





2	Display	2.8-inch TFT LCD with touch screen.
3	Soft Key (Left)	Performs the command as defined in the icon on screen (above the key).
4	Talk Key	Press this key to dial or answer a call.

5	QWERTY Keypad	Use the keypad to enter letters or numbers through the numberic pad.
6	Phone and Battery Status LED	<ul> <li>Missed Call/Missed Message: Red Blinking</li> <li>Low Power: Red Blinking</li> <li>Battery Charging: Solid Orange</li> </ul>
7	5-Way Navigation Key	Press the multi directional control up, down, left, or right to move through menus; carry out the selection by pressing the center button.
8	Soft Key (Right)	Performs the command as defined in the icon on screen (above the key).
9	End Key	Press to end a call or close an application.
10	Microphone	Speak into the high sensitivity microphone when using the phone or recording a voice note.
11	Stylus	Navigate or interact with the touch screen.



5	Mini-SD card slot	Insert a micro-SD card to expand device memory.
6	IR Receiver	Sends and receives data to devices within close range.
7	Stylus	Navigate or interact with the touch screen.
8	Scan Key (Right)	Press the key to scan and decode a bar code.
9	Capture	Turn on the camera function to capture still photos or movies.



1	Power Button	Power on or off the device.
2	Scanner	Point the reading window of the scanner in the direction of a bar code.
3	Mini-USB Port	Connect a mini USB cable for PC sync and battery charging.
4	Sync Jack	Connect to cradle (optional) to recharge battery or synchronize information.
5	Headphones	Connect a 2.5 mm Earphone.

#### SIM CARD INSTALLATION

You must install a SIM card to use the phone functions of your H-21. Perform the following procedures to install the SIM card.

NOTE: Power off the device and remove the battery before inserting a SIM card. Make sure the SIM card snaps correctly into the SIM socket.

# **Removing the Battery Cover**


**CAUTION!** Make sure the device is turned off before you attempt to remove the battery cover. Otherwise the device will shut off automatically and unsaved data may be lost.

#### STEP 1:

Use the tip of the stylus to perform the following procedures. Do not use excessive force.

- First slide the Lock Release to the unlock position (A).
- Then turn the Lock Button to the unlock position (B).

**NOTE:** The battery cover locks will only unlock in this order.




# Removing the Battery Cover cont.

**CAUTION!** To avoid injury during the following step, hold the device in front of you and direct the force away from your body.

# STEP 2:

- Hold the stylus in your writing hand and the device in your opposite 1. hand.
- Insert the stylus into the groove closest to you (A). Push the stylus in an upward motion to separate the battery cover from the device (B).



# Installing the SIM Card

Once the battery cover and battery has been removed, you can install the SIM card. Perform the following procedures to complete the installation of the SIM card.

## STEP 1:


Slide the SIM card of the arrow to unlock. the contacts face up Refer to Fig. 1

# STEP 2:


Align the SIM card in with the beveled edge facing the bottom of the device.

# **STEP 3:**

Rotate the SIM card bracket in the direction the bracket (A). Ensure bracket back into place (B). Refer to Fig. 2

Install the battery. See "Installing the Battery" on page 13.

# STEP 6:

Replace the battery cover. See "Replacing the Battery Cover" on page 13.




Align the contacts on the battery with the connectors on the battery bay and insert as shown (A). Lower the battery in place (B).

#### REMOVING THE BATTERY


To exchange the battery at any time, perform the following procedures to remove the battery.:


# STEP 2:

Lift the battery in the direction of the arrow, as shown, to remove it.



#### LOCKING THE BATTERY COVER

Before you can power the device on, you must lock the battery cover. Perform the following procedures to lock the battery cover.



#### POWER AND BATTERY SETTINGS

The life and performance of your battery depend on many factors including signal strength, temperature of the environment in which you use your phone, features and settings, and more.

## Viewing Battery Power

- 1. Tap Start > Settings > Power.
  - The main and backup battery life displays.
- 2. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

## **Optimizing Battery Power**

To get the most out of the life of your battery, set the H-21 to shut down after the system becomes idle for a specific amount of time.

