1. GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1. Product Description

The Mobile Action Technology Inc., Model: MA-720 (referred to as the EUT in this report) is Bluetooth Data Suite.

1.3. Test Methodology

Both conducted and radiated testing were performed according to the procedures in ANSI C63.4 (2003). Radiated testing was performed at an antenna to EUT distance 3 meters.

1.4. Test Facility

The open area test site and conducted measurement facility used to collect the radiated data is located on the address of SGS Taiwan Ltd. No. 134, Wu Kung Rd., Wuku Industrial Zone, Taipei Country, Taiwan. 2. SYSTEM TEST CONFIGURATION

2.1. EUT Configuration

The EUT configuration for testing is installed on RF field strength measurement to meet the Commissions requirement and operating in a manner which intends to maximize its emission characteristics in a continuous normal application.

2.2. EUT Exercise

The EUT (Transmitter) was operated in the engineering mode to fix the Tx frequency that was for the purpose of the measurements.

2.3. Test Procedure

2.3.1 Conducted Emissions

The EUT is a placed on as turn table which is 0.8 m above ground plane. According to the requirements in Section 7 & 13 of ANSI C63.4-2003. Conducted emissions from the EUT measured in the frequency range between 0.15 MHz and 30MHz using CISPR Quasi-Peak and Average detector mode.

2.3.2 Radiated Emissions

The EUT is a placed on as turn table which is 0.8 m above ground plane. The turn table shall rotate 360 degrees to determine the position of maximum emission level. EUT is set 3m away from the receiving antenna which varied from 1m to 4m to find out the highest emission. And also, each emission was to be maximized by changing the polarization of receiving antenna both horizontal and vertical. In order to find out the max. emission, the relative positions of this hand-held transmitter (EUT) was rotated through three orthogonal axes according to the requirements in Section 8 & 13 of ANSI C63.4-2003.

Fig. 2.4.1 Configuration of Tested System



4. DESCRIPTION OF TEST MODES

The EUT has been tested under operating condition.

Test program used to control the EUT for staying in continuous transmitting and receiving mode is programmed.

Channel low (2402MHz) · mid (2441MHz) and high (2480MHz) with 741k highest data rate are chosen for full testing.

5.2. EUT Setup

- 1. The conducted emission tests were performed in the test site, using the setup in accordance with the ANSI C63.4-2003.
- 2. The EUT was plug-in the AC/DC Power adapter. The host system was placed on the center of the back edge on the test table. The peripherals was placed on the side of the host PC system. The rear of the EUT and peripherals were placed flushed with the rear of the tabletop.
- 3. The spacing between the peripherals was 10 centimeters.
- 4. External I/O cables were draped along the edge of the test table and bundle when necessary.
- 5. The host system was connected with 110Vac/60Hz power source.

5.3. Measurement Procedure

- 1. The EUT was placed on a table which is 0.8m above ground plane.
- 2. Maximum procedure was performed on the six highest emissions to ensure EUT compliance.
- 3. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured were complete.






6. PEAK OUTPUT POWER MEASUREMENT

6.1. Standard Applicable

For frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band employing at least 75 hopping channels, and all frequency hopping systems in the 5725-5850MHz band: 1Watt. For all other frequency hopping systems in the 2400 – 2483.5MHz band: 0.125 Watts.

6.2. Measurement Procedure

- 1. Place the EUT on the table and set it in transmitting mode.
- 2. Remove the antenna from the EUT and then connect a low loss RF cable from the antenna port to the power meter or spectrum. (Channel power function, RBW, VBW = 1MHz)
- 3. Record the max. reading.
- 4. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured were complete.



Peak Power Output Data Plot (CH Mid)





7.1. Standard Applicable

For frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400MHz-2483.5 MHz no limit for 20dB bandwidth.

7.2. Measurement Procedure

- 1. Place the EUT on the table and set it in transmitting mode.
- 2. Remove the antenna from the EUT and then connect a low loss RF cable from the antenna port to the spectrum analyzer.
- 3. Set the spectrum analyzer as RBW=10KHz (1 % of Bandwidth.), Span=3MHz, Sweep=auto
- 4. Mark the peak frequency and –20dB (upper and lower) frequency.
- 5. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured were complete.



