CHANNEL SETTINGS

TKR-361MP has eight (8) available channels for the wireless microphone. Please take note that the microphone and the main player should be on the same channel.

In case of channel interference (either the microphone cannot be detected by the main player), follow the instructions below for re-channeling.


[Step1] Change the channel on the main unit by using the remote control.

1) Turn on the main unit. Make sure no song is playing.



2) Go to channel select menu:

Press (MANI) button + choose "Config" ► "System Setup" ► "Version" + (SEL) button.





- 3) Please take note that the Firmware Version information will appear on your screen. On the first line, it will show the version and the channel.
- 4) Select a channel number from 1 to 8 using the alphanumeric keypad on the remote.

(In case of interference, please change the channel from the present setting)



5) [Power off] ► [Power on] to save.

CHANNEL SETTINGS

[Step2] Set the channel of the microphone using the microphone's keypad.

1) Turn on the microphone by pressing the POWER button.



The microphone LED will be turned on and off twice.

- 3) Press the same channel number that you set in the main player.
 The microphone LED will be turned on and off twice.
- 4) Press REC button. Microphone LED will be turned on and off twice.
- 5) Press MENU button to save. ►
 Microphone LED will be turned on and off 6 times.

Thank you for purchasing the GRAND VIDEOKE.

- The GRAND VIDEOKE provides various kinds of Moving Picture Background. (Nature, World Tour, 3D, MTV, K-POP M/V, K-Drama etc.)
- The GRAND VIDEOKE provides additional built-in memory space of 64MB, so you can either record songs save pictures to use as background image.
- This product plays five types of music content:
- MIDI (Musical Instrument Digital Interface) is music produced through a synthesizer to qenerate all the sounds of all instruments for a specific song.
 MIDI music is typical karaoke music. It rarely uses vocals.
- GRAND VIDEOKE is a specially modified MP3 music for karaoke use developed by TJ media.
 It is real orchestra music that lets you experience singing with
 back up singers, second voice, orchestra accompaniment such as real string instruments.
- Multiplex is songs with vocals.
- Churus is songs with backup vocals.
- MIV is original music video with original singer's voice.
- The remote control included in the package makes this product more convenient to use.
- The alphanumeric keypad of the remote control makes it easy for you to find your favorite songs even if you remember only the song title or the first name of the artist.
- The GRAND VIDEOKE has the capability to reserve up to 30 songs.
- The GRAND VIDEOKE has a Favorite Songs function that saves your favorite songs even after the unit is turned off. Any song included in this list is automatically saved.



Introduction

How To Use The Keys

The keypad of the GRAND VIDEOKE is an alphanumeric keypad similar to your cell phone. With the GRAND VIDEOKE keypad you can key-in letters into the screen when searching for songs.

The FOWER in the GRAND VIDEOKE Microphone is used to power on the Microphone.

Icons and Symbols

- Indicates that the song playing is GRAND VIDEOKE.
- Appears before the song if the song is in your favorites folder.

- Indicates that the song playing is MUITIPLEX.
- Indicates that the song playing is CHORUS.
- Indicates that the song playing is MTV.
- Duet song from the list indicated.



How to take care of your GRAND VIDEOKE

- 1. Do not attempt to open the GRAND VIDEOKE. This will void the warranty.
- Use only the adaptor included with your GRAND VIDEOKE. Using other adaptors could cause serious damage to this device and thereby void the warranty.
- Do not forcefully pull the microphone cable from the GRAND VIDEOKE microphone. See "Connecting the microphone to the GRAND VIDEOKE" for the proper procedure in removing the microphone cable from the GRAND VIDEOKE microphone.
- Do not cover the product or any of its accessories while the GRAND VIDEOKE is turned on. Always allow air to move freely around the GRAND VIDEOKE and the microphone in order to prevent overheating.
- 5. Avoid bending or twisting the cord.
- Do not place heavy or sharp objects on top of the cable to prevent punctures or cuts.
- 7. Do not put this device near an object containing water (such as a vase) to avoid damage or electric shock. In case water or any liquid substance enters the unit, immediately unplug the power cord, then bring your GRAND VIDEOKE to the nearest dealer or service center to check for damage and for repair, if necessary.
- 8. Do not place the product on an unstable surface, near flammable substances, under direct sunlight, or in a wet and dusty place.
- In order to prevent malfunctions, do not place the product near devices that generate strong electric & magnetic fields such as transformers, mobile phones, back portion of TV's, etc.
- 10. Make all the necessary connections before powering up the GRAND VIDEOKE.
- Make sure to place the batteries of the remote control in the correct polarity to prevent possible damage to the remote control.

Maintenance & Cleaning of your GRAND VIDEOKE

- During thunderstorms, do not use the product and unplug the adaptor from the wall socket.
- 2. If you will not use the product for a long time, unplug the adaptor.
- Do not use strong solvents (such as alcohol/benzene/thinner) to clean the product. This could damage the product's paint work; use only cloth dampened with water and mild detergent.
- 4. Before cleaning or moving the device, unplug the adaptor.


