Softkeys

The left and right soft keys are located at the top of keypad area. Pressing the soft keys allows you to select the option displayed on the screen directly above them, including options during a call. The functions of the soft keys change according to the current context.

Main Menu

You can access the different features of your Xenium 9@9j from the main menu. The following table summarises the structure of the Main menu, what the icons represent and the page number on which you can obtain more information regarding the menu functions.

Press right softkey *Back* to return to the previous menu.

Press  in idle mode to access the main menu and press , ,  or  to navigate through the icons and lists, or press  -  keys, and  or  keys to access the options and functions directly. When navigating through a list, the scrolling bar on the right of the screen will indicate your current position in the list. Press left softkey *Options* or  to access the corresponding options of the selected item in the list.

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I. Getting Started

Please read the safety instructions in the "Precautions" section before use.

Before you start using your phone, you must insert a valid SIM card supplied by your GSM operator or retailer. The SIM card contains your subscription information, your mobile telephone number, and a small quantity of memory in which you can store phone numbers and messages (for more information, see "Contacts" on page 51). You can also insert a memory card. This provides you with expanded memory capability, which allows you to store additional music, photo, and video files separate from the phone's built-in memory.

Inserting the SIM card

Remove the back cover

Make sure that the phone is switched off. You need to remove the back cover of your phone before you can insert the SIM card. Hold the phone with the front facing downwards as shown in the diagram and slide the back cover upwards as shown below.



Remove the battery

Lift the battery up from the bottom as shown below.



You may lose all your personal settings if you remove the battery when the phone is switched on.

Insert the SIM card

Make sure that the clipped corner of the SIM card is facing the correct direction and the metallic contacts are facing downwards. Slide the SIM card into the card slot until it stops. When you remove your SIM card the first time, make sure that you smoothen the edges, otherwise you may have difficulty sliding in the card.



Replace the battery

With the metallic contacts facing downwards, press the battery down into its slot until it locks into place.



Replace the back cover

Slide the back cover down into its slot until it stops.



When inserting the battery, be careful not to damage the metallic connectors of the SIM card slot.

Switching on the phone

To switch on the phone, long press and release the  key. Enter the PIN code if required (the 4 to 8 digit secret code of your SIM card). It is preconfigured and provided to you by your network operator or retailer. For more information on PIN code, see "Security settings" on page 65.

If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in succession, your SIM card will be blocked. To unlock it, you must obtain the PUK code from your network operator.

Charging the battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery. The new battery is partially charged. A sound alert will be emitted to warn you when the battery level becomes low.

We recommend that you do not remove the battery when the phone is switched on as you may lose all your personal settings as a result. If you do remove it, the date and time settings are only memorized for a short while. As such, you need to reset the information after you have installed the battery back again.

Once the battery and battery cover are installed, you can charge the phone. Plug in the connector as shown below. Then plug the other end into an AC power socket.



Charging with a dry battery

This product is packaged with an Energizer Lithium AAA battery. When you need immediate backup power, replace the AAA battery in your phone with a fresh battery. To maximize backup power, use the Energizer Lithium AAA battery. For short bursts of backup power, use an Energizer alkaline AAA battery for reliable backup power.

To enhance the use of your phone, use an Energizer Rechargeable AAA battery (not included) in the phone, which can be kept in the battery cavity and will charge when you charge your phone.

You need to open the battery cover with the decoration piece provided and then insert an AAA battery as shown below.



The battery symbol indicates the state of charge. During charging, the charge indicators will scroll; it takes around 3 hours to fully charge the battery. When all the scroll bars are steady, the battery is fully charged. You can then disconnect the charger. Depending on the network and condition of use, talk time and stand-by time can go up to 10 hours* and 1 month* respectively. The dry battery (when fully charged) can provide you with an extra 2 hours and 300 hrs of talk time and stand-by time respectively.

