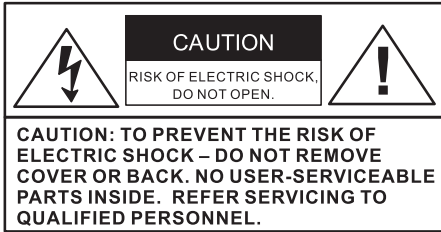

SAFETY

For units with an insertable AC Power Adapter cordset:

Important Safety Instructions

1. Read These Instructions: All safety and operations manual should be read before the product is operated.

4. Follow All Instructions: All operations manual should be followed.

5. Water and Moisture: Do not use this unit near water. For example, do not use near a bath tub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub. 6. Cleaning: Clean the unit only with a dry cloth. Unit must be unplugged from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners on the unit.

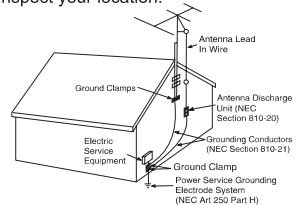

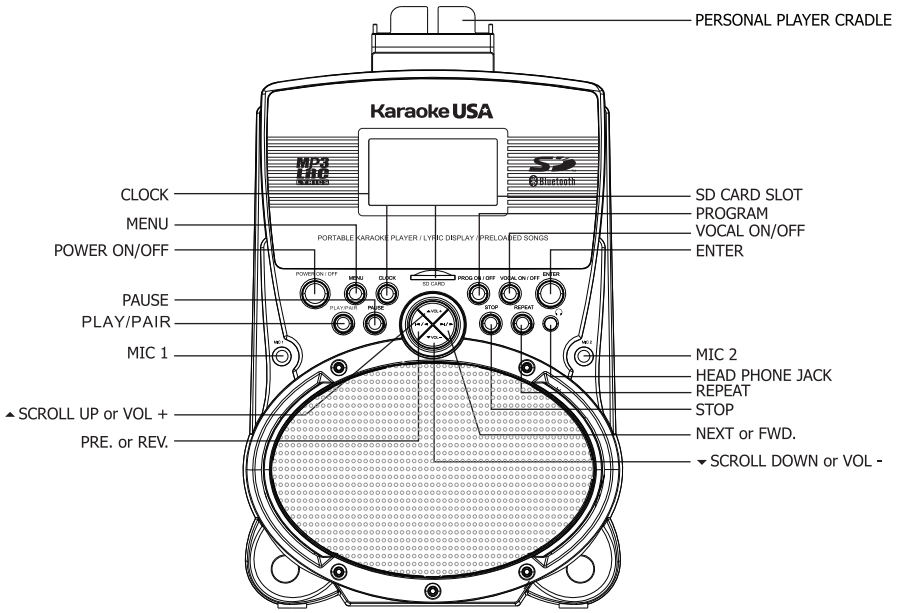

FUNCTION:

Power On/Off

- Press ON/OFF key once to set On or Off;
- When the unit is turned on, it will display the main song list;

MENU - Press MENU button once to enter the selection screen, using Up and Down buttons. Press ENTER to select a desire function;

CLOCK - Press this button will display the clock

Prog. On/Off - Press PROGRAM ON/OFF button to start the program. Select your favorite song and Press Enter (song bookmark). The song you selected will be blinking on the screen. Press Enter again to remove it from bookmark list. After mark all songs, press PLAY those selected songs.

VOL+ and VOL- Press VOLUME + or VOL - to adjust the volume level

ENTER - To Confirm your selection or play

PLAY/PAIR - Press the PLAY starts to play the music. In Bluetooth mode, press and hold this button to disconnect any paired devices in order to pair another device.

PAUSE - Temporarily suspends player. Lyric motion freezes and audio reproduction stops

STOP - Press STOP button to stop playing and go to the song list

REPEAT - Press REPEAT button one time to re-play the current song while playing. Press repeat twice to repeat all songs on HD or SD card, press three times to eliminate the repeat function. (Double Function Button)

VOCAL ON/OFF - Press this button when playing songs to turn on or off the lead vocal from the music. This allows singer to learn the song and practice with vocal until they can remember lyric timing.

Download Introduction

WORKING WITH MP3 AND LRC FILES

MP3 files may be intimidating to some. They are nothing more than computer files that can be moved, copied, stored and deleted. When made available for an MP3 player to access, great sound is the result. MP3 files are the most common format of downloadable music on the internet.

