow of <u>all</u> photos, in the **Photo Gallery** screen, tap **Select All**, → tap **Slideshow**.

To play a slideshow of <u>selected</u> photos, tap **Multi-Select**, \rightarrow tap on each photo you want to include, \rightarrow tap **Slideshow**.

When the slideshow is playing, tap anywhere on the screen to display the top Function Menu and the for the Application Quick Launch Menu Bar.

Play Music in Background

You can play music in the background as you play a slideshow.

- 1. Be sure your **Settings >Photos >Enable Music with Slideshow** is selected.
- 2. Start your slideshow as instructed above.
- The music will automatically play in the background as your slideshow is displayed.



You can assign any photo from the **Internal Memory** as your display wallpaper.

- 1. Select **Photos** from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- If you have an SD card inserted, a Select Media Source pop-up window will appear. Select the Internal Memory.
- In the Photo Gallery screen, tap the desired photo, → tap View, → tap Wallpaper.
- 4. Tap \supset to return to the **Photo Gallery** screen.

Import Photos



You can import photos from your SD card into the internal memory when desired.

- 1. Insert your SD card.
- 2. Select **Photos** from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- 3. Tap SD Card in the Select Media Source pop-up window.
- To import individual photo, tap on the photo that you want to import, → tap Import Selected.

To import <u>multiple</u> photos, tap Multi Select, → tap desired photos to import, → tap **Import Selected**.

EMAIL



- ❖ POP3, SMTP and IMAP accounts are supported.
- While viewing your email, you can turn your device to rotate the orientation of the screen from vertical to horizontal.

Email Inbox

- Select Email from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- If you set up an email account during the initial setup, it will be listed in the Email Accounts screen.
- ❖ If you did not set up an email account during the initial setup, or would like to set up a new account, tap Settings, → tap Add Account.
- 3. Tap directly on the email account, or tap ☐ next to the email account, → tap Inbox.

Open Email Message

- 1. In the **Inbox** screen, tap on an email to open it.
- 2. Tap **Reply** to reveal and select the reply options:
 - Reply
 - Reply all
 - Forward
 - Save Attachments
 - Attachment files must be of a supported format in order to be saved in yourpandigital novel. Save files into the respective folders (i.e., photo files into Photos folder, etc.)
- To display the previous or next email message listed in the Inbox, tap Previous or Next.
- If you want to add this message to a folder, tap Folders, → tap the desired folder name.
- 5. If you want to delete the message, tap **Delete**.

Compose New Email Message

- 1. In the Inbox screen, tap Compose.
- Tap in the To/CC/BCC entry field and then enter the recipient's email address. OR
 - Tap Add Contacts to select the recipient(s) from your Contacts list.
- 3. Tap in the **Subject** entry field to enter your desired subject title.
- 4. Tap in the **message** area to enter your personal message.
- 5. If desired, tap **Add Attachment** to attach a file.
- 6. Tap **Send** when ready to send your email.
- 7. You can save your message without sending it by tapping Save Draft.
- 8. If you do not want to send or save the message, tap **Discard**.

Add Senders to Contacts

- If you want to add senders' email addresses to your Contacts list, tap next to the desired email messages, → tap Add to Contacts.
- 2. The email address will be saved. If you want to add additional contact information (*i.e.*, name, phone, address, etc.) to this contact, use the **Contacts** feature (pq. 43).

Folders

To help you keep your email messages organized, you can create personalized folders into which you can move your emails.

- 1. In the Inbox screen, tap Folders.
- 2. Enter your desired folder name, → tap ⊕.

Move Single Email to Folder

- 1. In **Inbox** screen, tap an email to open it.
- 2. Tap **Folders**, → tap the desired folder name.

Move Multiple Emails to Folder

- 1. In the **Inbox** screen, tap \square next to the desired emails, \rightarrow tap **Folders**.
- 2. In the **Folders** screen, tap the desired folder name into which you want to move the selected emails.

Add Accounts

You can enter multiple personal email addresses that you would like to access through your pandigital novel.