The phone supports Alkaline, Lithium and rechargeable Nickel Metal Hydride (NiMH) batteries regardless of the brand.

****Depending on the network conditions, user settings, method of use, etc the actual results may differ.***

The scrolling icons of the dry battery level indicator displays the status of charging only when you use a rechargeable dry battery.

Keeping the charger plugged to the mobile phone when the battery is fully charged will not damage the battery. The only way to turn off the charger is to unplug it, so it is advisable to use an easily accessible AC power socket.

If you do not intend to use your phone for several days, we recommend that you remove the battery.

You can use the phone while it is charging (note that the vibra alert goes off when the charger is connected). If the battery is completely flat, the battery icon will only reappear after a few minutes of charging.

Getting Started

Insert a micro SD Card

1. Gently slip the card into the micro SD card slot, with the gold contacts facing downwards.
2. Then press the micro-SD down until the card locks into place.



To remove the micro SD card, push down the card into its slot and release it. The card will spring out of the slot.

Setting hotkeys

You can configure the numeric keys $2\text{-}9$ - 0 , A , B , C , D , up and down softkeys to access your favorite features. Once they have been set, you can simply long press the numeric key to access the corresponding features.

Getting Started

2. Calling

Make a call

From idle screen

1. In idle mode, enter the phone number with the keypad. To correct an error, press left softkey.
2. Press  to dial the number.
3. Press  to hang up.

To make an international call, long press  to insert the international prefix “+”.

Using the phonebook

1. Press  in idle mode.
2. Select a contact from the list, press  to dial. To select a different number, press  or  (see “Contacts” for more information).
3. Press  to hang up.

IP call (China only)

You may select *IP call*. When you select *IP call* option, the mobile phone will automatically add the IP special service number preset by you in front of the phone number and then make IP call.

Calling

When you have entered several IP special service numbers, you will be prompted to verify them to avoid adding them repeatedly.

Options during a call

During a call, you can press  *Options* to carry out the following operations:

- Activate/Deactivate *Handsfree*
- Use the *BT headset*
- Mute/Unmute the call
- Put the call on *Hold*
- Access the *Scratchpad*
- End the call
- Access *Main menu*

Mute or unmute a call

During a call, press left or right softkey to *Mute* or *Unmute*. If you select *Mute*, the microphone will be deactivated.

When you switch from one call to another, muting will be cancelled.

Adjust speaker/earpiece volume

During a call, call on hold or call waiting, you can press +/- side keys to increase or decrease the

volume (if you are not browsing the call options menu).

When the volume has been set, the call volume will take effect immediately and the settings will be applied to your subsequent calls.

End a call

Press left softkey and select [End call](#) or  to end a call.

Make an international call

1. Long press  until "+" appears on the screen.
2. Enter the country code.
3. Enter the area code (normally without the 0 in front), followed by the phone number.
4. Press  to call directly.

Make an emergency call

You can make an emergency call anytime, irrespective of whether the mobile phone has been registered on the network.

1. In idle mode, enter the emergency call number (specific number in the caller's country)
2. Press .

Note that an emergency call will not be stored in the call record.

Make a second call (Network dependent)

You can make a second call by putting the current call on hold:

1. During a call with Party A, you can enter Party's B number using the keypad.
2. Press  to dial Party B's number. Party A will be put on hold automatically.

Make a Conference Call (Network dependent)

Your phone supports multi-party call of up to five members. The screen will display [Conference call](#) during the multi-party call.

When there is a call waiting while you are already on the phone, you can carry out the following operations to establish the multi-party call:

1. Press  to answer the second call. The first call will be put on hold automatically.

2. Select **Conference Call** from the call menu. The two calls will be combined and a conference call is established.

During the multi-party call, you can answer a new incoming call or add a new member to the call by dialing the new member (the ongoing multi-party call will be put on hold automatically). Once the call is established, select **Establish conference call** from the call menu to add the new member to the multi-party call (you can add up to five members). If you wish to separate one member from the call, you can select **Split conference Call** during the multi-party call. To disconnect a member from the call, select **End call in conference**.