Your player comes with 100 songs preloaded. See page 4 for song listing. Additional songs are available for downloading on the internet. Using your computer and your SD Card, songs can be downloaded, copied onto your SD Card (up to 16GB), then insert SD Card into player. Songs will show on the player menu for selection.

NOTE: To see song lyrics, you must download and use an LRC (lyrics) file that has been cued to the MP3 song file. An LRC file is not required to play MP3 songs.

Songs are available for downloading on SingTheHits.com. Click on free downloads and download MP3LRC formatted songs. These downloads are in a compressed ZIP file for convenience. They must be decompressed before copying to your SD Card. In the end, each song will have 2 files: MP3 and LRC.

WORKING WITH MP3 AND LRC (LYRIC) FILES

Your player will play MP3 files with an added benefit. If a matching LRC file is provided, you can view the lyrics to your MP3 song on the player's lyric display. However, LRC files are not necessary to listen to great music or to sing along as karaoke. An LRC file is nothing more than a text file with timing marks inserted before each line of lyrics. The timing marks tell the player when to insert the line of lyrics into the display as the song is played.

MP3 and matching LRC files may be found searching the internet. Whether you decide to download, share or create your own lyrics file, you must follow one simple rule. The MP3 and LRC filenames must be exactly the same except for the extensions *.MP3 and *.LRC. If they are exactly the same, the player will know to access both automatically. You don't have to do anything extra like tell the player you have a lyrics file. It automatically searches each time an MP3 is played.

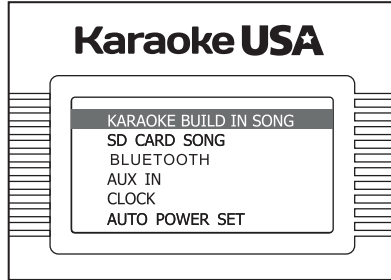

Power On/Off

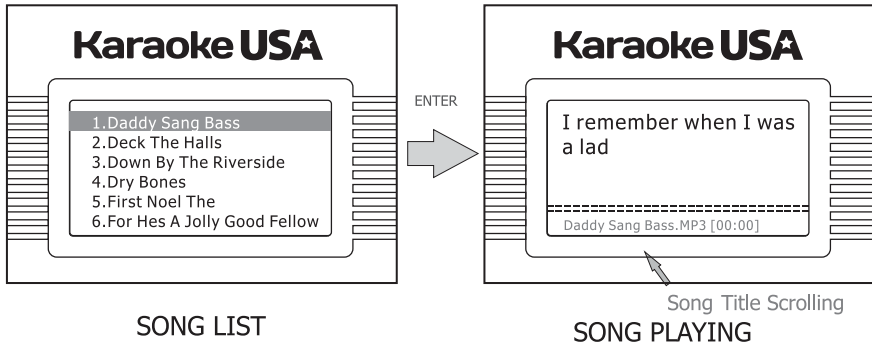
Press ON/OFF key once to on or off.

* When the unit is turned on, it will display the song list.

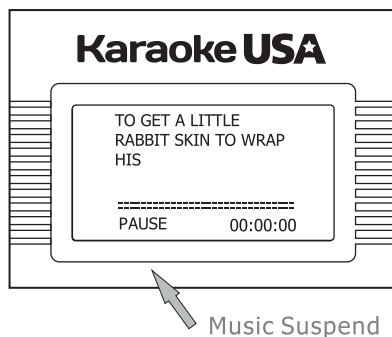


- * Press ENTER to directly play the current selected song (default setting is 1st song)

Built in songs or SD Card song will have same operation, just go Direct from menu to SD Card song.

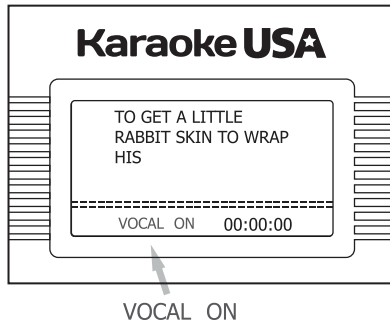

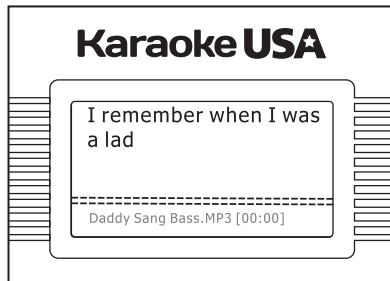
- * Lyric will be displayed on screen and scroll upward.

