

1.1 Keys and connectors

Inserting or removing the SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your phone and remove battery before inserting or removing the SIM card.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press it and slide it out.

Installing or removing the battery



- . Insert and click the battery into place, then close the telephone
- Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

Installing and removing the memory card (microSD card)



Insert the microSD card with its golden contact facing downwards into the slot until it is locked in place. To remove it, gently push the card in until it unlocks.

Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone and outlet respectively.

To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use: reduce the backlight time, etc.

2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the \sim key until the phone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary. The main screen is displayed.

Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you are required to adjust initial basic settings and login to your Facebook account to synchronize Facebook information.

2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the key from the Home screen.



3.1 Placing a call

Enter the desired number from the keypad directly or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call log**, then press the \checkmark key to place the call. The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by selecting "**Save**".

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the **Delete** key.

To hang up, press the ∞ key.

3.2 Answering or rejecting a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the \checkmark key or select "Answer" by pressing the \bigcirc key to answer.

Hang up the call by pressing the A key. If the caller (local contact only) is not one of your Facebook friends and the remind setting is active, a reminder screen will appear to suggest sending a Facebook friend request to the caller.

3.3 Calling your voicemail (1)

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can listen to at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down the we key.

4 Changing the menus

The menus can be changed to the way you want them.

Change the order

Access the main menu, focus on the main menu item you want to move, select "Options/Move", and tick "/" will be shown on the item you selected, then release it to your favorite destination.

Show/Hide

Access the main menu, select "Options/Add and remove menu", and select the left check box of the selected menu once to show/hide, and then select "Done" to save the operation.

You may access this menu using the following options

5.1 SMS/MMS

You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this mobile phone.

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

Write new SMS/MMS 511

You can select "Write new SMS/MMS" from the messaging screen to write text/multimedia messages. One or more recipients can be added from the contact list and you can remove a recipient by pressing Select "Contacts" using the key and then select multiple recipients.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when images, videos, audio, slides or attachments are inserted; Subject, CC/BCC/email address is added; or the message contains more than 8 pages of text.

When finished entering text, press the key to send it.

An SMS message of more than a certain number of characters (the number of characters depends on your language) will be charged as several SMS messages. An MMS message containing photos and/or sounds may also be billed as more than one message. Specific letters (accents) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause your recipient to receive your message as two or more SMS messages.

5.2 Email

Your phone has an email client with the settings pre-defined for a few popular email services like - Gmail, Sky, AOL, etc. Besides these, you can set up other POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts that you may be using.

5.2.1 Email account set-up

Pre-defined email service

If you own an email account with a predefined service, you can install it to your phone by selecting the service (Gmail, Sky, etc.), entering the username, password and account name, and then confirming by selecting "OK".

New email service

To set up a new email account other than the predefined email services, select "Other Email accounts".

You are required to enter your email address, display name, password, account name, then confirm with "Save". Afterwards you'll need to select protocol (1) (POP3 or IMAP4), then enter your incoming server address and outgoing server address, and finally select "Save".

Contacts.....



Consulting your contacts

You can access this function from the main menu screen by selecting "Contacts" or selecting A from the widget bar.

When accessing this menu, you will see two tabs:

Phone List all contacts

Group Organize contacts into groups



When consulting your contacts for the first time, you are required to import them from the SIM card to your phone.

6.2 Adding a contact

You can add a new contact by selecting "Add contact".

The following fields are accessible when you create a new entry in Contacts: Name, Image, Mobile, Home, Work, Email, Birthday, Birthday reminder, URL, Address, Ringtone.

From here, you can access either the Music player or the Radio.

9.1 Music player

Gives you full flexibility when managing music both on your mobile and SD card.

9.2 Radio

Your phone is equipped with an FM radio (1) with RDS (2) functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or display parallel visual information related to the radio program if you tune to stations offering Visual Radio service. You can listen while running other applications.

10 Wi-Fi (3).....



Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on phone even when no SIM card is inserted.

To access this function, press iii to enter the main menu, and select

To connect/disconnect a wireless network

- Press "Wi-Fi"
- Select "WIFI Connection"

If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (contact network operator for details).

When finished, select "Options/Done".

To disconnect a Wi-Fi network, select "Options/Disconnect".

12 Camera



Your mobile phone is fitted with a camera for taking photos and shooting videos.

To access this function, select on from the main menu screen.



SD card (if available) is automatically set as the preferred storage location for any photos and videos which you take.

13 Pictures.....



This menu displays the following two tabs when accessed:

Camera roll List photos you have taken

Images List images provided with the phone

Videos List videos you have taken

Facebook gallery is displayed in albums. The first album will be "Fan photos" which is generated automatically and contains all pictures where you have been tagged.

