## - Safety Precautions

To reduce the risk of electrical shock and injury, please follow these basic safety precautions before using the phone.

1. Carefully read and observe the instructions in this manual.
2. Follow all warnings marked on the unit
3. When cleaning, unplug the phone first, then use a damp cloth to wipe. Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.
4. Do not place objects on the line cord that may cause damage.

Phone Layout and Keys Function (continued)

You can access many features of your answering machine remotely from any touch tone telephone. A four-digit security code (remote code) is required to access the system and the factory default one is 0000. To enter remote access:

1. Dial your telephone number from any touch tone telephone.
2. When the Announce1/Announce2 starts to play, you may enter the remote access mode by inputting the remote code.
3. After you enter the remote code, the system will play the menu of commands. You can then follow the commands to operate.

## Note:

- If you enter the remote code incorrectly the answering machine will announce you to answering machine will announce you to enter the coae again. You are then given two code before the line is disconnected.

## TAM Reset

This function allows you to reset the TAM settings to the factory default.

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose TAM Setting, press the Select key
3. Press Up?: key or Down mey to choose the TAM Default, press the Select soft key. You will be prompted to enter the PIN code.
4. Enter the PIN code (the default one is 0000), then press the Reset soft key. If the PIN code is validated all TAM settings will return to the factory default, otherwise a warning tone will be heard and the settings will remain.

Result: After resetting, the TAM will return to standby mode.

## Week Date Setting

Before each message is played, the week and time it was received will be announced. You are able to use the base to set the week date.
In the active mode (all lights on) press and hold the 14 key on the base until the current setting is announced. Press the $\pitchfork \otimes$ key repeatedly to set, use the 14 key to confirm. Every time you press the key, the system will announce the corresponding week date.

## Note:

- If you remove the battery or pull out the dapter, you need to set the week date again.


## Voice Prompt Language

You are able to select the language used to play the voice prompt messages.

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose TAM Setting, press the Select key.
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose TAM Language, press the Select key.
4. The languages will be displayed. Use Up? key or Down $\square$ key to scroll through the options. Each language will be displayed in its own native translation.
5. Press the Select key to choose the required language and you will hear a confirm beep.

## Remote Code

To operate your answering machine remotely from another phone you need to enter the remote code. For security reasons you had better change this code (the default one is 0000). For more details please refer to par. Remote Control.

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press Up?? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose TAM Setting, press the Select key.
3. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose Remote Code, press the Select key.
4. The LCD shows the current remote code. Enter the new code you want to set, press the OK key.

In standby mode press and hold this key until the «< icon appears to activate the shaker and visual ringer function. Press and hold this key again until the icon disappears to deactivate it.

## Answer mode Select

The answering machine operates in two modes, "answer and record (Announcel)" or "answer only (Announce2)". Each mode comes with a preset announcement that is played to your callers. You can choose the desired mode as follows:

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose TAM Setting, press the Select key
3. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose ANNC Select, press the Select key.
4. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Announce1 or Announce2, press Select key.

## Notes

- If you choose Announce2, the caller hears your announcement but will not be able to leave a message.
- The Announce2 is also played when your answering machine becomes full.


## Set the ring delay

You can select from 2 to 6 rings. In addition, the Toll Saver setting is also available for pre-remote access free of charge. The toll-saving pre-remote access feature can be used to check whether new messages have been received on your answering machine from a distant telephone. If a new message has been recorded on your answering machine, your call is taken after 3 rings at the latest. If no new messages has been recorded on your answering machine, your call is taken after 6 rings. End the call before the 6th ring. This means that no charges ensue

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose TAM Setting, use the Select key to confirm.
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose Set Ring, press the Select key.
4. Use Up? key or Down mey to choose the answer rings ( 2 Rings ~ 6 Rings or Toll Saver), press the Select key.

## TAM On/Off

You are able to switch the answering machine on or off.

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode
2. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose TAM Setting, press the Select key.

4. Use Up? key or Down mey to choose On or Off, press the Select key.

## Way 2: Using the base unit

In the active mode (all lights on) press $\underset{\text { Ans }}{ }$ key on the base unit to enable or disable this function, the current state will be announced.

## TAM Alert

A tone will sound every 1 minute when a new message is received until you review the message. You are able to switch the tone on or off.

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press Up?? key or Down mey repeatedly to choose TAM Setting, use the Select key to confirm.
3. Press the Down $\square$ key to choose TAM Alert, press Select key.
4. Use Up ? key or Down mey to choose On or Off, press the Select key.

