

Appendix 5 RF Exposure Information



Maximum transmitter power:

Frequency	Maximum peak output power	Output power
(MHz)	(dBuV/m)	(mW)
2405	94.31	0.8093
2435	93.77	0.7147
2475	91.71	0.4448

According to KDB 447498 D01:

The 1-g and 10-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100 MHz to 6 GHz at *test separation distances* ≤50 mm are determined by:

[(max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW)/(min. test separation distance, mm)] \cdot [$\sqrt{f(GHz)}$] \leq 3.0 for 1-g SAR and \leq 7.5 for 10-g extremity SAR,24 where

- f(GHz) is the RF channel transmit frequency in GHz
- Power and distance are rounded to the nearest mW and mm before calculation25
- The result is rounded to one decimal place for comparison
- 3.0 and 7.5 are referred to as the numeric thresholds in the step 2 below

Result:

$$(0.8093/5)*\sqrt{2.405} = 0.251 < 3.0$$

$$(0.7147/5)^*\sqrt{2.435} = 0.223 < 3.0$$

$$(0.4448/5)^*\sqrt{2.475} = 0.140 < 3.0$$

Conclusion:

No SAR is required.
