1.1 Overview

The MODAT-550A is an Android-based mobile data collector with a 5.5" touchscreen. At the heart of the system is the octa-core ARM® Cortex®-A53 1.5 GHz CPU. Wireless communication technologies include 802.11a/b/g/n Wi-Fi, and Bluetooth 4.0 LE. Other peripherals include a 13-megapixel camera, a 1D/2D barcode scanner, a microSD card slot, a Micro USB port, a headset jack and a speaker.




Figure 1-7: Dimensions (units in mm)

Unpacking



To unpack the MODAT-550A, follow the steps below:



WARNING!

Only remove the protective plastic cover stuck to the front screen after installation. The plastic layer protects the monitor surface during installation process.

Step 1: Carefully cut the tape sealing the box. Only cut deep enough to break the tape.

Step 2: Open the box.

Step 3: Lift the MODAT-550A out of the box.

Step 4: Make sure all the components listed in the packing list are present.

3

Installation





3.1 Anti-static Precautions



WARNING:

Failure to take ESD precautions during the maintenance of the MODAT-550A may result in permanent damage to the MODAT-550A and severe injury to the user.

Electrostatic discharge (ESD) can cause serious damage to electronic components, including the MODAT-550A. Dry climates are especially susceptible to ESD. It is therefore critical that whenever the MODAT-550A is accessed internally, or any other electrical component is handled, the following anti-static precautions are strictly adhered to.

- Wear an anti-static wristband: Wearing a simple anti-static wristband can help to prevent ESD from damaging the board.
- Self-grounding: Before handling the board touch any grounded conducting material. During the time the board is handled, frequently touch any conducting materials that are connected to the ground.
- Use an anti-static pad: When configuring the MODAT-550A, place it on an antic-static pad. This reduces the possibility of ESD damaging the MODAT-550A.

3.2 Installation Precautions

When installing the MODAT-550A, please follow the precautions listed below:

- Power turned off: When installing the MODAT-550A, make sure the power is off. Failing to turn off the power may cause severe injury to the body and/or damage to the system.
- Certified Engineers: Only certified engineers should install and modify onboard functionalities.
- Anti-static Discharge: If a user open the rear panel of the MODAT-550A, to configure the jumpers or plug in added peripheral devices, ground themselves first and wear and anti-static wristband.





WARNING:

- Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type recommended by the manufacturer.
- Disposal of a battery into fire or a hot oven, or mechanically crushing or cutting of a battery, that can result in an explosion.
- Leaving a battery in an extremely high temperature surrounding environment that can result in an explosion or the leakage of flammable liquid or gas.
- A battery subjected to extremely low air pressure that may result in an explosion or the leakage of flammable liquid or gas.

3.3 Charging the System

To start using the MODAT-550A, the user must charge the MODAT-550A by the power adapter. To charge the MODAT-550A, please follow the steps below.

- **Step 1**: Open the protective rubber cover to expose the Micro USB port.
- Step 2: Connect the Micro USB plug of the Micro USB cable to the Micro USB connector of the MODAT-550A (Figure 3-1).

Step 3: Pick the power plug that suits the user's territory, and secure it to the power adapter (**Figure 3-2**).

Step 4: Connect the other end of the Micro USB cable to the USB connector of the power adapter (**Figure 3-3**).

Then plug the power adapter to a power source.

OR connect the Micro USB cable directly to a computer.

Step 5: The LED indicator on the front panel lights up in red to indicate that the battery is charging. When the battery is fully charged, the LED indicator turns green.



3.4 microSD Card Installation

This section covers the installation of a microSD card.

Release the six retention screws that secure the battery cover to the MODAT-550A.



WARNING:

Before removing the battery cover, make sure that the system power is turned off and all power to the system has been disconnected. Failing to do so may cause severe damage to the MODAT-550A and injury to the user.

Step 1: Lift the battery cover up to remove.



Step 2: Locate the microSD card slot and insert a microSD card into it.

3.5 I/O Connectors

The I/O connectors are protected by a rubber cover. Open the rubber cover before connecting any peripheral devices to the MODAT-550A.

3.5.1 Headset Jack

The headset jack on the top panel enables the MODAT-550A to be connected to a headset. Open the protective rubber cover to expose the headset jack before connection.




Figure 3-6: MODAT-550A Headset Jack

3.5.2 Micro USB Connector

The MODAT-550A is equipped with a Micro USB connector that allows connection to a computer or the supplied power adapter. Refer to **Step 1** ~ **Step 3** in **Section 0** to connect the MODAT-550A to a computer or power adapter by using the supplied Micro USB cable.

After connecting the MODAT-550A to a computer, follow the steps below to allow transferring files between the computer and MODAT-550A.