- 1. Select **Email** from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- 2. On the Email Accounts screen, tap Settings.
- 3. On the Email Settings screen, tap Add Account.
- 4. Enter your Name, Email Address, and Password.
- Manual Setup (optional): The server settings will automatically be populated based on your email account provider (i.e., Gmail, yahoo, etc.). However, if you need to change the server settings tap Manual Setup and make necessary changes.
- 6. Tap Save.

Edit Email Information

- On the Add Account screen, tap Manual Setup to edit the email account information.
- 2. The server settings will automatically be populated based on your email account provider (i.e., Gmail, yahoo, etc.). However, if necessary, make changes to the server settings as desired.
- 3. Tap **Save**.

Delete Email Accounts

- If you have multiple accounts, and you delete the account designated as the default account, the next email listed will automatically be set as the default.
- 1. Select **Email** from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- 2. On the Email Accounts screen, tap Settings.
- 3. Tap next to the desired accounts to delete, → tap **Delete Account**.

Set Default Account

One email address must be designated as the default account, so if you have multiple email accounts you can designate any one as the default.

- 1. Select Email from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- On the Email Accounts screen, tap Settings.
- 3. Tap \blacksquare next to the desired account to set as default, \rightarrow tap **Set as Default**. If you delete the account that was designated as the default account, the next email listed will automatically be designated as the default.

SHOP B&N



Select **Shop B&N** from the Application Quick Launch Bar to go to the Barnes & Noble store locator web page.

Downloading Purchased Media

After purchasing media through the Barnes & Noble online store, you can download it to your pandigital novel using the **Get Books** feature (pg. 16).

ALARM



You can use your pandigital **novel** as an alarm clock by setting multiple alarms.

Tap **Alarm** in the Application Quick Launch Bar for quick access to the Alarm setup under **Settings** (pg. 45).



Select Calendar from the Application Quick Launch Bar.

- . The gray shaded date is current date.
- Green tabs indicate scheduled events on dates.



Add Event

- 1. On the Calendar screen, tap on the date to which you want to add an event.
- 2. Tap Add Event.
- 3. Tap in each entry field to enter the desired event information, \rightarrow tap **Save**.
- 4. Repeat steps 2-3 for additional events on the same date.
- 5. Tap to return to the Calendar screen.

Edit Event

- 1. On the Calendar screen, tap on the date with the event you want to edit.
- 2. Tap on the event you want to change.
- 3. Make desired changes, \rightarrow tap **Save**.
- 4. Tap for to return to the Calendar screen.

Event Reminders

If you assigned one or more reminders, a pop-up window will appear for scheduled events.

Tap **Snooze all** if you want to be reminded again in the number of minutes you specified when you added the event.

Tap **Dismiss all** to cancel the alert.

Delete Events

- 1. On the Calendar screen, tap Manage Events.
- 2. Tap next to each event you want to delete → tap **Delete Selected**.
- 3. Tap en to return to the Calendar screen.

SEARCH



You can search for a specific string of text in media file names.

- 1. Select **Search** from the Application Quick Launch Bar.
- 2. Tap into the search entry field and enter the desired text.
- 3. Tap **Search**.
- 4. The search results will be displayed, sorted by Books, Photos, Music, and Videos.
- 5. Tap on a listed file to access it.

IMPORT SD CARD



You can quickly and easily import \underline{all} media files of selected media types from your SD card.

- 1. Insert your SD card.
- 2. Open the Application Quick Launch Bar and then select Import SD.
- In the Import Media window:
 Tap All to import all files of all media types, or tap next to only the desired media type(s).
 - If you want to import <u>selected</u> photos, use the Import Photos function (pg. 37).
- 4. Tap Import.

STOCKS



You can quickly check the status of specific company's stock offerings.

Select **Stocks** from the Application Quick Launch Bar. The browser will launch and display a popular Finance webpage.

FACEBOOK



Select **Facebook** from the Application Quick Launch Bar. The browser will launch and display your Facebook login window; enter your login information to log into your Facebook account.

