

Uconnect™ 3.0 System



1. RADIO

Press the RADIO hard-key to enter the Radio Mode. The different tuner modes; AM, FM and SXM can be selected by touching the corresponding soft-keys in the Radio Mode.

2. INFO

Press the INFO button for an RDS station (one with call letters displayed). The radio will return a Radio Text message broadcast from an FM station (FM mode only).

3. A-B-C

Press the A-B-C hard-key to select the A, B or C preset list.

4. ENTER/BROWSE & TUNE/SCROLL

Press the ENTER/BROWSE button to accept a highlighted selection on the screen. Rotate the TUNE/ SCROLL rotary knob to scroll through a list or tune a radio station.

5. SEEK UP

Press the Seek Up soft-key to tune the radio to the next listenable station or channel.

6. BACK

Press the BACK button to return to a previous menu or screen.

7. MENU

Press the MENU button allows to scroll between the setting sub-menus.

8. PLAY/PAUSE/MUTE

Press to Play, Pause or Mute the music.

9. AUDIO

Press the AUDIO button to adjust the Bass, Mid Range, Treble, Balance or Fade.

10. SEEK DOWN

Press the Seek Down soft-key to tune the radio to the previous listenable station or channel.

11. ON/VOLUME

Push the ON/VOLUME control knob to turn on the radio. Push the ON/VOLUME control knob a second time to turn off the radio.

The electronic volume control turns continuously (360 degrees) in either direction without stopping. Turning the ON/VOLUME control knob to the right increases the volume and to the left decreases it.

12. PRESETS 1–6

These buttons tune the radio to the stations that you commit to pushbutton memory AM (A, B, C), FM (A, B, C) and Satellite - 18 AM, 18 FM and 18 SAT stations.

13. MEDIA

Pressing the MEDIA button will allow you to switch from AM/FM modes to Media mode (CD, USB/iPOD, AUX, Bluetooth).

Radio Mode

The radio is equipped with the following modes:

- FM
- AM
- SXM Sirius XMTM Satellite Radio (if equipped)

Touch the RADIO button, to enter the Radio Mode. The different tuner modes; AM, FM, and SXM, can then, be selected by touching the corresponding soft-keys in the Radio mode.

ON/OFF & Volume Control

• Push the ON/OFF Volume control knob to turn on the radio. Push the ON/OFF Volume control knob a second time to turn off the radio.

• When the audio system is turned on, the sound will be set at the same volume level as last played.

Enter/Browse & Tune/Scroll Control

 Turn the rotary TUNE/SCROLL control knob clockwise to increase or counterclockwise to decrease the radio station frequency. Push the ENTER/BROWSE button to choose a selection.

Seek Functions

- Touch and release the Seek Up button to tune the radio to the next listenable station or channel.
- During a Seek Up function, if the radio reaches the starting station after passing through the entire band two times, the radio will stop at the station where it began.

Seek Down

- Touch and release the Seek Down button to tune the radio to the next listenable station or channel.
- During a Seek Down function, if the radio reaches the starting station after passing through the entire band two times, the radio will stop at the station where it began.

Setting Presets

The Presets are available for all Radio Modes, and are activated by touching any of the six Preset buttons.

When you are receiving a station that you wish to commit into memory, press and hold the desired numbered button for more that 2 seconds or until you hear a confirmation beep.

The Radio stores up to 18 presets in each of the Radio modes. Press the A-B-C hard-key to select the A, B or C preset list.

If the screen shows Acquiring Signal, you might have to change the vehicle's position in order to receive a signal. In most cases, the satellite radio does not receive a signal in underground parking garages or tunnels.

Audio

- 1. Press the AUDIO button at the button of the radio.
- 2. The Audio Menu shows the following options for you to customize your audio settings.

Mid, Bass, Fade, Balance

• Select the desired setting to adjust, then touch the Enter/Browse button. Turn the Tune/Scroll knob to adjust the setting + or - 9. Press the back button when done.