Switch calls (Network dependent)

When you have one active call and one call on hold, you can press left softkey **Options**, then select **Swap calls** to switch between the 2 calls.

Call Handsfree

During a call, press left softkey **Options** and select **Handsfree**.

When the headset is plugged into the phone, you cannot activate handsfree mode.

Calling

Answer a call

Press **□** to answer a call.

Reject a call

Press **□** to reject a call.

Answer a second call (Network dependent)

If you have activated **Call waiting**, you will be alerted when there is a second incoming call. You can:








1. Press **□** to answer the second call. The current call will be put on hold automatically.
2. Press **□** to reject the second call and continue with your current call.
3. When there is one active call and one call on hold, you can press **□ Options** to carry out the following operations:
 - **Handsfree**
 - **Scratchpad**
 - **End all calls**
 - **BT headset**
 - **End call**
 - **Mute**
 - **Swap calls**

If you press the numeric keys, the notepad editor will open under call waiting mode.

Contact Picture

This feature allows you to link a contact in your phonebook to a photo you have taken using the Camera function, or a picture you have downloaded via WAP or data cable. During a call, if the other party's name card is linked to a picture, the incoming call background will display the corresponding picture. This feature is referred to as *Contact picture*.

Contact picture is only available on the phone memory. The photo size should not be larger than 128 x 160 pixels.



3. Text and number entry

Input Method

Your phone supports 6 types of input methods:

Multitap ABC/Abc/abc

T9 ABC/Abc/abc

T9 PinYin

Simplified Chinese stroke

Numeric

Symbols

You can select in the option list the appropriate input method to enter English letters, words, symbols and numbers. Icons appearing on the screen indicate the active input mode.

Function keys

Right Delete the characters on the left of the softkey cursor or exit from editing mode.

◀/▶/◀/▶ Move the cursor, select a letter, word or symbol from the list, or scroll down a list.

□ Return to idle mode.

Left softkey Select the highlighted word from the list or enter Options menu.

□ Enter symbols.

□ long press to switch between Multitap and T9 inputs.

Multitap ABC/Abc/abc Input

1. Press once on the numeric key (2 to 9) to enter the first letter on the key, press twice to enter the second letter on the key, so on and so forth. If the letter you wish to enter and the one you have just entered are on the same key, just wait for a few seconds for the cursor to reappear.
2. Press right soft key to delete the characters on the left of the cursor.

Example: how to enter the word "home":

Press 4 (GHI), 6 (MNO), 6 (MNO), 6 (MNO), 6 (MNO), 3 (DEF), 3 (DEF). Press □ when the message is completed.

You can press key □ to insert a space in ABC/abc Multitap input mode.

T9® text input



T9® Predictive Text Input is an intelligent editing mode for entering text on a mobile phone. It allows you to enter text more quickly by anticipating the word you want to enter based on the keys you have pushed. You press once on the key corresponding to each letter needed to spell a word and T9® suggests a word based on your keystrokes.

Text and number entry

If several words are available, the first word in the list is displayed and highlighted. Press ▲/▼ or left softkey to browse the list and press ☰ to insert the word.

T9 ABC/Abc/abc Input

Smart English input method offers a faster way for you to enter English words.

1. You only need to press once on the numeric key (1_{asc} to 9_{asc}) corresponding to each letter needed to spell a word. As you enter the letters, the words displayed on the screen will be updated accordingly.
2. Press right softkey to delete the entries on the left of the cursor.
3. Use ▲ and ▼ to select the desired word and press left softkey to enter it.

Examples: how to enter the word "home":

1. Press 4_{asc}, 6_{asc}, 6_{asc}, 3_{asc}. The screen displays the first word of a list: *Good*.
2. Press ▼ to scroll and select *Home*.
3. Press ☰ to confirm.

