Review of this application is complete. Please reply to the following items.

Q1: Please revise test report page 71 to show ANSI/TIA-603-C-2004. The procedure is the same, but FCC requires that the test report reference the current standard.

Q2: Please copy test report page 5 to a separate document as the FCC system requires that a separate tune-up exhibit be uploaded as a part of this application.

Q3: Confidentiality was requested for internal photos. Internal photos may not be filed as permanent confidential without special approval from FCC, and FCC normally does not make such approval. Internal photos can be filed with temporary confidentiality up to 180 days or until the equipment is marketed whichever occurs first. If temporary confidentiality is used, the manufacturer or agent is responsible for notification to the TCB in the event that the product is marketed prior to the 180 days.
