



3.2 Your Device

3.2.1 Front




No.	Name	Description
0	LED Indicator	Indicates the status of the device. The LED turns green when the device stalls due to a fault.
2	SIM/SD card slot	Insert a micro SD and a micro SIM card.
3	Touchscreen	Displays apps and acts as a multi-touch interface.
4	Back button	Returns to the previous page or menu.
6	Home button	Returns to the Home screen.
6	Menu button	Displays more option menus. If you tap and hold this button for a few seconds, the apps you previously opened will be listed. Tap any app to open it.
0	Printer	Prints receipts.

4.1 Installing the Cards

There is a slot for micro SD and micro SIM cards on the left side of your device.


- A micro SD card is required for external storage.
- A micro SIM card is required for using mobile services.




All cards should be purchased separately if necessary. The specifications may differ according to country where the device is purchased. Contact your sales representative for more information.

To insert a micro SIM card and a micro SD card


1 Insert the tip of a sharp object to slide the card tray out from the slot on the left side of your device.



2 Place your micro SIM (1) and micro SD card (2) on the card tray with the gold contacts facing downward.



3 Slide the card tray back into the slot until it locks in place.






To remove the inserted cards, repeat Step 1.




4.2 Connecting the Power Adapter

To connect the power adapter to the device

1 Remove the port cover.



2 Connect the power adapter to the power port and a power outlet.




3 Replace the port cover.

4.3 Installing a Paper Roll

To install a paper roll before using the printer

1 Hold the top half of the device and open the printer door as shown below.


2 Insert the paper roll into the tray as shown below.

4.4 Cutting Off Receipts


This terminal uses a roll of thermalsensitive paper (width & diameter 58 mm) to print receipts. Pull the receipt toward the display to cut it off. Pulling the paper backward may cause the printer door to open.





5.1 Turning the Device On and Off

To turn on the device, press and hold the Power button for a few seconds.



To turn off the device, press and hold the Power button, then tap **Power off**.



- To turn the screen on or off, press the Power button.
- Registering the accounts without turning on the Wi-Fi may incur extra charges depending on your data plan.

5.1.1 Using Airplane Mode

On the Home screen, tap ***** More** and turn **Airplane mode** on. This feature disables all wireless and mobile services. Repeat the step to deactivate Airplane mode.



You can activate Wi-Fi and Airplane mode from the quick action center. Drag down from the top of the screen at any time from any menu or app and tap the **Wi-Fi** button or **Airplane mode** button.

5.2 Resetting the Device

If your device does not work properly or freezes due to unknown errors, you can force the device to restart.

To reset the device's software



Back up any data and settings you want to keep before resetting the device to the factory default settings.



5.3 Using the Touchscreen

Follow the instructions below to correctly use the touchscreen.



- Do not touch the screen with any sharp objects.
- Do not apply too much pressure to the touchscreen.



5.4 Locking and Unlocking the Device

Lock the screen to protect your device and its data.

The device locks if it is not in use for a specified period by default. To unlock the device, press the Power button to turn on the screen and drag upward from the bottom of the screen.



5.5 Using the Home Screen

- To return to the Home screen, tap the Home button \bigcirc at any time from any menu or app.

- When the icons on the status bar are hidden, tap the status bar on the screen to display icons temporarily.
- The appearance of icons may vary depending on your region or network service provider.

5.6 Customizing Your Home Screen

You can customize the Home screen by adding shortcuts.

5.6.1 Adding Shortcuts

Shortcuts added on the Home screen allows you to access and launch apps or activate a feature quickly and easily.

On the Home screen, tap (ii) to view all your apps. Tap and hold the app icon you want to add a shortcut until the Home screen appears. Drag and drop the app icon to create a shortcut.



The same shortcuts can be added to any of the available screens.

5.6.2 Arranging Shortcuts

Tap and hold the shortcut icon you want to move. Drag the shortcut icon to a new location. To place the item on a different page, drag it to the edge of the screen.

5.6.3 Removing Shortcuts

Tap and hold a shortcut, then drag it to **X Remove** and release it to delete the shortcut.



5.7.1 Quick Actions

Access the most frequently used settings quickly with quick action, turning them on or off in an instance.

1 Drag down from the top of the screen at any time from any app and tap a quick action button to turn it on or off.



2 Drag up from the bottom of the screen or tap the Back button **4**.



5.7.2 Setting Date and Time

The date and time are automatically set based on the network you are connected to.

To set the date and time manually

On the Home screen, tap **\(\sigma \)** > **\(\sigma \) Date & time**, then disable **Automatic date & time**. If you turn off this option, the options for setting date and time will be activated.

To set the date and time automatically

On the Home screen, tap 🔯 > 🕓 Date & time, then enable Automatic date & time.

To select the time zone manually

On the Home screen, tap a > \(\mathbb{O}\) Date & time, then disable Automatic time zone.

To select the time zone automatically

On the Home screen, tap **a** > **Date & time**, then enable **Automatic time zone**.

To set the date and time format

On the Home screen, tap a > \(\mathbb{O}\) Date & time, then turn Use 24-hour format on or off.

5.7.3 Setting the Keyboard and Language

On the Home screen, tap (a) > (a) Language & input to change the language and the keyboard you use. For more information, refer to Language and Input on page 34.

5.7.4 Adjusting the Screen Brightness

- 1 On the Home screen, tap 🌼 > 🌓 Display > Brightness level.
- 2 Tap **Brightness level** and move the slider to adjust the screen brightness.



