

ON/OFF/MODE BUTTON

SETTING THE PASSWORD

- When setting the Password for the first time, press the - button 0; "LOCK?" will appear in the display. Enter the desired four digit Password using the Calculator/ Alphabet buttons 2.
- Press the ENTER button and the unit will be locked; a key icon will appear in the display. When in the Locked mode, any mode after the Currency Converter will need the password to access.
