- iPhone charger - Charge an iPhone using a port on your new phone.
- Contacts list - Your personal phonebook of up to 200 listings, arranged alphabetically.
- Speakerphone - Enjoy handsfree conversations.
- 12 rings tones and sleep mode - Sleep mode automatically switches the phone to the minimum volume at night.
- Alarm clock
- Personal cordless network - Connect up to five handsets to your base. Each handset can access up to four additional base units in order to extend your total wireless coverage.

## Troubleshooting

| The handset works perfectly, but a beep occurs during phone calls. | Check the batteries charge and charge them if necessary. |
| There is noise and audio interference during phone calls. | Get closer to the base unit. If you can access more base units, try selecting a closer one. |

## Warnings

AYour iPhone Complimate has been carefully designed to give you years of safe, reliable performance. As with all electrical equipment, however, there are a few basic precautions that you should take to avoid hurting yourself or damaging the unit:

- Read the instructions in this handbook carefully. Be sure to save it for future reference.
- Read and follow all warning and instruction labels on the equipment itself.
- Be sure to use only the switching power supply in the package, and ensure that your power source matches the rating listed for it. If you are not sure, check with your dealer or with your local power company.
- Avoid strong shocks. Don't use the switching power supply if it has received any hard knocks or looks damaged in any way; immediately contact an authorised service center.
- Hold your handset firmly. Otherwise it may fall and be damaged.

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## Sleep Mode

This feature enables you to not be disturbed by the ring tone at night. If the sleep mode is activated, the ring volume automatically switches to volume level 1 during the period of time that you set.

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose $O$, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press Down $\square$ to choose Sleep mode, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

4 Press Up $? 8$ or Down $\square$ to choose "ON" to activate this feature or choose "OFF" to deactivate it, press $\Theta$ beneath Select to confirm.

5 If you choose "ON", enter the period of time that you define as sleep mode time, in 24-Hour format, and then press $\Theta$ beneath OK.

## Note:

- $\mathbf{Z}^{\mathbf{Z}}$ appears to the right of you activate sleep mode and set an alarm.


## Alarm

You can set an alarm to ring once or ring in regular intervals about every 10 minutes.

## Activating the Alarm Feature

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose Date then press - beneath Select.
3 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select to choose Alarm.
4 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose "ON", and then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

5 Use the numeric keys to enter the time using the HH:MM format.
6 Press - beneath Select to save the alarm time setting.
7 Press the Left $\quad-$ or Right $\oplus$ to select the ring type.
8 Press - beneath Select to save the setting and return to the previous menu.

9 When the alarm sounds, press $\rightarrow$ beneath Stop to stop it or press - beneath Snooze to let it ring again after 10 minutes.

## Deactivating the Alarm Feature

1 Perform steps 1 through 3 from the last section, and then choose "OFF", and then press $\boldsymbol{-}$ beneath Select.

- If you selected $\mathbf{1 2 - H O U R}$ in the Time format menu, enter the time in 12 h format and use the Up $?$ or Down $\square$ to select AM or PM.

## Chapter 8: Date and Time

## Date Format

If you have set the date, you can choose the date format.
1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose 0 , then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press Down $\square$ to choose Date format, then press beneath Select. Three different date formats appear, (MM/DD, DD/MM and MM-DD).

4 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to highlight the format that you prefer, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

## Time Format

If you have set the time, you can choose the time format.
1 Press $\boldsymbol{-}$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press
 Date and time

3 Press Up $\rightarrow$ or Down $\square$ to choose Time format, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select. Two different time formats appear, (12hour and 24-hour).

4 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to highlight the format that you prefer, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

## Flash Time

During a conversation, allows you to access special services offered by your telephone network or to transfer a call to another extension if you are connected to a PABX (Private Automatic Branch of eXchange).
If your key does not work properly, you need to adjust the Flash time, as follows:

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose Base, then press beneath Select.
3 You are prompted to enter the current base PIN code (the default PIN is 1590). Use the numeric keys to enter and press $\rightarrow$ beneath OK.