Clock Setting

- 1. Press the Menu button at the bottom of the radio, next select the Time Format setting and then select Set Time.
- 2. Adjust the hours or minutes by turning the Tune/ Scroll knob, then pressing the Enter/Browse button to move to the next entry. You can also select 12hr or 24hr format by turning the Tune/Scroll knob, then pressing the Enter/Browse button on the desired selection.
- 3. Once the time is set press the "Back" button to exit the time screen.

Media Mode

Media Mode is entered by touching the Media button located on the side of the display. Once in Media Mode, select your media Source by rotating the Scroll rotary knob and pushing the Enter button.

Shuffle

Touch the shuffle soft-key to play the selections on the USB/iPod® device in random order to provide an interesting change of pace. Touch the soft-key a second time to turn this feature off.

Audio

Refer to Radio Mode for adjusting the audio settings.

Disc Mode

If equipped, your vehicle may have a remote Disc player located in the lower center console storage bin.

Disc Mode is entered by either inserting a Disc or by touching the Media button located on the side of the display. Once in Media Mode, select Disc mode.

Inserting Compact Disc

Gently insert one Disc into the Disc player with the Disc Press the EJECT button to eject the Disc. If you have label following the illustration indicated on the player. ejected a Disc and have not removed it within 10 seconds, The Disc will automatically be pulled into the Disc player it will be reloaded. If the Disc is not removed, the radio and the Disc icon will illuminate on the radio display. If will reinsert the Disc but will not play it. a Disc does not go into the slot more than 1.0 in (2.5 cm), a disc may already be loaded and must be ejected before a new Disc can be loaded.

If you insert a Disc with the ignition ON and the radio ON, the unit will switch to CD/Disc mode and begin to play when you insert the Disc. The display will show the track number, and index time in minutes and seconds. Play will begin at the start of track 1.

Browse

Touch the browse soft-key to scroll through and select a desired track on the Disc. Touch the exit soft-key if you wish to cancel the browse function.

Eject Button – Ejecting a Disc

A Disc can be ejected with the radio and ignition OFF.

USB/iPod® Mode

USB/iPod® Mode is entered by either inserting a USB Jump Drive or iPod® cable into the USB port or by touching the Media button located left of the display. Once in Media Mode, touch the source soft-key and select USB/iPod®.

- 2. Then scroll down and press the Audio soft-key to get to the Audio menu.
- 3. The Audio Menu shows the following options for you to customize your audio settings.

Equalizer

Touch the Equalizer soft-key to adjust the Bass, Mid and Treble. Use the + or - soft-key to adjust the equalizer to your desired settings. Press the back arrow soft-key when done.

• Touch the Balance/Fade soft-key to adjust the sound from the speakers. Use the arrow soft-key to adjust the sound level from the front and rear or right and left side speakers. Touch the Center "C" soft-key to reset the balance and fade to the factory setting. Press the back arrow soft-key when done.

Speed Adjustable

 Touch the Speed Adjusted Volume soft-key to select between OFF, 1, 2 or 3. This will decrease the radio volume relative to a decrease in vehicle speed. Press the back arrow soft-key when done.

Loudness

 Touch the Loudness soft-key to select the Loudness feature. When this feature is activated it improves sound quality at lower volumes.

Clock Setting

There are two ways to enter the clock setting procedure on the Uconnect $^{\text{TM}}$ 5.0 system.

1. Press the More hard-key on the right side of the display, next press the Time soft-key and then press the Set soft-key. **OR** Press the Settings hard-key on the right side of the display, then press the Clock soft-key. The Time setting screen is displayed and the clock can be adjusted as described in the following procedure.

NOTE: In the Clock Setting Menu you can also select Display Clock. Display Clock turns the clock display in the status bar on or off.

- 2. Touch the Up or Down arrows to adjust the hours or minutes, next select the AM or PM soft-key. You can also select 12hr or 24hr format by touching the desires soft-key.
- 3. Once the time is set press the "Done" soft-key to exit the time screen.

This functionality is only available for radios equipped with a Satellite receiver. In order to receive satellite radio, the vehicle needs to be outside with a clear view to the sky. If the screen shows Acquiring Signal, you might have to change the vehicle's position in order to receive a signal. In most cases, the satellite radio does not receive a signal in underground parking garages or tunnels.

