



16. 1 SIM cards

Dual SIM settings

When two SIM cards are inserted, you can configure the default card for mobile data, phone calls and SMS messages according to your plan.

- Go to Settings -> Dual-SIM and network.
- 2. Choose the preferred SIM for cellular data, calls or SMS messages.



Note:

1. You can configure whether you want to select a SIM card manually or use the default SIM card each time you make a call. If you choose to use the default SIM card, your phone will use that SIM card for all outgoing calls.

16.2 Airplane mode

Wireless devices may interfere with an airplane's flight system. Power off your phone or switch to airplane mode when you are on a flight.

After you enable airplane mode, all of your phone's network features will be disabled. You will not be able to make or receive calls, use mobile data, Bluetooth or WLAN. However, you will still be able to play music, watch videos, and use applications that do not require an Internet connection. When airplane mode is on, is displayed in the status bar.

Use one of the following methods to enable or disable airplane mode:

- Go to Settings -> More connection settings and then turn the Airplane mode switch on.
- Swipe down from the status bar to open the Quick settings panel, and then tap → Airplane mode to turn it on.

16.3 Display

Configure the display settings to personalize your phone. For example, you can change the wallpaper, font size, and screen-off time.

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Settings** -> **Display.**
- 2. You can configure the following settings.
 - Brightness level: Turn on the switch and your phone will automatically adjust the screen brightness according to the ambient brightness. You can also use the brightness slider to manually adjust the brightness.
 - Wallpaper: Set the lock screen and Home screen wallpapers. You can also go to **Themes** -> **Mallpapers** to set the screen papers.
 - LED indicator: If Notification indicator is enabled, the status indicator will blink when you receive notifications. If Charging indicator is enabled, the status indicator will be on when your phone is charging.
 - Eye protection mode: Turn on the switch to decrease the blue light of the screen to reduce harm to the retina. You can make a schedule by turning **Scheduled** on and set the specific time.
 - Font size: Set the font size.
 - Automatically lock: Make the phone lock automatically after a certaint time of inacticity.
 - Auto-rotate screen: If this option is enabled, your screen's orientation will switch automatically depending on how you hold your phone when performing certain operations, such as browsing a web page or viewing a picture.

16. 4 Sounds and vibration

Change the incoming call and message ringtones or set the system alert sound and vibration effects.

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Settings** -> **Sounds and vibration**.
- 2. You can configure the following settings.
 - Volume: Adjust the ringtone, media and alarm volume.
 - Vibrate: If **Vibrate on ring** is enabled, your phone will vibrate when receiving incoming calls. If **Vibrate on silent** is enabled, your phone will vibrate when your phone is under silent mode.

- Ringtones and alerts: Select ringtone for SIM1 and SIM2. Choose a preset ringtone as the notification tone for messages, emails and other notifications.
- System feedback: Touch the switches to enable or disable dial pad touch tones, outgoing SMS messages alert tone, lock sounds, touch sounds and vibrate on tap.

16.5 Storage

Check that there is enough space on your phone's internal storage or microSD card before downloading update packages or large files.

Go to Settings -> Storage to view available storage information.

16.6 Battery

- 1. On the Home screen, tap Settings -> Battery.
- 2. Power saving: You can choose **Smart power saving** mode or **Ultra power saving** mode by turning on the switch.


16.7 Apps

 - High accuracy: Use GPS, WLAN, Bluetooth, or cellular networks to determine location. Enable this option for highly accurate positioning.
 - Battery saving: Use WLAN, Bluetooth, or cellular networks to determine location. Enable this option for reduced power consumption and longer standby times.
 - Device only: Use GPS to determine location. Enable this option to reduce mobile data usage.

16. 10 Accounts

When you use your phone for the first time, you can set up a connection with your existing account or create a new account.

Add an account

- Go to settings -> Accounts.
- Tap Add account.
- 3. Select an account type, and then follow the onscreen instructions to enter your account information.

Delete an account

- 1. Go to **settings** -> **Accounts** and then select the account type.
- 2. Select the account that you want to delete, and then tap : -> Remove account to delete it.

Synchronize accounts

Enable the sync feature to keep all of your phone's data up-to-date and prevent data loss. You can sync emails, contacts, and other data from your old phone or computer. The type of data that can be synced depends on the account type. Some applications may not support syncing for all data types.

The example below illustrates how to sync data for an email account.

- Go to settings -> Accounts.
- 2. Tap : and check the **Auto-sync data** box turn it on.
- 3. Select an account type, and then select the account you want to sync with your phone. Then it will automatically sync data.

Note:

- 1. Using unauthorized third-party software to update your phone may render your phone unusable or put your personal information at risk. Always update through your phone's online update feature or send your phone to a nearby authorized Neffos service center for assistance.
- 2. Your personal data will not be erased during a system update unless you have installed an incompatible app. It is better to back up important data before updating your phone.
- 3. When updating, ensure that your phone has at least 30% battery power remaining.
- 4. After updating, you may find that some third-party applications are incompatible with your system, such as Internet banking applications and games. This is because it takes a while for third-party application developers to release updates for new Android releases. Please wait until a new version of the application is released.

- Enable or disable TalkBack
 - 1) Go to Settings -> Smart settings -> Accessibility.
 - 2) Tap **TalkBack** and turn the switch on, and then tap **OK** to enable TalkBack. The audible tutorial will be started automatically when you enable TalkBack for the first time.
