











First, unplug the IOGEAR USB Bluetooth adapter from your computer. 2. Go to Control Panel > Device > Settings > Control Panel. 3. Click on Add or Remove Programs. 4. Click on Windows Bluetooth Software and click on Remove. 5. When the uninstall is complete, restart your computer. <p>Windows Vista</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. First, unplug the IOGEAR USB Bluetooth adapter from your computer. 2. Go to Control Panel > Control Panel. 3. Click on Control Panel under Programs and click on Programs and Features > Control Panel > Basic View. 4. Click on Windows Bluetooth Software and click on Uninstall on the top. 5. When the uninstall is complete, restart your computer.
<h3>Installation-Mac OS X</h3> <p>Installation - MAC OS X</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Use of the IOGEAR Bluetooth adapter requires MAC OS X version 10.5 or later. There is no need to install any additional software, as Apple provides all required Bluetooth drivers.  <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Insert the Bluetooth adapter into an available USB port on your computer, and go to System Preferences. 3. Click on the Bluetooth icon and make sure the box next to Bluetooth is checked in "Turn on/Off" that they will be on the Settings tab. To connect and pair with a Bluetooth device, click on Set Up New Device in "List and List" that will be on the Devices tab. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. If you have already connected a device under 10.5 the Bluetooth window will look like this. Instead of clicking the Set Up New Device button, click the button with a plus sign symbol below the device list. 4. This will initiate the Bluetooth Setup Assistant; click Continue to proceed. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. On this window, you can select what type of Bluetooth device you want to setup. Please make your choice below and then click Continue. 6. Your computer will search for Bluetooth devices in your area and display them under the Available Devices field. Select the device you wish to communicate with and then click Continue to pair/connect to your device. 7. Insert the IOGEAR Bluetooth™ with the system tray. This will start the Initial Bluetooth Configuration Wizard.  <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Choose the Initial Bluetooth™ Configuration Wizard has started. Click Next.

<h3>Installation-Windows XP</h3> <p>Start Here!</p> <p>Windows XP Service Pack 2</p> <p>The Microsoft Bluetooth stack driver is included with Service Pack 2 for Windows XP. You should have Service Pack 2 installed. You may choose not to install Service Pack 2. The installation CD will install the Windows XP Bluetooth drivers for XP service pack 2. If you do not have Service Pack 2 installed, please follow below steps to install Windows Bluetooth Software.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Make sure that the IOGEAR Bluetooth adapter is NOT plugged into the computer before installing the software. Insert the IOGEAR installation CD into your CD-ROM drive. The associated software will pop up the setup installation window to begin the driver installation. Click OK to start the installation. 2. Click Next to continue. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. If you accept the license agreement, click Next.  <p>During the initial "Bluetooth Device not Found" window, DO NOT plug in the Bluetooth adapter at the first time, simply click Cancel to proceed with the driver installation without connecting the Bluetooth device.</p> 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Once the driver installation has completed, click Finish. 	<h3>Installation-Windows Vista</h3> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Make sure the IOGEAR Bluetooth adapter is plugged into the computer before installing the software. Insert the IOGEAR installation CD into your CD-ROM drive. The associated software will pop up the auto setup window for the installation CD. Simply click on the Run setup.exe to start the installation. 2. To start the Windows Bluetooth software installation simply click on the OK button. 
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Click Next to begin the driver installation.  <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Select "I accept the terms in the license agreement" and click Next to continue. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Click Next to continue. 6. Click Install to begin the installation. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 7. If you are prompted by the windows security message select Install this driver software anyway to proceed with the installation. 8. During the initial "Bluetooth Device not Found" window, DO NOT plug in the Bluetooth adapter at the first time, simply click Cancel to proceed with the driver installation without connecting the Bluetooth device. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Click Finish to complete the installation. 
<h3>Installation - Windows XP Service Pack 2</h3> <p>Windows XP Service Pack 2 - Bluetooth Stack</p> <p>If you are using Windows XP with Service Pack 2, you may use the Bluetooth drivers provided by Microsoft. Please in mind however that the Bluetooth stack has limited Bluetooth profiles support. For more information, please visit the Microsoft website at www.microsoft.com.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To use the Microsoft Bluetooth stack, simply plug your IOGEAR Bluetooth adapter into an available USB port on your computer. Windows will automatically detect the Bluetooth device and install all necessary drivers. 2. You will then see a Bluetooth icon on your task bar that allows you to perform all Bluetooth operations, as shown below: 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Optionally, you can find them in Control Panel > Bluetooth Devices. 4. To connect with your Bluetooth device, simply right-click on the Bluetooth icon on the task bar and select Add a Bluetooth Device. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Make sure to set your Bluetooth device "discoverable" mode and click Next to continue. 6. Your computer will search for all Bluetooth devices in your area and list them in the results. Click the desired device, and click Next to continue. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 7. Please consult the user manual for your Bluetooth device to see if you need a display to pair establish a connection. In most cases, you can pair in a single display when you use the screen to enable the pairing with your Bluetooth enabled device. 8. Your Bluetooth device will then connect to the IOGEAR Bluetooth adapter and you can add the device you need, to finish the process. Click Finish to complete.