4 Press - beneath Select to access Flash time. The current setting appears.
5 Press Left $\bullet$ or Right $\infty$ to choose the desired flash time, then press $\Theta$ beneath Save. You can choose from 100 ms , $120 \mathrm{~ms}, 300 \mathrm{~ms}$ or 600 ms .

## Key Functions

Press to enter \# or to switch between upper case and
lower case letters in the English mode.

## Auto Answer

You can answer a call by simply picking up the handset from the base, without pressing any key.

1 Press $\bigoplus$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press

to choosebeneath Select.

3 Press Up ? or Down $\infty$ to choose Auto answer, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

4 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose "ON" to activate this feature or choose "OFF" to deactivate it, press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

## Language

You can change the language used to display the menu messages. There are multiple languages available.

1 Press - beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose $\rightarrow$, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose Language, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select. The current language appears.
4 Press Up $?$ or Down $\square$ to select the language that you want, press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

## Resetting the Base

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose Base, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.
3 The handset prompts you to enter the current base PIN code (the default PIN is 1590). Use the numeric keys to enter the PIN, and then press $\Theta$ beneath OK.

4 Press Up $?$ or Down $\square$ to choose Base reset, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

5 "B Reset ?" appears. Press $\Theta$ beneath OK to confirm.
6 Press ©

## Notes:

- Be careful! When you reset the handset, you will lose any data stored in it (e.g. Numbers in the incoming and outgoing lists). Jot them down before resetting the handset.
- Resetting the base does not affect the handsets registered to the base.


## Select Keys

## Resetting the Handset or the Base

If you reset the handset or the base, all of the user-selectable features restore to the factory settings: When resetting the handset, the incoming and outgoing lists will be erased, but the Contacts and Flash time do not reset.

The handset and base can be reset independently. It is useful for the following purposes:

- If you have made many wrong settings and you want to restore the handset to the factory presets.
- If the phone shows logical malfunctions (incorrect symbols on the display, incorrect behavior, etc.), the problem can be caused by a switching power supply noise or an electrostatic spike that can temporarily alter the memory of the internal microprocessor. Resetting could solve the problem.


## Resetting the Handset

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose
3 Press Up $?$ or Down $\infty$ to choose Reset handset, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

4 The handset asks you to enter the current handset PIN code (the default PIN is 1590). Use the numeric keys to enter and press - beneath OK. "Reset ?" appears. Press $\Theta$ beneath OK to confirm.

5 Press ©

## Selecting a Base

Your handset can be used with up to 4 base units, provided that it has been registered with them. This menu option enables you to select which base you want to use:

1 Press $\boldsymbol{-}$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose Handse , then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.
3 Press Up ? or Down $\square$ to choose Select base, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

4 Press Up $? 3$ or Down $\square$ to select the base, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

5 Press (

## Notes:

- $V$ appears to the right of the selected base.
- If the selected base has not been registered with your handset, "Not registered" appears.
- At step 4, if you select "Best base", handset finds the first available unit as you move around.


## Package Contents

Once you have unpacked your phone, make sure that you have all of these parts. If any component is missing or broken, please call your dealer.

*The shapes of the plug varies according to each country's specification.

## Connecting

1 Connect the plug of the power supply to the power jack of the base, and then plug the power supply into a standard AC wall outlet.

2 Connect one end of the phone line cord to the phone line jack on the base, and then connect the other end to a standard phone wall outlet.


## Installing the Batteries

Rechargeable Ni-MH batteries (AAA size, $1.2 \mathrm{~V}, 800 \mathrm{mAh}$ ) come with your phone. Install the batteries before use.

1 Slide the battery cover in the direction of the arrow, and then pull it out.

2 Insert new batteries as indicated, matching correct polarity (+,-).
3 To replace the battery cover, sliding the cover up until it snaps into place.


## Base PIN

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press
 to choose

then pressbeneath Select.

3 The handset prompts you to enter the current base PIN code (the default PIN is 1590). Use the numeric keys to enter the code and press $\rightarrow$ beneath OK.

4 Press Up $? 2$ or Down $\square$ to choose Change PIN, then press beneath Select.

5 Enter the new four-digit PIN, and press - beneath OK.
6 Enter the new PIN code again to confirm it, then press beneath OK to save the setting.