## Way 1: Using the menu

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press the Down $\square$ key to choose Message, use the Select key to confirm.
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Delete All, press the Select key to confirm.
4. The LCD will show Confirm ?. Press the OK key to delete all the messages or press the key to delete all the

## Way 2: Using the base unit

In the active mode (all lights on) press and hold the $\left[\begin{array}{c}\varnothing \\ \text { Del }\end{array}\right]$ key to delete all the messages. The relevant voice prompting will be heard, too. If you press and hold this key during the playing, the current message will be deleted.

## Note:

- Up to 15 minutes messages can be recorded.


## Record the memo

You can use your phone to record memo messages (each can be up to 3 minutes) for another user of your phone. The memo can be played back as a message.

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press the Down $\square$ key to choose Message, use the Select key to confirm.
3. Press Up? key or Down key repeatedly to choose Memo Record, press the Select key.
4. You can record your message after a tone. Recording will stop automatically after 3 minutes. You can also confirm and end the recording by pressing the OK key. During recording the LCD shows "Recording...".

## Note:

- If someone leaves you a memo, the ["0] icon will appear on the LCD in the standby mode.

This icon appears when you have new message(s).

## Message

This feature allows the caller to leave a message to the owner who is not at home. When a call is received in answer-record mode, the machine will play Announcel, and then performs message recording. The process is as follows:

After N times ringing, the phone enters answerrecord mode automatically and starts to play Announce1. The caller can start to record after a tone.

## Play New/Saved Messages

## Way 1: Using the menu

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press the Down $\square$ key to choose Message, use the Select key to confirm.
3. Press the Select key again to choose New MSG or press the Down $\square$ key to choose Saved MSG, press the Select key to confirm.
4. The phone will announce "You have $\mathbf{N}$ new message(s)" or "You have $\mathbf{N}$ saved message(s)". The relevant messages will be played one by one. You can use the key to delete the current message or the Back soft key to stop the playing and exit.

## Way 2: Using the base unit

When you have one or several new messages, press the key to play it/them. If there are no new messages, press this key to play the saved messages. Press the 104 key once to re-play the current message, press it twice to play the previous one or press the $\infty$ key once to play the next one. Press the key again to finish.

## Connecting Lines

1. Connect one end of the phone line cord to the phone line jack of the base, and the other end to a standard phone wall outlet.
2. Connect the modular ends of the two power adapters to the power jacks of the base and the charger, then plug the AC adapters into standard AC wall outlets.

## Installing Batteries

The rechargeable Ni-MH batteries (AAA size) come with your phone. Install the battery before using your phone.

1. Slide the battery cover in the direction of the arrow and pull it out.
2. Insert new batteries as indicated, matching correct polarity (+,-).


Installing Batteries (continued)
3. To replace the battery cover, slide the cover up until it snaps in place.


Notes:

- The batteries need to be replaced if they do not recover their full storage capacity after recharging.
- When replacing the batteries, always use good quality Ni-MH AAA re-chargeable batteries. Never use other battery.


## Charging Handset

! Important Note: Before initial operation, YOU SHOULD FULLY CHARGE THE HANDSET for about 15 hours.

To charge the handset, place it on the base or charger.
Result: When you place the handset on the base or charger, the handset automatically turns on.


## Play Announce1/Announce2

## You can play the current Announcel/2.

## Way 1: Using the menu

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press the Select soft key to choose Announce.
3. Press Select soft key to choose Announce1 or press the Down $\square$ key to choose Announce2, then press the Select key to confirm.
4. Press the Select soft key to choose Playback.
5. The current Announce1/2 will be played. During the process you can use the Back soft key to stop and exit.

## Way 2: Using the base unit

In the active mode (all lights on) press the anms or
Annc key on the base unit to playback the current Announce1/Announce2. Use the key to end the playing at any time.

## Restore Announce1/Announce2

## Way 1: Using the menu

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press the Select soft key to choose Announce.
3. Press Select soft key to choose Announce1 or press the Down $\square$ key to choose Announce2, then press the Select key to confirm.
4. Press Up ? key or Down mey to choose Default, press the Select key to confirm.
5. The LCD will show Confirm ?. Press the Select key to restore the default Announce1 /Announce2 or press the Back key to cancel

## Way 2: Using the base unit

In the active mode (all lights on) press the anm or Amm key to play Announce1/2, then press and hold
 hear a confirm tone. The default Announcel or Announce 2 will be played back after that.

## Record Announce2

Announce-only Announce2 is an answer-only message. If you have not record Announce2 before, the unit will play the default one "Hello, your call cannot be taken at the moment, please call back later".
If you want to change Announce2, do the following steps to update it:

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press the Select soft key to choose Announce.
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square \square$ key repeatedly to choose Announce2, then press the Select key to confirm.
4. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose Record, press the Select soft key.
5. You can record your message after a tone. Recording will stop automatically after 3 minutes. You can also confirm and end the recording by pressing the OK key. During recording the LCD shows "Recording...".