Step 1: Swipe down from the top of the screen, then tap USB for file transfer (Figure 3-9).






Figure 3-7: USB for File Transfer

Step 2: The screen in **Figure 3-10** should be displayed. Tap **Transfer files** to allow the connected computer to recognize the MODAT-550A. Then the user can transfer files between them.






Figure 3-8: USB Connection Option Screen

3.6 System Maintenance

If the components of the MODAT-550A fail, they must be replaced. Please contact the system reseller or vendor to purchase the replacement parts.



NOTE:

A user cannot replace a motherboard. If the motherboard fails it must be shipped back to IEI to be replaced. Please contact the system vendor, reseller or an IEI sales person directly.

4

Using the MODAT-550A

4.1 Powering On/Off

To power on/off the MODAT-550A, please follow the steps below:

Powering On: Press the power button until the start-up screen displays.

Powering Off: Press and hold the power button until the Power off menu as shown in




Figure 4-2: Power Off Menu

 Figure 4-2 appears. Tap Power off to turn off the MODAT-550A.

NOTE:

When the MODAT-550A is powered on, press the power button once to suspend the MODAT-550A or to resume from the suspend mode.



4.2 Home Screen

The MODAT-550A has multiple home screens allowing users to customize the screen with widgets, apps and shortcuts. The following sections describe the basic technique to manage the home screen.

4.2.1 Adding a Home Screen

To add a home screen, touch and hold an app/widget icon. A icon (Figure 4-3) appears, indicating that a new home screen is available. Drag and release the icon to the new home screen.

4.2.2 Switching between Home Screens

Swipe right or left to switch between home screens.




Figure 4-4: Multiple Home Screens



4.2.3 Favorites Tray

The Favorites tray at the bottom of each home screen allows users to keep the most important or frequently used shortcuts.

Tap the (All Apps) button at the center of the Favorites Tray to access the All Apps page.




Figure 4-5: Favorites Tray




4.2.4 Adding Shortcuts

To add app or widget shortcuts on the home screen, follow the steps below.

Step 1: To add an app shortcut, tap the All Apps button on the home screen to access the All Apps page.

To add a widget shortcut, touch and hold the background of a home screen, then tap **WIDGETS**.

Step 2: Touch and hold an app/widget icon and drag it to the home screen.






Figure 4-6: All Apps/WIDGETS Page



4.2.5 Arranging the Home Screen

The items on the home screen can be moved and deleted. Touch and hold an item on the home screen and drag it where you want. To trash the item on the screen, drag it to the Remove icon. Release the icon when it turns red.




Figure 4-7: Trash an Item on Home Screen



4.3 Navigation Buttons




Figure 4-8: Navigation Buttons

The three navigation buttons shown in **Figure 4-8** can always be found at the bottom of every screen.





Figure 4-9: Status Bar

The status bar on the top of the screen (**Figure 4-9**) displays system status, such as battery level or signal strength.




Figure 4-10: Notification List and System Status

Swipe down from the status bar to view notification and status details (Figure 4-10).

4.5 Settings

The Settings menu allows configuration to the MODAT-550A, such as Wi-Fi, volume, display brightness, etc. To enter the Settings menu, tap **Settings** on the All Apps page.

4.5.1 Wireless & Networks




Figure 4-11: Wireless and Networks Settings

In the Wireless & networks field, the user can turn on/off the Wi-Fi and Bluetooth functions.

Wi-Fi:

Allows the user to turn on or off the Wi-Fi function and manage the access points. The user can tap to configure advanced Wi-Fi settings.



Bluetooth:

Allows the user to turn on or off the Bluetooth function and manage the Bluetooth connections.

Data usage:

Allows the user to view data usage status.

4.5.1.1 More Settings




Figure 4-12: More Settings Menu

After tapping **More** in the Wireless & networks field, the user can configure the following settings.

Airplane mode:

Allows the user to turn on or off the airplane mode.



NFC:

Allows the user to turns on or off the NFC function and configure the data exchange modes.

Wi-Fi calling:

Enables or disables Wi-Fi calling function.

Tethering & portable hotspot:

Allows the user to set this device as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot, configure the hotspot settings and turn on or off the USB/Bluetooth tethering function.

VPN:

Sets up and manages Virtual Private Networks (VPNs).

Cellular networks:

Configures the cellular network settings.



4.5.2 Barcode

The barcode menu allows powering on/off the barcode reader and configuring its settings. The barcode settings can also be set through the Barcode Reader application in the application page.




Figure 4-13: Barcode Menu

Barcode on/off:

Turns on or off the barcode reader.

Scan mode:

Sets up the scan mode.