- * Press PAUSE to suspend the music and press PLAY to resume (status on LCD)



- * Press VOCAL ON/OFF to remove the vocal output of the song.
- * Press VOCAL ON/OFF again to resume vocal output(status on LCD)

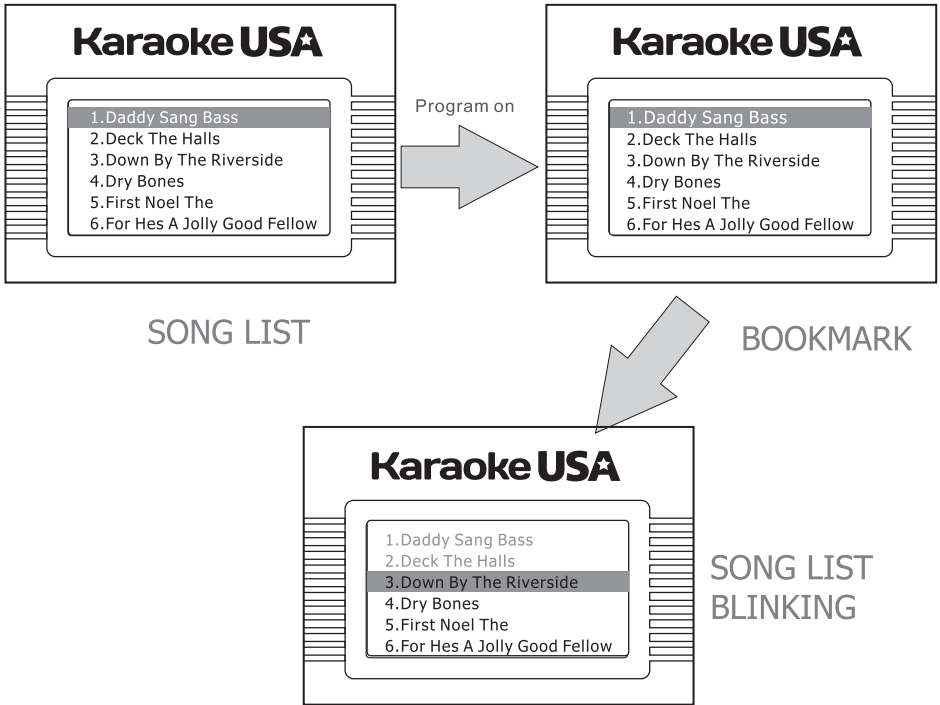


Song Title and timing Scrolling

PROGRAM On/Off - – Press PROGRAM ON/OFF button to start the program in the song list. Select your favor song and Press ENTER (song bookmarked). The song you selected will be blinked on the screen. Press ▲ and ▼ to scroll through the song list and press ENTER to mark next song, Press ENTER again to remove it from bookmark list. After marking all songs, press PLAY to play those selected songs;

Operation

Play SD Card

Before you do this, make sure there are some MP3 format musics stored in your SD card.



*Insert your SD card to the SD card slot, then press MENU, press ▼ to select the SD CARD SONG, press ENTER again to go to the songs that stored in your SD card.

This machine supports up to a "maximum limit" of 999 Songs loaded from your SD Card.

Play Bluetooth Music

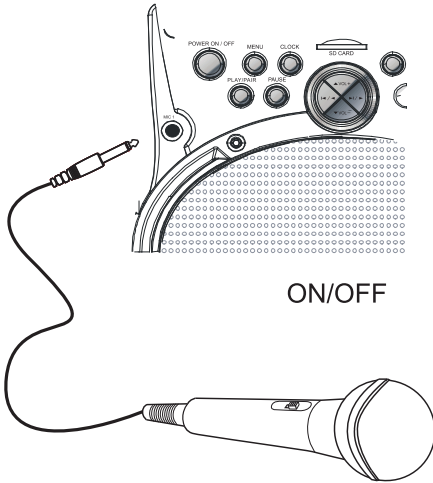
1. Pairing your Smart Phone using Bluetooth :
 - A. Power the machine ON and then Press MENU.
 - B. Press ▼VOL- to the BLUETOOTH mode and ENTER to select.