To avoid electric discharge or damage of battery:

- When putting the batteries in the remote control, check its poles (1 /-).
- Make sure that you use AAA size balteries.
- When changing the batteries, change both batteries at the same time.
- If you will not use the device for a long time, take the batteries out of remote control.


When to change the batteries (2 x AAA Batteries)

 If the remote control does not work even within a short distance from the main player, the batteries need to be changed.


How to change the batteries:

Nomenclature (Microphone)

- Make sure that you use AA size of batteries.
- When changing the batteries, change both batteries at the same time.
- If you will not use the device for a long time, take the batteries out of microphone.







- 2. Check if the POWER LED on the front of main unit is turned off.



Power On/Off - Microphone

button on the microphone will turn on and off the microphone but not the main unit.

- 1. Press Power button.
- 2. Check if the POWER LED is turned on.
- 3. Check if the icon is indicated on the TV screen.
 - To check the icon, the main unit must be turned on.
 - If no icon is on the screen, the microphone is not connected properly. Please refer to "CHANNEL SETTING" for more information.
- 4. To turn off the microphone, please press the button for 2 seconds.
- 5. Check if the POWER LED is turned off.





How to operate the GRAND VIDEOKE

You can use up to 11 Song Transfer Packs including the 10 STPs copied to the internal memory of the main unit. Song Transfer Pack can also be directly played from the song pack slot.

Song Pack Installation

- 1) Please turn off the main unit.
- 2) Insert the Song Transfer Pack into the song pack slot on the left side of the main unit.




- 3) Turn on the main unit.
- 4) Key in a song number from the Song Transfer Pack. If you can't find the songs, repeat steps 1 to 4.
- The songs will automatically be added to the song library.


to the GRAND VIDEOKE



- On the front of the GRAND VIDEOKE player, connect the microphone cable to the MIC1 or MIC2.
- Connect the other side of the cable to the bottom of the microphone as shown above.
- When inserting the microphone cable to the GRAND VIDEOKE microphone, you should hear a clicking sound that indicates that the cable is properly inserted.
- To remove the microphone cable, hold the movable locking mechanism of the microphone cable and gently pull it down.
- With GRAND VIDEOKE, there are two kinds of second microphone that you can use. Your first option is to use a GRAND VIDEOKE Microphone with remote control keypads. This type of microphone has the same buttons as the remote control. Your second option is to use an ordinary microphone that you can buy from any audio/video store. Please see the last page for the speciPcations of the ordinary microphone compatible with GRAND VIDEOKE.
- If you have a second GRAND VIDEOKE microphone, you can connect it to the MIC2 using the method above.
- You can use an ordinary type of microphone that is impedance 600Ω ; simply connect to either MIC1 or MIC2.




- Connect the yellow plug to the video terminal of the main player, and connect the other side of this cable to the video terminal of the TV.
- Connect each of the audio cables (I white/R–red) to the audio terminal of the main player, and connect the other side of these cables to the audio terminal of IV.
- Adjust your TV setup to external input mode.

Connecting the GRAND VIDEOKE to other Sound Systems



- Connect the yellow plug to the video terminal of the main player, and connect the
 other side of this cable to the video terminal of the TV.
- Connect each of the audio cables (1-white/R-red) to the audio terminal of the main player, and connect the other side of these cables to an audio device or an amplifier.
- Adjust your TV setup to external video mode and also your audio or amplifier to
 external audio input (or AUX).
- For the external device connection of TV, audio or amplifier, please refer to the manuals of these devices.

Favorite Menu

The Favorite Songs list contains user selected songs that are stored in the GRAND VIDEOKE's memory. This list is retained even after the GRAND VIDEOKE is turned off.



To add songs to the favorite list:

- To register your favorite song, select a song search screen and press (MENU).
- A {Heart} icon will be added in front of the title, which means the song is in your favorite folder. If you press well again, the {Heart} icon will disappear and the song is removed from the lavorite folder.

Managing the favorite list:

- In your favorite song list, you can sort the songs in terms of the song number, title or artist. If you want to remove a song in the list, select a song and press
- Press (\$) To play a song from the Favorite Songs list.
- You can also reserve the songs in your favorite list to cue them to play, just highlight the song and press .
- You can sort your favorite songs by title, artist, and number, then press vol to change the sort mode.
- You can add up to 50 songs in this list from the convenience of the search screen.



Additional Menu Functions & Configuration Settings

Record Menu

The record function allows the user to record his/her song. Both the instrumentals and the user's voice are recorded and can be played back.





Recorded songs are stored in the GRANDVIDEOKE's built-in memory. The user memory is shared by the recorded songs and the user photos. The total memory is 64MB which is equivalent to 60 minutes of recorded songs. 40 minutes is immediately available while the remaining 20 minutes was used for the pre-loaded user photos. To maximize the capacity of the user memory you may delete the user photos using the USB function.

