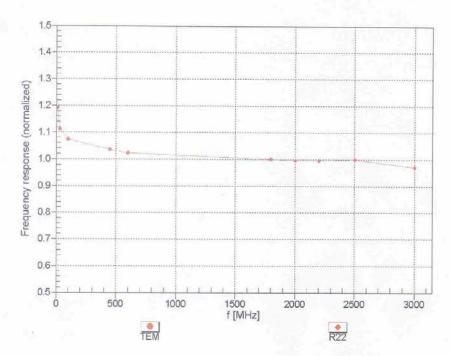

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Frequency Response of E-Field (TEM-Cell:ifi110 EXX, Waveguide: R22)

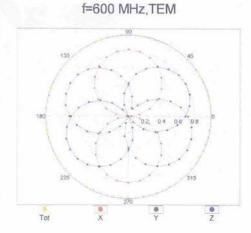


Uncertainty of Frequency Response of E-field: ± 6.3% (k=2)

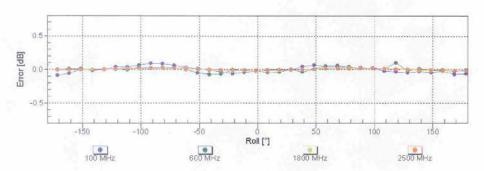

Receiving Pattern (ϕ), $\vartheta = 0^{\circ}$





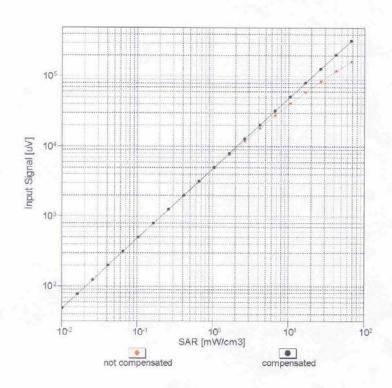


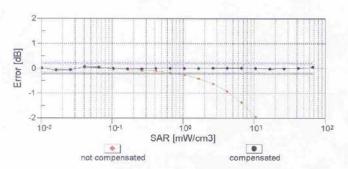
Uncertainty of Axial Isotropy Assessment: ± 0.5% (k=2)



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Dynamic Range f(SAR_{head}) (TEM cell, f = 900 MHz)



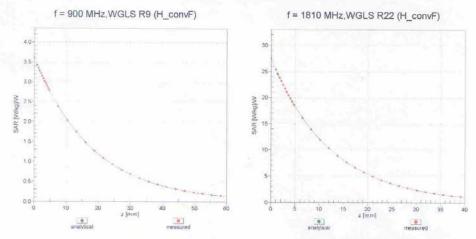


Uncertainty of Linearity Assessment: ± 0.6% (k=2)

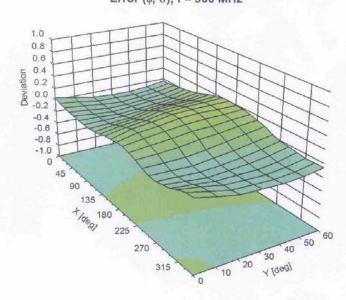


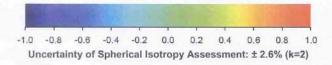

After long term use with 100W radiated power, only a slight warming of the dipole near the feedpoint can be measured.

The dipole is made of standard semirigid coaxial cable. The center conductor of the feeding line is directly connected to the second arm of the dipole. The antenna is therefore short-circuited for DC-signals. On some of the dipoles, small end caps are added to the dipole arms in order to improve matching when loaded according to the position as explained in the "Measurement Conditions" paragraph. The SAR data are not affected by this change. The overall dipole length is still according to the Standard.

No excessive force must be applied to the dipole arms, because they might bend or the soldered connections near the feedpoint may be damaged.