CONTACTS



You can create an address book of your personal contacts, including personal notes as desired.

Select Contacts from the Application Quick Launch Bar.

Add New Contacts

- 1. In the Contacts screen, tap Add Contact.
- In the Add Contact screen, tap in each entry field to enter your contact information.
- 3. Tap **Save**.
- You can also add contact email addresses directly from received emails (pg. 38).

Edit Contacts

- In the Contacts screen, tap on the desired contact name that you want to edit.
- In the Edit Contact screen, tap in the entry fields to change or add information.
- 3. Tap Save.

Delete Contacts

In the Contacts screen, tap next to the contacts you want to delete, → tap Delete Selected.

OR

In the Contacts screen, tap on the contact you want to delete, → tap Delete.

2. Tap **OK** to confirm the deletion.

WEATHER



You can quickly check the weather forecasts of desired locations.

Select **Weather** from the Application Quick Launch Bar. The browser will launch and display a popular Weather webpage.

SETTINGS



Settings>General

- 1. Select **Settings** from the Application Quick Launch Bar, → tap **General**.
- Tap in the Email address and Password fields to enter your Barnes & Noble account login information.
- 3. Tap in the **Date** and **Time** fields to set the current date and time.
- 4. Select your desired time format:
 - **12** = 12:00am-12:00pm (default)
 - **24** = 12:00-24:00
- 5. Tap in the **Language** field to select desired language from the drop-down list.
- 6. Tap & slide to adjust the screen brightness.

 When **Auto Brightness** is selected, your device senses the light exposure and will automatically adjust the screen's brightness accordingly (i.e., in dark environments the screen will automatically brighten).
- 7. Tap the desired setting for the **Keyboard and System Sounds** (i.e., keyboard click, end of row ding, warning ding, etc.).

Settings>Photos

Use these functions to set your Slideshow preferences.

Select Settings from the Application Quick Launch Bar, → tap Photos.

- Tap in the Slideshow Interval field to select the speed at which the slideshow photos transition from one to another (default = 5 seconds), → tap OK.
- 3. Tap next to the desired **Slideshow Transition** to set the special effects as slideshow photos transition from one to another (*default = Random*).
- 4. Tap **Enable Music with Slideshow** if you want music to automatically play as background music with your slideshows.
- 5. Tap **Display Current Date and Time** if you want to display the current time with your photos during your slideshows.

Settings>Network

In order to connect to the Internet, you must have a Wi-Fi network set up on your pandigital novel. If you did not set up a network during the initial setup, do so now.

- 1. Select **Settings** from the Application Quick Launch Bar, → tap **Network**.
- 2. If your Wi-Fi network is not listed, tap **Rescan**.
- 3. The device will scan and list local Wi-Fi Networks found. A indicates secure networks that require login name/key to connect.
- 4. Tap the desired network to which you want to connect.
- 5. If the network is secure, enter the **Network Password** in the pop-up window.
- 6. Tap **Connect**.
- ❖ If your Wi-Fi network is set as hidden, it will not be found by the auto scan. Tap Add Network and then enter the network name and key, → tap Save.
- (Advanced): After saving the Wi-Fi network, you can change your network settings by selecting Manual Setup, and then follow the prompts.

Turn Wi-Fi Off

There may be times when you want to prevent your device from connecting to a Wi-Fi network, even if you've set the network up on your device.

On the **Network** screen, tap very next to **Wi-Fi** to turn off. Tap to turn back on.

- When the Network is turned off, you will not be able to launch applications that require a Wi-Fi connection (i.e., Web, Email, etc.).

Delete 'Remembered' Wi-Fi Network

When you connect to a Wi-Fi network, the device will remember the settings for future connections. If you have previously connected to networks that you no longer want 'remembered', you can delete them from the Network list.

- 1. Select **Settings** from the Application Quick Launch Bar, → tap **Network**.
- 2. Tap the network that you want to delete, → tap Forget.

Settings>Alarm

This clock icon is displayed at the top of screens indicates that one or more alarms have been set and are active.

