# Safety and use .....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your cellphone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

#### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a cellphone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their cellphone when the vehicle is not parked. Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless telephones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.

When driving, do not use your cellphone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your cellphone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your cellphone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,

- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the car's electronic devices are shielded from cellphone RF energy.

### CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimize its performance. Switch the cellphone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the cellphone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, cellphones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Your cellphone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. 

# 2.I Set-up

# Inserting and removing the SIM card ()

In order to make or receive calls, you must insert your SIM card as illustrated below.



Place the SIM card with the bronze colored chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press the SIM card firmly and slide it out. Please power off your telephone before you remove the SIM card.

## Installing the battery



Insert and click the battery into place, then close the telephone cover. Do not force the battery, as this may cause damage to the battery and or telephone.

# Charging the battery



### Connect the battery charger

- It may take up to 20 minutes during the initial charge for the telephone to powerup.

- When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours (iii)).

# 3.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the  $\bigcirc / \bigcirc$  key to place the call. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the right softkey.

To hang up the call, press the  $^{\circ}$ / $\stackrel{\circ}{=}$  key.

To enter characters "+", "W" (for tonewait) or "P" (used to store a number with extension number), hold down the  $\Box$  + key (the following characters will scroll by: 0, +, P,W).

## Making an emergency call

If your telephone is covered by the network, dial **911** or any other applicable emergency number and press the  $\bigcirc / \bigcirc$  key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code or unlocking the keypad.

# **3.2** Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>

Voicemail once configured, will take messages of callers if you are unavailable. To access your voicemail, hold down the  $|_{\infty}$  key.

If the access number for your operator's voicemail service does not work, dial the number that you were given. To change this number at a later date, refer to "**My numbers**" (see page 28).

# **3.3** Receiving a call