## Chapter 7: Settings

## Changing the Handset \& Base PIN

Base and handset PINs are required to protect your phone against unauthorized use. They are set to 1590 at the factory. You can change the PINs as follows:

## Handset PIN

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose
3 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select to choose PIN code.
4 Enter the current PIN code, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath OK.
5 Enter the new four-digit PIN, and press - beneath OK.
6 Enter the new PIN code again to confirm it, then press beneath OK to save the setting.

## Note:

- At step 4, if you enter the wrong PIN, your phone generates a warning sound.


## Notes:

- Replace batteries if they don't recover their full storage capacity after recharging.
- When replacing the batteries, always use high quality Ni-MH re-chargeable batteries. Never use other types of batteries.


## Charging

## DECT Phone \& iPhone

Before initial operation, fully charge the DECT phone for 15 hours or more.

To charge the DECT phone or iPhone, simply place it on the base.


## Notes:

- When charging, the bars in $\square$ scroll.
- You can adjust the visual angle of the iPhone according to your needs (from 30 degrees to 75 degrees).


## Turning On or Off the Phone

When you place the handset (DECT phone) on the base, it automatically turns on.

To turn on the handset (when it's off), press $\qquad$
To turn off the handset, press © until "Goodbye!" appears.

## Note:

- Nothing appears on the screen when the battery power is very low. Fully charge the handset before use.


## Registering a New Handset

To share your phone line with other people, you can register up to 5 handsets to your base. To do this, assign a new number to each handset that you register. The supplied handset is already registered with the number 1, appearing as 1. For security reasons, the registration procedure can only be performed by people who are close to your base and know the REGISTER PIN. Please note that this PIN cannot be modified.

1 On the base, press and hold (O)D) for about three seconds, and then release the button.

2 Press - beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
3 Press to choose Handset and then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

4 Press Down $\square$ to choose Register, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

5 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose the base number that you want. Press - beneath Select to search the base. The display shows a series of characters.

6 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select to confirm. The display asks you to enter the AC (the authentication code is 1590). Enter this code and press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

7 If the registration is successful, a confirmation tone occurs and the new handset shows the handset number (e.g. 1).

## Editing or Deleting Contacts

You can edit or delete a number in the contacts, as follows:
1 Find the desired number in the contacts.
2 Press - beneath Select to view the details of the selected entry.
3 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select to display the option menus.
4 Press Up? or Down $\square$ to choose the desired option:

- Edit - allows you to edit the selected entry.
- Delete - deletes the selected entry.
- Delete all - deletes all of the contact entries.


## Speed Dial

You can store up to 9 speed dial numbers on the numeric keypad (0~9), so you can easily dial the numbers by pressing and holding the associated numeric key.

## Storing Speed Dial Numbers

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select to choose $B$.
3 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose Speed dial, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

4 Repeatedly press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to select the desired location (KEY 1~KEY 9), and then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Modify.
5 You can press Up $\because$ or Down $\square$ to scroll to the desired entries, and then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

6 Press $\Theta$ beneath Select again to confirm.

## Dialing a Speed Dial Number

Press and hold the numeric key (1~9), then press to dial the number through your landline or dial it through your iPhone using 回。

## Note:

- To extend radio coverage, a handset can be registered to up to 4 different base units. A base can be used with up to 5 handsets, and one base can connect to only one handset at a time.


## Deactivating a Handset

If necessary, you can clear a handset's registration, but you cannot deactivate the handset that you are using.

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose Base , then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Enter the current base PIN (the default is 1590) and press $\rightarrow$ beneath OK.

4 Press Up 2 or Down $\square$ to choose Release handset, then press -beneath Select. "H Desub ?" appears. Use the keypad to press the handset number for which you want to clear the registration, then press - beneath OK. A confirm tone occurs, and the handset cannot be used anymore with the base.

## Choosing the Dialing Mode

Your phone can be set to pulse dialing (rotary), or tone dialing (DTMF). To change the dialing mode:

1 Press $\boldsymbol{-}$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose CH , then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.
3 Enter the current base PIN (the default is 1590) and press $\rightarrow$ beneath OK.

