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## 5. USING THE RAZER EDGE

### DEFAULT TABLET BUTTON FUNCTIONS

- **Power Key**
  - Press to lock / unlock the tablet.
  - Double press to launch the camera app from any screen.
  - Press and hold to open the Power actions menu.
- **Volume keys**
  - Increase or decrease ring, media, and alarm sounds.
  - Press any of these from the camera app to take a photo.
- **Power Key + Low volume key**
  - Press both keys simultaneously to take a screenshot.

### TOUCHSCREEN ACTIONS / GESTURES

- **Tap.** Lightly tap to select an option or item, launch a chosen app, or to enter text using the virtual keyboard.
- **Double Tap.** Lightly tap twice on an image to zoom in or out on a selected area, or text to select a word.
- **Tap and Hold.** Tap and hold an item or app to open additional options for the selected item.
- **Tap and Drag.** Tap and hold an item or app, and then move your finger to drag it to the preferred location.
- **Swipe.** Lightly tap and move your finger horizontally or vertically across the screen to move through lists, scroll through webpages, browse photos, and perform other browsing navigation.
- **Pinch and Spread.** Pinch or spread two fingers to zoom out or in on an image or on other content such as maps or webpages.

### LOCKING / UNLOCKING THE SCREEN

To lock the screen, simply press the power key and the screen will turn off indicating that the screen is now locked. To unlock, simply press the power key, and then swipe up.

*Note: If you have already customized your lock screen's security setting, you may need to use the screen lock setting set of your tablet.*

## TABLET ACTIVATION

When you first boot up the device, you will be greeted by the setup wizard. Simply follow the instructions to enable Google, security, time, and other services.

## COPYING YOUR DATA

When you first boot up the device, you will be greeted by the setup wizard. During this time, you will be asked if you want to copy data from your old device. You will need internet access to proceed, otherwise you may skip this step and continue when you can access the internet. Follow the instructions as it guides you through different methods of transferring data.

## DESKTOP

- **Status bar.** Displays quick information such as alerts and notifications below:

P. **Quick Settings.** Provides quick accessibility to essential tablet settings and tablet notifications. To access the Quick Settings, from the top of the screen, drag the status bar downwards. You can expand the pane by tapping or swiping downwards again to view all accessible settings.

You may also add or remove notifications icons displayed using the Edit icon () or access the tablet's settings with the Settings icon ()

	<b>Nearby Share</b>	Tap to access the Google Nearby app.

**Q. Dock.** Use the Dock for immediate accessibility over the applications you commonly use.

Depending on the docked app, you may long press on a docked app to do any of the following:

-  **Remove.** Remove an app shortcut from the dock.
-  **Add Widget.** Add the docked app's widget (if available) to your Desktop.
-  **App Info.** View an app's info.
-  **Edit Shortcut.** Edit app shortcut properties such as its label and swipe action.
- **Other actions.** Some apps offer an extended action (e.g. new conversations for messages, etc.).

**R. Home navigation.** Primary navigation across all apps.

-  **Return.** Returns to the previously opened screen or hides active windows.
-  **Home.** Tap to go back to the Desktop. Tap and hold this button to open Google Assistant.
-  **Used apps.** Display all recently opened applications. You may close all opened apps by tapping on **CLEAR ALL** or open apps in split view by tapping on an app in the list and dragging it upwards. You may also close a specific app by tapping the corresponding  icon of the app.

**S. Applications Drawer.** Display all applications installed on your tablet. To access the Applications menu, from the Dock, simply swipe upwards. Aside from tapping an icon to launch an app, you may also tap and hold on an app to open other app options and actions.

## ENTERING CHARACTERS OR TEXT

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## 6. CONFIGURING YOUR TABLET

### CUSTOMIZING THE DESKTOP

#### APP SHORTCUTS

##### *Adding / Removing app shortcuts*

Make your most used apps immediately accessible by adding these as app shortcuts in your Desktop.

- To add new app shortcuts to the Desktop, simply tap and hold any app on the application drawer then drag it to the preferred Desktop area.
- To remove an application shortcut, tap and hold an app shortcut and then tap **X**.