No Subscription

Radios equipped with a Satellite receiver, require a subscription to the Sirius Service. When the Radio does not have the necessary subscription, the Radio is able to receive the Traffic/Weather channel only.

Replay

The replay function provides a means to store and replay up to 22 minutes of music audio and 48 minutes of talk radio. Once the channel is switched, content in replay memory is lost



Operation

Voice commands can be used to operate the UconnectTM Phone and to navigate through the UconnectTM Phone menu structure. Voice commands are required after most Uconnect™ Phone prompts. There are two general methods for how Voice Command works:

- 1. Say compound commands like "Call John Smith mobile".
- 2. Say the individual commands and allow the system to guide you to complete the task.

You will be prompted for a specific command and then guided through the available options.

- Prior to giving a voice command, one must wait for the beep, which follows the "Listen" prompt or another prompt.
- For certain operations, compound commands can be used. For example, instead of saying "Call" and then "John Smith" and then "mobile", the following compound command can be said: "Call John Smith mobile".

Press the button to accept the call. To ignore the call, touch the "Ignore" soft-key on the touch-screen. You can also touch the "answer" soft-key or touch the caller ID box.

Answer Or Ignore An Incoming Call — Call Currently In Progress

If a call is currently in progress and you have another incoming call, you will hear the same network tones for call waiting that you normally hear when using your mobile phone. Press the phone button, answer softkey or caller ID box to place the current call on hold and answer the incoming call.

NOTE: The UconnectTM Phone compatible phones in the market today do not support rejecting an incoming call when another call is in progress. Therefore, the user can only answer an incoming call or ignore it.

Making A Second Call While Current Call Is In Progress

To make a second call while you are currently on a call, press the (YVR button and say "Dial" or "Call" followed by the phone number or phonebook entry you wish to call. The first call will be on hold while the second call is in progress. Or you can place a call on hold by touching the Hold soft-key on the Phone main screen, then dial a number from the dialpad, recent calls, SMS Inbox or from the phonebooks. To go back to the first call, refer to "Toggling Between Calls" in this section. To combine two calls, refer to "Join Calls" in this section.

Place/Retrieve A Call From Hold

During an active call, touch the "Hold" soft-key on the Phone main screen.

Toggling Between Calls

If two calls are in progress (one active and one on hold), touch the "Swap" soft-key on the Phone main screen. Only one call can be placed on hold at a time.

You can also press the button to toggle between the active and held phone call.

Join Calls

When two calls are in progress (one active and one on hold), touch the "Join Calls" soft-key on the Phone main screen to combine all calls into a Conference Call.

Call Termination

To end a call in progress, momentarily press the button or the end soft-key. Only the active call(s) will be

terminated and if there is a call on hold, it will become the new active call. If the active call is terminated by the far end, a call on hold may not become active automatically. This is cell phone-dependent.

Redial

- Press the "Redial" soft-key,

Working With Automated Systems

This method is used in instances where one generally has to press numbers on the mobile phone keypad while navigating through an automated telephone system.

You can use your UconnectTM Phone to access a voice mail system or an automated service, such as a paging

service or automated customer service line. Some ser- entries. For example, if you previously created a Phone-UconnectTM Phone.

When calling a number with your Uconnect™ Phone that normally requires you to enter in a touch-tone sequence on your mobile phone keypad, you can utilize the NOTE: touch-screen or press the (VR button and say the word "Send" then the sequence you wish to enter. For example, if required to enter your PIN followed with a pound, (37 4 6 #), you can press the ((2VR button and say, "Send 3 7 4 6 #". vices require immediate response selection. and convenience of you and your passengers. Some of these should not be used when driving because they take your eyes from the road or your attention from driving. Never dial using the mobile phone keypad while driving.

You can dial a phone number with your mobile phone keypad and still use the Uconnect™ Phone (while dialing via the mobile phone keypad, the user must exercise caution and take precautionary safety measures). By dialing a number with your paired Bluetooth® mobile phone, the audio will be played through your vehicle's audio system. The UconnectTM Phone will work the same as if you dial the number using voice a command.

