I have a few comments on this Application. Depending on your responses, kindly understand there may be additional comments.

- 1.) Please provide both Internal and External photographs for this device.
- 2.) Please remove the reference to Photographs in the Confidentiality Request
- 3.) The tune-up procedure provided is insufficient. How is this device tuned up at the factory? What are the target RF power values?
- 4.) Please provide a Parts List.
- 5.) This device contains a receiver as part of a Licensed transmitter. Therefore the regulatory statements of 15.19(a)(1) would apply. Please review and add this statement to the EUT as appropriate.
- 6.) FYI: The plots provided in Section 5.4 of the Test Report are very difficult to read. In the future, please do not send plots which are so "short and wide" in aspect ratio. Larger plots would be appreciated
- 7.) Because of the RF power and antenna gain of this device, it is advisable that installation instructions be given indicating how to minimize RF exposure to all persons. Please note the RF Exposure exhibit indicates that a minimum distance of ~115cm (depending on antenna gain) should be followed. Please review.