## Use the base to record Announce1

## /Announce 2

Press and hold the Annc or Anmc key on the base unit until the system announce. Begin speaking after you hear the beep. Use the key to finish at any time.

Notes:

- When recording the announcement, speak towards the microphone on the base. To get the best recording result, you had better keep your mouth 20 cm away from the microphone.
If you record/playback/restore Announce1 or Announce2, the answer mode (refer to par Answer mode Select) will be switched to the corresponding mode automatically.


## Using Handset Carrying Clip

The supplied handset carrying clip allows you to conveniently carry the handset with you. It clips easily to your belt, waist band, or shirt pocket.

If you want to remove the carrying clip:
Insert a screw driver along the edge of one of its arms and release the clip. Then lift it off.


## ■ Using Headset (optional)

The headset jack is located in the left side of the handset and is 2.5 mm standard plug. Simply plug the headset into this jack and the headset will be activated.

## Note

- When the headset is plugged into the headset jack the microphone on the handset will be deactivated.



## Wall Mounting (optional)

To wall-mount your phone follow these steps:

1. Install the two self-tapping screws (not supplied) at a distance of 60 mm from each other and located on a horizontal line.
2. Install the mounting bracket as shown in the figure on the right.
3. Place the phone onto the screw-heads and slide down to secure.

## TAM Functions

## - Announcement

It is necessary to record the announcement which requests the caller to leave a message when nobody is at home. The answer and record message (Announce1) and the answer only message (Announce2) can be up to 3 minutes respectively.

## Record Announce1

Auto-answer Announce1 is a conventional message requesting you to leave a message. If you have not record Announcel before, the unit will play the default one "Hello, your call cannot be taken at the moment, to record your message, please speak after the tone"

If you want to change Announcel, do the following steps to update it

1. Press the TAM soft key in standby mode.
2. Press the Select soft key to choose Announce. 3. Press Select key again to choose Announce1
3. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose Record, press the Select soft key.
4. You can record your announcement after a tone. Recording will stop automatically after 3 minutes. You can also confirm and end the recording by pressing the OK key. During recording the LCD shows "Recording..."

## Caller ID on call waiting

When you subscribe to Call Waiting service from your local telephone company, the telephone will display the name and number of the second caller while you are having a conversation.

1.When you are on the line, the telephone will automatically display the name and number of the second caller.
2.Press the Flash soft key to answer the second caller.
3. When you have finished, press the Flash soft key to continue with your conversation with the first caller.

Turning Handset On/Off

## Note:

- If you have transferred an external call to another handset you cannot use the call waiting function via the second handset.

If the handset is in power off mode, when you place the handset on the base, it automatically turns on. To turn the handset on or off in standby mode, follow these steps:

1. To turn on the handset when it's off, press and hold the $\sigma$ key until you switch the display on. On power up, the handset will enter subscription mode and search for a registered base. A message as shown below will be displayed to the user, and the signal icon will flash.

## ")" <br> Searching...

2. To turn off the handset, keep the key pressed until the display disappears.

If the handset is successful in finding a base, the handset will enter the standby mode, the display will show handset number and the handset name (if you have one saved as described on page 26), signal icon, battery icon and current time. If the handset is unsuccessful in finding a base, the handset will behave according to the Out of Range condition.

## Note:

- When battery power is very low, if you place the handset on the base, the display will show as below. YOU SHOULD FULLY CHARGE THE HANDSET BEFORE USING.


## Basic Functions

All descriptions in this manual assume that the handset is in standby mode. Set the telephone to standby mode by pressing the $\boxed{\sigma}$ key.

## - Making a Call

1. Pick up the handset and press the $\leftrightarrows$ key. Result: The (l) icon appears on the LCD.
2. Dial a telephone number.

Note:
You can store up to 10 telephone numbers in memory for automatic dialing.
3. To end the call, either press the © key or replace the handset on the base.

You can enter the desired phone number in standby mode, which allows you to make corrections before dialing. Follow these steps:

1. Enter a telephone number (up to 32 digits). Check it. You can also use the Right key to insert a pause. The system will announce you the number you are just inputting if you have switched the Talk Keypad function on.

## Note:

- If you make a mistake while entering a number, press the Erase soft key to clear the last digit.

2. When the number appears correctly, press the $\leftrightarrow$ key.

## Setting up a 3-way conference call

When you have both an external call and an intercom call in progress, you can set up a threeway conference call, like this:

1. During an external call, press the Left $\square$ key and then the number of the handset you want to join the 3 -way call.
2. The called party press key to answer.
3. The calling party can press the ${ }^{*}$ key to start the 3 -way call.
4. Either of the two internal handsets can press the $\sqrt{0}$ key to leave the conference call at any time.