20dB Band Width Test Data CH-Mid





8. 100KHz BANDWIDTH OF BAND EDGES MEASUREMENT

8.1. Standard Applicable

According to §15.247(c), in any 100 KHz bandwidth outside the frequency bands in which the spread spectrum intentional radiator in operating, the radio frequency power that is produced by the intentional radiator shall be at least 20dB below that in the 100KHz bandwidth within the band that contains the highest level of the desired power, In addition, radiated emissions which fall in the restricted bands, as defined in §15.205(a), must also comply with the radiated emission limits specified in 15.209(a).

8.2. Measurement Procedure

- 1. Place the EUT on the table and set it in transmitting mode.
- 2. Remove the antenna from the EUT and then connect a low loss RF cable from the antenna port to the spectrum analyzer.
- 3. Set center frequency of spectrum analyzer = operating frequency.
- 4. Set the spectrum analyzer as RBW, VBW=100KHz, Span=25MHz, Sweep = auto
- 5. Mark Center: 2393MHz and 2487.5MHz.
- 6. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured were complete.
- 7. Radiated Emission refer to section 9.






Conducted Emission: Test Data CH-Low







9. SPURIOUS RADIATED EMISSION TEST

9.1. Standard Applicable

According to §15.247(c), all other emissions outside these bands shall not exceed the general radiated emission limits specified in §15.209(a). And according to §15.33(a)(1), for an intentional radiator operates below 10GHz, the frequency range of measurements: to the tenth harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or to 40GHz, whichever is lower.

9.2. EUT Setup

- 1. The radiated emission tests were performed in the 3 meter open-test site, using the setup in accordance with the ANSI C63.4-2003.
- 2. The EUT was put in the front of the test table. The peripherals was placed on the side of the host system. The rear of the EUT and peripherals were placed flushed with the rear of the tabletop.
- 3. The spacing between the peripherals was 10 centimeters.
- 4. External I/O cables were draped along the edge of the test table and bundle when necessary.
- 5. The host PC system was connected with 110Vac/60Hz power source.

9.3. Measurement Procedure

- 1. The EUT was placed on a turn table which is 0.8m above ground plane.
- 2. The turn table shall rotate 360 degrees to determine the position of maximum emission level.
- 3. EUT is set 3m away from the receiving antenna which varied from 1m to 4m to find out the highest emissions.
- 4. Maximum procedure was performed on the six highest emissions to ensure EUT compliance.
- 5. And also, each emission was to be maximized by changing the polarization of receiving antenna both horizontal and vertical.
- 6. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured were complete.








9.4. Test SET-UP (Block Diagram of Configuration)





Ch Low 3GHz – 26.5GHz







Ch Mid 3GHz - 26.5GHz










Channel Number






Dwell Time Test Data CH-Low

13. Peak Power Spectral Density

13.1. Standard Applicable

According to §15.247(d), for direct sequence systems, the peak power spectral density conducted from the intentional radiator to the antenna shall not be greater than 8 dBm in any 3kHz band during any time interval of continuous transmission.

13.2. Measurement Procedure

- 1. Place the EUT on the table and set it in transmitting mode.
- 2. Remove the antenna from the EUT and then connect a low loss RF cable from the antenna port to the spectrum analyzer.
- 3. Set the spectrum analyzer as RBW = 3KHz, VBW = 10KHz, Span = 300KHz, Sweep=100s
- 4. Record the max. reading.
- 5. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured were complete.





Power Spectral Density Test Plot (CH-Mid)





14. ANTENNA REQUIREMENT

14.1. Standard Applicable

For intentional device, according to §15.203, an intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device.

And according to §15.247(4)(1), system operating in the 2400-2483.5MHz bands that are used exclusively for fixed, point-to-point operations may employ transmitting antennas with directional gain greater than 6dBi provided the maximum peak output power of the intentional radiator is reduced by 1 dB for every 3 dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6 dBi.

14.2. Antenna Connected Construction

The directional gains of antenna used for transmitting is -0.8 dBi, and the antenna connector is designed with permanent attachment and no consideration of replacement. Please see EUT photo for details.

15. RF EXPOSURE

15.1. Standard Applicable

According to §1.1307(b)(1), systems operating under the provisions of this section shall be operated in a manner that ensure that the public is not exposed to radio frequency energy level in excess of the Commission's guideline.

This is a Portable device.

15.2. Measurement Result:

This is a portable device and the Max peak output power is 0.49dBm (0.00112W) lower than low threshold 60/fGHz mW (24.48mW), d<2.5cm in general population category;

The SAR measurement is not necessary.
