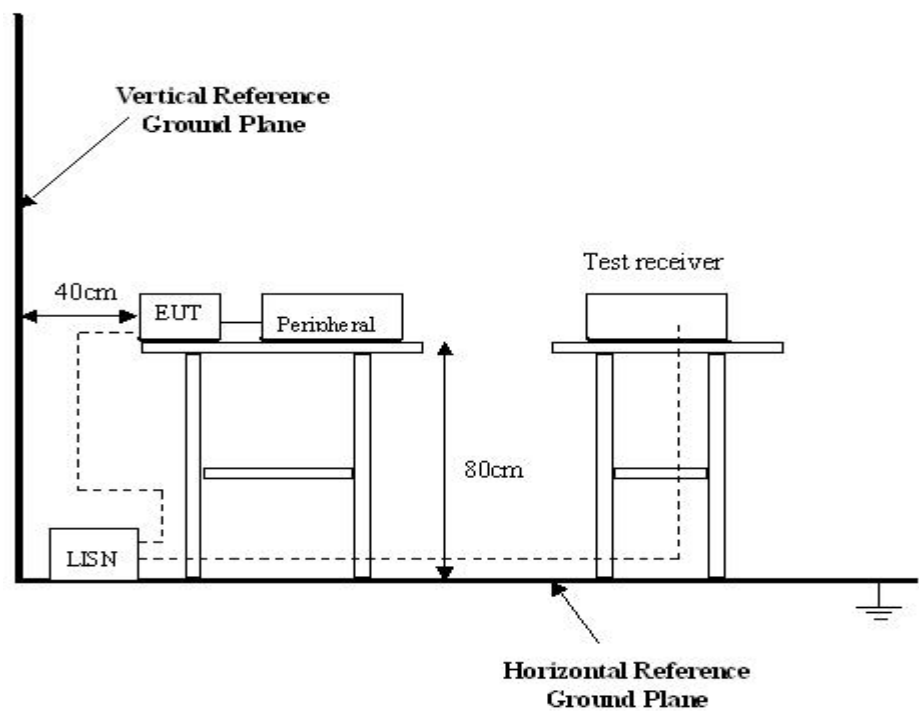

6.2 **Test Procedure**

1. The EUT was tested according to ANSI C63.4:2003. The frequency spectrum from 150kHz to 30MHz was investigated.
2. The maximised peak emissions from the EUT was scanned and measured for both the Live and Neutral Lines. Quasi-peak & average measurements were performed if peak emissions were within 6dB of the average limit line.

6.3 Conducted Test Setup

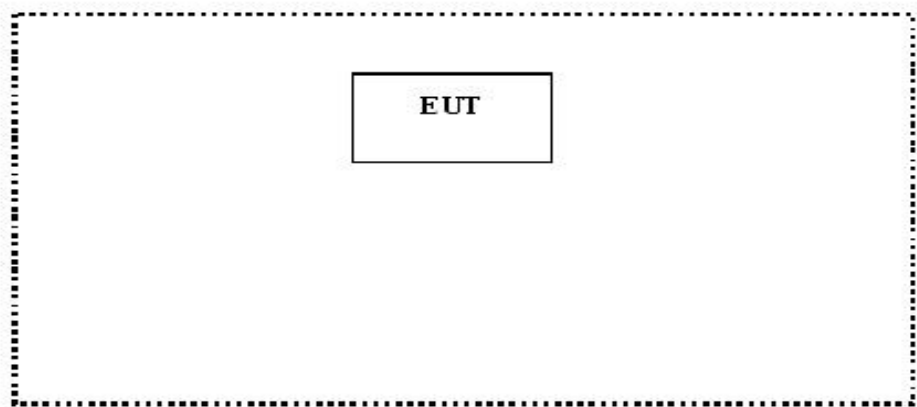
The conducted emission tests were performed using the setup accordance with the ANSI C63.4:2003, The specification used in this report was the FCC Part15 Paragraph 15.207 limits.



6.4 EUT Operating Condition

Operating condition is according to ANSI C63.4:2003.

- A. Setup the EUT and simulators as shown on follow.
- B. Enable RF signal and confirm EUT active.
- C. Modulate output capacity of EUT up to specification.



6.5 Conducted Emission Limits

66-56 dB μ V/m between 0.15MHz & 0.5MHz

56 dB μ V/m between 0.5MHz & 5MHz

60 dB μ V/m between 5MHz & 30MHz

Note: In the above limits, the tighter limit applies at the band edges.