T9 PinYin Input (China & Hong Kong only)

This is an intelligent editing mode that not only allows you to press only once on a key corresponding to each letter needed to form a

character, but is also equipped with association input feature. Keystrokes are analysed and all the possible pinyin combinations will be displayed at the bottom of the screen.

Using T9 PinYin input method

1. Enter the pinyin letters accordingly. Press once on the key corresponding to the pinyin letter without having to consider its position on the key. As you enter the letters using your keypad, the pinyin combinations on the screen will be updated accordingly.
2. Press **◀** or **▶** to select the character (the selected pinyin character will be highlighted) and press **⊕** to confirm.
3. Enter the association character: As soon as you have selected and entered a character, the candidate list will be updated and a list of association characters will be displayed. Press **◀** or **▶** to select the desired association character and press to **⊕** confirm entry.

Simplified Chinese Stroke Input (China & Hong Kong only)

Using Stroke input method

1. Enter the strokes: Enter the strokes of the chinese character according to its stroke sequence. When you press the keys

corresponding to the required strokes, the strokes will display on the screen. The phone will display the candidate characters corresponding to the strokes you have entered. As you enter the strokes, the candidate characters on the screen will be updated accordingly.

2. Enter character: Press **◀** or **▶** to select the required chinese character from the candidate list. Press **⊕** input the chinese character and press right softkey to clear the strokes you have entered.
3. Enter associate character: As soon as you have selected and entered a character, the candidate list will be updated and a list of association characters will be displayed. Press **◀** or **▶** to select the desired association character and press **⊕** to confirm entry.



Numeric input

1. Press **123** to switch to Symbol input method list
2. Press the numeric keys (**0** to **9**) to enter the numbers corresponding to the keys.
3. To delete a number, press right softkey.





Symbol Input

Press **••** to enter punctuation or symbols. Use the navigation keys to select the desired punctuation or symbol and press left softkey or **⊗** to enter it.

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4. Entertainment



This section describes the games and additional tools installed on your mobile phone.

Some of the features described here are dependent on the configuration of your mobile phone, the country in which you purchased your mobile phone, and/or your service provider.

Games

Default games

This menu features games that are pre-installed in your mobile phone. Press to enter the main menu from idle mode and select **Entertainment > Games**.

Java

Your mobile phone features a Java run-time environment, which allows you to run Java applications, such as games downloaded from the network.

- Press **Java > Launch** to launch a new application after you download it into the phone.

5. Browser



Your phone comes with a WAP browser. You can obtain news, sports and weather information, as well as services from the internet via the WAP browser.

This feature is available only if your subscription includes WAP access services. The settings have been pre-configured (depends on country variants) and you do not need to modify them. For more information, please contact your network operator.

WAP

Normally, the phone would have been pre-configured. If you wish to add or modify the configuration parameters, you need to obtain the necessary information from your network operator before you proceed. Homepage

Select this menu to access the homepage directly. You can also set the homepage address in the settings menu.

Bookmark

You can save the current web page or the web pages that you frequently visit to the **Bookmark** list, manage and organize them.

When you enter the menu, a list of bookmark entries is displayed. To connect to the web address of a particular bookmark entry, select an entry using ▲ or ▼ and press ☰.

To add a new bookmark, press ☰ to enter the main menu from idle mode and select **Browser** > **Bookmark**. Select <New bookmark> and press left softkey or ☰. Then Enter the **Bookmark name** and **URL** of the new bookmark and press left softkey or ☰.

To manage a bookmark, press ☰ from idle mode to enter the main menu and select **Browser** >

Bookmark. Then select a bookmark from the list and press left softkey to access the following options:

Launch Access the bookmark page.

View/Edit View/edit bookmark name/address.

Set as homepage Set the bookmark as homepage

Send bookmark Send the bookmark to your contact.

Delete Remove the bookmark.

