The Bluetooth wireless module provides short-range wireless communications that replace the physical cable connections that traditionally link electronic devices.

This guide provides instructions for setting up your Bluetooth module hardware and software, finding and installing the latest versions of the software, and finding additional information and support.

Before You Begin

Before you begin any installation or removal procedures:

- 1. Save your work, exit all applications, and shut down the notebook. If you are not sure whether the notebook is off or in Hibernation, briefly press the power button. If your work returns to the screen, save your work, exit all applications, and then shut down the notebook.
- 2. Disconnect all external devices connected to the notebook.
- 3. Disconnect the power cord.
- 4. Remove the battery pack.
- 5. Attach the label provided in the option kit to the bottom of your computer. This label must be placed on the product to legally operate the Bluetooth module.



Locating the Bluetooth Compartment

For the HP Compaq nc6000 Notebook Series, the Bluetooth compartment is represented by $\mathbf{0}$ in the following illustration.



Installing the Bluetooth Module

CAUTION: To prevent electrostatic discharge from damaging electronic components, discharge yourself of static electricity by touching a grounded metal object. For more information about preventing electrostatic damage, refer to the *Regulatory and Safety Notices* guide on the *Documentation Library* CD.

Before installing the Bluetooth module follow the procedures in the "Before You Begin" section.

Removing the Compartment Cover

For the HP Compaq nc6000 Notebook Series:

- 1. Loosen the captive screw **1** that secures the compartment cover to the computer.
- 2. Lift the compartment cover straight up **2** to remove it.





For the HP Compaq nc8000 and nw8000 Notebook Series:

- 1. Remove the screw **1** that secures the compartment cover to the computer.
- 2. Lift the compartment cover straight up **2** to remove it.





Attaching the Bluetooth Module

For the HP Compaq nc6000 Notebook Series:

- 1. Install the Bluetooth module flush against the compartment cover.
- 2. Insert the 2 module screws provided in the option kit. Be sure not to overtighten.





Connecting the Cable and Replacing the Compartment Cover

For the HP Compaq nc6000 Notebook Series:

1. Connect the Bluetooth module to the cable located inside the compartment. You may discard the cable provided in the option kit.





- 2. Replace the compartment cover by pushing it straight down**1** onto the computer.
- 3. Tighten the captive screw **2** to secure the compartment cover.



For the HP Compaq nc8000 and nw8000 Notebook Series:

1. Connect the Bluetooth module to the cable provided in the option kit. The small connector attaches to the Bluetooth module. The large connector attaches to the platform connector.

2. Install the Bluetooth module flush against the compartment cover with the 2 screws provided in the option kit. Be sure not to overtighten.



- 3. Replace the compartment cover by pushing it straight down onto the computer.
- 4. Replace the screw. Be sure not to overtighten.



Be careful not to pinch or disconnect the cables. This could cause loss of power or signal from the module. Tuck any excess cable inside the system enclosure.



Installing the Bluetooth Software

The *Bluetooth Software* CD contains the necessary software and drivers to configure the Bluetooth module.

Enabling Hardware

Before beginning the configuration of your Bluetooth software and drivers, verify that the wireless LED on the computer is illuminated. Refer to your notebook documentation for the location of the LED.

If the LED is not illuminated, press the Wireless On/Off button. This powers on the Bluetooth module, initiates hardware detection, and displays the Found New Hardware Wizard. Refer to your notebook documentation for the location of the Wireless On/Off button.



Depending upon the operating system in your notebook, you may or may not need to complete the following steps because the Bluetooth USB driver may be installed automatically. However, if a dialog box displays requiring user interaction, perform the following steps.

To continue with the installation:

- 1. Select Next after the Found New Hardware Wizard is displayed. The installation of the USB driver for the Bluetooth module begins.
- 2. If you see a dialog box regarding Microsoft logo requirements, select Continue Anyway.
- 3. Select Finish to complete the installation of the Bluetooth hardware enabling driver.