7.2 Measurement Uncertainty

All measurements involve certain levels of uncertainties, especially in the field of EMC. The factors contributing to uncertainties are spectrum analyzer, cable loss, antenna factor calibration, antenna directivity, antenna factor variation with height, antenna phase center variation, antenna factor frequency interpolation, measurement distance variation, site imperfections, mismatch (average), and system repeatability.

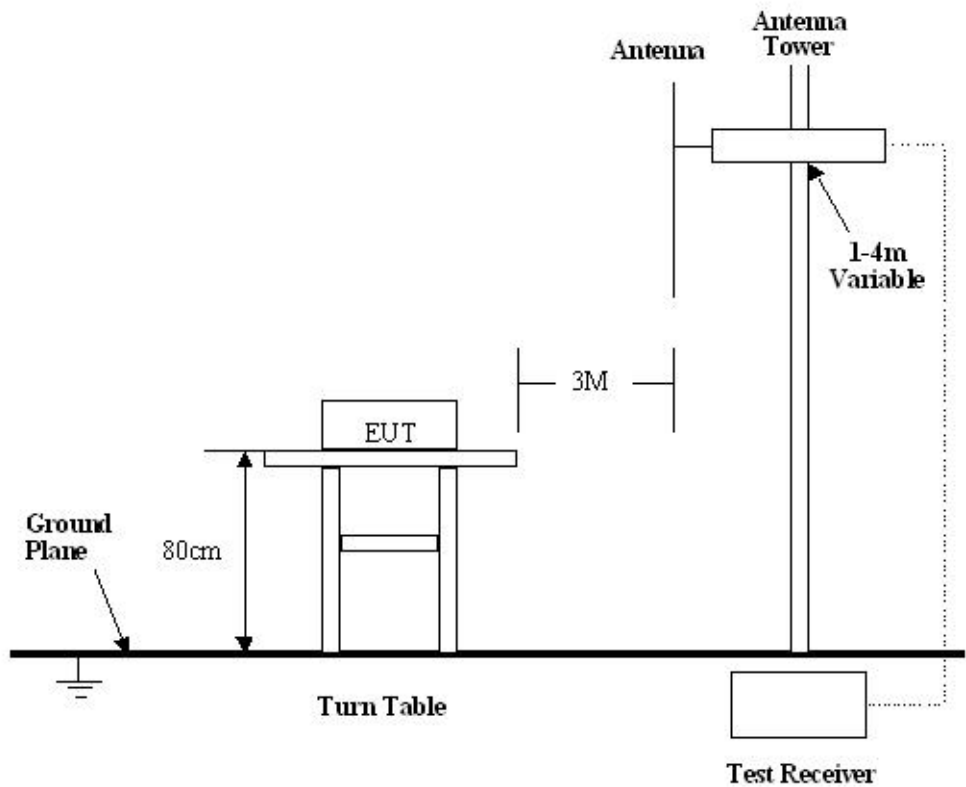
Based on ANSI C63.4:2003, The Treatment of Uncertainty in EMC Measurements, the best estimate of the uncertainty of a radiation emissions measurement at SGS EMC Laboratory is +4.0 dB.

7.3 Test Procedure

1. For the radiated emissions test, since the EUT does not have a power source, there was no connection to AC outlets.
2. Maximizing procedure was performed on the six (6) highest emissions to ensure EUT is compliant with all installation combinations.
3. All data was recorded in the peak detection mode. Quasi-peak readings was performed only when an emission was found to be marginal (within -4 dB μ V of specification limits), and are distinguished with a "Qp" in the data table.
4. The EUT was under normal mode during the final qualification test and the configuration was used to represent the worst case results.

7.4 Radiated Test Setup

The radiated emission tests were performed in the 3m Semi- Anechoic Chamber test site, using the setup accordance with the ANSI C63.4:2003, The specification used in this report was the FCC Part15 Paragraph 15.231(e) limits.



7.5 Spectrum Analyzer Setup

According to FCC Part15 Paragraph 15.231 Rules, the system was tested to 5000 MHz.

7.6 Corrected Amplitude & Margin Calculation

The Corrected Amplitude is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor and Cable Factor, and subtracting the Amplifier Gain from the Amplitude reading. The basic equation is as follows:

$$\text{Corr. Ampl.} = \text{Indicated Reading} + \text{Antenna Factor} + \text{Cable Factor} - \text{Amplifier Gain}$$

The “**Margin**” column of the following data tables indicates the degree of compliance with the applicable limit. For example, a margin of -7dBμV means the emission is 7dBμV below the maximum limit for Class B. The equation for margin calculation is as follows:

$$\text{Margin} = \text{Corr. Ampl.} - \text{Class B Limit}$$

Where F is the frequency in MHz, The formulas for calculating the maximum permitted fundamental field strengths are as follows:

- (1). For the band 130-174MHz, $\mu\text{V/m}$ at 3 meters $= 22.72727(F) - 2454.545$;
- (2). For the band 260-470MHz, $\mu\text{V/m}$ at 3 meters $= 16.6667(F) - 2833.3333$.

