Dear Application Examiner:

Be advised that Leviton Mfg. Co., Inc. employs a product identification system with a model number buried within a catalog number. The catalog number of the form xxx-xxxxx-xxx is required for order entry and appears on the packaging only. The model number is a simpler subset of the catalog number and is the number that appears on the actual product, the certification records, the instruction sheets and advertising. The first three digits document variations in packaging (individual boxes, bulk pack, blister pack, etc.) and never affect the actual product. The balance of the digits include variations that may be immaterial to the identification of the actual product (color which can be observed directly or input voltage range (120, 277, etc.) which is inappropriate for a battery-operated device) are dropped. What is left is a unique number for each and every unique design.

In accordance with the above discussion the catalog number WSCxx-IRW distills down to model number WSC. We have added an R to the identifier to identify the round version of the same product. We have not added the R to the model number because we are not selling it as a different product.

We hope this explains the differences between our catalog numbers and model numbers.