- When in Bluetooth mode, the screen flash : "BT".
2. Setting your Smart Device to "explore" the unit.
 - A. Activate your Bluetooth function on your smart device.
 - B. Click "Setting" and select "Bluetooth"
 3. Using your Smart Device to connect to the Machine
 - A. Your Smart Device will Discover:SD517.
 - B. Select SD517.
 - C. To accept the pairing to your smart Device .
 - D. If they are paired, the screen will shows constant: "BT" and you will hear a "beep" sound.
 - E. If they are not paired, the screen will show flash "BT".
 - F. Please repeat "Steps 1,2 & 3"above until they are paired.
 4. Play Audio via Bluetooth After Pairing:
 - A. Select the song files that you wish to play from your Smart Device.
 - B. Then play your Smart Device to start sending to the Machine by Bluetooth connection.
 - C. Always remember to use full volume to send your song files from your smart device.
 - D. Adjust the Master Volume on the Machine to a comfortable level when necessary.
 - E. Music will be put "on Hold" automatically when your Smart Device receives a phone call to let you answer. The music will resume when you end the call.
 5. Bluetooth transmits audio only. You will not see lyrics when using Bluetooth for a music source.

Play Bluetooth Music

Using a Bluetooth Device (Continued)

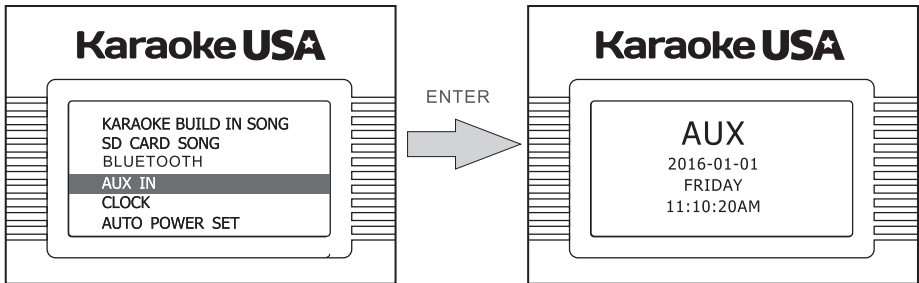


- * To control your Bluetooth device from this unit, press the **PLAY** button to start playback. Press the **PAUSE** button during playback to pause the song.
- * Adjust the volume to a comfortable level using the **VOL+** or **VOL-** control on this unit as well as the volume on your Bluetooth device.
- * **SKIP:** Advance or go back one track by pressing the **SKIP** ◀ / ▶ / **SKIP** ▶ / ▶ buttons.
- * Press the power **ON/OFF** button to turn the unit off.

AUX IN

* Plug your iPod or your portable player through the cable to the **MP3/iPOD/AUX IN** port on the back of the unit.
(cable provided in the package)

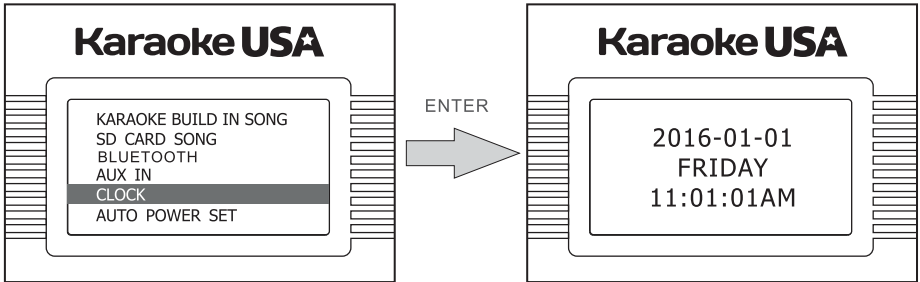


- * Press **MENU**, then press ▼ to select the **AUX IN**, press **ENTER** again to listen your external player's music.
- * Audio from your iPod or MP3/Mp4 player will be mixed with the singer's voice and be played through the player's speaker.
- * Adjust volume up or down

Time Set

- *Press MENU once to enter mode selection screen.
- *Press ▼ / VOL- to the CLOCK and ENTER to select.



- *Press ENTER again to star time setting.



- *Press ▲ or ▼ to change the blinking digit.
- *Press ◀ or ▶ and continue with next digit.
- *The sequence is Year > Month > Day> Hour > Minute.
- *After setting all digits, Press ENTER then display return to normal clock display.