4 Press Down $\square$ to choose Dial mode, then press - beneath Select. The current setting appears.
5 Press Left or Right $\infty$ to choose DTMF or PULSE, then press $\Theta$ beneath Save to confirm.

## Setting Date \& Time

Your phone can display the current date and time.
You must set the correct date and time to indicate when calls or messages are received.

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose 0 , then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press - beneath Select to choose Set Clock. The current settings are displayed:

4 Using the keypad, enter the current date and time (four digits for each, as explained below in the notes).

5 Press $\bigoplus$ beneath Select to save the setting.

## Reviewing or Dialing a Number in Contacts

You can search stored contacts by entering the first characters of their names (alphabetic search). You can also scroll through the entire list without accessing the Contacts menu.

## Method 1: Alphabetic Search

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press $\Theta$ beneath Select to choose
3 Press - beneath Select to access View.
4 Enter the first few letters of the name by using the alphanumeric keys, and press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select. The details appear.

5 Press to dial the number through your landline or dial it through your iPhone with $\qquad$

## Method 2: Searching by Scrolling the Contacts List

1 Press Down $\square$. The entire list appears in alphabetical order.
2 Repeatedly press Up $\because$ or Down to scroll to the desired entry.
3 Press $\Theta$ beneath Select to view the details of the selected entry.

4 Press to dial the number through your landline or dial it through your iPhone with .

## Method 2: In Standby Mode

1 Enter a phone number, then pressbeneath Save.

2 Complete storage by starting from Step 4 in the last paragraph of Method 1.

## Character Map

To enter a specific alphanumeric character, press the relevant key according to the following table: once for the first character, twice for the second and so on.

## Notes:

- To delete letters, use $\Theta$ beneath Delete.
- If you want to shift the case while entering letter, press
- When entering the same letter twice or a different letter on the same key, wait for a few seconds for the cursor to move automatically, and then select the next letter.


## Notes:

- If you selected $\mathbf{1 2 - H O U R}$ in the Time format menu, enter the time in 12 h format and use Up $\boldsymbol{3}$ or Down $m$ to select AM or PM.
- When setting the month, you can enter 1 digit or 2 digits at a time, but it is displayed in 2-digit format. (For example: For August, you can enter 8 or 08 in the month field, but the display shows "08".)
- After setting the time, press $\Theta$ beneath Select to set the date. During the date setting, press Left $\square$ to switch to time setting.
- If your service uses the FSK standard, the date and time is automatically set when you receive a call to this unit.

## Pairing with an iPhone

To use an iPhone with your iPhone Complimate, you must first pair and connect the iPhone with the iPhone Complimate.

1 Turn on the Bluetooth feature of your iPhone. Click Settings, General, Bluetooth and OFF, then the iPhone searches for available devices.

2 Press $\Theta$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
3 Press to choose Blutaoth
4 Press $\Theta$ beneath Select to choose Add device. The LCD shows Please wait..., and the Bluetooth LED flashes.
5 When the iPhone finds i-700, click Not Paired to connect it with the base. When the iPhone is successfully connected, Connected displays.

## Connecting an iPhone

All Bluetooth-paired devices are stored in the Device list, and only devices in the list can establish a Bluetooth connection with the DECT phone. Although seven iPhones can be paired with the DECT phone, only one iPhone can be connected to the base and be engaged in a call at one time.

## Method 1: Using the iPhone

1 Click Settings, General, Bluetooth. If the Bluetooth feature is off, click OFF to switch it on.

2 Click Not Connected to the right of i-700 to connect the iPhone to the iPhone Complimate. When the connection is successful, Connected appears.

## Chapter 6: Contacts

You can store frequently used numbers so that you can easily make a call without having to remember or enter the phone number. You can store up 200 entries in your contact list.