This menu allows you to manage, organize and quickly access the web pages you have previously visited.

1. When you enter this menu, the web pages you have previously visited will be listed.
2. Press left softkey **Options** to access the following:

Bookmark

Enter address

Configure browser

This menu allows you to configure the **Browser settings** and select the **WAP profiles** in **Browser connection profiles** for web browsing. Your phone may have been pre-configured with the settings of a specific network operator. If you are a subscriber of the network operator, you may start using your WAP browser immediately. Otherwise, you need to re-configure the settings.

6. Music & Radio



Music Player

This menu allows you to play music. The music stored in the music player folder will be automatically detected and added to the play list. When the music is playing, you can dial or answer an incoming call. The player will pause once the connection is established.

Activate Music Player

Press  in idle mode to access the main menu, then, select *Music & Radio > Music Player*.

Left softkey Access *Option* menu.

Option menu of the Music Player

- Play** Play the selected music track.
- Open tracks list** Open the track list of the selected folder.
- Activate Bluetooth** Enable the Bluetooth function for file transfer.
- Shuffle and repeat** Select among *Off*, *Repeat track*, *Repeat all*, *Shuffle* or *Shuffle and repeat*.
- Add to playlist** Add the track to the *Playlist* folder to choose from when selecting a music track in *File Manager*.
- Delete** Remove the selected track.
- Details** Display detailed info of the music track.
- Rename** Edit the name of the track.
- Background play** Access other menus with music playing at the background.
- Exit** Exit from the music play menu.

FM Radio

This menu allows you to listen to the radio on your phone. Press  in idle mode to access the main menu, then, select *Music & Radio > FM radio*. Connect the headset connector to your phone before you can activate the radio function.

7. Camera



Your mobile phone features a digital camera that allows you to take pictures and record videos, store them in your phone and memory card, use them as wallpaper or send them to your friends.

Please ensure that the camera lens is clean before you take pictures, as small dust particles can strongly affect the picture quality.

The selected color effect will be displayed on the screen in real time.

Help View information for image effect.

Advanced **Storage setting:** **Phone memory** or **Memory card**
Picture prefix name: modify the default name of the photo

Photo preview option menu

Once you have activated the camera, simply press **⊕** to take a picture. The picture is automatically saved and displayed on the screen. You can press left softkey **Options** to carry out the following operations:

Delete Delete the current picture.

When there is not enough memory space, you will not be able to save the picture and you will be prompted with a warning message. You have to delete existing pictures before you can store new ones.



MMS (network dependent)

Your mobile phone can also send and receive MMS (Multimedia Messaging Service) messages. With MMS, you can send messages that contain pictures, sound and text.

Before you can send MMS, you need to enter the correct MMS Center number and ensure that the network profile of your MMS has been correctly configured. You can obtain such information from your network operator.





your choice. Enter a currency and an amount in the currency fields. Then enter a rate in the *Conversion rate*. The sum is calculated automatically.

Flight Mode

This application allows you to activate or deactivate the flight mode. If it is set to *On*, the network function will be closed and all related network operations will be prohibited.

Stopwatch

Your phone features a stop watch and the minimum unit is 0.1 second. The starting time is 000:00.0, in the format “mmm:ss.n”, where mmm stands for minutes of the watch, ss stands for seconds, n stands for 0.x second. The stopwatch will start the timing when you press left softkey *Start* or ⊗. You can press left softkey *Stop* to stop the timing, *Resume* to resume counting or press right softkey *Reset* to reset the timing.

Auto Switch On/Off

This menu allows you to set your mobile phone to switch itself on or off at pre-set times. This lets you extend your phone's battery life (e.g. during the

night), not be disturbed at given times and have your phone switch back on automatically. Press left softkey **Options** to access the following options:

Auto Switch On/Off Select among: *On only*, *On and off*, *Disabled* or *Off only*.