Add Alarm

- 1. Select **Settings** from the Application Quick Launch Bar, → tap **Alarm**.
- Tap Add Alarm.
- 3. Tap in the **Label** entry field to enter the desired descriptive label for the alert (i.e., Lunch Meeting).
- 4. Tap in the **Alarm** entry field to enter the time, → tap **Set**.
- 5. Tap Alert and select the desired alert sound.
- If you want the alarm to alert repeatedly on specific days, tap above the desired days.
 - If you don't select a repeat, the alarm will automatically be deleted when it is activated and then dismissed.
- 7. Tap **Save**.
- 8. Repeat steps 2-6 to set up more alarms now, or tap to close the **Add Alarm** screen.

Set Alarm Volume

In the Alarm screen, tap & slide to adjust the volume level of the alert.

Shut Off Alarm Alert

When a scheduled alarm is activated, a pop-up window with the alarm title appears.

Tap **Snooze** if you want to be reminded again in 10 minutes.

Tap **Dismiss** to cancel the alert.

De-Activate Alarms

You may have instances where you want to temporarily de-activate alarms rather than delete them.

- 1. In the Alarm screen, tap ✓ next to the alarm(s) you want to de-activate.
- 2. Tap let to re-activate.

Edit Alarm

- 1. In the Alarm screen, tap Edit.
- 2. Tap the alarm you want to edit, → make desired edits.
- 3. Tap **Save**.
- 4. Tap to return to the Alarm screen.

Delete Alarm

- 1. In the Alarm screen, tap Delete.
- In the Delete Alarm screen, tap the alarm you want to delete, → tap
 Delete.

Settings>Factory Reset

- Resetting the defaults will change general settings back to the factory pre-set defaults (i.e., slideshow preferences). Your media will not be affected.
- Select Settings from the Application Quick Launch Bar, → tap Factory Reset.
- 2. Tap Reset device.
- 3. Tap **YES** to confirm the reset, or tap **NO** to cancel reset.

Settings>Support

Select **Settings** from the Application Quick Launch Bar, → tap **Support**.

The information listed on the **Technical Support Information** screen may be required if you contact Technical Support.

USER GUIDE



To view the full pandigital **novel** User Guide, select **User Guide** from the Application Quick Launch Bar. The User Guide will open in the Reader.

Once open, you can use the standard **Reader** functions to search and navigate through the document in the same manner as your downloaded media files.

The User Guide is also posted on our website: www.pandigital.net/support. Click the **Downloads** tab on the **Support** page.

Connect to Computer

You can connect your pandigital novel to a Windows or Macintosh computer via a USB cable to copy files between the two devices.

❖ Compatible with operating systems: Windows 2000/XP/Vista/7, Mac OSX

Connect to Windows PC

- Connect the small end of the USB cable to the pandigital novel mini USB port, and the larger end to an available USB port on your computer.
- Windows Explorer will open listing all drives connected to your computer; the pandigital novel drive will be listed as PD_Novel.
 There will be 4 pre-assigned folders listed:
 - EBooks (PDF, EPUB)
 - Photos (JPG, JPEG, BMP, PNG, GIF)
 - Music (MP3, WMA, AAC)
 - Videos (MPEG4)
- 3. To copy files <u>into</u> your pandigital **novel**, select and drag the desired files into the appropriate pre-assigned folder based on file type.
 - The device will only recognize files that are of a supported format and resides in the appropriate pre-assigned folder (i.e., photo files must be in Photos folder, etc.). If you create any other folders or sub folders under the pre-assigned folders, the files will not be recognized.
- To copy files <u>from</u> your pandigital novel into your computer, select and drag the desired files to any desired location on your computer.

Disconnect

It is important to always perform a safe PC 'release' before disconnecting the USB cable from the pandigital novel and computer.

Windows 7

- 1. On the Windows System Tray, click the hardware removal icon.
- Click the Eject Removable Disk message corresponding with the pandigital novel device drive.

 When the message "Safe to Remove Hardware" appears, you can disconnect the USB cable from your pandigital novel and computer.