5.8 Connectivity

5.8.1 Wi-Fi

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network is an easy way of accessing the Internet. When you are out, you can connect to Wi-Fi networks in public places.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap 🔯 > 💎 Wi-Fi.
- 2 Make sure to turn Wi-Fi on.
- 3 Tap the network you want to join.
- 4 If necessary, enter the password for the network and tap **CONNECT**.

To disconnect the network connection, turn Wi-Fi off.



Your device periodically notifies you of available connections. The notification appears briefly at the top of the screen.

5.8.2 Bluetooth

You can connect wirelessly to various Bluetooth-compatible devices, such as phones, computers, headsets, and car kits. You can also send your photos to Bluetooth-compatible phones or to your computer.

On the Home screen, tap ② > ** Bluetooth.

Because devices with Bluetooth wireless technology communicate using radio waves, they do not need to have a direct line of sight. However, they must be within 10 meters (33 feet) of each other, although the connection may be subject to interference from obstructions, such as walls or from other electronic devices.



- Paired devices can be connected to your device when Bluetooth turns on.
- Other devices can detect your device only if the Bluetooth settings view is open.



Do not accept the requests from unknown devices and also do not try to pair with an unknown devices. This helps to protect your device from harmful content.

To pair with a Bluetooth device

Pair your device with Bluetooth compatible devices.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap (a) > * Bluetooth.
- 2 Turn the Bluetooth on.



- Make sure the devices you want to pair with have Bluetooth enabled.
- You may need to start the pairing process from the headset. For details, see your headset user guide.
- 3 On the Bluetooth device list, tap the device you want to pair with.
- 4 Type or confirm the PIN, and tap **PAIR**, if required.



- The passcode, which you can create, must be entered on both devices. The PIN in some devices is fixed. For details, see the user manual of the other device.
- A PIN is only used when you connect to a device for the first time.

When your device has paired with other devices via Bluetooth, your device will automatically pair in the future when in range.

To unpair a Bluetooth device

Unpair your device with the device you paired.

- 1 On the Home screen, tap 🔯 > 🔻 Bluetooth.
- 2 Tap the device's name to disconnect.
- 3 Tap **FORGET**.

To send content via Bluetooth

Use Bluetooth to wirelessly share your photos or other content with Bluetooth-compatible devices or to your computer. You can use more than one Bluetooth connection at a time.

For example, while using a Bluetooth headset, you can still send things to another device.

- 1 Pair your device with another Bluetooth device.
- 2 Tap the content you want to share, then tap < > Bluetooth.
- 3 On the Bluetooth devices list, tap the device you want to share with.



6.1 Installing and Uninstalling Apps

You can download Android apps and install them on your device.

6.1.1 Installing Apps

- 1 Connect the device to your PC via a micro USB cable.
- 2 Download apps to your PC or SD card.
- 3 Transfer your downloaded apps to your device via the micro USB cable.

6.1.2 Uninstalling Apps

Tap >Apps, and then uninstall the app you want to uninstall.

6.3 Calendar

Use this app to create, view, and manage events.

On the Home screen, tap (iii) > 31. You can also add a shortcut on the Home screen.



To add events, you must set up an account. For information on how to set up an account, refer to *Accounts on page 33*.

6.3.1 Creating Events

- 1 On the Home screen, tap (::) > 31.
- 2 Tap = > Schedule, Day, 3-day, Week or Month.
- 3 In **Day**, **3-day** or **Week** view, tap a date or time to select and tap it again to add events. If you try to add events in **Schedule** or **Month** view, tap a date and the screen will switch to **Day** view.
- 4 Tap the time and tap it again to add events.



You can also add events by tapping \bigoplus at the bottom right of the screen in any view modes. Make sure you have to choose the date first.

6.3.2 Changing Calendar View

- 1 On the Home screen, tap (::) > 31.
- 2 Tap = and select one of the following options: Schedule, Day, 3-day, Week or Month.

- 4 Tap the event to view the details.

6.3.4 Editing and Deleting Events

6.4.1 Alarm and clock

You can set and delete an alarm with the Clock app.

To set an alarm

- 2 Tap and set the time for the alarm and tap **OK**.
- 3 Select the **Repeat** checkbox and select the days you want the alarm to sound on. If you want to change the alarm ringtone, tap **Default ringtone** (**Platinum**).
- 4 To make the device vibrate during the alarm, select the **Vibrate** checkbox.
- 5 Tap **Label** to name the alarm.

To delete an alarm

- 1 On the Home screen, tap (:::) > > 5.
- 2 Tap an alarm > 1.
- 3 Tap **UNDO** in the following pop-up box, if you do not want to delete the selected alarm.

To add cities

- 1 On the Home screen, tap (:::) > > O.
- 2 Tap (a) to add cities, and select the checkboxes of the cities you want to add.
- 3 Tap ← to save.

To switch to Night mode

- 1 On the Home screen, tap (::) > \bigcirc > \bigcirc .

Your device dims the screen lights and displays the current time. Tap the screen to go back to the Clock screen.

I dropped the device in the water.

Turn off the device. Place the device in a dry place. Let them dry completely for a considerable period of time, and then turn the device back on. If it does not turn back on, contact our Customer Service Center.

Charged services

- In the following cases, it will be charged when requesting for after-sales service.

- Faults caused by the customer.
 - Defect due to inappropriate or careless use of the product (dropping, submersion under water, shock, damage, unreasonable operations, etc.)