Periodically Select the desired frequency *Once*, *Every day* , *Except weekend* or *User choice*.

Switch on time Enter the time at which you want your mobile phone to switch itself on.

Switch off time Enter the time at which you want your mobile phone to switch itself off.

Lunar date converter

This menu gives you the correspondence between Gregorian and Chinese calendars by displaying the corresponding date in lunar mode from a selected Gregorian date.

Features requiring date and time information (e.g. organizer events) depend on Gregorian dates only.

Press to access the date edition window. Change the date if needed by pressing the corresponding keys, then press to convert to lunar mode.

11. Contacts



Contacts are stored in one of the two available phonebooks: SIM phonebook (located on your SIM card, by which the number of entries you can store depends on the card capacity) or the Smart Phonebook (located on your phone, which allows you to store up to 500 names). When adding new contacts, the contacts will only be added to the phonebook you have selected..

You can store up to 500 name cards, provided other features in the phone such as Organizer, Sounds, Pictures, and Videos, etc. did not use up a large amount of the phone's memory space.

Precautions

Radio Waves

 Your cellular mobile phone is a **low power radio transmitter and receiver**. When it is operating, it sends and receives radio waves. The radio waves carry your voice or data signal to a base station that is connected to the telephone network. The network controls the power at which the phone transmits.

- Your phone transmits/receives radio waves in the GSM frequency (900 / 1800 / 1900 MHz).
- The GSM network controls transmission power (0.01 to 2 watts).
- Your phone complies with all relevant safety standards.
- The CE mark on your phone shows compliancy with European electromagnetic compatibility (Ref. 89/336/EEC) and low voltage directives (Ref. 73/23/EEC).

Your cellular mobile phone is your responsibility. To avoid damage to yourself, to others or to the phone itself, read and follow all the safety instructions and make them known to anyone borrowing your phone. Furthermore to prevent unauthorized use of your phone:



Keep your phone in a safe place and keep it out of small children's reach. Avoid writing down your PIN code. Try to remember it instead.

Switch off the phone and remove the battery if you are going to leave it unused for a long time.

Change your PIN code after purchasing the phone and to activate call restriction options.



The design of your phone complies with all applicable laws and regulations. However your phone may cause interference with other electronic devices. Consequently you should follow all **local recommendations and regulations** when using your cellular phone both at home and when away. **Regulations on the use of cellular phones in vehicles and aircraft are particularly stringent.** Public concern has been focused for some time on the possible health risks for users of cellular phones. The current research on radio wave technology, including the GSM technology, has been reviewed and safety standards have been drawn up to ensure protection from exposure to radio wave energy. Your cellular telephone **complies with all applicable safety standards** and the Radio Equipment and

Telecommunications Terminal Equipment Directive 1999/5/EC.

Always switch off your phone

Inadequately protected or **sensitive electronic equipment** may be affected by radio energy. This interference can lead to accidents.

Before boarding an **aircraft** and/or when packing the phone in your luggage: the use of mobile phones in an aircraft may be dangerous for the operation of the aircraft, disrupt the mobile phones network and may be illegal.

In **hospitals**, clinics, other health care centres and anywhere else where you may be in the close vicinity of **medical equipment**.

In areas with a potentially **explosive atmosphere** (e.g. petrol stations and also areas where the air contains dust particles, such as metal powders).

In a vehicle transporting flammable products (even if the vehicle is parked) or a vehicle powered by liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), check first that the vehicle complies with the applicable safety rules.

Precautions

In areas where you are requested to turn off radio transmitting devices, such as quarries or other areas where blasting operations are in progress.

 Check with the vehicle manufacturer that **electronic equipment** used in your vehicle will not be affected by radio energy.

Pacemakers

If you have a **pacemaker**:

- Always keep the phone more than 15 cm from your pacemaker when the phone is switched on, in order to avoid potential interference.
- Do not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- Use the ear opposite to the pacemaker to minimize the potential interference.
- Switch off your phone if you suspect that interference is taking place.