##### *Grouping app shortcuts*

To group multiple app shortcuts in a single folder on the Desktop, tap and drag the app shortcut to the app shortcut you want to group it with. Tap the Unnamed Folder, and then tap its name to assign a new name.

### CHANGING THE WALLPAPER

Customize the look of your tablet with presets or your custom wallpaper.

1. Tap and hold anywhere on the Desktop, and then tap **Wallpapers**.
2. Select the preferred source of the image to be used as wallpaper.
3. Select whether the wallpaper will appear at the center, left, or right edges.
4. Tap **Set Wallpaper**, and then tap the screens you want it to be applied to.

### USING WIDGETS

Widgets are smaller versions of the applications you commonly use on your tablet which you can add in to your Desktop for quick function accessibility.

1. Tap and hold on the Desktop and then tap Widgets (  ).
2. Tap and hold on the preferred widget, and then drag it to the desired location.

### EXPLORING YOUR TABLET'S SETTINGS

Accessible from the applications drawer, the Settings app enables you to customize and control your tablet's overall properties.

### NETWORK & INTERNET

Manage and configure various network and connectivity settings

## Wi-Fi

Connect your tablet to a wireless network within the area.

### Connecting to a wireless network

To connect your tablet to a wireless network:

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi**.
2. Toggle **Wi-Fi** on. The tablet will automatically start scanning for wireless networks within the area. To refresh the list, simply swipe downwards.

*Note: You may also access the Wi-Fi settings page through the Quick Settings. Tap and hold the Wi-Fi icon on the Quick Settings to have your tablet scanning for available wireless networks.*

3. Tap the wireless network you want to connect to then enter the required password (if any).

*Note: Once connected, your tablet would automatically connect to the wireless network whenever the tablet's Wi-Fi is on and the wireless network is within reach.*

### Manually connecting to a wireless network

If you want to manually connect your tablet to a hidden wireless network:

1. From the Desktop, swipe down to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi**.
2. Toggle **Wi-Fi** on.
3. At the bottom of the scanned wireless networks list, tap **+ Add network**, and then enter the required details needed.

*Note: This can also be done under Network & Internet > Wi-Fi > Saved networks > Add network.*

## Wi-Fi Preferences

Enable public network availability notification, install certificates, use various Wi-Fi features, and view other network properties such as MAC and IP addresses.

## Wi-Fi Data Usage

Monitor and set data usage restrictions across all applications, as well as set necessary notifications or warnings when your preferred data limit has been reached.

### Setting a data usage warning

You may set a data limit warning to help you avoid excessive data usage.

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Network & Internet > Data usage**.
2. Tap the **Usage** bar and then enter the desired data usage limit. You may change the unit to Mbyte or Gbyte depending on the size of the desired limit.
3. Tap **SET** to save the new Data warning limit.

### Using Data saver

Reduce overall data usage by preventing the apps you have set to sending and/or receiving data in background.

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Network & Internet > Data usage**.
2. Tap **Data saver** and toggle it on.
3. Tap **Unrestricted data**, and toggle on the applications which you want to have restricted data access.

*Note: You may also include system apps on the list by simply tapping ..., and then tapping on Show system.*

### Airplane Mode

Use Airplane mode to disable all connectivity functions on your tablet such as Wi-Fi, network data, and Bluetooth. To toggle Airplane mode on or off, you can either do any of the following:

- From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Network & Internet > Airplane mode**.
- From the Desktop, fully expand the Quick Settings, and then tap **Airplane mode**.

### Hotspot & Tethering

Utilize the tethering and wireless hotspot options of your tablet. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Network & Internet > Hotspot & Tethering**.

*Note: Using any of these features may significantly affect overall battery usage.*

- **USB tethering.** Share your tablet's internet connection to a connected USB host.
- **Wi-Fi hotspot.** Share your tablet's internet connection by making your tablet into a Wi-Fi hotspot. The Wi-Fi hotspot's settings can be modified through the **Set up Wi-Fi Hotspot** option.
- **Bluetooth tethering.** Share your tablet's internet connection via Bluetooth.
- **Ethernet tethering.** Share your tablet's internet connection via Ethernet.