Output mode:

Sets up the output mode.



4.5.3 Display




Figure 4-14: Display Menu

Use the Display menu to configure the following items.

Brightness level:

Adjusts the screen brightness.

Adaptive brightness:

Turns on this function to optimize brightness level for available light.

Wallpaper:

Sets up the wallpaper.

Sleep:

Sets up the time of inactivity after which the screen turns to sleep mode.



Press power button twice for camera:

Enable or disable to quickly open camera without unlocking screen.

Screen saver:

Configures the screensaver settings.

Font size:

Sets up the font size.

Display size:

Sets up the item size on the screen.

When device is rotated:

Allows the user to select to rotate the contents of the screen when the MODAT-550A is rotated.

Cast:

Allows the user to turn on or off the wireless display function and manages the wireless display devices.



4.5.4 Notifications

The Notifications menu allows the user to configure the notification settings of each app.




Figure 4-15: Notifications Menu



4.5.5 Sound

Use the Sound menu to configure sound volume, ringtone and sound enhancement settings.




Figure 4-16: Sound Menu

The Apps menu displays the applications installed in the device, and allows users to manage them.




Figure 4-17: Apps Menu

The Storage menu displays the status of the internal storage and the inserted microSD card, and allows users to manage the data stored in them.




Figure 4-18: Storage Menu

The Battery menu displays the battery status and allows enabling the battery saver function.




Figure 4-19: Battery Menu

The Memory menu displays the average memory use and memory used by apps.




Figure 4-20: Memory Menu

The Users menu allows you to add a new user profile and emergency information.




Figure 4-21: Users Menu

Use the DuraSpeed menu to enable or disable the DuraSpeed function which helps boost the foreground app by restricting background apps.




Figure 4-22: DuraSpeed Menu

Use the Location menu to turn on the location access function so that the apps can obtain the user's location information. When this function is turned on, the user can decide the method to determine the user's location.




Figure 4-23: Location Menu



4.5.13 Security




Figure 4-24: Security Menu

Use the Security menu to configure the following items.

Screen lock:

Sets up the way to unlock the screen.

Encrypt phone:

Once this item is enabled, the user will need to enter the numeric PIN, password or pattern that have been set up to decrypt the MODAT-550A each time when powering on.

Make passwords visible:

Enables to show password when typing.



Device administrators:

Views or deactivates the device administrators.

Unknown sources:

Enables to allow installation of applications from unknown sources.

Data protection:

Taps to protect the selected data from unwanted access.

Credential storage:

In the Credential storage field, the user can manage the CA certificates and install certificates from the phone storage.

Trust agents:

Taps to view or deactivate trust agents.

Screen pinning:

When this function is turned on, the user can keep the current screen in view until the user disables this function.

Apps with usage access:

Taps to manage the apps with usage access.



4.5.14 Accounts

Tap Add account to start setting up an e-mail or corporate account.




Figure 4-25: Accounts Menu





4.5.15 Language & Input




Figure 4-26: Language & Input Menu

Use the Language & input menu to configure the following items.

Language:

Sets up the language for MODAT-550A.

Spell checker:

Allows the user to enable the spell checking function and to configure its settings.

Personal dictionary:

Configures the user dictionary.

Keyboard & input methods:

Sets up the input methods.



- Text-to-speech output:
 - Configures the text-to-speech settings.
- Pointer speed:
 - Sets up the pointer speed.




Figure 4-27: Backup & Reset Menu

Use the Back & reset menu to configure the following items.

- Back up my data:
 - Enable or disable to back up app data, Wi-Fi passwords and other settings to Google server.
- Network settings reset:
 - Resets all network settings, including Wi-Fi, Cellular data and Bluetooth.



DRM reset:

Deletes all the DRM licenses on the MODAT-550A.

Factory data reset:

Erases all data from the internal storage of the MODAT-550A.

4.5.17 Date & Time




Figure 4-28: Date & Time Menu

Use the Date & time menu to configure the following items.

Automatic date & time:

Turns on to use the network-provided or GPS-provided time.

Automatic time zone:

Turns on to use the network-provided time zone.



Set date:

Sets up the system date. This item is available only when the **Automatic date** & time item is set to **Off**.

Set time:

Sets up the system time. This item is available only when the **Automatic date** & time item is set to **Off**.

Select time zone:

Sets up the time zone. This item is available only when the **Automatic time zone** item is disabled.

Use 24-hour format:

Turns on to use the 24-hour format.




Figure 4-29: Accessibility Menu




Figure 4-30: Printing Menu




Figure 4-31: Scheduled Power On & Off Menu




Figure 4-32: About Phone Menu




Figure 4-33: Camera Application