Users of hearing aids

If you are a user of a **hearing aid**, consult your physician and hearing aid manufacturer to learn whether your particular device is susceptible to cellular phone interference.

Improved performance

In order to **improve the performance of your phone**, reduce radio energy emission, **reduce battery consumption and ensure safe operation** adhere to the following guidelines:



For the optimal and satisfactory operation of the phone, you are recommended to use the phone in the normal operating position (when not using in hands-free mode or with a hands-free accessory).

- Do not expose your phone to extreme temperatures.
- Treat the phone with care. Any misuse will void the International Guarantee.
- Do not immerse the phone in any liquid; if your phone is damp, switch it off, remove the battery, and let them dry for 24hrs before using them again.
- To clean the phone, wipe it with a soft cloth.
- Placing and receiving calls consumes the same amount of battery energy. However, the mobile consumes less energy in idle screen when kept in the same place. When in idle screen and while you are moving, your phone consumes energy to transmit updated location information to the network. Setting the backlight for a shorter period

of time as well as avoiding unnecessary navigating in the menus will also help to save the battery's energy for longer phoning and stand-by performances.

Battery information

- Your phone is powered by a rechargeable battery.
- Use specified charger only.
- Do not incinerate.
- Do not deform or open the battery.
- Do not allow metal objects (such as keys in your pocket) to short circuit the battery contacts.
- Avoid exposure to excessive heat ($>60^{\circ}\text{C}$ or 140°F), moisture or caustic environments.

The use of an alarm system to operate a vehicle's light or horn to indicate incoming phone calls is prohibited on public roads in some countries. Check local regulations.

In hot weather or after prolonged exposure to the sun (e.g., behind a window or a windscreens), the temperature of your phone's casing might increase, especially when featuring a metallic finish. Be very careful in this case when picking up your phone and

Troubleshooting

The phone does not switch on

Remove/reinstall the battery. Then charge the phone until the battery icon stops scrolling. Unplug from charger and try to switch on the phone.

Your phone doesn't return to the idle screen

Long press the hangup key or switch off the phone, check that the SIM card and the battery have been installed correctly and switch it on again.

The network symbol is not displayed

The network connection is lost. Either you are in a radio shadow (in a tunnel or between tall buildings) or you are outside the network coverage area. Try from another place, try to reconnect to the network (especially when abroad), check that the antenna is in place if your mobile has an external antenna, or contact your network operator for assistance/information.

The display doesn't respond (or the display responds slowly) to key presses

The display responds more slowly at very low temperatures. This is normal and does not affect the operation of the phone. Take the phone to a warmer

place and try again. In other cases, please contact your phone supplier.

Your battery seems to over heat

You might be using a charger that was not intended for use with your phone. Make sure you always use the Philips authentic accessory shipped with your phone.

Your phone doesn't display the phone numbers of incoming calls

This feature is network and subscription dependent. If the network does not send the caller's number, the phone will display *Call 1* or *Withheld* instead. Contact your operator for detailed information on this subject.

You can't send text messages

Check your call divert options.

1. What Does This Limited Warranty Cover?

Philips warrants to the original retail purchaser ("Consumer" or "You") that this Philips cellular product and all accessories originally provided by Philips in the sales package ("Product") are free from defects in materials, design and workmanship under normal use in accordance with the operating instructions and pursuant to the following terms and conditions. This limited warranty extends only to the Consumer for Products purchased and used in the original country of purchase. The limited warranty is valid only in Philips' intended country of sales of the product.

2. How Long is The Limited Warranty Period?

The limited warranty period for the Product extends for ONE (1) YEAR from the date of purchase of the Product, documented by valid proof of purchase. The limited warranty for original Philips rechargeable battery extends for six (6) months from the date of purchase.

3. What Will Philips Do if The Product is Not Free From Material Defects in Materials and