## Note:

- If one of the handsets drops the conference call, the remaining handsets will continue the conference.


## Calling with more than one Handset

If you have more than one handset registered to the same base, you can make internal calls and transfer an external call between the registered handsets.

## Making an internal call

1. Press the Left $\quad$ key, the LCD displays as follows, then enter the number of the handset you want to call.

2. If the destination handset is not available, the handset will return to standby mode. If the handset entered is valid, the called handset will ring and display HSX Calling. The handset user can press the $\rightarrow_{6}$ key to answer the internal call.
3. At the end of your conversation, press the key.

## Note:

- During the internal call, if an external call comes in, the LCD will show the caller's number. You should press the $\widehat{\square}$ key to end the internal call first then press the ke to answer the call.


## Call transfer between handsets

You can transfer an external call between the handsets those are registered to the same base.

1. During an external call, press the Left $\quad \mapsto$ key and then the number of the handset you want to transfer the call to.
2. If the called party can answer your call, he/she can press the key to talk with you. At this time you can inform him/her of the incoming call.
3. When the called handset answers, press the key or replace the handset to the base to complete the transfer.

## Receiving a Call

When a call is received, the New Call Result: After you hang up the call, the LCD information will appear. displays the call duration.

If the caller can be identified, the caller's phone number is displayed. If the caller cannot be identified, only the New Call information displays. If you have a voice message, the "MSG WTG ON" and icon will be shown on the LCD.

1. To answer the call, press the key. If you have activated the Auto Answer function, when the handset is on the base, simply lift it up to answer.
2. To end the call, either press the $\square$ or replace the handset on the base.

## Notes

- You can select the ringer volume by using Up $? 3$ key or Down $\square$ key when the phone rings with an incoming call.
- If you want to deactivate the $\nabla$ icon, press the Up 3 key in standby mode, then press and hold the 44 key. After that, press the $\odot$ key to return to standby mode. (The handset must be registered to the base.)
- If the polyphonic ring tone is set, the ring tone may continue for 4 seconds after the caller's hang-up or after the parallel phone had answered the call.


## Muting the Microphone

During a conversation, you can temporarily switch your phone's microphone off, so that the other party cannot hear you.

Example: You want to say something to another person in the room but do not want the other party to hear you.

## - Amplification Function

Your phone is equipped with a specialized amplification function designed to fit your needs. During a conversation you can adjust the Vol+ or Vol- control on the left side of the handset and use the AMP key on the right side. You can also adjust the Tone control to fit the levels to your hearing requirements. The selected volume will be displayed on the LCD.

## Registration

To mute your microphone, press the Mute soft key during the conversation. The "Call Muted" appears on the LCD.

To unmute the microphone, press the Mute soft key again. You will restore the normal condition.

When you press the AMP key in receiver mode during a conversation, the Amplify indicator on the handset lights on. If you press the AMP key again, the indicator will go out.
Please note that the default setting is: Volume:3, Tone: 2, Amplify: Off.
You can also select the earpiece volume or the speaker volume by the Audio Setup in Menu under HS Settings, as described in page 38

The supplied handsets are already registered with the number 1 and 2 . You can register up to 5 handsets to the same base in order to share the same line with other people.

Before registering a handset to the base, you should press and hold base unit (:II) key for about 5 seconds then release it

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose the Registration menu, press the Select soft key.
3. Use Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to scroll through the Base names list, press the Select soft key to choose a base to your necessary. The handset will search for the requested base and the relevant information will flash on the LCD.
4. If the base is found, and the handset is successfully registered, you will be prompted to enter the PIN code (the default one is 0000) Enter it then press the Select soft key. If the PIN code is correct, the Registration tone will sound and then the base assigns a number to the handset, otherwise a warning tone will sound, and then the handset returns to the previous registration state.
5. If the base is not found, the handset will behave according to the Out of Range condition.

## Talk CID

This feature allows you to check the caller ID number when a new call is receiving without looking at the display.

1. Press the Menu soft key
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key to choose the Talk CID menu, press the Select soft key.
4. You can use Up ? or Down mey to choose On or Off to enable or disable the function.
5. Press the Save soft key.

## Ringer Setting

You can select your own external (from the telephone Network) or internal (from other handsets registered to the same base) ring tone and adjust the volume.
1.Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key to choose HS Settings menu, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up ? key or Down mey to choose Ring Setup, press the Select soft key.
4.Press the Select soft key to choose INT Ring or press the Down $\square$ key to choose EXT Ring, press the Select soft key.
5. Press Up? key or Down key to choose Melody or Volume, press the Select soft key.