NOTE: Certain brands of mobile phones do not send the dial ring to the UconnectTM Phone to play it on the vehicle audio system, so you will not hear it. Under this situation, after successfully dialing a number the user may feel that the call did not go through even though the call is in progress. Once your call is answered, you will hear the audio.

Mute/Un-Mute (Mute ON/OFF)

When you mute the UconnectTM Phone, you will still be able to hear the conversation coming from the other party, but the other party will not be able to hear you. In order to mute the UconnectTM Phone simply touch the Mute button on the Phone main screen.

Advanced Phone Connectivity

Transfer Call To And From Mobile Phone

The UconnectTM Phone allows ongoing calls to be transferred from your mobile phone to the UconnectTM Phone without terminating the call. To transfer an ongoing call from your paired mobile phone to the Uconnect[™] Phone or vice versa, press the Transfer button on the Phone main screen.

Connect Or Disconnect Link Between The UconnectTM Phone And Mobile Phone

If you would like to connect or disconnect the Bluetooth® connection between a UconnectTM Phone paired mobile phone and the UconnectTM Phone, follow the instructions described in your mobile phone User's Manual.

Things You Should Know About Your Uconnect $^{\text{TM}}$ Phone


Bluetooth® Communication Link



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

related to the use of the UconnectTM features and applications in this vehicle. Only use UconnectTM when it is safe to do so. Failure to do so may result in an accident involving serious injury or death.

When you press the UconnectTM Voice Command (*\frac{1}{2}VR button, you will hear a beep. The beep is your signal to give a command.

If no command is spoken the system will say one of two responses:

- I didn't understand
- I didn't get that, etc.,

If a command is not spoken a second time, the system will respond with an error and give some direction as

what can be said based on the context you are in. After three consecutive failures of a spoken command the VR session with end.

Pressing the UconnectTM Voice Command (*EVR button while the system is speaking is known as "barging in." The system will be interrupted, and after the beep, you can say a command. This will become helpful once you start to learn the options.

NOTE: At any time, you can say the words "Cancel" or "Help".

These commands are universal and can be used from any menu. All other commands can be used depending upon the active application.

Roadside Assistance (If Equipped)

If your vehicle is equipped with this feature and within cellular range, you may be able to connect to Roadside Assistance, Uconnect™ Care and Vehicle Care by pressing the "Assist" button on the Rearview Mirror of your vehicle. To the extent any such calls incur additional

costs, you are responsible for them. If Roadside Assistance is provided to your vehicle, you agree to be responsible for any additional roadside assistance service costs that you may incur.

In order to provide UconnectTM Services to you, we may record and monitor your conversations with Roadside Assistance, UconnectTM Care or Vehicle Care, whether such conversations are initiated through the UconnectTM Services in your vehicle, or via a landline or mobile telephone, and may share information obtained through such recording and monitoring in accordance with regulatory requirements. You acknowledge, agree and consent to any recording, monitoring or sharing of information obtained through any such call recordings.

9–1–1 Call – If Equipped

The 9-1-1 Call system is an embedded phone system that allows you to connect to a 9-1-1 operator in an emergency. You can choose to press the 9-1-1 Call button on the Rearview Mirror to contact a 9-1-1 operator.

9–1–1 Call Operating Instructions

1. Press the 9-1-1 Call button on the Rearview Mirror;

NOTE: In case the 9-1-1 Call button is pushed in error, there will be a 10 second delay before the 9-1-1 Call system initiates a call to a 9-1-1 operator. To cancel the 9-1-1 Call connection, press the 9-1-1 Call button on the Rearview Mirror or press the cancellation button on the Phone Screen, Termination of the 9-1-1 Call will turn the green LED light on the Rearview Mirror off.

