




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Impedance Measurement Plot for Head TSL

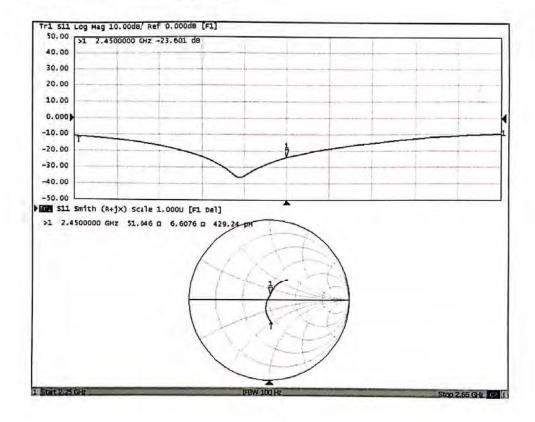








Picture 21: Front Side, the distance from handset to the bottom of the Phantom is 15mm




Picture 22: Back Side, the distance from handset to the bottom of the Phantom is 10mm




Picture 23: Front Side, the distance from handset to the bottom of the Phantom is 10mm