Result: You can select the ring tone from Melody 1 to 10 or adjust the volume from Volume 1 to 5 , or off. When you adjust the ring tone or volume, the phone plays the selected melody or sounds the selected loudness.

## 6.Press the Save soft key to confirm

## Notes

- If you set the volume to "Off", when a call comes in, only the New Call information appears on the LCD.
- You can also use the Vol+ or Vol- control in standby mode to adjust the ringer volume.


## Last Number Redial

1. Press the Right key in standby mode.

Result: The LCD displays the last number you dialed
2. Press the $\leftrightarrows$ key to dial out the number

Your phone allows you to retrieve the last 10 numbers you have dialed and recall them quickly.

## Search for and dial a number in

 Redial Book1. Press the Right $\infty$ key in standby mode.
2. If you want to scroll through the memory, press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly until you find out the number you want to dial.
3. Press the $\leftrightarrow$ key to dial out the number.

## Notes:

- If no numbers are found, "Empty" is displayed.
- When the redial book is full, each time you dial a new number, the oldest number stored in the redial book is automatically erased.


## Use Redial Book options

Using the redial book options, you can add a number to phone book or delete a number in the redial book.

1. Press the Right key.
2. Scroll to the desired number by using Up ?: key or Down $\square$ key.
3. When the number appears on the display, press the More soft key to choose the desired option:

## Amplified

Your phone is equipped with a specialized amplification function designed to fit your needs. If you switch this function on, the handset receiver volume adjustment is $15-30 \mathrm{~dB}$. Otherwise the receiver volume adjustment is 0 15 dB .

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Amplified menu, press the Select soft key.
4. You can use Up ? key or Down mey to choose On or Off to enable or disable the function.
5. Press the Save soft key

## Talk Keypad

This feature allows you to check the number you have entered in standby mode without looking at the display.

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up?? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key to choose the Talk Keypad menu, press the Select soft key.
4. You can use Up ? $?$ or Down $\square \square$ key to choose On or Off to enable or disable the function.

## 5. Press the Save soft key

## Selecting a Base

This function allows you to select a base from those already registered to the handset. You can access the options by scrolling the menu.

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up? key or Down $\square \square$ key to choose Select Base menu, press the Select soft key.
4. You can use Up?? key or Down mey to select the base you want, then press the Select soft key. If you select a non-existent base, the handset will sound a warning tone.
5. The display will show Selected BSX. Press the Select soft key to confirm. A confirm tone will be heard.

## HS Reset

If you reset the handset, all the features under HS Settings menu will be restored to the factory initial setting: Alarm, Audio Setup, Ring Setup, Tone Setup, Language, HS Name, Auto Answer and Date \& Time. But LCD Contrast can not be restored.

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose the HS Reset menu, press the Select soft key. You will be prompted to enter the PIN code
4. Enter the PIN code (the default one is 0000 ), then press the Reset soft key. If the PIN code is validated all handset settings will return to the factory default, otherwise a warning tone will be heard and the settings will remain.

Result: After resetting, the handset will return to standby mode.

Add to PB: allows you to add the number to the phone book. Complete storing the entry by starting from step 4 described in par."Adding the Phone Book Entries" (obviously, you will find the number already entered in the appropriate field).
Delete: allows you to delete the selected number
Delete All: allows you to delete the whole redial book.
4. To return to standby mode, press thekey.

## Note:

- At step 3, when you select Delete or Delete All options, a message "Confirm ?" will further ask you to confirm the deletion. To confirm press the Del or Del All soft key, to escape press the Cancel soft key.


## CID Book

When you receive a call, if the caller's information is transmitted from the network on which the call was made (and the caller doesn't hide it), the caller's phone number is displayed. Moreover, if you missed one or more calls, the icon will appear on the LCD. If the CID memory is full, the $d$ icon will flash on the LCD

Out Of Area - This message will display when someone calls from an area where the telephone company is not offering the caller identification services or is not yet providing number delivery to your area

Private - If the caller has exercised the option to prevent his name and number from being sent, the message will show on the LCD.

View and dial any of the CID numbers

1. Press the Menu soft key
2. Use the Select soft key to choose the CID Book, and if available, the numbers are displayed. (You can also access the CID book directly by pressing the Up? key in standby mode.)
3. Use Up ? key or Down $\square \square$ key to view the numbers, you can make a call by pressing the key. You can also add the entry to phonebook.

## Note:

- At step 3, each item of the incoming list is marked with the $\uparrow$ icon if the call has been reviewed or with the $d$ icon if the call hasn't been reviewed yet.


## Add CID Number to Phone Book

1. Press the Menu soft key
2. Use the Select soft key to choose the CID Book.
3. Use Up ? key or Down mey to view the numbers, when the desired number displays on the LCD, press the More soft key to enter Add to PB menu.