## Storing Contact Entries

## Method 1: Using the Contacts Menu

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press - beneath Select to choose
3 Press Up $? 2$ or Down $\square$ to choose New number, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

4 Enter a name. For additional details, please see the "Character Map".
5 Press Down $\square$ to move the cursor to the number field, then enter the appropriate phone number (up to 16 digits). Press and hold \# to insert a pause if necessary.
6 Press Down $ص$ to highlight the ring type number at the right of $\delta \sqrt{d}$, then press Left $\square$ or Right $\infty$ to select a ring to associate with the number.

7 Use the same method to associate a picture with this numbertress beneath Save to confirm.

## Notes:

- At step 5, az or AZ changes to 0-9. This indicates that you can only enter digits.
- If you make a mistake while entering a number or name, press $\Theta$ beneath Delete to clear the last character. You can also use Left $\square$ or Right $\infty$ to navigate to incorrect characters, then press $\Theta$ beneath Delete to clear them.


## Dialed Calls List

The last 20 dialed calls are stored in the Dialed Calls list. You can review, redial, delete and save these numbers.

1 Press $\Theta$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.

3 Press Up ? or Down $\square$ to choose Dialed calls, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select. The last dialed number appears on the screen.

4 Press Up $?$ or Down $\square$ to find the desired number, press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.
Press to dial it via your landline or dial it via your iPhone using
5 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select to display the option menus.
6 Press Up 2 or Down $\square$ to choose the desired option:

- Add to contacts - allows you to save the number in the contacts list. If the number is longer than 16 digits, only the first 16 digits are stored.
- Delete - deletes the selected number.
- Delete all - allows you to delete the entire dialed calls list (a prompt confirms your intent). Press $\Theta$ beneath Select to confirm or $\Theta$ beneath Cancel to exit without deleting the entries.


## Note:

- At step 3, if the list is empty, "No record." appears.


## Method 2: Using the iPhone Complimate Menu

1 Press $\Theta$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press $\sim_{\infty}^{\text {Blataoth }}$ to choose , then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.
3 Press Down $\square$ to choose Device list, press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

4 The display shows all devices that have been paired before. Press Up $?$ or Down $\square$ to choose the desired device, press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

5 Press - beneath Select to choose Connect. When the connection is successful, Connected appears to the right of i-700 on the iPhone screen.

## Method 3: Quick Connection

1 Press on the iPhone Complimate.
2 The display shows all devices that have been paired before. Press Up ? or Down $\square$ to choose the desired device, press $\Theta$ beneath Select to complete the connetion.

3 When the connection is successful, Connected appears to the right of i-700 on the iPhone screen.

## Note:

- If you switch off the Bluetooth function on the iPhone then switch on, you must connect it again.


## Disconnecting an iPhone

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose Bluetooth
3 Press Down $\square$ to choose Device list, press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

4 The display shows all devices that have been paired before. Press Up $\because$ or Down $\square$ to choose the desired device, press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

5 Press - beneath Select to choose Disconnect. Then a prompt tone occurs and Not Connected appears to the right of i-700 on the iPhone screen.

## Notes:

- At step 3, if the list is empty, "No record." appears.
- When "Missed calls xx" appears, you can press the OK key to access the Incoming Calls list.
- If the caller has specified that his name and number not be sent, "Private" appears on the screen and in the list.
- "Out of area" appears and is stored in the incoming call list when someone calls from an area where the telephone company does not offer identification services or name and number delivery to your region.


## Answered and Missed Calls Options

You can save or delete a number in the missed calls list, as follows:

1 Find the desired number in the incoming calls list.
2 Press $\Theta$ beneath Select to display the call information.
3 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select to display the option menus.
4 Press Up $\because$ or Down $\infty$ to choose the desired option:

- Add to contacts - allows you to save the number in the contacts list. If the number is longer than 16 digits, you can store only first 16 digits of the number.
- Delete - deletes the selected number.
- Delete all - allows you to delete the whole incoming calls list (a prompt confirms your intent). Press $\Theta$ beneath Select to confirm or $\Theta$ beneath Cancel to exit without deleting the entries.