## VPN

Set up, connect, and/or manage your own VPNs (Virtual Private Networks).

*Note: A lock screen pin or password is required before you can use this feature.*

To add a VPN profile:

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, tap **Settings**, and then go to **Network & Internet >VPN**.
2. Tap the **+** button, and then correctly enter the needed details on the Edit VPN profile fields provided. The new profile will be added into the VPN list.

To edit a VPN profile:

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, tap **Settings**, and then go to **Network & Internet >VPN**.
2. Tap the corresponding settings icon (  ) of the VPN profile that you want to edit, and then change the fields needed.
3. Tap **Save** to apply the changes or **Forget** to delete the VPN profile.

To connect or disconnect from a VPN profile

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, tap **Settings**, and then go to **Network & Internet >VPN**.
2. Tap the **VPN profile** you want to connect to and then enter the needed details.
3. Tap **Connect**.

*Note: To disconnect from the VPN, tap the active VPN profile and then tap **Disconnect**.*

## CONNECTED DEVICES

Manage your tablet's features in connecting with other devices.

### Bluetooth

Securely pair your tablet with a Bluetooth device.

### Configuring the Bluetooth settings

Securely pair your tablet with a nearby Bluetooth device.

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Connected devices > Bluetooth**.
2. Toggle Bluetooth on to do any of the following:

- **Pair new device.** Scan for available Bluetooth devices you can pair with.
- **Device name.** Rename the tablet's displayed Bluetooth device name.
- **Received files.** Open the folder of all the files your tablet has received via Bluetooth.
- **tablet's Bluetooth address.** View the Bluetooth's MAC address.

## Pairing your tablet with a Bluetooth device

To pair your tablet with a Bluetooth-enabled device:

1. Enable the Bluetooth device that you want to pair with your tablet.

*Note: Remember the Bluetooth name of the device you want to pair with your tablet and make sure that the device is discoverable / visible to other Bluetooth devices.*

2. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, tap **Settings**, and then go to **Connected devices > Bluetooth**.

*Note: You may also access the Bluetooth settings page through the Quick Settings. Simply long tap on the Bluetooth icon from the Quick Settings to open your tablet's Bluetooth settings.*

3. Tap **Pair new device** and then tap the device that you want to pair your tablet with and confirm that you want to pair your tablet with the selected device.

*Note: Some devices may require a Bluetooth pairing code which you may have to confirm on both devices.*

4. The device will automatically pair and added to the **Paired devices** list.

*Note: If the device you paired with is nearby and discoverable, and your tablet's Bluetooth is enabled, your devices would automatically pair with each other and/or will be readily accessible.*

## Changing Bluetooth device permissions

Once you have paired a Bluetooth device with your tablet, you may change the usage permissions of the paired device.

1. On the **Bluetooth > Paired devices** list, tap the corresponding  icon of the device that you want to have the usage permissions changed.
2. Tap any of the usages that you want the paired device to be used for. Do take note that the usages listed below may vary for each device:
  - **Contact sharing.** Share tablet contacts with the Bluetooth device.
  - **Internet access.** Use the connected Bluetooth device for internet connectivity.
  - **Media audio.** Use the connected Bluetooth device for media audio.
  - **tablet audio.** Use the connected Bluetooth device for tablet calls.

## Disconnecting a Bluetooth device

To disconnect a Bluetooth device from your tablet:

1. On the **Bluetooth > Paired devices** list, tap the connected Bluetooth device that you want to disconnect from your tablet.
2. Tap **OK** on the Disconnect prompt to confirm. The device will disconnect from your tablet.

## Forgetting a Bluetooth device

To remove a Bluetooth device from the paired devices list:

1. On the **Bluetooth > Paired devices** list, tap the corresponding  icon of the device that you want to unpair with your tablet.
2. Tap **Forget** to remove the device from the list.

*Note: You would need to pair your tablet again with Bluetooth device if you want to connect your devices again.*

## Cast

Mirror your tablet's display on wireless projection capable devices. Do take note that experience may vary from one screen to another, as some devices aren't specifically designed for casting.