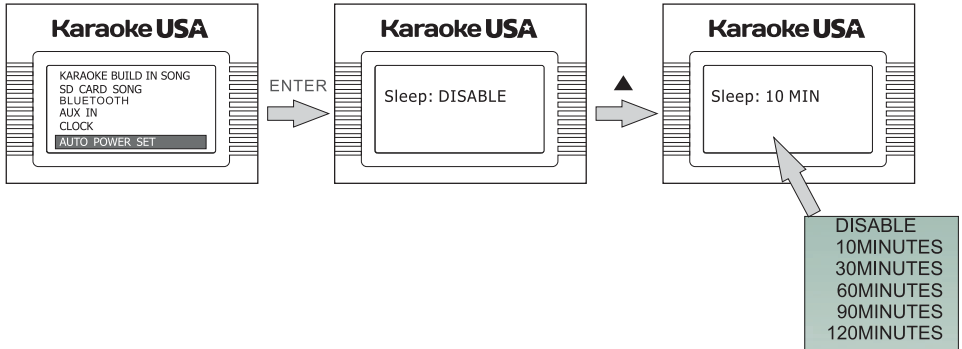

*Press ▲ or ▼ to change auto power off time.

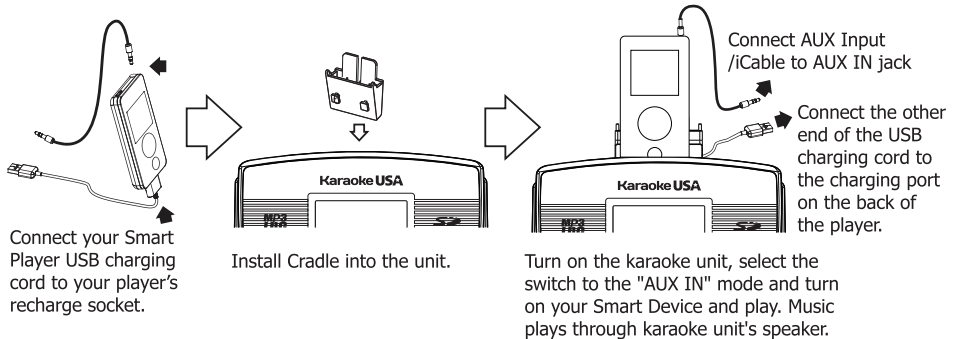


*Auto power times are available for 10 minutes, 30 minutes, 60 minutes, 90 minutes, 120 minutes.

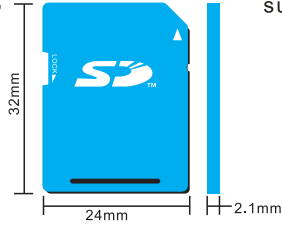
Troubleshooting

Symptom	Possible Solutions
Can't turn on.	Check Battery polarities being installed correctly
	Check if AC Adaptor is functioning.
Can't play Music.	Check if the Power is turned ON.
	Are the Music files in MP3 format?
	Check if the Music files are intact.
Music file is played but no sound output.	Adjust the Volume Control up to desire level for listening.
	Check if the music files are intact.
No sound output after iPod is hooked up	Check if the Connecting cable between iPod and Unit is damaged. Check if iPod and Unit is connected correctly. (Please refer to the Manual for proper connection) Set the unit at the proper mode.
Can't Play Music files in SD card.	Check if the SD card is inserted correctly sticker upwards. Make sure the music on your SD card is.mp3 format.
If your Unit doesn't respond or displays strange characters and symbols, you are recommended to RESET the Machine at the back with a Pin. (Note: The Time and Program setting will be lost!)	
No sound when playing audio via Bluetooth.	Your Bluetooth device has been paired property. Pairing your Bluetooth device; see page 13 or refer to the Bluetooth device user's manual.
	The volume control of your Bluetooth device is set at too low. Increase the volume of your Bluetooth device.
	The volume control of main unit is set at too low; Increase the volume of main unit to adjust to "+" level.

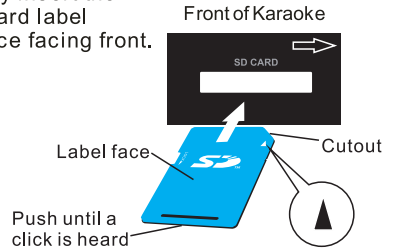
Troubleshooting

SD CARD

* Gently insert the SD Card label surface facing front.



* Compliant card type: SDHC Card, SD Card, miniSD Card, miniSDHC Card, microSD Card, microSDHC Card (requiring miniSD Card/miniSDHC Card/microSD Card/microSDHC Card adapter)

* If a miniSD Card, miniSDHC Card, microSD Card or microSDHC Card is used, insert/remove it together with the adapter.