## LCD Contrast Setting

The adjustment allows you to optimize the visibility of the display by changing its contrast according to the environment conditions.

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose LCD Contrast, then press the Select soft key.
4. Use Up? key or Down $\square \square$ key repeatedly to choose among the 17 available contrast levels, then press the Save soft key.
5. Press the key to return to standby mode.

## Setting Date \& Time

1. Date \& Time Format
2. Press the Menu soft key
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
4. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Date \& Time menu, press the Select soft key.
5. Use Up? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Date Format or Time Format, press the Select soft key.
6. You can use Up ? key or Down $\square \square$ key to choose the Date format (DD-MM/MM-DD) or the Time format (12-Hour/24-Hour), press the Save soft key to save.

## 2. Setting date \& time

1. Perform steps 1 to 3 of previous paragraph.
2. Press Up?? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Set Date or Set Time menu, press the Select soft key.
3. Enter the current date/time by numeric keypad and press the Save soft key to save and exit.

## Notes:

- If you select 12-Hour, AM/PM will appear on the right of the time in standby mode. - At step 3 you need to enter the time in $24-$ Hour format.


## Audio Setup

You can also use the menu to adjust the audio volume.

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Down $\square$ key to choose Audio Setup menu, press the Select soft key.
4. Use Up ? key or Down mey to choose Speaker V. or Earpiece V., press Select soft key.
5. The display shows the current setting. Use Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose the volume level (Volume 1- Volume 5), press the Save soft key.

## Key Tone

Every time you press a key, your handset acknowledges it with a key tone. You can disable the key tones for a silent use. In certain error conditions, a warning tone will sound when an incorrect key is pressed.

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up key or Down $\square \square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up $? \square$ key or Down key to choose Tone Setup menu, press the Select soft key.
4. Press the Select soft key again to choose Key Tone.
5. Use Up?? key or Down $\square$ key to choose On or Off to enable or disable the function.
6. Press the Save soft key

## Note:

- For normal use, we recommend you leave the key tone enabled. This makes the phone easier to use

4. Press the Select soft key, you are prompted to enter the name.
5. Enter the name and press the Next soft key, then you can modify the number you want to store.
6. Press the Next soft key, you are able to select the ring tone from Melody 1 to Melody 10, press the Save soft key to confirm and exit, you will hear a confirm beep.

## Delete a number in the CID Book

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Use the Select soft key to choose the CID Book.
3. Scroll to the number you want to delete by using Up? key or Down $\square$ key.
4. When the desired number appears on the display, press the More soft key.
5. Use Up ? key or Down mey to choose Delete, press the Select soft key. The display will show "Confirm ?". Press the Del soft key to confirm, you will hear a beep and the LCD shows the next number.

## Delete all numbers in the CID Book

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Use the Select soft key to choose the CID Book.
3. Press the More soft key and use Up? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Delete All menu, then press the Select soft key.
4. The display shows "Confirm ?", press the Del All soft key to confirm.

Result: You hear a beep and the phone returns to the standby mode after clearing all the CID numbers.

## Torch

If you turn this feature on, the visual ringer will light steadily. You can use the phone as a torch.

To turn on this feature, in the Standby mode just keep the \# key pressed till the visual ringer light.

## Key Lock

If you turn on this feature, all keys will be locked except M1~M4. You can answer calls by using the key. But when you hang up, the phone returns to the locked mode. This feature is useful to avoid pressing keys by mistake

To lock the keys, in the standby mode just keep the ** key pressed till the display shows "HS Locked", then the -0 icon appears.

To turn off this function, keep the $\#$ key pressed again till the visual ringer go out.
** key pressed again till the key lock icon -1 disappears from the display.

## Note:

- In locked mode, if you press any key, the phone will generate a warning tone, and the "HS Locked" message will be redisplayed.


## HS Settings

## Setting Alarm

You are able to set the alarm on the handset and adjust the alarm settings

1. Press the Menu soft key
2. Press Up ? key or Down mey repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press the Select soft key to choose Alarm menu.
4. The display shows the current set. Use Up ?: key or Down $\square$ key to select On/Off, press the Select soft key.
5. If you select On, the display indicates you to enter the time in $\mathbf{H} \mathbf{H}: \mathbf{M M}$ format. Use the numeric keypad to enter.
6. Press the Next soft key, a beep sounds and the display shows Snooze On/Off, you can press Up? key or Down mey to enable or disable the snooze function on the alarm and press the Save soft key.
7. When the alarm sounds, press any key to switch it off.

## Notes

- At step 5 you need to enter the time in 24 Hour format.
If you press any key at the right time the alarm to ring, the alarm will be silent.
- If you choose Snooze On, the alarm wil ring at reqular intervals of 11 minutes. If you press the $\bar{\sigma}$ key when the alarm sounds, the option will be switched to Snooze Off.


