This Quick Start Guide takes you through the simple steps to set up your Smart Remote™. Once set up, your Smart Remote™ can be used to control many home entertainment devices, such as:

- •TVs plasma, LCD, CRT, rear-projection, HDTV, etc.
- Set-top boxes cable, satellite, HD broadcast & IPTV
- DVD players, CD players VCRs & DVRs
- Audio amplifiers
- And more ...

And that's not all! You can browse your personalized TV program guide right on the Smart Remote's™ color display, as well as the latest weather, sports and news provided by click365™ – all without disturbing other TV viewers. Automatic updates are delivered seamlessly to the Smart Remote™ via your home wireless network.

1) LCD:

Instructions and information are displayed here

2) power connector:

Plug in the power charger here to recharge your Smart Remote™

3) headphone connector:

You can plug headphones in here for private listening

4) backlight button:

If the Smart Remote™ is idle for several seconds, the screen will go black to conserve power. Just push this, or any button, to bring the screen back

5) left & right soft keys:

These keys have different functions in different contexts, as indicated by the labels directly above them at the foot of the screen

6) select (SEL) key:

Use this key to select a highlighted item on the screen

7) up, down, left & right arrow keys:Use these keys to navigate around the screen

8) number/letter keys:

You will use these keys whenever it's necessary to enter text

9) clear key:

This key will erase any numbers or letters you have entered with the number/letter keys. Use this key if you make an error and need to re-enter information

BEFORE YOU START

Before starting the setup process, you must first charge your Smart Remote™

 Plug in the power charger -

• Leave the power charger plugged in for at least 4 hours to complete charging

Note: After the initial setup, charge Smart Remote[™] as necessary. A low battery is indicated both visually (by a small icon on upper-left of screen) and audibly with a series of rapid beeps



Gathering required information

You will need the following information to set up your Smart Remote™:

- The name of your home WiFi network (SSID)
- The security key (WEP key) of your home WiFi network (if security-enabled)

Note: Currently the Smart Remote™ provides support for nonsecure and WEP-enabled secure networks. If you have trouble locating your WiFi information, contact your router maunufacturer



Gathering required information continued...

- The brands of all the devices you intend to control with your Smart Remote $^{\mbox{\tiny IM}}$
- The type of TV service you receive (cable, satellite or broadcast) and the name of your provider
- Which device you use to tune TV channels; i.e. your TV, cable box or satellite box

Waking up the remote.



CONNECTING TO YOUR WIFI NETWORK



SELECT NETWORK

After displaying an initial welcome screen, the Smart Remote™ will search for available networks and display them in a list.

Connection to a WiFi network allows automatic downloads of the TV program guide and enables software updates. If you choose not to connect to a network, select **Skip** by pressing the right soft key, otherwise:

- Scroll through network options using the up & down arrow keys until you find your network
- Choose your network by pressing SEL

Note: if your network is not in the list, select **Options** and choose **Re-scan** to try again, or select **Skip** to connect later

If your network is secure, you will be prompted to enter your 10 or 26 character network (WEP) key.

• Using the **number/letter** keys on the key pad, enter your WEP key, then select OK

Note: To enter A-F, press 2 or 3 repeatedly until the letter is displayed (similar to sending a text message on a cell phone). To delete characters, press the **Clear** key



ENTER WEP KEY

NOTE: The Smart Remote™ currently does not support WiFi networks using WPA security.

CONNECTING TO YOUR WIFI NETWORK



SOFTWARE UPDATE

Once you've selected your network the Smart Remote™ will check for software updates.

These updates may take anywhere from a few seconds to several minutes depending on the number of updates and your connection speed.

If anything fails, or you are not connected to the network, select **Back** (right soft key) to repeat the process. If the error persists, check your network or refer to the User Manual.

Setting your location

When you reach the location screen, use the up & down arrow keys to highlight a setting, then press **SEL** to change that setting.

- Use the up, down & SEL keys to choose your country and time zone
- Enter your ZIP code using the **number keys**
- Select Next

CHOOSE YOUR PROVIDER

After setting your location, the next step is to configure your TV program guide. Once you reach the Add Provider screen:

- Highlight your TV provider from the list of available providers in your area using the up & down arrow keys
- Press **SEL** to choose the highlighted provider

The Smart Remote[™] downloads the guide information for the selected provider over the next few minutes as you continue with setup.

The device you use to change TV channels (typically your TV, cable box or satellite box) is referred to as your *DirecTune™ device*. You will configure control of your DirecTune™ device in the next step.



SETTING UP CONTROL OF YOUR HOME ENTERTAINMENT DEVICES...



Your Smart Remote[™] is capable of controlling many different home entertainment devices.

 Confirm that you want to setup your entertainment devices by selecting YES with the left soft key

Note: The next series of steps will present on-screen directions requiring confirmation similar to this step. Selecting YES will advance you to the next set of choices



 Choose the device you want to control

Note: As always, if you don't see what you're looking for on the list, you can scroll down using the arrow keys

Note: The first device you add should be your DirecTune™ device



· Choose the brand of the device

SETTING UP CONTROL OF YOUR HOME ENTERTAINMENT DEVICES...

Testing command sets on your Smart Remote™

- Press keys on your Smart Remote™, such as volume and numbers to change channels, to see if the device is actually being controlled
- If all required keys do NOT work, or you receive an audible beep indicating that a command is not present in the command set, press the right arrow key to test the next command set



TESTING A COMMAND SET



 When all required keys work, select **Options** to save the device settings


After saving the device settings, you will be asked if you want to add another device.





ADDING AND MANAGING ACTIVITIES


Creating an *activity* allows you to program a multi-step process as a single function; In order to watch a movie on DVD you may need to switch on the TV, change it's input, turn on the DVD player and then press Play. All these steps are captured in the activity, and by pressing a single button, you play the activity.