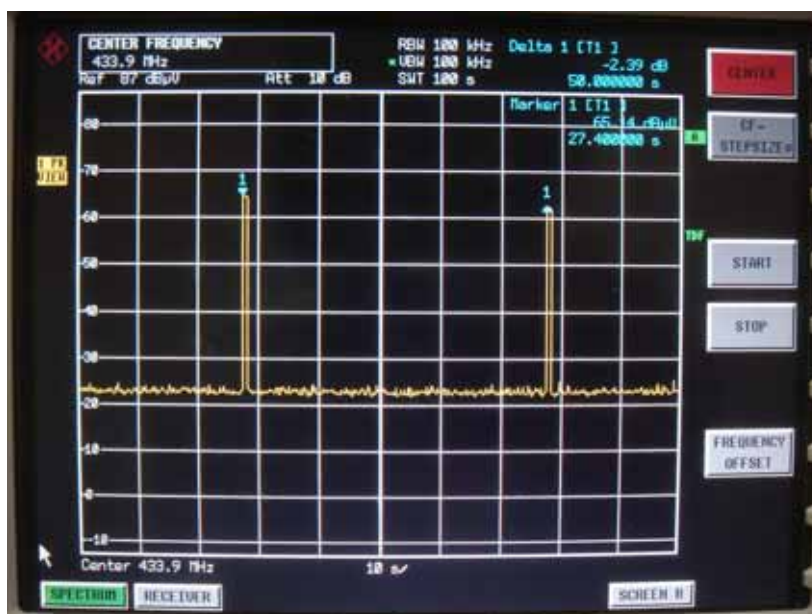
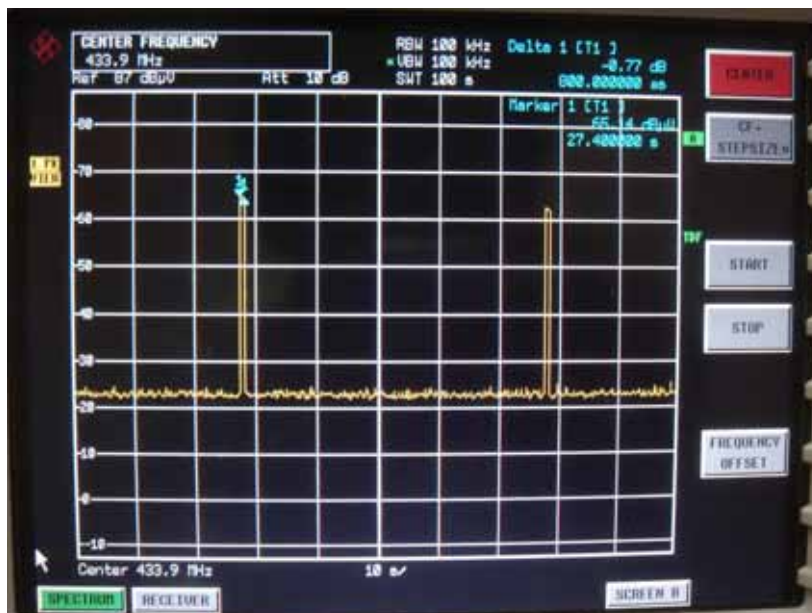

8 Periodic Operation

In addition, devices operated under the provisions of this paragraph shall be provided with a means for automatically limiting operation so that the duration of each transmission shall not be greater than one second and the silent period between transmissions shall be at least 30 times the duration of the transmission but in no case less than 10 seconds.

Refer to the duty cycle plot (as below), We find each the duration transmission for the device is about 0.8 second. and silent period between transmissions is about 50 seconds. This device does meet the FCC requirement.

9.1 Test Procedure

1. The EUT, peripherals were put on the turntable which table size is 1mX1.5m, table high 0.8m. All set up is according to ANSI C63.4:2003.
2. The bandwidth of the fundamental frequency was measure by spectrum analyser with 3KHz RBW and 3KHz VBW.The 20dB bandwidth is defined as the total spectrum the power of which is higher than peak power 20dB.

