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GENERAL INFORMATION

Product Description for Equipment under Test (EUT)

The *Circus World Displays Ltd.*'s product, model number: 22302 (FCC ID: SMH22303) or the "EUT" in this report was a *Camera unit of 2.4GHz Wireless Security Camera with Dual Channel Receiver*, which was measured approximately: 21.5 cm (L) x 8.5 cm (W) x 16.5 cm (H), rated input voltage: DC 6V from Adapter.

Note: The series product, models 22300, 22301, 22302, 22303, 12300, 12301, 12302, 12303, SC1428GMR2T1R-USA-BK00, SC1428GMR4T2R-USA-BK00, SC1428GMR1T1R-USA-BK00, SC1428GMR2T1R-USA-BK01, SC1428GMR4T2R-USA-BK01, SC1428GMR1T1R-USA-BK01 and SC1428GMR1T-USA-BK01, they share the same product only named differently due to different combination. Model 22302 was selected for testing, the detailed information can be referred to the attached declaration letter that stated and guaranteed by the applicant.

Objective

This report is prepared on behalf of *Circus World Displays Ltd.* in accordance with Part 2-Subpart J, Part 15-Subparts A, B and C of the Federal Communication Commissions rules.

The tests were performed in order to determine the compliance of EUT with FCC Part 15, Subpart C, section 15.203, 15.205, 15.207, 15.209 and 15.247 rules.

Test Methodology

All measurements contained in this report were conducted with ANSI C63.4-2009, American National Standard for Methods of Measurement of Radio-Noise Emissions from Low-Voltage Electrical and Electronic Equipment in the range of 9 kHz to 40 GHz.

All emissions measurement was performed and Bay Area Compliance Laboratories Corp. (Shenzhen). The radiated testing was performed at an antenna-to-EUT distance of 3 meters.

Measurement uncertainty with radiated emission is 5.91 dB for 30MHz-1GHz.and 4.92 dB for above 1GHz, 1.95dB for conducted measurement.

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Test Facility

The Test site used by Bay Area Compliance Laboratories Corp. (Shenzhen) to collect test data is located on the 6/F, the 3rd Phase of WanLi Industrial Building, ShiHua Road, FuTian Free Trade Zone Shenzhen, Guangdong, China.

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Test site at Bay Area Compliance Laboratories Corp. (Shenzhen) has been fully described in reports submitted to the Federal Communication Commission (FCC). The details of these reports have been found to be in compliance with the requirements of Section 2.948 of the FCC Rules on December 06, 2010. The facility also complies with the radiated and AC line conducted test site criteria set forth in ANSI C63.4-2009.

The Federal Communications Commission has the reports on file and is listed under FCC Registration No.: 382179. The test site has been approved by the FCC for public use and is listed in the FCC Public Access Link (PAL) database.



The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this Section. The manufacturer may design the unit so that a broken antenna can be replaced by the user, but the use of a standard antenna jack or electrical connector is prohibited.

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Antenna Connector Construction

The EUT use one external omni-directional antenna (with reversed SMA-J connector) arrangement and the maximum gain is 2.2 dBi, fulfill the requirement of this section. Please refer to the internal photos.



The adapter was connected to a 120 VAC/60 Hz power source.

The EMI test receiver was set to investigate the spectrum from 150 kHz to 30 MHz.



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


Measurement Uncertainty

All measurements involve certain levels of uncertainties, especially in field of EMC. The factors contributing to uncertainties are spectrum analyzer, cable loss, antenna factor calibration, antenna directivity, antenna factor variation with height, antenna phase center variation, antenna factor frequency interpolation, measurement distance variation, site imperfections, mismatch (average), and system repeatability.

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Based on CISPR 16-4-2:2011, the expended combined standard uncertainty of radiation emissions at Bay Area Compliance Laboratories Corp. (Shenzhen) is 5.91 dB for 30MHz-1GHz and 4.92 dB for above 1GHz. And the uncertainty will not be taken into consideration for the test data recorded in the report

EUT Setup



The radiated emission tests were performed in the 3 meters test site, using the setup accordance with the ANSI C63.4-2009. The specification used was the FCC 15.209 and FCC 15.247 limits.

The external I/O cables were draped along the test table and formed a bundle 30 to 40 cm long in the middle.

The adapter was connected to a 120 VAC/60 Hz power source.

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EMI Test Receiver & Spectrum Analyzer Setup

The system was investigated from 30 MHz to 25 GHz.

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Test Procedure

For the radiated emissions test, the adapter was connected to the outlet of the LISN.

Maximizing procedure was performed on the highest emissions to ensure that the EUT complied with all installation combinations.

Data was recorded in Quasi-peak detection mode for frequency range of 30 MHz to 1GHz and peak and Average detection modes for frequencies above 1GHz.

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Corrected Amplitude & Margin Calculation

The Corrected Amplitude is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor and Cable Loss, and subtracting the Amplifier Gain from the Meter Reading. The basic equation is as follows:

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Corrected Amplitude = Meter Reading + Antenna Factor + Cable Loss - Amplifier Gain






