I have a few comments on this Application. Depending on your responses, kindly understand there may be additional comments.

- 1.) The Operational Description indicates that this device can operate simultaneously on 2.4GHz 802.11g and 5GHz 802.11a. However, the RF Exposure evaluation does not address colocated transmitters. Please resolve this omission and provide a new RF Exposure exhibit showing the effect of summing "worst case" emissions of each transmitter.
- 2.) The RF Exposure exhibit also seems to have an incorrect description for Section 5. Please review.
- 3.) The Manual appears to indicate that this product can operate on illegal channels in the North America. Can the end user change the country code in the software? If so, kindly note that this is not permitted under the Rules.
- 4.) The FCC is now very concerned with intermodulation products which will occur when two transmitters are operating both simultaneously and in close proximity to one another. The External Photographs show but one antenna this leads me to conclude that both transmitters will feed their power to the same antenna. This can cause very large spurious emissions problems for simultaneous transmitters. Please provide test results for spurious emissions with both transmitters operating simultaneously.