9.2 Band Edge

Requirements: The bandwidth of the emission shall be no wider than 0.25% of the center frequency for devices operating above 70 MHz and below 900 MHz. For devices operating above 900 MHz, the emission shall be no wider than 0.5% of the center frequency. Bandwidth is determined at the points 20 dB down from the modulated carrier.

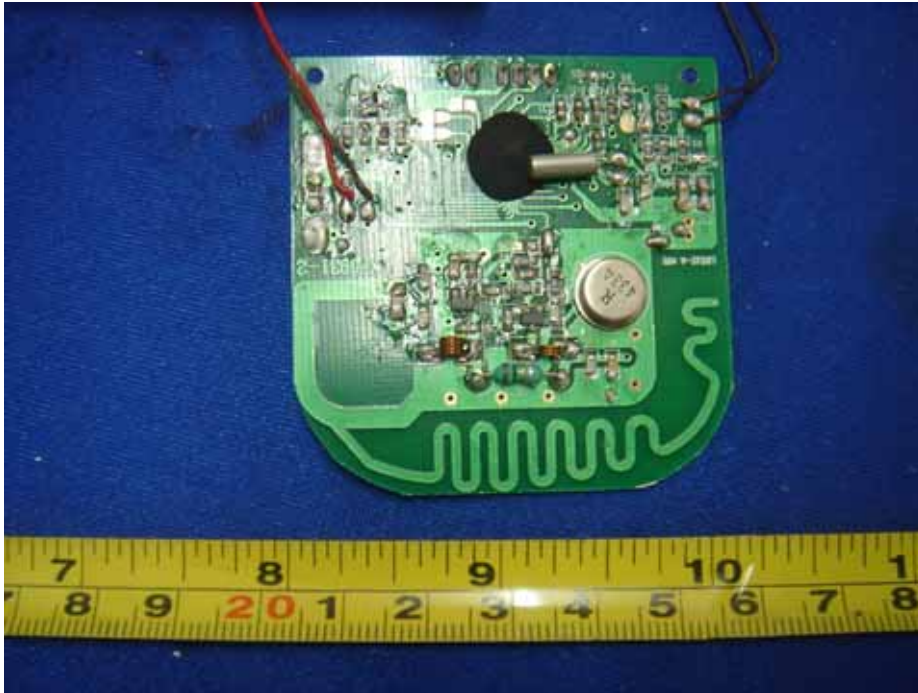

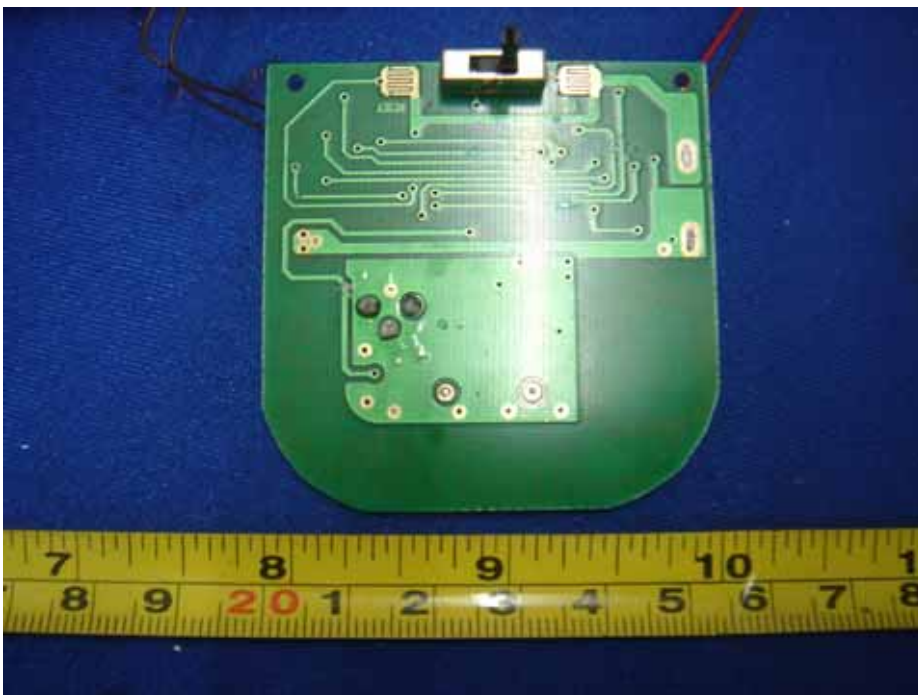