- 1. Tap Start > Settings > Power > Advanced.
- 2. Select the amount of idle time before the device shuts down.
- 3. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

#### Charging the Battery

To charge the battery, do one of the following options:

- Connect one end of the USB adapter to the device and plug the opposite end into a wall outlet.
- Connect the device to a PC using the supplied USB cable.

#### MINI-SD CARDS

The H-21 contains a micro-SD card slot for expanding the device's memory.

# Inserting a Mini-SD Card

**CAUTION!** Inserting the micro-SD card in the wrong direction can cause damage to the card and the device.

- Lift the micro-SD card slot cover. See "H-21 Views and Descriptions" on page 3.
- 2. Insert the micro-SD card with the logo side down.
- Push down until the card clicks into place.

## Removing a Mini-SD Card

- 1. Press the micro-SD card inward to eject the card.
- 2. Remove the micro-SD card from the card slot.

#### CONNECTING A HEADSET

- Locate the headphones port on the bottom of the phone. See "Top and Bottom View" on page 6.
- Peel back the rubber door.
- 3. Insert the provided headphones into the headphones port.

# GETTING STARTED

This chapter will instruct you on how to perform general operations such as powering the H-21 on and off, using the Today Screen and Start Menu, and setting up various organizational tools.

#### POWERING ON

- Move both battery cover locks to the lock position.
  - **NOTE:** The Power button will not work unless the battery cover is locked. See "Locking the Battery Cover" on page 15.
- 2. Press the Power button located along the top of the device. See "H-21 Views and Descriptions" on page 3.

#### POWERING OFF

- Press and hold the **Power** button for 3 seconds.
- 2. The system displays a confirmation screen. Tap **Yes** when prompted.



#### ENTERING AND EXITING SLEEP MODE

Sleep mode is an energy-saving mode that still allows you to receive phone calls and messages.

#### To put the device in sleep mode:

Press the Power button once for less than 1 second.

#### To return from sleep mode:

· Press the **Power** button again for less than 1 second.

#### CALIBRATING THE TOUCHSCREEN

Calibration ensures that the correct screen items are activated when tapped. The first time you power on the H-21, the system will ask you to calibrate the touchscreen. Tap the center of the cross using the stylus until the calibration is complete.

#### To recalibrate the screen at any time:

- Tap Start > Settings > System > Screen > Alignment.
- 2. Tap the Align Screen button and follow the on screen instructions.



3. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

#### LOCKING/UNLOCKING THE H-21

Locking protects the screen from accidental key presses.

To lock/unlock the keyboard and touchscreen:

Tap Start > Lock.




The keyboard and touchscreen are locked. To unlock the screen simply slide the **Lock** button to either the right or left. 2.



#### PROGRAMMING BUTTONS

To assign a function to the F1, F2, F3 and F4 buttons:


- Tap Start > Settings > Personal > Buttons > Program Buttons.
- Select a button (F1, F2) and assign a program from the drop down menu. 2.



3. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

To edit the Up/Down control and Repeat Rate:

- Tap **Start > Settings > Personal > Buttons > Up/Down Control**. Drag the slider next to the appropriate option to change the setting.
- 2.



3. Tap OK to save.

#### BACKLIGHT SETTINGS

- 1. Tap Start > Settings > System > Backlight.
- 2. Customize the following settings:



- · Select the time for the backlight to turn off if the device is not in use.
- Enable or disable the backlight when a button is pressed or the screen is tapped.
- 3. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

#### TODAY SCREEN

The Today Screen is usually the first screen that displays when you turn on the H-21. It displays a list of shortcuts to phone functions, programs, and favorites. The Today screen looks like this:



No.	Name	Description
1	Start Button	Tap to access the Start Menu
2	Highlighted Item	Tap to access a function or application. User can scroll to the right or the left of the highlighted item for additional options
3	Contacts	Tap to access Contacts
4	Status Bar	Displays Barcode Reader, ActiveSync, Phone, Volume, and Battery Status
5	Item Option	Displays an option specific to the highlighted item

# **Accessing the Today Screen**

Tap Start > Today.