14 Clock



14.1 Alarm

Your mobile phone has a built-in alarm clock with a snooze feature. You can set up to five separate alarms and choose whether or not the alarm should repeat.

14.2 WorldTime

The WorldTime shows current local time and the time zone in different cities. You may view up to three cities at one time.

14.3 Time and Date

Allows you to set the date and time in either 12/24h format.

You can also set the daylight saving adjustment.





15 Calendar.....



Once you enter this menu from the main menu screen, you'll see a month-view calendar for you to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc. Days with events entered will be marked in colour.



When you are logged onto Facebook, all your Facebook friends' birthday reminders will be synced automatically to your local calendar. An ion icon will appear on the status bar to notify you of upcoming birthdays.

16 Social



You can enter this menu by selecting "Social" on the main menu.

It enables to you easily access features including MSN, Gtalk, FBChat and Twitter.

17 Apps..



Access useful applications from this menu.

The applications you use most frequently can be added to or removed from the main menu screen by selecting "Options" on the main menu screen, and then select "Add and remove menu".

18 Tools.....



You phone is equipped with several frequently used tools. You can access these tools by selecting "Tools" on the main menu.

18.1 Weather.....



Your phone is equipped with a weather app which will give you forecasts of up to three days for favorite cities.

18.2 News.....



A huge time saver, providing news updates from a website in a simple form.

Once subscribed to a channel, it gives you the ability to track and manage all your favorite RSS content on your mobile phone at anytime, anywhere!

18.3 Tasks



Enables you to easily manage and track the progress of a task with priorities. All the tasks will be sorted by due date.

18.4 Notes.....



You can create a note in text or voice format by accessing "**Notes**" from the applications list.





18.5 Calculator.....

18.7 Stopwatch



The stopwatch is a simple application for measuring time with the ability to register several results and pause/resume measurement.

22 Text input mode/ character table

There are two text entry methods that can be used to write messages:

- Normal
- Predictive mode

Normal

This mode allows you to type text by choosing a letter or a sequence of characters

Predictive mode

This mode can perform predictive input in the hardware keypad and supports multi-language input.

Safety and use

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your mobile phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

TRAFFIC SAFFTY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile phone when the vehicle is not parked. Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless mobile phones and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas.

When driving, do not use your mobile phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your mobile phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS antilock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the car's electronic devices are shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the mobile phone from time to time to optimize its performance.

Remember to abide by local authority rules of mobile phone use on aircrafts.

Operational Warnings: Obey all posted signs when using mobile devices in public areas.

Follow Instructions to Avoid Interference Problems: Turn off your mobile device in any location where posted notices instruct you to do so. In an aircraft, turn off your mobile device whenever instructed to do so by airline staff. If your mobile device offers an airplane mode or similar feature, consult airline staff about using it in flight.

Switch the mobile phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile phones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the mobile phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids.

When the mobile phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing ald or insulin pump. In particular when using the mobile phone you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device. If any.

Read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. If you have any questions about using your mobile device with your implantable medical device, consult your healthcare provider.

To avoid hearing impairment, answer the call before holding your mobile phone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

It is recommended to have proper supervision while small children use your mobile phone.

When replacing the cover please note that your mobile phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your mobile phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your mobile phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc.). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is -10°C (14°F) to +55°C (131°F) (the max value depends on device, materials and housing paint/texture).

Over 55°C (131°F) the legibility of the mobile phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Do not open or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or try to bend your mobile phone.

Do not use the mobile phone if the glass made screen, is damaged, cracked or broken to avoid any injury.

Do not paint it.

Use only batteries, battery chargers, and accessories which are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates and are compatible with your mobile phone model.TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates disclaim any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries.

Your mobile phone should not be disposed of in a municipal waste. Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your mobile phone.

- Do not burn or dispose of a used battery in the garbage or store it at temperatures above 60°C (140°F).

RADIO WAVES:

THIS MOBILE PHONE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio-frequency (RF) energy. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines include a substantial safety margin designed to ensure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for mobile phone semploys a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by public authorities such as the Federal Communications Commission of the US Government (FCC), or by Industry Canada, is 1.6 W/kg averaged over 1 gram of body tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the mobile phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the mobile phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the mobile phone. Before a mobile phone model is available for sale to the public, compliance with national requiations and standards must be shown.







The highest SAR value for this model mobile phone when tested is 0.826 W/Kg (Vodafone Chat 655/655W) for use at the ear and 1.06 W/Kg (Vodafone Chat 655W, with 1.0cm distances), 0.685 W/Kg (Vodafone Chat 655 with 1.5 cm distances) for use close to the body.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various mobile phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for RF exposure. For body-worn operation, the mobile phone meets FCC RF exposure guidelines provided that it is used with a non-metallic accessory with the handset at least 10 mm from the body. Use of other accessories may not ensure compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.
