






## Electronic Dial Function

## About batteries

### 1 When the battery is exhausted.



- If the battery is dead, the battery icon turns .
-  If the icon and the 'No battery' message appear, the cellular phone will shortly switch off. Please charge it.

### 2 Battery charge time and average battery life

| Classification     | Type | Charge time | Average battery life |                    |
|--------------------|------|-------------|----------------------|--------------------|
|                    |      |             | Operating Life       | Standby Life       |
| Standard (830 mAh) |      | 140 minutes | About 120 minutes    | About 90~160 hours |

- The charge time is based on the qualifying charger provided.
- The charge time may be very depending on the battery condition.
- The battery life is measured in compliance with the Standards concerning cellular phone life measurement and its notation of a cellular phone established by the Korea Consumer Protection Board.

#### Batteries are consumables

Batteries are consumables. As a battery is used, its life is gradually reduced. Purchase a new battery when the battery life is reduced to about half its initial battery life.

### 3 Tips about battery life

- If you use additional functions such as the messaging service, games, and the Internet, the battery life is reduced.
- The battery life may vary depending on the service type (Slot mode) of the base station that serves the cellular phone.
- If you stay in a No Service for a long time, the standby life is radically reduced due to high.
- The battery is consumed faster in an area where there are few radio waves or where channels (base stations) overlap.
- Making/receiving lots of calls reduce standby life radically.
- Since batteries are consumables, the battery life is reduced slowly during use.

#### What is slot mode?

Cellular wireless base stations communicated at regular intervals to identify the location of each cellular phone. This is called 'slot mode'. The more the number of communications are shorter the standby life. The communication cycle is determined by the wireless base station and is about 2.5 to 5 seconds.

### 4 Cautions and warnings about battery usage

- Be careful not to drop batteries, and do not disassemble them at random.
  - This may cause failure or the reduction of battery life, overheating.
- Do not put batteries near a heater or microwave!
  - This may cause an explosion.
- Use only the charger specified.
  - Other chargers may cause failure, overheating or explosion due to the over charge of the battery.
- Be careful not to allow the battery or the objects overheating with metal objects such as necklace or coin!
  - This may cause fire from the battery or the objects overheated.
- Do not place batteries in an area that is enclosed and excessively hot; keep them in an area that has a temperature range of between 0°C to 40°C.
  - It may alter the exterior look of the battery or cause failure.
- Keep batteries out of the reach of children.
  - Do not put batteries in your mouth and do not use a damaged battery. If leakage from a damaged battery contaminates the skin, clean it off in running water for one to two minutes.

#### Using Environments

- Be careful around electronic devices
- Do not use the mobile phone around pace maker.

- **When the battery life is different from the manual,**
  - The battery life will shorten when charging and discharging continues for a prolonged time. The battery life varies if it is left in cold or hot places. (See page 17)

## About Electrical frequency

While the power is turned on, the phone sends and receives high frequency energy. Information and Communication Department has posted safety regulation on the effects of this kind of high frequency energy on humans and this phone is made in compliance of such regulation. This electrical frequency protection regulation defines the maximum allowable exposure limit, and this limit includes extra allowance to protect all, regardless the age or the health condition. The defined exposure limit is 1.6w/kg. Cell phones, under the Information and Communication Regulation #2000-93 (Electrical Frequency Absorption Measurement Standard), it must pass Electrical Frequency Absorption Rate, or SAR(Specific Absorption Rate) in order to be able to market the product. - Reorient or relocate the receiving antenna.
- Increase the separation between the equipment and receiver.
- Connect the equipment into an outlet on a circuit different from that to which the receiver is connected.
- Consult the dealer or an experienced radio/TV technician for help.

### Read this information before using your phone

In August 1996 the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the United States with its action in Report and Order FCC 96-326 adopted an updated safety standard for human exposure to radio frequency (RF) electromagnetic energy emitted by FCC regulated transmitters. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standard previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies. The design of this phone complies with the FCC guidelines and these international standards.

Use only the supplied or an approved antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could impair call quality, damaged the phone, or result in violation of FCC regulations.

Do not use the phone with a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with the skin, a minor burn may result. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

#### **Body-worn Operation**

This device has been tested for body-worn operation and meets FCC RF exposure guidelines, and positions the handset at a minimum of 1.5Cm from the body. Use of any body-worn accessories may not compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines.

#### **Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) for Wireless Phones**

The SAR is a value that corresponds to the relative amount of RF energy absorbed in the head of a user for a wireless handset. The SAR value of a phone is the result of an extensive testing, measuring and calculation process. It does not represent how much RF the phone emits. All phone models are tested at their highest value in strict laboratory settings. But when in operation, the SAR of a phone can be substantially less than the level reported to the FCC. This is because of a variety of factors including its proximity to a base station antenna, phone design and other factors. What is important to remember is that each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SAR's do not represent a variation in safety. All phones must meet the federal standard, which incorporates a substantial margin of safety. As stated above, variations in SAR values between different model phones do not mean variations in safety. SAR values at or below the federal standard of 1.6W/kg are considered safe for use by the public.

The highest reported SAR values of 1.500 are:

CDMA mode (Part 22)- Head: 1.500 W/kg; Body-worn: 1.290 W/kg