Installing Software

The *Bluetooth Software* CD contains the necessary software and drivers to configure the Bluetooth module. You can also install the Bluetooth software that has been preloaded in the image of your notebook.

To install the software for your Bluetooth module:

- 1. Select Start > All Programs > Software Setup.
- 2. Select Next when the Software Setup Welcome screen is displayed.
- 3. Select the check box next to the Bluetooth software driver to enable the software for installation, then select Next.
- 4. Select Finish to complete the installation and reboot the notebook.

A software item that is enabled for installation via Software Setup will have a check mark in the check box next to it. Deselect all items that you do not want to install and then select Next to continue with installation of the Bluetooth software.



If you are having problems with the installation, contact your network administrator for assistance.

Setting up Bluetooth Software

Once you have completed the software installation, you can set up the Bluetooth software by selecting the Bluetooth icon on the desktop or taskbar.

- 1. Right-click the Bluetooth icon on your notebook and select Start Using Bluetooth. The Bluetooth Setup Wizard displays the following options:
 - □ Add the icon to the Start menu
 - □ Add the icon to the Program menu
 - □ Add the icon to My Computer



- 2. Select Next to continue.
- 3. Change the Computer Name (your designation) and Computer Type.
- 4. Select Next to continue.
- 5. If you choose the option to configure local services, the message "Please wait while Windows installs software for your device" will be displayed. The installation takes several minutes.
- 6. This procedure installs 2 Bluetooth COM ports: COM6 and COM7, depending on your system configuration.

After the COM ports have been installed, the Bluetooth Service Selections dialog box is displayed. You can now select the Bluetooth services you want to configure.

Configuring Bluetooth Service Selections

Bluetooth Service Selections is a list of your computer's wireless default settings.

- 1. Select each service individually and select Configure.
 - As you highlight a service, the configure button is displayed allowing you to configure the service. Select Next after you have configured all services you have elected to modify.

The message "Please wait while Windows installs software for your device" is displayed. The installation takes several minutes.

- Select the type of service to offer remote devices: Allow other devices to create a private network with this computer.
- Connection Sharing: Required to be set up by the user via Network properties.

 - Startup Automatically: Disabled
 - Secure Connection: Enabled
 - Modems: defaults to installed modem
 - Notifications: Visual and Audio
 - The first time you use the Dial-up Networking service (after a device has been discovered) and the Connecting to the DUN service, the following message is displayed, "Please wait while Windows installs software for your device." After the Bluetooth module has been installed, a dialog box is displayed allowing you to enter your user name and password to connect to your ISP or corporate network.
- **D** Bluetooth Serial Port
 - Startup Automatically: Disabled
 - Secure Connection: Enabled
 - COM Port: default Virtual COM Port
 - Notifications: Visual and Audio
- 2. After the services have been configured and the devices have been installed, you are prompted to configure another Bluetooth module. Select Skip.
- 3. Select Finish. This completes the basic configuration of your Bluetooth module.

Reconfiguring Bluetooth

To reconfigure your Bluetooth module, select the Bluetooth Setup Wizard from any of the Bluetooth icons or menu items. You will see 4 options to reconfigure or modify how you interoperate with other devices.

- Find a Bluetooth module based on the type of service it provides.
- Find a Bluetooth module and configure how the local Bluetooth module will use its services.
- Configure a local Bluetooth service(s) that will be made available to a remote device.
- Change the name and/or type of device that is displayed by the computer configured with Bluetooth.

To change, modify, or configure your Bluetooth settings, choose an option, select Next and follow the on-screen instructions.

To access the Bluetooth configuration panel, select Advanced Configuration from any of the Bluetooth icons or menu items.

Information and Updates

HP strongly recommends that you install any software upgrades that are available from HP for your Bluetooth module. Most software at the HP Web site is packaged in a compressed file called a Softpaq. Download the appropriate Softpaq and save it to your hard drive.

To obtain software upgrades:

- 2. Follow the on-screen instructions to identify your country or region.
- 3. Select the download drivers and software radio button and enter the product information for your notebook series name and device.