## Modify PIN

This function allows you to change the PIN number of the currently active Base. The default PIN is 0000 .

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square \square$ key to choose BS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Use Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Modify PIN menu, press the Select soft key.
4. The display shows "PIN?". Enter the current PIN, then press the Next key. If the old PIN code is correct, you will be prompted to enter a new PIN code, otherwise a warning beep will sound and you will be returned to the Modify PIN menu.
5. Enter the new PIN, press the Next key. You will be requested to confirm the PIN code. Enter the new PIN again then press the Save soft key to confirm and exit.

## BS Reset

If you reset the base, all the features under BS Settings menu will be restored to the factory initial setting: Dial Mode and Flash Time.

1. Press the Menu soft key
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key to choose BS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up?? key or Down $\square$ key to choose BS Reset menu, press the Select soft key. You will be prompted to enter the PIN code
4. Enter the PIN code (the default PIN is 0000) then press the Reset soft key. If the PIN code is validated all Base settings will be reset to the factory default, otherwise the settings will remain.
Result: After resetting, the handset will return to standby mode.

## Auto Answer

With this feature, you can answer a call by just picking up the handset from the base without pressing any key

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, press the Select key.

## - Selecting a Language

The handset supports up to 7 predefined languages: English, French, Spanish, German, Italian, Dutch and Russian. You can change the language used to display the menu messages.

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up $?$ key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Use Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Auto Answer, then press the Select soft key.
4. Use Up ? key or Down key to choose On/Off to enable/ disable the function, then press the Save soft key, you will hear a confirm beep.

## Note:

- When the answering machine starts working this feature will be deactivated.

3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Language, then press the Select soft key.
4. The languages will be displayed. Use Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to scroll through the options. Each language will be displayed in its own native translation.
5. Press Save soft key to select the required language and you will hear a confirm beep.

## ■ HS Name

Using this feature, you can define a name of the handset in order to easily recognize your handset if you have more than one registered on the same base. To set the handset name:

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, press the Select soft key.

## Range Alarm

A beep will sound when the handset is out of range of the Base. You are able to select to enable/disable this audible warning

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly to choose HS Settings, press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up? key or Down $\square$ key to choose HS Name, then press the Select soft key.
4. You can enter the handset name (up to 12 characters) by using the alphanumeric keys use the Erase soft key to delete the incorrect haracters), then press the Save soft key to confirm and exit. The handset name will be displayed above your handset number in standby mode.
5. Use Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Tone Setup, then press the Select soft key.
6. Press the Down $\square$ key to choose Range Alarm, press the Select soft key.
7. Use Up? key or Down mey to choose On or Off to enable or disable this audible warning, then press the Save soft key, you will hear a confirm beep.

## BS Settings

## Terminate HS

This function allows you to delete a handset registration from the base.

## 1. Press the Menu soft key

2. Press Up?? key or Down mey to choose BS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press the Select soft key to choose the Terminate HS menu. The display shows "PIN?" to prompt you to enter the PIN Code (The default PIN Code is "0000"). Then press the OK soft key.
4. Use Up ? key or Down key to select a handset. If you select the current handset or a non-existent handset, a warning tone will be heard.
5. Press the Select soft key to confirm, and the selected handset will behave according to the unregistered condition.

## Flash Time

You can select to change the Flash time by the following steps:

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Up?: key or Down mey to choose BS Settings, then press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to choose Flash Time menu. Press the Select soft key.
4. The display shows the current setting. Use Up ?: key or Down $\square$ key to select Flash-1 Flash-2, press Save soft key.

## One-Touch Memories

You can store up to 4 numbers in direct memories All the numbers will be stored in the phone book.

## Storing Memory Numbers

1. Press the memory key ( $\mathbf{M 1}$ to $\mathbf{M 4}$ ) in standby mode.
2. The display shows "Number ?". Enter the desired number (up to 20 digits), press the Next soft key.
3. Use Up $?$ key or Down $\square$ key to select the ring you like to associate with the number, press the Save soft key to confirm.

## Viewing Memory Numbers

1. In the standby mode, press the Down key.
2. Press Up ? key or Down mey repeatedly until the desired number is displayed.

## Dialing from One-touch Memories

In the standby mode, press M1 to M4 button to dial out the corresponding number.

## Editing Memory Numbers

Perform the steps of the "Editing the Phone book Entries" paragraph, see page 33.

## Note

- The memory default names are M1: to M4: you can add something following them but cannot delete the default name. e.g. you can modify M1 to M1: home.


## Deleting Memory Numbers

Perform the steps of the "Deleting the Phone book Entries" paragraph, see page 33.