1. Make sure that your tablet and the device you will mirror to are connected to the same network.
2. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Connected devices > Cast**.
3. On the list of available devices, select your device from the list and wait for your tablet to mirror its screen on the selected device.

## Printing

Manage your tablet's printing options.

## USB

Change your tablet's USB function when connected to a USB host device via USB cable to any of the following functions:

- **Charge this device.** Only charges your tablet when connected to a USB host.
- **Supply power.** Charge a connected USB host device.

*WARNING: This function will only work on devices that support USB Charging.*

- **Transfer files.** Transfer files to and from a USB host device. Your tablet's internal and external storage will be accessible to the host device.
- **Transfer photos.** Transfer photos to and from the USB host device and vice versa. Only the image folders in your tablet's internal and external storage will be accessible to the host device.
- **MIDI.** A function for USB-based external MIDI devices.

## APPS

Individually manage the notifications provided by each app.

### *All Apps*

View, disable, manage, or set default applications installed in your tablet.

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Apps > All apps**.
2. Select any app installed in your tablet then view, change, or use the following options or settings below:
  - **Open.** Open the selected app.
  - **Disable.** Uninstall or disable an app. You may only disable pre-loaded applications.
  - **Force stop.** Stop the operation of the selected app. This is useful when an app is misbehaving and/or if you want to restart the selected app.

### *Default Apps*

Set an app as the default app when supported files or links are opened. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Apps > Default apps**.

### *Screen time*

View your daily screen time per app, notifications received, times the app was opened and set timers for your apps. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Apps > Screen time**. Use the following Dashboard settings below:

- **Dropdown bar.** Tap the dropdown bar to change viewing Screen time, Notification received, or Times opened.
- **App timer.** Choose any of the listed apps then select **App timer** to set a daily usage limit for that app.

### *Unused Apps*

View unused apps installed in your tablet. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Apps > Unused apps**.

## *Special app access*

Control how each or all apps can access your tablet's features, hardware, and/or data. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Apps > Special app access**. You may then customize each app access below:

- **All files access.** Enable an app from reading, modifying, and deleting files on your tablet or any connected storage device.
- **Device admin apps.** View or deactivate apps on your tablet that have device administrator privileges.
- **Display over other apps.** Enable an app to run over other apps.
- **Do Not Disturb access.** Permit an app to send out notifications even when Do Not Disturb mode is active.
- **Media management apps.** Allow an app to manage media files including modifying and deleting files created by other apps.
- **Modify system settings.** Enable an app to modify system settings.
- **Device & app notifications.** Allow an app to show notifications.
- **Picture-in-picture.** Enable an app to create a Picture-in-picture window while the app is open or after leaving it, allowing the app's window to display on top of other apps as you use it.
- **Premium SMS access.** Permit an app to have access on SMS.
- **Unrestricted data.** Allow an app to have full access on network data even with Data Saver active.
- **Usage access.** Enable an app to track what apps you're using and how often.
- **Install unknown apps.** Set an app as a trusted source when installing unknown apps.
- **Alarms & reminders.** Allow an app to set alarms and schedule time-sensitive actions.
- **Usage access.** Permit an app to track app usage and frequency of use.
- **VR helper services.** Enable an app to run in virtual reality mode.
- **Wi-Fi control.** Allow an app to turn on, connect to, add, remove, or start a network access.

## NOTIFICATIONS

View notifications and manage the behavior of the selected app's notifications.

### *Configuring each app's notifications*

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > App settings**.
2. Tap the app that you want to customize. You may configure any of the following:
  - **On.** Enable or disable all notifications from this app.

- **Allow notification dot.** Enable or disable notification dot display on the app's icon.
- **Categories.** Toggle on/off or configure other available services within the app which show notifications. Categories may vary for each app.

#### *Notification history*

Your recent and snoozed notifications will appear under this area. To access this option, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Notification history**.

#### *Conversations*

Your marked, priority, or any modified conversations will appear under this area. To access this option, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Conversations**.

