Safety and use

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your cellphone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

• TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a cellphone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their cellphone when the vehicle is not parked. Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless telephones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.

When driving, do not use your cellphone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your cellphone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your cellphone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,

- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the car's electronic devices are shielded from cellphone RF energy.

CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimize its performance. Switch the cellphone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the cellphone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, cellphones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the cellphone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, gas station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the cellphone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump. In particular when using the cellphone you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

To avoid hearing impairment, answer the call before holding your cellphone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let small children use your cellphone without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your cellphone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your cellphone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your cellphone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc.). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10° C to $+55^{\circ}$ C (the max value depends on device, materials and housing paint/texture). Over 55° C the legibility of the cellphone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Do not open or attempt to repair your cellphone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or try to bend your cellphone.

Do not paint it.

Use only batteries, battery chargers, and accessories which are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates and are compatible with your cellphone model (see Accessories List page 69).TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates disclaim any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries.

Your cellphone should not be disposed of in a municipal waste. Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your cellphone.

Some people may suffer epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, or when playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult your doctor before playing video games on your cellphone or enabling a flashing-lights feature on your cellphone. Parents should monitor their children's use of video games or other features that incorporate flashing lights on the cellphones. All persons should discontinue use and consult a doctor if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements, or disorientation. To limit the likelihood of such symptoms, blease take the following safety orecautions:

- Do not play or use a flashing-lights feature if you are tired or need sleep.

- Take a minimum of a 15 minute break.

- Play in a well lit environment.

- Play at the farthest distance possible from the screen.

When you play games on your cellphone, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. Follow these instructions to avoid problems such as tendinitis, carpal tunnel syndrome, or other musculoskeletal disorders:

- If your hands, wrists, or arms become tired or sore while playing, stop and rest for several hours before playing again.

- If you continue to have sore hands, wrists, or arms during or after playing, stop the game and see a doctor.

Your cellphone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for cellphones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by public authorities such as the Federal Communications Commission of the US Government (FCC), or by Industry Canada, is 1.6 W/kg averaged over 1 gram of body tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the cellphone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the cellphone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the cellphone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the cellphone Before a cellphone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national regulations and standards must be shown.

The highest SAR value for this model cellphone when tested is 0.961 W/Kg for use at the ear and 0.96 W/Kg for use close to the body.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various cellphones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure. For body-worn operation, the cellphone meets FCC RF exposure guidelines provided that it is used with a non-metallic accessory with the handset at least 1.5 cm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.

The World Health Organization (WHO) considers that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for use of cellphones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using "hands-free" devices to keep cellphones away from the head and body. 




Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger

- It may take up to 20 minutes during the initial charge for the phone to powerup.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The AC outlet must be near the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours)).

2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the 3 key until the telephone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary and then confirm by pressing the \bigcirc key. The main screen will wake up.



If you don't know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code near your telephone and store your card in a safe place when not in use.

If cell broadcast messages are displayed, use the \bigcirc key to browse through them in full or press the right softkey to return to the main screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, "Searching/Emergency" will be displayed.

In the power on screen, you also have access to "Media album" and "Camera" functions even if no SIM card is present..

2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the $\frac{1}{2}$ key from the main screen.

Calls

3.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the $\$ key to place the call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the right softkey.

To hang up the call, press the $\frac{3}{2}$ key.



To enter characters "+", "W" (for tonewait) or "P" (used to store a number with extension number), hold down the \bigcirc key (the following characters will scroll by: 0, +, P, W).

Making an emergency call

If your phone is covered by the network, dial 911 or any other applicable emergency number and press the \langle key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unlocking the keypad.

3.2 Calling your voicemail (1)

Voicemail once configured, will take messages of callers if you are unavailable. To access your voicemail, hold down the 2 key.





If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to "**My numbers**" (see page 27).



To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

3.3 Receiving a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the \backslash key to talk and then hang up using the $\frac{2}{3}$ key.

If the $\{33\}$ icon is displayed, the vibrator is activated and ringtones are disabled. If the # icon is displayed, the phone neither rings nor vibrates.

The caller's number is displayed if it is transmitted by the network (contact your network operator to check service availability).

If the flip is open

- To answer a call, press the 📏 key.

If the flip is closed

- To answer a call, open the flip (if clamshell open answer option is activated, see page 40).

Muting the ringtone

Press the right softkey once while the telephone is ringing. Answer the call by pressing the $\$ key.

Rejecting a call

Press the $\frac{9}{2}$ key once or the right softkey twice.

3.4 During a call

Available functions

During a call, you may access your directory, diary, short messaging, etc. without disconnection of your current conversation by pressing the $\triangleleft \triangleright$ key.

3.5 Conference calls ⁽¹⁾

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to 5). If you are on a double call, press "**Options**" and select "**Conference**" then confirm with the \bigcirc key. If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the \backslash key and speak with your new correspondent.

This correspondent becomes a member of the conference if you press "**Options**" and select "**Add to conference**", and then confirm by pressing \bigcirc . Pressing $\stackrel{\circ}{\searrow}$ disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press "Options" and select "End conf.".

3.6 Line switching ⁽¹⁾

Your SIM card can contain two distinct telephone numbers. Under "**Call register**", choose "**Line switching**" and then select a default line; all outgoing calls will be made from this number. Incoming calls will still be received from both lines despite the default set.

The services programmed on the default line do not impact those selected on the other line.





My cellphone turns off by itself

- · Check that your keypad is locked when you are not using your cellphone
- Check the battery charge level

My cellphone will not charge properly

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; the battery charge indicator can take several minutes and may be accompanied by a quiet whistling sound