## Paging

You can page the handset from the base unit making it ring with a special tone. It's useful to locate a lost handset.

Press the ©01) key on the base unit (less than 5 seconds), all the handsets registered to the base will ring for about 60 seconds.

## - Dial Mode

You can select to change the dial mode by the following steps:

1. Press the Menu soft key
2. Press Up ? key or Down key repeatedly to choose BS Settings, and press the Select soft key.
3. Press Down $\square$ key to choose Dial Mode, then press the Select soft key.

To stop paging, press the (:I) key on the base again or any key on the handset.

## Note

- On a long (a) kev press more than or equal to 5 seconds, the base will enter subscription mode. For details, see page 43.

4. You can press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to select the required dial mode options (Tone/Pulse) and press the Save soft key. A confirm beep will be heard

## Note:

- If you are not sure which dialing mode should be selected, please contact your local service provider.


## Handsfree

During a call, you may turn on the speakerphone built in the handset. In this mode you can simply put your handset on a surface (e.g. a desk) and enjoy the comfort of the handsfree conversation.

To turn the feature on, press the key during a call (line engaged). The $\mathfrak{d} \boldsymbol{l})$ icon appears on the LCD.

To turn the feature off, and keep on talking in normal mode, press the key again. Thed icon will disappear.

## Flash Signal

When the line is engaged, pressing the Flash soft key sends the Flash signal. This key is used in conjunction with special services (e.g. call waiting) which can be available in your phone network. For further details please contact your network telephone company.

To use the said special services, just press the Flash soft key while the line is engaged: the display will show $\mathbf{R}$.

Find out the number you want to dial. Refer to "Viewing the Phone book Entries". Then press the G key or Dial soft key

## Editing the Phone book Entries

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Down $\square$ key to choose Phonebook, press the Select soft key.
3. Press Down $\square$ key to choose Edit menu. Press the Select soft key.
4. Press Up ? $\quad$ key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly until the entry you want to edit displays, press the Select soft key to confirm.
5. If necessary, press the Erase soft key to clear the digit(s) then enter the desired name and number, press the Next soft key to save.
6. Use Up ? key or Down $\square$ key to select the ring you like to associate with the number, press the Save soft key to confirm.

## Deleting the Phone book Entries

## 1. Press the Menu soft key.

2. Press Down $\square$ key to choose Phonebook, press the Select soft key.
3. Press Up ? key or Down mey to choose Delete. Press the Select soft key
4. Press Up ? key or Down mey repeatedly until the name you want to delete displays, then press the Select soft key. The display shows "Confirm ?". You can press the Del soft key to delete it or press the Cancel key to exit.
5. At step 3, if you choose Delete All menu and press the Select soft key, the display will show "Confirm ?". You can press the Del All soft key to delete all the entries or press the Cancel key to exit.

## PB Status

The PB Status shows the number of phone book entries already stored. When the PB Status shows on the LCD, press the Select soft key to enter it.

## Adding the Phone book Entries

1. Press the Menu soft key.
2. Press Down key to choose Phonebook press the Select soft key.
3. Press the Select soft key to choose New.
4. The display shows "Name ?". Enter the name you want to use, then press the Next soft key to confirm. The display shows "Number ?". Enter the desired number (up to 20 digits), press the Next soft key.
5.* Use Up ? key or Down mey to select the ring you like to associate with the number, press the Save soft key to confirm.
5. Repeat if necessary.

* If you want to set a VIP number, you should select a special ring tone for it. The ring tone should be different from the external ring you should be different from the external ring you have set. You can set up to 9 VIP ring tones associate with 9 VIP numbers/groups.


## Note:

- If you make a mistake while entering number, use the Erase soft key to correct it. Each time you press the key, the last digit is deleted. To clear all digits, press and hold the Erase key.


## Using a Pause

A pause is useful when you access an interactive voice response system, such as an automated banking system. A pause provides a delay of 3 seconds. If you want to insert a pause when you dial a number in standby mode or store a number in memory, press the Right key. The letter $\mathbf{P}$ will appear at the pause entry.

## Viewing the Phone book Entries

1. In the standby mode, press the Down $\square$ key.
2. Press Up? key or Down mey repeatedly until the desired entry is displayed.

## Advanced Functions

## - Menu Navigation

To access a menu option:

1. To display menu items, press the Menu soft key.
2. To scroll through menu options, press Up ? key or Down $\square$ key repeatedly.
3. To select a menu, press the Select soft key when the desired menu appears on the LCD.
4. Repeat if necessary.

## To return to standby mode:

If you press the Back soft key from any menu, the phone returns to the previous screen.

To return to standby mode, press the $\square$ key
Also, the phone will automatically return to standby mode from any menu if no key is pressed in the next 40 seconds.