2. The LED light on the Rearview Mirror will turn green once a connection to a 9-1-1 operator has been made;

- 3. Once a connection between the vehicle and a 9-1-1 operator is made, the 9-1-1 Call system may transmit the following important vehicle information to a 9-1-1 operator:
 - indication that the occupant placed a 9-1-1 Call;
 - the vehicle brand; and
 - the last known GPS coordinates of the vehicle.
- 4. You should be able to speak with the 9-1-1 operator through the vehicle audio system to determine if additional help is needed.

NOTE: Once a connection is made between the vehicle's 9-1-1 Call system and the 9-1-1 operator, the 9-1-1 operator may be able to open a voice connection with the vehicle to determine if additional help is needed. Once the 9-1-1 operator opens a voice connection with the vehicle's 9-1-1 Call system, the operator should be able to speak with you or other vehicle occupants and hear sounds occurring in the vehicle. The vehicle's 9-1-1 Call system will attempt to remain connected with the 9-1-1 operator until the 9-1-1 operator terminates the connection.

5. The 9-1-1 operator may attempt to contact appropriate emergency responders and provide them with important vehicle information and GPS coordinates.

6. If a connection between the vehicle and a 9-1-1 operator is made, the 9-1-1 Call system may transmit certain vehicle information to a 9-1-1 operator, including the last known GPS coordinates of your vehicle. If a connection is made between a 9-1-1 operator and your vehicle, you understand and agree that 9-1-1 operators may record conversations and sounds in your car upon connection and consent to such recordings. or smoke is visible, dangerous road conditions or location), do not wait for voice contact from a 9-1-1 operator. All occupants should exit the vehicle immediately and move to a safe location.

WARNING!

The 9-1-1 Call system is embedded into the vehicle's electrical system. Do not add any aftermarket electrical equipment to the vehicle's electrical system. This may prevent your vehicle from sending a signal to initiate an emergency call. To avoid interference that can cause the 9-1-1 Call system to fail, never add aftermarket equipment (e.g., two-way mobile radio, CB radio, data recorder, etc.) to your vehicle's electrical system or modify the antennas on your vehicle.

9-1-1 Call System Limitations

Vehicles sold in Canada and Mexico DO NOT have 9-1-1 Call system capabilities.

9-1-1 or other emergency line operators in Canada and Mexico may not answer or respond to 9-1-1 system calls.

If the 9-1-1 Call system detects a malfunction, any of the following may occur at the time the malfunction is detected, and at the beginning of each ignition cycle:

- the Rearview Mirror light will continuously be illuminated red;
- The Phone Screen will display the following message "Vehicle phone requires service. Please contact your dealer."; and,
- An In-Vehicle Audio message will state "Vehicle phone requires service. Please contact your dealer."

Ignoring the Rearview Mirror light could mean you will not have 9-1-1 Call services. If the Rearview Mirror light is illuminated, have an authorized dealer service the 9-1-1 Call system immediately.

WARNING!

The ORC turns on the Air Bag Warning Light on the instrument panel if a malfunction in any part of the system is detected. If the Air Bag Warning Light is illuminated, the 9-1-1 system may not be able to send a signal to a 9-1-1 operator. If the Air Bag Warning Light is illuminated, have an authorized dealer service the ORC system immediately.

Even if the 9-1-1 Call system is fully functional, factors beyond Chrysler Group LLC's control may prevent or stop 9-1-1 Call system operation. These include, but are not limited to, the following factors:

If the screen shows Acquiring Signal, you might have to When in Satellite mode: change the vehicle's position in order to receive a signal. In most cases, the satellite radio does not receive a signal in underground parking garages or tunnels.



Operation

Voice commands can be used to operate the UconnectTM Phone and to navigate through the UconnectTM Phone menu structure. Voice commands are required after most Uconnect™ Phone prompts. There are two general methods for how Voice Command works:

- 1. Say compound commands like "Call John Smith mobile".
- 2. Say the individual commands and allow the system to guide you to complete the task.

Call By Saying A Phonebook Name

- Press the button to begin,
- After the "Listening" prompt and the following beep, say "Call John Doe Mobile",
- The UconnectTM Phone will dial the number associated with John Doe, or if there are multiple numbers it will ask which number you want to call for John Doe.

