After a review of the submitted information, I have a few comments on the above referenced Application.

Administrative Issues:

- 1) The internal photographs included photographs for 2 different TX cards (Intel 2100 and 2200BG). We do not expect that the device may use two different WLAN cards at the same time, and the Certification will only cover one TX board since they would be considered different TX's. Please provide a detailed explanation and correct any exhibits affected (i.e., operational descriptions, specifications in reports, etc). that may be affected by this. Note that the users manual mentions the 2100, while the operational description mentions 2200BG. Which card is actually used?
- 2) Please provide a higher resolution sample label exhibit.
- 3) The bandwidth plot on page 14 of 69 of the EMC report does not appear complete. Please provide a corrected plot.
- 4) No separate RF exposure exhibit has been provided for this application. Please provide. In addition, please identify where the antennas are located in this device and provide either an MPE estimate report or SAR report as applicable. If necessary, please justify the use of MPE vs. SAR.
- 5) The users manual does not appear to address RF exposure information necessary to be provided to the user. This information will be dependent on item #4 above. Please update.