## Chapter 5: Call Logs

## Answered or Missed Calls

When you receive a call and you subscribe to your network provider's caller ID service, if the caller's information is transmitted from the network on which the call was made (and the caller doesn't hide it), the caller's phone number is displayed. Additionally, you miss calls "Missed calls" followed by the number of missed calls ( 01,02 , etc.) and the icon $\downarrow$ appears.
The last 30 received (or missed) calls are stored in the Answered calls list (or Missed calls list), and you can call back the numbers, delete them or store them in the contacts list. To view the numbers, you can access the Answered calls list (or Missed calls list).

## Reviewing or Dialing a Number in the Incoming Calls List

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose $\square$, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press - beneath Select to access Missed calls or press Down $\square$ to choose Answered calls. Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select to confirm. The list of incoming calls appears. Numbers received via a landline appear with $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$, and numbers received via cellphone line appear with .

4 Scroll through the relevant calls list using Up ? or Down $\infty$ until you find the desired number, and then press beneath Select. The date/time that you received the call appears.
5 To dial a number through your landline, press or dial it through your iPhone using

## Removing a Paired iPhone

If you already have the maximum of seven paired iPhones in the Device list and you want to add another iPhone, you must first delete a paired iPhone.

1 Press beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose $\subset$, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.
3 Press Down $\square$ to choose Device list, and then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

4 The display shows all devices that have been paired. Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose the one you want to remove, and then press - beneath Select.

5 Press Down $\square$ to choose Remove, and then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select. The display shows Remove ? iPhone. Press - beneath Select to confirm. After successful operation, a confirm tone occurs.

6 In your iPhone, delete the DECT Bluetooth information. Click (D) on the right side of i-700, then click Forget this Device. Forget Device appears. Click it to delete.

## Reminder

Some of Instant Messenger, such as Viber, Skype, Fring, Im+, Nettalk...... may not well support Bluetooth protocol, please check with releant providers and update the software to use i-700 properly.

## Chapter 3: Basic Functions

## Making a Call

When you dial, up to 25 digits appear on the screen. If the number is longer than 16 digits, the digits become smaller to accommodate the whole number.
You can place your calls in two ways:

## Traditional Mode

1 Pick up the handset and press to engage the line. You hear a dial tone, and $\boldsymbol{\wedge}$ appears.

2 Dial a telephone number. The number appears on the screen. When you hear your called party, speak with a normal voice.
3 To end the call, press or place the handset on the base.

## High-featured Mode

This procedure is more convenient and reliable, because you can check the number as you enter it:

1 Enter a telephone number. Press and hold $\square$ to insert a pause if necessary. Check the number on the display.

2 If you make a mistake, correct it by using $\Theta$ beneath Delete.
3 When the number correctly appears, press to dial it out through a landline.
Or press to dial through your iPhone.
Note: The iPhone Complimate must first be connected to the iPhone via Bluetooth. For more details please refer to Bluetooth section.

## Charging Tone

Every time you place the handset on the base, a tone occurs. This tone confirms that the handset is charging. You can switch the tone ON or OFF.

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press
 Sound , then press $-$ beneath Select.

3 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose Charging tone, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

4 Press Up $? 3$ or Down $\square$ to choose "ON" to activate this feature or choose "OFF" to deactivate it, and then press beneath Select.

## Note:

- For normal use, we recommend that you leave the charging tone enabled. This makes the phone easier to use and avoids the risk improper placement in the charging cradle. In this case, the handset would not charge and it might go unnoticed.


## Key Tone

Every time that you press a key, your handset acknowledges it with a key tone. You can disable the key tones.

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose $\bigcirc$, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press Up $?$ or Down $\square$ to choose Key tone, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

4 Press Up $\because$ or Down $\square$ to choose "ON" to activate this feature or choose "OFF" to deactivate it, press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

## Note:

- For normal use, we recommend that you leave the key tones enabled. This makes the phone easier to use.


## Power Off Tone

When you turn off the handset, it generates a tone. You can disable the tone.

1 Press $\bigoplus$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press the navigation keys to choose $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

3 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose Power off tone, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

4 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose "ON" to activate this feature or choose "OFF" to deactivate it, and then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

Call Switching between the DECT Phone and an iPhone
During a call, you can switch between your iPhone Complimate and your iPhone.