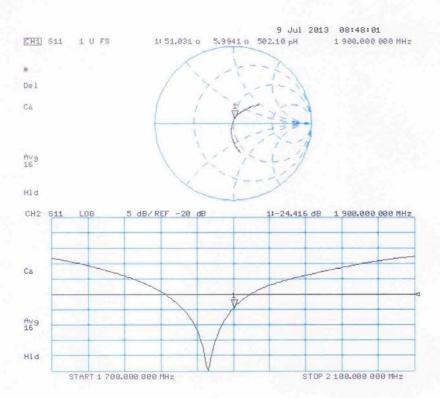

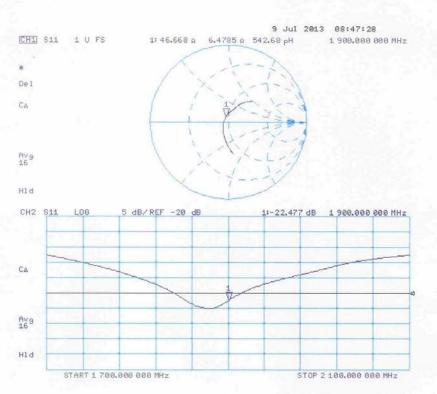

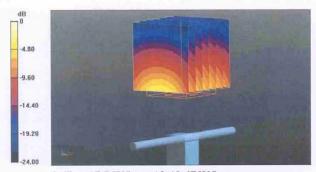

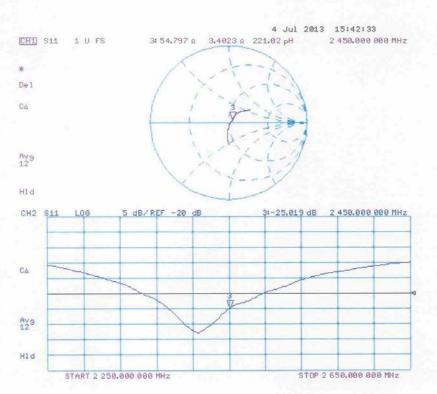

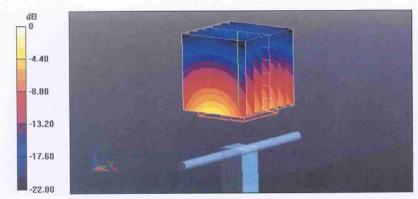

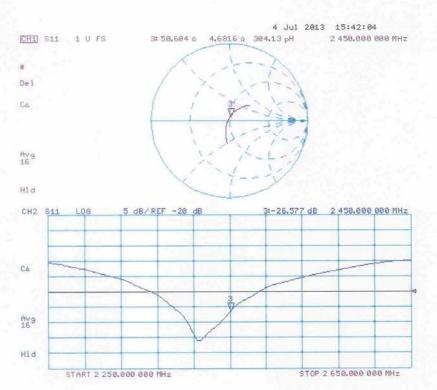

All the differences between spot check data and original data are within the measurement uncertainty. So it is acceptable to quote the test results of original sample.

