


Plot of Conducted Emissions Test Data

Plot of Conducted Emissions Test Data





The external I/O cables were draped along the test table and formed a bundle 30 to 40 cm long in the middle. The spacing between the peripherals was 10 cm.



5.5 Corrected Amplitude & Margin Calculation

The Corrected Amplitude is calculated by adding the Antenna Factor and the Cable Factor, and subtracting the Amplifier Gain from the Amplitude reading. The basic equation is as follows:

The "Margin" column of the following data tables indicates the degree of compliance with the applicable limit. For example, a margin of $-6dB\mu V$ means the emission is $6dB\mu V$ below the maximum limit for Class B. The equation for margin calculation is as follows:

5.7 Summary of Test Results/Plots

Radiated Disturbance EUT: Access Control M/N: SAM+10,000