1 During a cell line call using the DECT phone, click ${ }^{*}$ on the display of the iPhone, then click The call switches to the iPhone.
2 To switch back, click $\quad 1700$ on the iPhone. The call switches back to the iPhone Complimate.

## Note:

- To use this feature, the DECT phone must be paired and connected to the iPhone beforehand. For more details, please refer to Bluetooth section.


## Options during a call

During a call, you can press - beneath Option, and then select Hold to put the call or hold, or select Contacts to enter the Contacts list.

## Important Note:

When making/answering a call by iPhone, if you go away from the base of iPhone Complimate (longer than 10 meters), and then get closer to the base again, the call will be switched to the connected iPhone Complimate. At this time, you could have the following selections:

## Method 1:

Lift the handset of iPhone Complimate, then press $\square$ to continue the call.

## Method 2:

Click $\sqrt{4}$ ) on the display of the iPhone, then click $\square$ Phone The call switches to the iPhone again.

## Receiving a Call

When a call is received, the phone rings and "Incoming Call" appears on the screen. 个 Indicates a landline call or 苗 indicates a cellphone line call. If the incoming call can be identified (i.e. The caller's information is transmitted) you also see the caller's number.

Press to answer a landline call or press to answer a cell line call when your iPhone is charging. Or if the handset is on the base and you have activated the "Auto Answer" function (See page 51 for details), simply pick it up to answer the call. During conversation, the screen shows the elapsed time.

To end the call, press $\widehat{\odot}$ or replace the handset on the base.

## Note:

- The caller is identified only if your telephone network and the caller's network supports the service. However, a caller can still hide his/her number.


## Ring Setting

You can select unique cell, landline and internal call ring tones and volumes. There are 15 ringtones, and four volume levels. You can also turn off the ringer.

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose $\bigcirc$, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press $\Theta$ beneath Select to choose Cell ringtone, or press Up $? \rightarrow$ or Down $\square$ to choose PSTN ringtone or INT ringtone, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

4 Press Left or Right $\infty$ to select the ring tone that you like. Each time you press Left $\bullet$ or Right $\infty$, the handset sounds with the selected ring.

5 Press $\Theta$ beneath Select to save the ring tone setting and enter the ring volume setting.

6 Press Left $\square$ or Right $\infty$ to choose the volume level that you want. Each time you press Left $\square$ or Right $\infty$, the handset sounds with the selected volume.

7 Press - beneath Select to save the settings and return to the previous menu.

## Notes:

- If you turn off the ringer, when a call comes in, only the incoming call message appears on the display.
- You can also turn the PSTN ring off/on by long pressing \# when the line is not engaged.


## Background Color

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose , then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press Up 3 or Down $\square$ to choose Background, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select. The current setting appears on the screen.
4 Press to choose among 9 pre-defined colors, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

## Handset Name

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose $\square$, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select.
3 Press Up $\because$ or Down $\infty$ to choose Handset name, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select
4 Press Up $?$ or Down $\square$ to choose "ON", press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

5 Enter the name, up to 15 characters long that you want to assign to the handset, and then press $\Theta$ beneath Save.

6 Press $\sqrt{\square}$. The handset name appears.
7 To deactivate this feature, access the Handset name menu and choose "OFF", press $\Theta$ beneath Select.

## Using the Speakerphone

During a call, you can turn on the speakerphone that is built into the handset. You can simply put your handset on a surface (e.g. a desk) and enjoy the comfort of a handsfree conversation.

To turn on the speakerphone, press during a call. appears.


## Adjusting the Volume

During a conversation, press the Up or Down key to adjust the earpiece volume (or the handsfree speakerphone volume). There are five levels, which are shown by the bars of anlll.

When the last bar is red, the volume is at its maximum level.

## Muting a Call

During a conversation, you can temporarily mute the microphone so that the party on the other end of the line cannot hear you. You can still hear the other party. This enables you to converse privately with someone near you.

To mute your microphone, press the Right © during the conversation: appears.

To unmute the microphone, press the Right $\qquad$ disappears.

