



Dear FCC Team,

We recently received certification for six similar UWB modules. The IDs are: U9YAL5835, U9YAL5834, U9YAL5830, U9YAL5833, U9YAL5808, and U9YAL5804. We would like to request long-term confidentiality for the User Guide's for each of these modules. These modules are used for military applications, and the specification of the Embedment Guide (User Guide) has a variety of FOUO markings indicating that they are not for public release. The government has reviewed these documents and decided that these documents should not be distributed.

All sales of these modules must first go through a government approval, and the Embedment Guide (User Guide) is only released after a strict NDA is signed. The document itself has these marking indicating the level of protection they should have, but the NDA signed by companies using these module explicitly prevents them from sharing the documentation and required them to destroy the documents once the project is over.

The documents themselves are held on a private server, and anybody requesting a copy must receive government approval before receiving them. The classification of the document itself indicates that it can not be freely shared. I have also attached a copy of the NDA we require people to sign.

The products that embed these modules are ITAR protected, and the product have a NIST FIPS 140-2 level of security (or higher). As a result, no data can be shared with third parties, and users of the module have strict NDA requirements.

Please consider the User Guide to under long term confidentiality for each of these 6 modules. I have attached a copy of the NDA that gets signed. I can also get further government support to remove these documents if required.