Call Controls

The touch-screen allows you to control the following call features:

- Answer

- Ignore
- Hold/unhold

- Swap 2 active calls
- Join 2 active calls together

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Touch-Tone Number Entry

- Touch the "Phone" soft-key,
- Touch the "Dial" soft-key,
- The Touch-Tone screen will be displayed,
- Use the numbered soft-keys to enter the number and touch "Call".

To send a touch tone using Voice Recognition (VR), press the (YVR) button while in a call and say "Send 1234#" or you can say "Send Voicemail Password" if Voicemail password is stored in your mobile phonebook.

Recent Calls

You may browse up to 34 of the most recent of each of the following call types:

- Incoming Calls
- Outgoing Calls

- Missed Calls
- All Calls

These can be accessed by touching the "recent calls" soft-key on the Phone main screen.

You can also press the button and say "Show my incoming calls" from any screen and the Incoming calls will be displayed.

You can also press the button and say "Show my recent calls" from any screen and the All calls screen will be displayed.

NOTE: Incoming can also be replaced with "Outgoing", "Recent" or "Missed".

Answer Or Ignore An Incoming Call — No Call **Currently In Progress**

When you receive a call on your mobile phone, the Uconnect™ Phone will interrupt the vehicle audio system, if on, and will ask if you would like to answer the call. Press the button to accept the call. To ignore the **Progress** call, touch the "Ignore" soft-key on the touch-screen. You can also touch the "answer" soft-key or touch the caller ID box.

Answer Or Ignore An Incoming Call — Call Currently In Progress

If a call is currently in progress and you have another incoming call, you will hear the same network tones for call waiting that you normally hear when using your mobile phone. Press the phone button, answer softkey or caller ID box to place the current call on hold and answer the incoming call.

NOTE: The UconnectTM Phone compatible phones in the market today do not support rejecting an incoming call when another call is in progress. Therefore, the user can only answer an incoming call or ignore it.

Making A Second Call While Current Call Is In

To make a second call while you are currently on a call, press the ("ZVR button and say "Dial" or "Call" followed by the phone number or phonebook entry you wish to call. The first call will be on hold while the second call is in progress. If two calls are in progress (one active and one on hold), touch the "Swap" soft-key on the Phone main screen. Only one call can be placed on hold at a time.

You can also press the button to toggle between the active and held phone call.

Join Calls

When two calls are in progress (one active and one on hold), touch the "Join Calls" soft-key on the Phone main screen to combine all calls into a Conference Call.

Call Termination

To end a call in progress, momentarily press the button or the end soft-key. Only the active call(s) will be

terminated and if there is a call on hold, it will become the new active call. If the active call is terminated by the far end, a call on hold may not become active automatically. This is cell phone-dependent.

Redial

Call Continuation

If you would like to connect or disconnect the Bluetooth® connection between a UconnectTM Phone paired mobile

Things You Should Know About Your UconnectTM Phone

Voice Command

- For best performance, adjust the rearview mirror to provide at least ½ in (1 cm) gap between the overhead console (if equipped) and the mirror.
- Always wait for the beep before speaking.
- Speak normally, without pausing, just as you would speak to a person sitting a few feet/meters away from you.
- Make sure that no one other than you is speaking during a voice command period.
- Performance is maximized under:
 - low-to-medium blower setting,

- smooth road surface,
- fully closed windows,
- dry weather condition.
- Even though the system is designed for users speaking in North American English, French, and Spanish accents, the system may not always work for some.


Mobile phones have been found to lose connection to the Uconnect[™] Phone. When this happens, the connection

can generally be reestablished by switching the phone OFF/ON. Your mobile phone is recommended to remain in Bluetooth® ON mode.

9-1-1 Call System Limitations

Vehicles sold in Canada and Mexico DO NOT have 9-1-1 Call system capabilities.

9-1-1 or other emergency line operators in Canada and Mexico may not answer or respond to 9-1-1 system calls.

If the 9-1-1 Call system detects a malfunction, any of the following may occur at the time the malfunction is detected, and at the beginning of each ignition cycle:

- the Rearview Mirror light will continuously be illuminated red;