## Last Number Redial

Your phone allows you to quickly redial the last dialed number.
Pick up the handset and press to engage the line. Then press $\Theta$ beneath Redial to dial the last-dialed number.

## Flash Signal

If your phone service includes call waiting or conference call services, you can use to initiate these functions. For further details please contact your telephone company. Additionally, if you are connected to an extension line (PABX), you can use 给 to transfer a call to another extension.

To initiate any of these functions, press while the line is engaged.

## Using a Pause

A pause is useful when you access an interactive voice response system, such as an automated banking system. A pause provides a delay of 3 seconds.

After you dial a number and press , if you need to insert a 3second pause, press $\rightarrow$ beneath Pause.

## Chapter 4: Display and Sound

## Display Contrast

This adjustment enables you to optimize the visibility of the display by changing its contrast according to environmental conditions.

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose Display , then press $-\infty$ beneath Select.
3 Press $\Theta$ beneath Select again to choose Contrast. The current setting appears.
4 Press repeatedly to choose among the 11 available contrast levels, then press $\rightarrow$ beneath Select.

## Wallpaper

1 Press $\rightarrow$ beneath Menu to display the main menu items.
2 Press to choose $\square$, then press $\Theta$ beneath Select. Press Up $?$ or Down $\square$ to choose Wallpaper, then press
$3 \bigoplus$ beneath Select. The current setting appears on the display.
4 Press to choose among 12 pre-defined wall paper images, then press the Left $\rightarrow$.

## Three-way Conference Calling

When you have an external call and an intercom call in progress, you can set up a three-way conference call, like this:

Press - beneath Confer to set up a three-way conference call.

## Out of Range Indicator

The bars to the right of $Y$ show the signal strength received from the base. If you are too far from the base, the radio signal might become too weak for the phone to access the telephone line. In these conditions you can't make or receive phone calls, and $Y$ turns red and "Searching..." appears.

## Locking the Keypad

This function is useful to avoid accidentally pressing keys when you are carrying your handset. If you activate keylock, all keys are inhibited except and 回.

In this condition, when a call comes in, you can answer the call by pressing or . When the call ends, the keys are locked again.
To lock the keys, press and hold 首 until
To unlock the keys, press and holdun until disappears from the display.

## Paging

You can page the handset from the base by making the handset ring with a special ring. It's useful to locate a lost handset or call the user who currently has the handset.

To send the paging signal, briefly press (OD)), located on the base. All handsets registered with the base ring for 15 seconds.

To stop the paging signal before 15 seconds have passed, press (ol)) or any keys on the handset.

## Note:

- If a call comes in while the handset is being paged, the handset stops the paging operation and starts ringing normally.


## Temporary Tone-Dial Switchover

If you are using pulse dialing because your telephone line doesn't support tone dialing, you might not be able to access certain external services (e.g. automatic call centers, voice mailboxes, interactive telephone systems etc.), because they need tone dialing. You can avoid this limitation and access them anyway by doing this:
1 Pick up the handset and press to engage the line.
2 Press and hold $\underset{\sim}{*}$ until "-" is displayed: your DECT phone is temporarily in the tone dial mode.

3 Enter the number of the service that you need to access.
4 When you hang up, the phone automatically returns to the pulse mode.

## Intercom

If you connected more than one handset to a base (you can connect up to 5 handsets to the same base), you can have a conversation between two people using two different handsets.

1 Pick up the handset and press Left $b$. The screen display shows "INT $\mathbf{x}->$ " ( $\mathbf{x}$ is your handset number).
2 Press the number of the handset that you want to contact (from 1 to 5 ). The called handset starts to ring.

3 If the called party can answer your call, he/she can press (它 and start talking. You can see the handset number of the called party on your screen.

4 At the end of the conversation, press

## Transferring Calls between Handsets

If you have more than one handset registered to the same base, you can transfer an outside call between the handsets.

1 When you are connected to an external call, press Left $\quad$ and the number of the handset that you want to contact (from 1 to 5 ).

2 If the called party can answer your call, he/she can press and start talking.

3 If you want to cancel the transfer before the called party answers, press Left $\wp$. The call transfer is cancelled.
