Hello Mike,

Here are the documents supplied by HP:

1. Technical description to show how the bios locking feature was employed on the notebook computer. This technical file can be granted as confidential document.
From HP: BIOS Lock is designed to ensure only certified radio devices can be used in HP Notebook and Tablet systems. During Power On Self Test (POST), System BIOS acquires the 4-part PCI ID from the Mini PCI device configuration space. The PCI ID is subsequently compared to IDs stored in BIOS that have been approved for use in the system. If a match is found, or a non-wireless device is detected, the system will exit POST normally and the system will launch the Operating System (OS). If a wireless device is detected that does not match any of the IDs stored in BIOS for this system, a warning message is displayed indicating an unauthorized card has been detected, and the system is prevented from launching the OS. The only way for the end-user to regain use of his system is to remove the unauthorized card.

I hope this is sufficient detail.
