ArKion Systems UGML, FCC ID: SM6-UGM-L, would like to have your authorization as a modular approval. The requirements of FCC part 15.212 have been met and shown on the following statements.

1. "The modular transmitter must have its own RF shielding." The radio portion of this module has been shielded, please see exhibition External Photo.
2. "The modular transmitter must have buffered modulation/data inputs." The UGML contains buffered data inputs; it is integrated in SN74LV07ADGVR
3. "The modular transmitter must have its own power supply regulation." The UGML contains a regulator in the DC input port, MAX1776.
4. "The modular transmitter must comply with the antenna requirements of section 15.203 and 15.204(C)." The UGML meets the FCC antenna requirements. The spurious emission, unique antenna connector and photo of antennas are shown in the application exhibits.
5. "The modular transmitter must be tested in a stand-alone configuration" The UGML was tested in a stand-alone configuration via a serial interface. Please see exhibit "Test Setup Photos".
6. "The modular transmitter must be labeled with its own FCC ID number." Please see exhibit "FCC Label" for the FCC ID of this module.
7. "The modular transmitter must comply with any specific rule or operating requirements applicable to the transmitter and the manufacturer must provide adequate instructions along with the module to explain any such requirements." The UGM-L is compliant with all applicable FCC rules. Detail instructions for maintaining compliance are given in the Users Manual.
8. "The modular transmitter must comply with any applicable RF exposure requirements." The EUT is compliant with all applicable RF exposure requirements. RF Exposure is addressed in the exhibit "MPE Data". Please contact me if you have any further questions.
