• TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given recent studies, which show that using a mobile telephone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile telephone when the vehicle is not parked.

Your mobile phone when powered emits radiation which may interfere with the vehicle electronic systems such as anti-lock brakes (ABS, airbag). As a result, you should:

- avoid placing the phone on the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area.
- connect the phone to an external antenna or switch the phone off. The antenna should be mounted and located away from the driver and passengers or separated from them by a metal screen (e.g. the car roof).
- check with the car manufacturer or your car dealer that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

• CONDITIONS OF USE:

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft to avoid prosecution.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except

in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency. When the phone is switched on, avoid placing it near a medical aid device, if you carry one, such as a pacemaker, one hearing aid or insulin pump. When using the phone you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, gas station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere. Do not let small children use the phone without supervision. Do not attempt to open or repair it yourself. Use only Alcatel batteries, battery chargers, and accessories that are compatible with your phone model. (See Accessories List, chapter 17). Alcatel will not be held responsible if this is not respected. Do not allow your phone to be exposed to unfavourable environmental conditions (humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10° C to $+ 55^{\circ}$ C. Over 55°C the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

• BATTERY:

Before removing the battery from your phone, please make sure that the phone is switched off. Take precautions with the battery and do not attempt to open the battery (chemical substances may cause burns). Do not pierce, disassemble nor cause a short-circuit in a battery. Do not burn or dispose of a used battery in household waste or store it at temperatures above 60 °C. Batteries must be disposed of in accordance with locally applicable environmental legislation. Batteries should not be used for any other purpose than the one intended. Never use damaged batteries.

CHARGERS

Mains powered chargers mains will operate within the temperature range: 0 to 40° C. The chargers designed for your mobile phone meet with the standard for safety of information technology equipment and office equipment use. They should be used for this purpose only.

• RADIO WAVES:

THIS MODEL PHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health. The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the **Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR**. The SAR limit set by public authorities such as the Federal Communications Commission of the US Government (FCC) or by Industry Canada, is 1.6 W/kg averaged over I gram of body tissue.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the phone. Before a phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 0.24 W/Kg and for use close to the body is 0.74 W/Kg. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure.

Your telephone is equipped with a built-in antenna. For optimal operation, you should avoid touching it or degrading it.

The World Health Organization (WHO) considers that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using "hands-free" devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body." (fact sheet $n^{\circ}193$).


Your telephone is a transceiver that operates on GSM networks with 1900 MHz bands (One Touch 331p) or 850 and 1900 MHz bands (One Touch 331a).

Protection against theft

Your telephone is identified by an IMEI (phone serial number) shown on the packaging label and in the product's memory. We recommend that you note the number the first time you use your telephone by entering \textcircled{M}_{0} , \textcircled{P}_{0} , \textcircled{O}_{0} , \textcircled{P}_{0} , \textcircled{P}_{0} and keep it safely. It may be requested by the police or your operator if your telephone is stolen. This number allows your mobile telephone to be blocked preventing a third person from using it, even with a different SIM card.

When you create a file, you can include 3 different numbers (Home, Mobile, Office).

If you change your SIM card, an information message will be displayed when the telephone is switched on. You must then decide if this card will become your main SIM card or if it is being inserted temporarily:



- Keypress on c: the SIM card you just inserted becomes your main card. You can create the files with up to three numbers (Home, Mobile, Office). If you reinsert your old SIM card, you will no longer find the three numbers that were formerly associated with the same name.
- Keypress on s: the SIM you just inserted is considered as "Temporary". You will be able to create or modify files with one number only. If you then reinsert the first card (your main card), you will find the three number association it originally contained.

8.2 Reading your messages

The messages will be automatically stored on your SIM card directory, but you can store them in your telephone's memory by selecting the "**Archive**" option.

"Unread" messages

When a new message is received, a screen message "**Do you want** to read your new messages?" and the **Do** icon are displayed and an audible signal (1) is emitted.


The **Equ** icon disappears when all new **"Events"** (messages, calls, ...) have been consulted.

You can call one of the numbers that appears in a message you have received by pressing (k).

All written, sent and stored messages.



"Archived" messages

These messages can be read or written messages that you have sent from the SIM card memory to the telephone memory. You can save up to 30 messages in your telephone memory.

Archived messages are classified in three groups: Received, To send, Sent.

You can create a message or amend a stored message. You can create a message with text only but can also assign icons or sounds, or mood icons (See page 47)




The shape of the cursor will tell you whether you are in: - predictive mode (data entry system, see page 45) or - normal mode

To switch from one mode to the other, make a long keypress on the $(\stackrel{**}{*})$ key.

While writing the message, depending on the selected entry mode, you can access the following options by pressing the key.

The underlined options (see page 44) will be displayed only in the predictive mode.



8.4 Data entry system (1): predictive mode

To make it easier to write short messages, your phone has an assisted data entry system: in predictive mode (1), the cursor looks like a thick bar . To create a word, you only need to press once the key for each letter contained in the word.


The character displayed may not correspond to the one you requested; the system suggests the most usual word. <u>Do not worry</u> about the words initially suggested, go on typing, the system will make better suggestions as you type.

When you have finished typing your word:

• If the suggested word is the one you want: Press (12) to validate and insert a space.

• If the word suggested is not the one you want: Press $\overline{0,+}$ to scroll for other suggestions and validate your choice of word by pressing $\overline{18}$.



The recipient of the message must have a compatible EMS (Enhanced Message Service) mobile phone in order to display icons and mood icons, and listen to the sounds attached to your message.

8.5 Sending a message (I)