# **Changing Today Screen Items**

1. Tap Start > Settings > Today > Items.

Select the check box next to the items you want included on the Today screen. Deselect the check box next to the items you don't want included on the Today screen.



3. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

#### START MENU

The Start menu displays icons to all the basic functions and applications.

1	Start Button	Tap to access the Start Menu

3	Lock	Locks the keyboard and touchscreen from accidental key presses

#### INPUT METHODS

The H-21 is enabled with 4 different input modes: Keyboard, Letter Recognizer, Block Recognizer, and Transcriber. You can enter texts and numbers by using the keypad or the touch screen.



## **Switching Input Methods**

To switch input methods from the settings menu:

- Tap Start > Settings > Personal > Input.
- 2. Select the desired input method from the drop down menu.



3. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

To switch input methods using the input icon:

 Tap the input icon located along the bottom center of the screen. An up arrow appears next to the input icon.



Tap the up arrow and select the desired input method from the pop up menu.



#### Using the Touch Screen Keyboard

The touch screen keyboard allows you to enter text by tapping keys with your stylus.

- Select the touch screen keyboard as your input method. See "Switching 1. Input Methods" on page 26.
  Tap the input icon located along the bottom center of the screen.
- 2. The touch screen keyboard displays.




3. To enter text, use your stylus to tap the keys on the touch screen keyboard.

#### **Using Letter Recognizer**

Letter recognizer interprets familiar handwriting styles, one symbol, letter, or number at a time.

- 1. Select the letter recognizer as your input method. See "Switching Input Methods" on page 26.
- Tap the input icon located along the bottom center of the screen. The letter recognizer displays.




- Do one of the following to begin entering text:
   Enter uppercase letters in the left (ABC) box.
  - Enter lowercase letters in the middle (abc) box.
  - Enter numbers and symbols in the right (123) box.

# **Using Block Recognizer**

Block recognizer interprets letters written in one stroke.

- Select the block recognizer as your input method. See "Switching Input Methods" on page 26. 1.
- 2. Tap the input icon located along the bottom center of the screen. The block recognizer displays.



- Do one of the following to begin entering text:
  Enter lowercase letters in the left (abc) box.

  - Enter numbers in the right (123) box.
  - Enter symbols by tapping once in either the left or right box and begin writing.

## **Using Transcriber**

Transcriber recognizes cursive and/or print handwriting.

- Select the transcriber as your input method. See "Switching Input 1. Methods" on page 26.
- Tap the input icon located along the bottom center of the screen. 2. The transcriber displays.



3. To enter text, use your stylus to write anywhere on screen.


#### SETTING UP CALENDAR

Calendar can be used to schedule appointments, such as meetings or events. Appointments of the day can be displayed on the Today screen.


There are five different appointment views: Day, Week, Month, Year, and Agenda.

## **Creating Appointments**


- 1. Tap Start > Calendar.
- 2. Tap Menu > New Appointment.
- 3. Select whether the appointment is all day from the **All Day** drop down menu.



 If the appointment is reoccurring, select how often it should recur from the Occurs drop down menu.



5. Tap to select the Categories and Attendees.



- 6. Tap the **Notes** tab to add notes to the appointment if necessary.
- 7. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

## **Deleting Appointments**

- 1. Tap Start > Calendar.
- 2. From Agenda view, select the appointment to delete.
- 3. Tap Menu > Delete Appointment.



4. For recurring appointments, tap **All** to delete the set. To delete only the selected instance, tap **One**.



**NOTE:** If the appointment has been synchronized with your PC, it will be deleted from your PC the next time you synchronize. If the appointment has not be synchronized, it will only be deleted from the H-21.

## **Changing the Reminder Time**

- Tap Start > Calendar.
- 2. Tap Menu > Tools > Options > Appointment.
- 3. Select the reminder time from the drop down menus.



4. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

## Changing the Calendar View


- 1. Tap Start > Calendar.
- Tap Menu > Tools > Options > General.
- 3. Select a default view from the **Start in** drop down menu.
  - Agenda View: Displays the current day's activities.
  - Day View: Displays a single day's schedule in a planner layout.
  - Week View: Displays a weekly schedule.
  - Month View: Displays free and booked days during the month.
  - Year View: Displays a calendar for the entire year.
- 4. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

#### WRITING NOTES

Notes allows you to quickly compose reminders, to-do lists, meeting notes, and more. You can write using the stylus, keypad, or touchscreen keypad.

### **Setting the Default Input Method**

- 1. Tap **Start > Notes**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Options.
- 3. Select one of the following methods from the **Default** drop down menu.



- Writing: Handwrite notes using the stylus.
- Typing: Type notes using the keypad or touchscreen keypad.
- 4. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

## **Creating a New Note**







Most SIM cards are preset with a personal identification number (PIN) provided by your wireless service provider. When PIN Security is enabled, you will be prompted to enter your PIN whenever you use your device.

This chapter instructs you on using Contacts to manage addresses and phone numbers, and Messaging to send and receive SMS, MMS, and e-mail messages.

#### USING CONTACTS

Contacts allows you to store phone numbers, e-mail addresses, birthdays, and other information that relates to a contact. Simply tap on a contact to quickly call or text message them. If you use Outlook on your PC, you can synchronize contacts between your device and PC.



Network	The type of network your e-mail server connects to.

Incoming mail server	The name of your e-mail server (POP3 or IMAP4).
Require SSL connection	Ensures that received e-mail for this account uses an SSL connection.  NOTE: If you select this and your ISP does not support an SSL connection, you will not be able to connect to receive e-mail.
Outgoing mail server	The name of your outgoing e-mail server (SMTP).
Outgoing server required authentication	Your outgoing e-mail server (SMTP) may require authentication.  NOTE: Your user name and password from above will be used.
Outgoing sever settings	Your outgoing e-mail server may require different authentication settings than your incoming e-mail server.
Different user name for outgoing server	An option that allows you to enter separate settings for your outgoing e-mail server.
User name	Your outgoing e-mail server user name.
Password	Your outgoing e-mail server password.
Domain name	The outgoing e-mail server domain name.
Require SSL connection (outgoing mail server only)	Enables you to send personal information more securely.  NOTE: If you select this and your ISP does not support an SSL connection, you will not be able to send e-mail.

#### BLUETOOTH MODES

There are three Bluetooth operational modes:

- On. Bluetooth is enabled and your device can send and receive information with other Bluetooth devices in range.
- Off. Bluetooth is disabled and can neither send nor receive information.
- Visible. Bluetooth is enabled and visible to all other Bluetooth devices in range.

### **Enabling Bluetooth**

- Tap Start > Settings > Bluetooth > Mode. Select the check box in front of Turn on Bluetooth. 2.



Tap OK to save and exit. 3.

## **Making Your Device Visible**

To allow other Bluetooth devices to detect your device and send you information, follow these steps:



## **Pairing With Devices in Range**

Pairing with another Bluetooth device allows you to exchange information in a secure manner. Make sure the two devices are within a range of 10 meters, and Bluetooth is turned on and in visible mode.

- 1. Tap Start >Settings > Bluetooth > Devices.
- Tap Add new device.
   A list of Bluetooth enabled devices within range displays on screen.
- 3. Select the device to connect to and tap Next.



 For a more secure connection, enter a passcode. The same passcode must be entered on the other device. If you do not want to use a passcode, tap Next.

If the connection is successful, a Device Added confirmation message displays on screen.



5. Select the service to use from the other device.



6. Tap Save.

# **Beaming Information**

To use Bluetooth to receive beams, ensure Bluetooth is turned on and that your device is visible and within close range.

### To enable incoming beams:

- Tap Start > Settings > Connections > Beam.
- 2. Select the check box next to Receive all incoming beams.



3. Tap OK to save and exit.

#### To beam an item:


You can beam information from your H-21 such as an appointment in Calendar, a task in Tasks, a contact card in Contacts, a picture in Pictures, or a file in File Explorer.