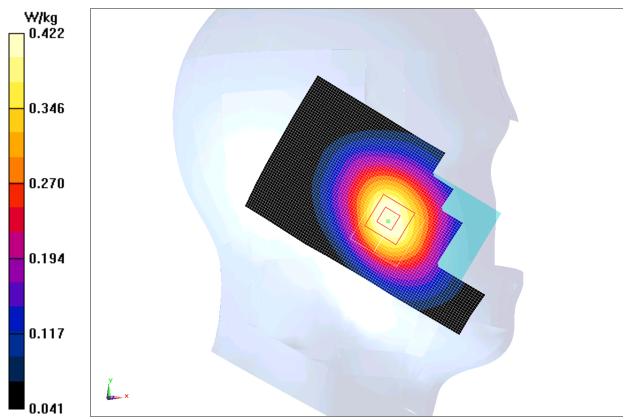


Fig.J.1 850MHz CH190

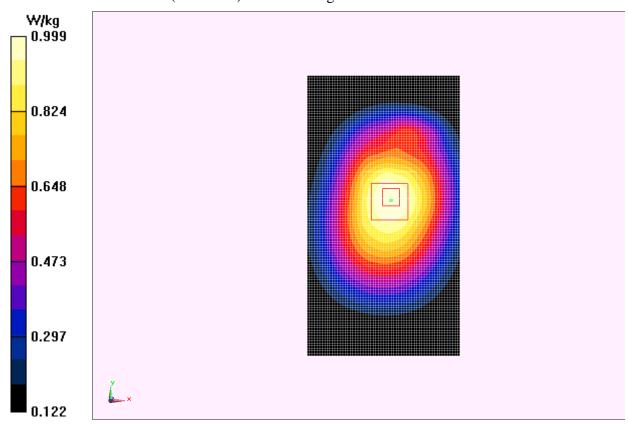


Fig.J.2 850 MHz CH128

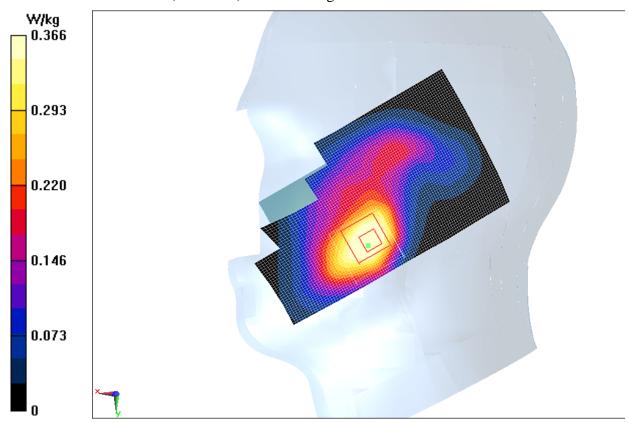


Fig.J.3 1900 MHz CH810

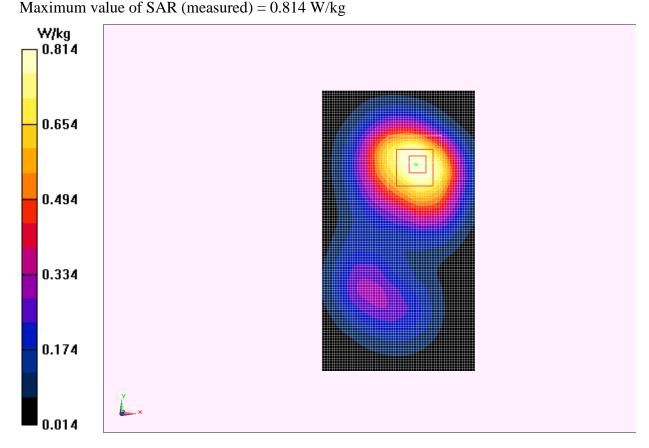


Fig.J.4 1900 MHz CH810

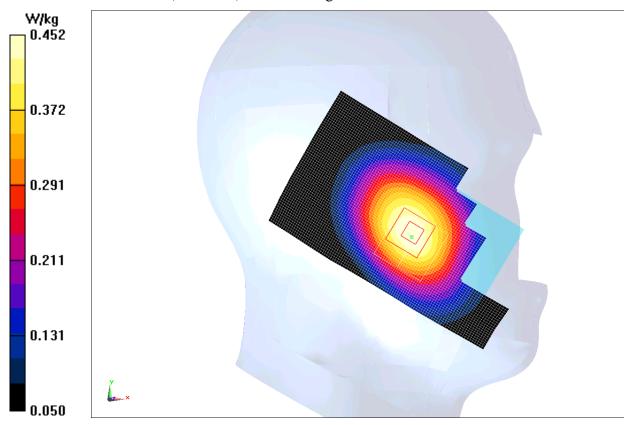


Fig.J.5 WCDMA 850 CH4233

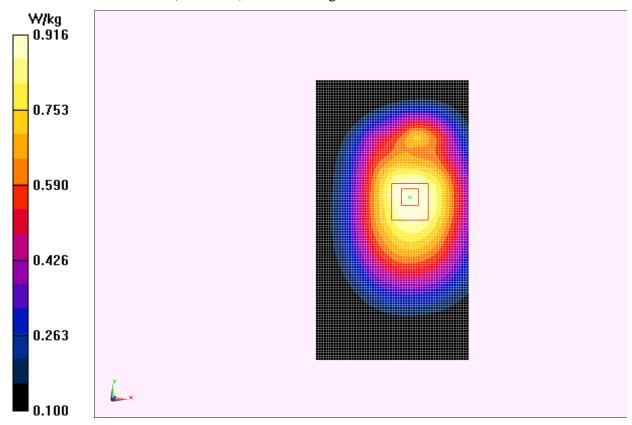


Fig.J.6 WCDMA 850 CH4182

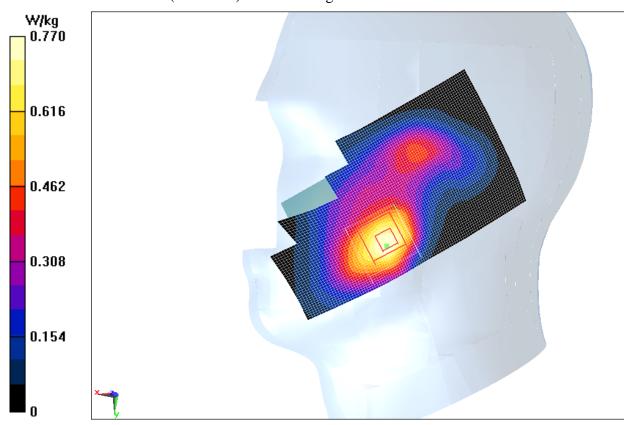