Windows VISTA

- 1. On the Windows System Tray, click the hardware removal icon.
- Click the Safely remove USB mass Storage device message corresponding with the pandigital novel device drive.
- 3. When the message "This device can now be safely removed from the computer" appears, you can disconnect the USB cable from your pandigital novel and computer.

Windows XP

- 1. On the Windows System Tray, click the hardware removal icon.
- 2. Click Remove Hardware Safely.
- Select the storage device corresponding with the pandigital novel, and then click Stop to disconnect. A final dialog box opens.
- Click Close.
- When the message "It is now Safe to Disconnect Hardware" appears, you can disconnect the USB cable from your pandigital novel and computer.

Connect to Macintosh Computer

- Connect the small end of the USB cable to the pandigital novel mini USB port, and the larger end to an available USB port on your computer.
- 2. Macintosh will recognize the pandigital **novel** as an external storage device titled **PD_Novel**.
- 3. Drag and drop files between the two devices as you normally move files.

Disconnect

- To safely disconnect the DPF from your Macintosh, select the PD_Novel icon on your desktop and press Command-e to eject the disk.
- 2. When the icon is no longer on the desktop, it is safe to unplug the USB cable.

Frequently Asked Questions

BASIC FUNCTIONALITY

- Q: Do I have to charge the battery before use?
- **A:** Yes. Charge the battery for at least 4 hours (pg. 9).
- Q: Is it easy to set up my pandigital novel?
- **A:** Yes! Plug in the device to charge the battery, turn the device on, and follow the prompts for the initial setup. (You can use the device while the battery is charging.)
- Q: How do I contact Customer Support?

MY LIBRARY

- Q: How do I add media to My Library?
- **A:** You can download media from Barnes & Noble, import media from your SD card, or copy media files from your computer.
- Q: Can I create personal bookshelves for organizing my media?
- A: Yes. On the My Library screen, tap Bookshelves (pg. 19).
- Q: Do I need an account with Barnes & Noble to download from their site?
- **A:** Yes. You will need an account and purchase media from their site before you can download into your device.
- Q: When it's not visible, how do I display the Application Quick Launch Bar?
- A: Simply tap at the bottom of the screen.

READER

- Q: Can I view media files in either vertical or horizontal orientation?
- **A:** Yes, digital media (eBooks, eMagazines, eNewspapers) or photos. To automatically switch viewing orientation, simply turn your device while viewing these types of media.
- Q: Can I change the size of the displayed text?
- A: Yes. Tap anywhere the top screen area to display the top function menu, → tap Font Size multiple times to toggle between small to X-large text as desired.
- Q: Can I easily jump to a specific page?
- A: Yes. Use either Bookmarks (pg. 23) or the Go To function (pg. 26).

- Q: Can I play music and read at the same time?
- **A:** Yes. You can tap the icon in the upper left corner to display the music navigation bar.
- Q: How do I display the top Function Menu while reading?
- A: Simply tap anywhere on the screen.
- Q: How do I display the Application Quick Launch Bar while reading?
- A: Simply tap anywhere on the screen to display at the bottom of the screen, and then tap
- Q: How do I bookmark a page?
- A: Tap the in the upper right corner of the page (pg. 23).
- Q: Can I highlight text on a page?
- **A:** Yes. On a page, touch, hold & slide your finger across the text that you want to highlight. Tap **Highlight** in the Reader options pop-up window that appears (pg. 24).

Battery Management

The pandigital novel battery is not fully charged out of the box, so it is recommended that you charge the battery for at least 4 hours before you start to use your device.

The rechargeable battery is designed and manufactured to be used and recharged for 500+ complete charge/discharge cycles. The capacity of the battery will reduce each time it is charged/depleted. However, you can still try to prolong the battery's lifetime by following the suggestions below:

- Use your device at least once a week.
- Charge the battery regularly and fully. Never leave the battery fully discharged for a long period of time.
- Always keep your device and the battery away from heat.

Charge Battery