#### *Bubbles*

Enable some conversations will appear as floating icons on top of other apps. To access this option, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Bubbles**.

#### *Device & app notifications*

Allow apps and devices to read notifications. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Device & app notifications**.

#### *Notifications on lock screen*

Enable apps and devices to show conversations and notifications while the device is locked. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Notifications on lock screen**. You have the option to show all, hide silent conversations and notifications, or don't show any notifications.

#### *Sensitive Notifications on lock screen*

Allow content to show on the lock screen. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Sensitive Notifications**.

#### *Do Not Disturb*

When enabled you will only get notified by important people or apps during a set schedule. To access this option, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Do Not Disturb**.

### *Wireless emergency alerts*

Control which alerts your tablet can receive and customize other alert preferences. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Wireless emergency alerts**.

On the **Alerts** section, you may tap on any of the options below to do following:

- **Extreme threats.** Enable or disable major threats to life and property alerts.
- **Severe threats.** Enable or disable severe threats to life and property alerts.
- **AMBER alerts.** Enable or disable child abduction emergency bulletins.
- **Test alerts.** Enable or disable to receive carrier tests and monthly tests from the safety alert system
- **Emergency alert history.** View active alerts in your area.

On the **Alerts preferences** section, you may tap on any of the options below to do following:

- **Vibration.** Toggle tablet vibration on/off when receiving alerts.
- **Alert reminder.** Disable alert reminders or change how often a received alert will remind you.

### *Hide silent notifications in status bar*

Allow content to show on the lock screen. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Sensitive Notifications**.

### *Allow notification snoozing*

Allow content to show on the lock screen. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications > Sensitive Notifications**.

### *Notification dot on app icon*

Enable or disable notification dot display on the app's icon. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications**.

### *Enhanced notifications*

Allows the device to suggest replies, changes, and other actions. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Notifications**.

## **BATTERY**

Monitor and manage the battery consumption on your device. From the Battery area, you can see the current battery percentage and charging status. Other options listed below are also available:

### *Performance Mode*

Enables the device to provide better performance in most scenarios but at the cost of more power consumption. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Battery > Performance Mode**.

### *Battery Usage*

Monitor the device's battery consumption based on the mode used and for each application used since the tablet has been fully charged. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Battery > Battery Usage**.

### *Battery saver*

Battery saver is designed to automatically reduce the performance, background activity, and other features when it is enabled.

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Battery > Battery Saver**.
2. Toggle **Battery Saver** on. This can also be done through the Quick Settings.
3. Tap **Set a schedule > Based on percentage**. Set the slider to a desired percentage as to when to activate the feature.
4. Tap **Turn off when charged** to automatically return the tablet to its original performance state and turn on other features when the battery is above 90%.

### *Battery Manager*

Manage the device's battery consumption by detecting which apps consume the most power. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Battery > Battery Manager**.

### *Battery Percentage*

Toggle battery percentage on the status bar on or off. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Battery > Battery Percentage**.

## **STORAGE**

View and manage the internal and portable storages of your tablet.

### *Storage manager*

Allows you to view and manage your internal and external storage. You can automatically remove photos and videos from your device depending on how long these have been stored on your tablet. To do so, simply follow these steps:

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Storage**.

2. Toggle the **Storage manager** on/off.
3. Tap **Storage manager** then tap **Remove photos and videos** to change the required number of days before a photo or video will be deleted.

## SOUND

Adjust system volume and other sounds for your tablet.

### *System volume*

1. From the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Sound**.
2. Use the sliders for Media, Alarm, and Notification volume to individually adjust each setting as preferred.

### *Do Not Disturb*

Allow or mute specific notifications and other alerts according to your preferred time or schedule. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Sound**.

### *Media*

Enable to keep media player open in Quick Settings to easily resume playback. You may also activate media recommendations. To access this area, from the Desktop, swipe up to show the Applications drawer, and then go to **Settings > Sound > Media**.

### *Customizing ringtones, sounds, and vibrations*

Change the system ringtones, sounds, and other vibration settings.

  - **Default Notification sound.** Default ringtone for all notifications.

## DISPLAY