## BARCODE SCANNER

The H-21 comes equipped with a barcode scanner for reading barcodes. Either with a 1D laser scanner or with a 2D camera module. In this chapter, learn how to enable the barcode scanner and adjust the various settings.

#### SETTING UP BARCODE READER

### **Enabling Barcode Reader**

The barcode reader is disabled by default and must be activated before use.

- Tap Start > Settings > System tab > Scanner Setting > Basic Settings.
- 2. Select the check box next to Enable barcode reader.
- 3. Select the check box next to **Enable trigger key** and select from **Side** (Scan Left and Right Key), F1, or F2.



4. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

### Setting to Multiple or Single Read Mode


Multiple read mode allows multiple barcodes to be read with just one triggering. Single read mode reads only one barcode during one triggering.

- 1. Tap Start > Settings > System tab > Scanner Setting > Read Options.
- 2. Select Single or Multiple from the drop down menu next to Read mode.
- 3. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

### **Setting Good Read Notification**

When the barcode scanner successfully decodes a reading, you can set the H-21 to notify you with a sound effect, vibration, both, or none.

- . Tap Start > Settings > System tab > Scanner Setting > Basic Settings.
- Select the desired notification from the drop down menu under Good read notification.



- Change the sound effect by selecting from the drop down menu under Sound.
- 4. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

### **Selecting Recognized Barcode Types**

The H-21 is capable of scanning and decoding various barcode types. To select or deselect the barcode types to scan for, perform the following steps:


- 1. Tap Start > Settings > System tab > Scanner Setting > Code Options.
- Select the check box next to the barcode types you want the reader to recognize.
- 3. Deselect the check box next to the barcode types you don't want the reader to recognize.
- 4. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

### SCANNING AND READING BARCODE LABELS

The H-21 can scan and decode barcode labels. If you prefer to read a barcode on your device right after scanning, open an application in which letters and numbers can be displayed before you activate the barcode reader.

**NOTE:** NOTE: Barcode Reader must be enabled before you begin. See "Enabling Barcode Reader" on page 121.

- Open the application in which you want the decoded barcode to display after scanning.
- Point the barcode reader to a barcode label and press the scan key (left scan key, right scan key, F1, or F2 depending on your trigger key setting).



**NOTE:** NOTE: Adjust the distance between your device and the label, and make sure the light emitted from the scanner exceeds the width of the label.



### GPS

The H-21 has a built-in GPS (Global Positioning System) signal receiver. To start navigating you must install a mapping software. Follow the instruction of your mapping software to begin using the navigation functions.

# **GPS Settings**

You may need to specify the GPS hardware port when installing the mapping software.

- 1. Tap Start > Settings > System > External GPS < Hardware.
- 2. Enter following values:



GPS hardware port: COM4.

Baud rate: 57600.

## **Using AGPS**

AGPS stands for Assisted Global Positioning System. AGPS enabled you to acquire a location faster with the aid of cellular towers. Some benefits of AGPS:

- Faster location acquisition
- · Conserves battery power
- · Location acquisition indoors

#### To enable AGPS:

- 1. Tap Start > Settings > System > AGPS Settings.
- 2. Select the check box next to Enable AGPS.



3. Tap **OK** to save and exit.

### **Receiving Better Satellite Signals**

It can take several minutes the first time you establish a GPS connection. If the device cannot detect the satellite signal, try the following:

- Move the device to an open space without buildings or trees around it.
- Make sure there are no wireless communication devices (e.g. radardetecting devices and mobile phones) nearby since these products may cause unstable signal reception.
- Connect an external Bluetooth GPS receiver (not included) to your device to enhance the reception.

### Important Notice about Using GPS

**CAUTION!** Do not use the GPS system when driving.

- The GPS is a navigation aid only and should not be used for precise location measurement.
- The GPS is built and operated by the US Defense Department. The accuracy of location data may be affected by changes made by the Department.
- Enabling the GPS function will consume more battery power.