Configuration Menu

The Configuration menu enables you to change some of the setting of the GRAND VIDEOKE like lyrics alignment, and difficulty level of the scoring. Here is the list of the default values for each configuration option.

To change any of the configuration options, highlight it by pressing (), then press () to change the values until your desired value is displayed. When you're done with the configuration menu, press (). To exit the menu screen press () once.

- While playing, on the remote control, press the [MUSIC NOTE]
 "Music Note" is displayed.
- While stand by, on the remote control, press the [MUSIC NOTE]
 "Music Note list" is displayed.



 While music note is displaying, you can change lyrics mode by pressing [MUSIC NOTE] button on the remote control.



Built-in Songs are available to display the music notes.
 (Medley, Event, MTV, STP some MIDI songs are not available music note display)






USB Function

The GRAND VIDEOKE is equipped with a Universal Serial Bus (USB) port.
 You can download the recorded songs from the device to your PC, or upload some image Ples from your PC to the main player.

PC connection

- After turning the main player off, connect the main player to the PC using the USB cable
- As you turn the main player on, the PC will automatically detect the new hardware.
- Click the window explorer to see if a 'TKR-361 UM' is detected.
- The GRAND VIDEOKE does not include the USB driver or installation software, but it is designed to be connected to any PC that is equipped with Windows XP,7 O/S.



IMPORTANT:

To disconnect the main player from the PC, close the folders, right-click on the "Safety Remove Hardware" icon on your taskbar. This will open a dialog box. Click the "USB Mass storage/TJ media" and then click on stop; a dialog box will appear asking for confirmation. Click on OK. "Safe to remove hardware" message will appear at the taskbar.

Using your photos as background image

- When the main player is connected to your PC, click the Windows Explorer on your PC.
- 2. Open the 'PHOTO' folder on the TKR-361 UM folder.
- In the 'PHOTO' folder, save the images or files you want to use as background image. The recommended size of images is 720x480; otherwise the image will not display properly. Please consult your favorite photo editing software to resize your pictures.
- 4. Disconnect the GRAND VIDEOKE from the PC and turn the main player on.
- 5. Press "BGV" button to select "MY.P" and your photos will be shown.
- 6. The file size of each image should be less than 1MB.
- 7. You can add approximately 110 images to the main player based on the size of each image at 350KB.





Troubleshooting Guide

- 1. The GRAND VIDEOKE does not turn on.
 - a. Make sure that the DC output plug of the adaptor is firmly plugged to the unit, and that its AC input plug is likewise firmly plugged into the AC outlet.
 - b. Press the power button.
- 2. The screen displays video but there is no sound.
 - a. Check if a headphone is connected to the TV or to the amplifier, and if so, disconnect the headphone.
 - b. Increase volume of the TV or the amplifier. Also increase the volume of the GRAND VIDEOKE.
 - c. Check if the red and white RCA plugs of the RCA cable are properly plugged in.
- 3. The screen does not display video.
 - a. Make sure that the RCA plugs are connected to the correct TV input jacks.

 Make sure also to set the TV to display the correct AV input.
 - b. Check if the yellow RCA plugs are properly plugged to the yellow RCA
 - jacks of the GRAND VIDEOKE and the TV.
- 4. The volume of the MIC is low.
 - a. Press the $\{+\}$ MIC volume button on the remote to increase the volume of the mic.
- 5. Real time score is displayed even if there is no person singing on the MIC.
 - a. Realtime score is designed to respond even to soft sounds, which includes surrounding noise.
- 6. The GRAND VIDEOKE does not turn off even after turning off the MIC.
 - a. The power switch of the MIC is designed to turn off the MIC. It does not control the power of the main unit.
 - b. Press the power switch on the GRAND VIDEOKE.
- Distance of the remote control is short. The remote control does not operate well.
 - a. Check battery of the remote control.
 - b. Is the product being used near a strong light source (direct ray of light or bright electric lights)? Avoid bright light sources as much as possible.
 - c. Remove any obstruction between the remote control and the main unit.
- 8. The GRAND VIDEOKE a does not recognize a Song Pack.
 - a. A song pack must be installed after the main player is turned off. In case the song pack was installed before the unit was turned off, simply turn off the unit and then turn it on again.
 - b. Turn off the unit and firmly reinsert back the song pack into its slot.



Q&A-Other

- 1. How do you set the TV mode?
- Enter the menu then [Config], then enter [TV Set-Up] then select either NTSC or PAL.
- 2. Why does the color of a text title change when singing?
- When the Song Practice function is turned on, the highlight color of the text changes only from red to blue when you sing correctly into the MIC, otherwise the highlight color remains red.
- 3. How do Ladjust TEMPO and KEY with a direction key?
- Press or to increase or decrease the key.

 Press (or) to increase or decrease the Lempo.
