Airespace wishes to certify an outdoor 802.11 accesspoint radio. This radio is an industrial IEE802.11 A/B/G access point in a robust weatherproof enclosure. See photos (below and right)

This outdoor access point radio is intended to be installed in areas such as commercial building rooftops, and commercial communications facilities such as towers. There are three items XXXX this radio is intended for professional installation.

a) Marketing:

The product will not be marketed to the general public. The device will be purchased by commercial enterprises and educational institutions wishing to extend their 802.11 infrastructure outdoors.

b) Requires professional installation:

Due to the nature of the device and the intended installation locations, the device will require professional installation of the radio and antennas as well as professional configuration of the product. The product will only be installed by professionals who have received proper training in the installation of the radio and the antennas.

c) Application example:

The outdoor radio will extend commercial IEEE802.11 infrastructure outside. The mounting of the radio will require professional installation as well the installation of the conduits to the radio that will being the Ethernet connection and 120 VAC or 48VDC to the radio.
